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ABSTRACT

The Regents Associate in Applied Science in Nursing External Degree has the two major components of (1) general education and (2) nursing. Candidates having satisfied the requirements for each component will be awarded an Associate in Applied Science in Nursing degree by the Regents of the University of the State of New York. There are no prerequisites such as age, residence, or previous education experience in nursing required for enrollment in the nursing program. Although the Regents External Degree Examinations in Nursing will not be available until October 1973, candidates officially enrolled in the nursing program may begin meeting the general education requirements or apply transcript credit toward the nursing component of the degree program. A description of the specific degree requirements is contained in this document.

Associate in Applied Science in Nursing

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I. Introduction:

The Regents Associate in Applied Science in Nursing External Degree has two components: General Education and Nursing. Candidates having satisfied the requirements for each component will be awarded an Associate in Applied Science in Nursing degree by the Regents of The University of the State of New York and will be eligible to take the registered nurse license examination in New York State.

There are no prerequisites such as age, residence, or previous education experience in nursing required for enrollment in the nursing program. Individuals who hold a registered nurse license and desire an associate degree are also welcome to participate.

Candidates may enroll now in the Associate in Applied Science in Nursing degree program. Although the Regents External Degree Examinations in Nursing will not be available until October, 1973, candidates officially enrolled in the nursing program may begin meeting the General Education requirements or apply transcript credit toward the nursing component of the degree program.

A description of the specific degree requirements for the Associate in Applied Science in Nursing is as follows:

II. General Education Component:

The objective of the general education component is to ensure that degree recipients have a basic college-level competence in the humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences/mathematics. The requirements may be satisfied in any one of the following ways:

A. Recognized College Proficiency Examinations

1. Satisfactory scores on the five College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) General Examinations;

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2. Satisfactory scores on at least five subject area proficiency examinations. These examinations are subject to the following restrictions:
 - a. at least one examination must be classified as humanities
 - b. at least one examination must be classified as social sciences
 - c. at least one examination must be classified as natural sciences or mathematics
 - d. the remaining two examinations can be from any academic area including humanities, social sciences, natural sciences/mathematics

B. Regular College Courses

The number and type of courses are as follows:

1. A minimum of 10 one-semester courses. If the courses were completed on a quarter system, a minimum of 15 courses are required.
2. The total number of required courses must be distributed in the following manner:
 - a. a minimum of two semester courses (three quarter courses) in the area of humanities
 - b. a minimum of two semester courses (three quarter courses) in the area of social sciences
 - c. a minimum of two semester courses (three quarter courses) in the area of natural sciences/mathematics
 - d. the remaining four semester courses (six quarter courses) in any academic area including humanities, social sciences, natural sciences/mathematics

For purposes of enabling you to better understand the types of courses that can be classified as being humanities, social sciences, natural sciences, mathematics, and electives, a sample list of courses is provided on pages 10-11. They have been classified according to subject matter areas. It is important to realize that this is a sample list which does not contain all courses that can qualify for credit in a particular area.

All official transcripts from regionally accredited colleges and universities will be accepted for evaluation without regard to the number of institutions attended by the candidate. There is no time limit as to when a course must have been completed. Only those courses where a grade of "D" or better was achieved can be used. An overall average of "C" is required for graduation.

C. Possession of a Previously Earned Degree

Submit verification that you completed an associate or baccalaureate degree which meets the area distribution requirements for regular college courses listed under B-2.

D. Military Service School Courses

Those courses which contain college level work and evaluated by the Commission on Accreditation of Service Expenses (CASE) may be used. The CASE credit recommendation will be utilized to determine the number and type of courses required to satisfy all requirements.

E. Special Assessment

Special Assessment can be used as a means of satisfying the distributions requirements (humanities, social sciences, natural sciences or mathematics and electives). The amount and type of college level credit allowed will vary among individuals, and will depend on the experience presented for validation.

F. Combination of Examinations, College Level Courses, and Special Assessment

An appropriate combination of these approaches can be used to satisfy the distribution requirement (humanities, social sciences, natural sciences/mathematics and electives). Two one-semester regular college courses are equivalent to an approved proficiency examination.

For a list of approved examinations administered by the College Proficiency Examination Program (CPEP), Regents External Degree Program (REDE), College Level Examination Program (CLEP), and United States Armed Forces Institute (USAFI) see pages 8 -10.

The Regents External Degree - Handbook of Information for Candidates should be consulted for additional information concerning minimum acceptable scores on examinations, special assessment, procedure for submitting official transcripts, and military service courses.

III. Nursing Component:

The objective of the nursing component is to ensure that degree recipients possess knowledge and technical nursing skills comparable to those of graduates from associate degree nursing programs. The candidate must demonstrate knowledge in four basic academic areas: Health, Commonalities of Nursing Care, Differences in Nursing Care, and Occupational Strategy. The content of the four nursing areas as a whole corresponds to the content included in the curriculum of associate degree nursing programs at accredited two-year colleges. However, the content in the four academic areas represents a unique organization of nursing content at the associate degree level and may not reflect the present curriculum designs or structure of specific courses offered in a college curriculum.

In addition to the four academic areas, the successful completion of a Performance examination will be required of all candidates. Since performance in the clinical laboratory is an integral part of every nursing curriculum, candidates will be required to demonstrate competence in executing technical nursing skills in the areas of planning, implementing, and evaluating nursing care. Although the performance area may not correspond to the clinical performance required in a particular course or stage in a college curriculum, it does reflect the technical nursing skills expected of every graduate from an associate degree program.

A general description of the five nursing areas follows:

- A. Health - basic concepts in health, interrelatedness of the psycho-social and cultural factors which affect health, health continuum, and the health care delivery system.
- B. Commonalities in Nursing Care - basic concepts in nursing, common recurring nursing problems, and nursing care common to all people.
- C. Differences in Nursing Care - common and specific manifestations of major health problems--acute and chronic, and differences in nursing care resulting from specific health problems and the individual's response--birth through senescence.
- D. Occupational Strategy - role and function of the technical nurse, legal aspects, health and nursing team, and nursing organizations.
- E. Performance - give nursing care in a variety of patient care situations.

IV. Satisfying Nursing Requirements:

Candidates may satisfy area requirements in the nursing component by means of: recognized examinations and/or regular college courses from regionally accredited colleges or universities. The Performance area may only be satisfied by taking the Regents External Degree Performance Examination.

Below is an outline of how recognized examinations and college courses may be used in meeting degree requirements in the nursing component.

A. Examinations

The five area requirements of the nursing component may be satisfied by taking the following Regents External Degree Examinations:

1. Health
2. Commonalities in Nursing Care - Part I & II
3. Differences in Nursing Care - Part I, II, & III
4. Occupational Strategy
5. Performance

With the exception of the Performance examination there is no required sequence in which a candidate must take the Regents External Degree Examinations. To be eligible for the Performance examination, candidates must successfully complete the four academic areas either by examination or regular college courses.

Examination Waiver

Candidates who have successfully completed the Fundamentals of Nursing examination offered by the New York State College Proficiency Examination Program may request a waiver for Part I of the Commonalities in Nursing Regents External Degree Examination. This waiver is subject to the following restrictions:

1. CPE in Fundamentals of Nursing must have been successfully completed prior to June 1, 1973.
2. Candidate must have enrolled in the nursing external degree program prior to June 1, 1975.
3. A grade of "C" or above was earned on the examination.

B. Regular College Courses

College transcript credit from regionally accredited institutions of higher learning may be used to waive area requirements in the nursing component of the degree program. No waiver on the basis of college transcript credit will be granted for the Performance area.

The area requirement in the nursing component will be waived only if:

1. The completed course(s) cover all the topics included in the examination developed in that area;
2. A grade of "C" or above was earned for each course;
3. Courses were completed within the last ten years from the date of enrollment in the Regents Associate in Applied Science in Nursing program.

Persons requesting credit for regular college courses must be enrolled in the Regents program and submit official transcripts from the institution(s) of higher learning at which the credit was earned. All official transcripts submitted from regionally accredited colleges or universities are to be evaluated by the Committee on Regents External Degrees in Nursing.

No request to meet nursing component degree requirements for special assessment will be granted to candidates. Candidates who have gained college-level knowledge in non-traditional ways such as on-the-job experience in patient care situations may demonstrate their competency by means of the Regents External Degree Examinations.
