ABSTRACT

This document presents a report of associate, bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees conferred by colleges and universities in Virginia between July 1, 1971 and June 30, 1972. In summary, the number of bachelor's and advanced degrees conferred by all Virginia accredited institutions of higher education totalled 20,576. Of this total, the state-controlled institutions conferred 76.5% (15,740) and the privately controlled institutions conferred 23.5% (4,836). Of the 20,576 bachelor's degrees and advanced degrees conferred by all Virginia accredited institutions, bachelor's degrees accounted for 15,767, first professional degrees 890, master's degrees 3,588 and doctor's degrees 331. HIGHLIGHTS OF DEGREES CONFERRED 1971-72

ALL INSTITUTIONS

The number of bachelor's and advanced degrees conferred by all Virginia accredited institutions of higher education totaled 20,576. Of this total, the state-controlled institutions conferred 76.5 per cent (15,740) and the privately controlled institutions conferred 23.5 per cent (4,836).

Of the 20,576 bachelor's and advanced degrees conferred by all Virginia accredited institutions of higher education, bachelor's degrees accounted for 15,767, first professional degrees 890, master's degrees 3,588 and doctor's degrees 331.

STATE-CONTROLLED INSTITUTIONS

The number of bachelor's and advanced degrees conferred by Virginia state-controlled institutions of higher education increased from 14,428 to 15,740, a gain of 9.1 per cent compared with a 12.2 per cent increase from 1969-70-to 1970-71.

First professional and master's degrees showed the largest percentage increases, 12.5 and 12.9 per cent respectively, while bachelor's degrees increased 8.6 per cent from 1970-71 to 1971-72. Doctor's degrees decreased 10.6 per cent from 1970-71.

Men received 54.9 per cent of all bachelor's and advanced degrees. The per cent of men receiving degrees by level ranged from 50.8 per cent at the bachelor's level to 94.3 per cent at the first professional level.

Women earned more than half of all degrees conferred in area studies, education, fine and applied arts, foreign languages, home economics, letters, library science, mathematics, nursing, other health professions, and public affairs and services.

Five fields of study accounted for almost two-thirds (66.1 per cent) of all bachelor's and advanced degrees conferred in 1971-72. In descending order, they were education (26.8 per cent), social sciences (14.2 per cent), business and management (11.2 per cent), engineering (7.0 per cent), and letters (6.9 per cent).

Six institutions (University of Virginia, Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, Virginia Commonwealth University, Old Dominion, William and Mary, and Radford) awarded over three-fourths (75.7 per cent) of all degrees conferred by the state-controlled colleges and universities.

Six fields of study (social sciences, English physical education, mathematics, natural subusiness education) accounted for ove (66.8 per cent) of all Collegiate Professional (High School Endorsement) earned in state-stitutions in 1971-72.

The Community Collège System awarded 2, degrees. This was an increase of 40.1 p 1970–71. The associate in applied scient for 1,354 degrees and the associate in arts numbered 937.

PRIVATELY CONTROLLED INSTITUTIONS

Of the 4,836 bachelor's and advanced degrees conferred by Virginia privately controlled institutions of higher education, bachelor's degrees accounted for 86.6 per cent (4,188), first professional degrees 4.2 per cent (206), master's degrees 9.1 per cent (439), and doctor's degrees 0.1 per cent (3).

Four fields of study accounted for almost two per cent) of all bachelor's and advanced ferred in 1971–72. In descending order, the sciences (25.4 per cent), education (17. business and management (12.2 per cent), (10.7 per cent).

INTRODUCTION

Background

American colleges and universities confer associate, bachelor's, master's, and doctor's degrees to recognize the successful completion of a prescribed course of study. Virginia's accredited institutions of higher education follow this pattern by providing programs in a wide variety of academic and professional fields leading to each of these degrees. The State Council of Higher Education presents its eighth annual report of degrees conferred by these colleges and universities as one index of their responsiveness to the needs of the State and of the nation.

Data on degrees conferred in 1971-72 were obtained from information submitted to the Council by the Virginia institutions of higher education as part of the U. S. Office of Education's "Higher Education General Information Survey, 1972-73." (Form OE-2300-2.1, "Degrees and Other Formal Awards Conferred Between July 1, 1971 and June 30, 1972").

Information about the number and distribution of high school teaching certificates was obtained from the State Council's inventory of "Degrees Qualifying for the Secondary Collegiate Professional Teaching Certificate Conferred Between July 1, 1971 and June 30, 1972" (Form C-2 7/72).

Explanation of Data

Degrees conferred are reported by five-levels (associate, bachelor's, first professional, master's, and doctor's), major fields of study, and the sex of the degree recipients. Definitions of degree levels as used in this report are presented on page 2.

Collegiate Professional Certificates (High School Endorsement) are summarized according to the high school subject fields specified in the State Board of Education's 1968 "Certification Regulations for Teachers."

Section 1, State-Controlled Colleges and Universities, Tables 1 through 5 summarize all degrees conferred by Virginia state-controlled institutions of higher education by institution, level, sex, and major field of study. Tables 6 and 7 summarize the Collegiate Professional Certificates (High School Endorsement) earned in Virginia state-controlled institutions. Appendixes A and B present a detailed breakdown of the degrees conferred in 1971-72 for each major field of study by level, institution, and sex. Appendix C reports the number of Collegiate Professional Certificates (High School Endorsement) earned in individual state-controlled institutions by degree level, sex, and teaching field in 1971-72.

Section II, Privately Controlled Colleges and Universities, Tables 1 and 2 summarize all degrees conferred by Virginia privately controlled institutions of higher education by institution, level, and major field of study.

A degrée awarded upon completion of at least two but less than four years of work beyond high school. In Virginia the degrées of Associate in Arts and Associate in Science are based on work that is wholly or chiefly créditable towards à bachelor's degrée. The degree of Associate in Applied Science is based on work in one of the occupational-technical fields and is designed to prepare for immediate employment.

Bachelor's Degree

A degree granted upon completion of an educational program requiring at least four but not more than five years of academic work in the liberal arts, sciences, and professional fields.

Collegiate Professional Certificate**

A five-year renewable certificate which is granted an applicant who has earned a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university and has completed the general requirements (including general education), professional education, and specific endorsement requirements (elementary, high school, or special education) as established by the State Board of Education.

Doctor's Degree

The highest academic degree in a given discipline or profession, based generally on (a) three or more years of graduate work, (b) satisfaction of a foreign language requirement, and (c) completion of a special study issuing in a dissertation approved by a committee of the

Master's Degree

A degree customarily granted upon successful completion of one (sometimes two) academic years of work in the liberal arts and sciences beyond the bachelor's degree. The master's degree in professional fields is an advanced degree beyond the first professional but below the Ph.D. degree, such as Master of Laws (LL.M.). (Master's degrees in hospital administration and social work are included in the master's degree category in this report.)
