ABSTRACT

Student enrollment in institutions of higher education in the Boston Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area (SMSA) for the fall cf 1972 are reported. Emphasis is placed on total enrollment, control of institution, level of students, first time students, and residence of undergraduates. Tables include statistical data concerning student enrollment and components of the SMSA. (MJM)





HIGHLIGHTS

- * Degree granting institutions of higher education in the Boston Standard Metro-politan Statistical Area (SMSA) enrolled 184,106 students in Fall 1972, a 3.37% increase over the 178,107 enrolled in Fall 1971. Enrollment in the public institutions in the Boston SMSA increased 14.27% while that in the private increased 0.69%.
- * Institutions in the Boston SMSA accounted for 57.4% of all students enrolled in the Commonwealth (320,952), and for 30.8% of all students enrolled in New England (597,208).
- Private institutions in the Boston SMSA accounted for 77.1% (143,897) of the total enrollment (186,564) in the Massachusetts private sector, and for 48.7% of the total (295,201) for the region. For the public sector these percentages were 29.9% and 13.3% respectively.
- * More than three out of four (78.2%) students in the Boston SMSA are enrolled in private institutions. For the city of Boston only, this figure is 83.6%. Outside the Boston SMSA, 68.8% of the students are enrolled in the Commonwealth's public institutions.

- * A total of 30,029 of the deg students enrolled within the Bost entering an institution of higher for the first-time in Fall 1972, private institutions and 6,522 at institutions.

INTRODUCTION

The New England Board of Higher Education annually compiles information on college and university enrollments in the region based upon data supplied to the U.S. Office of Education as part of the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS). That information is published by NEBHE in the annual report series, Student Enrollment in New England Institutions of Kigher Education.

Because of the number of requests for information concerning enrollment in the Boston-area, NEBHE is, with the present report, instituting another annual report series, Student Enrollment in Institutions of Higher Education in the Boston Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area (SNSA).

Included herein are enrollment data for all institutions located in those cities and towns comprising the Boston SMSA as defined by the U. S. Bureau of the Census (see Table 2). These data were taken directly from Student Enrollment in New England Institutions of Higher Education, Fall 1972; that report should be consulted regarding the USOE definitions employed here.

ENROLLMENT IN THE BOSTON SMSA

There were a total of 63 degree-granting institutions located in the Boston SMSA in Fall 1972, 29 in Boston and 34 in the surrounding cities and towns comprising the SMSA. Of those located in the city of Boston, 3 were public four-year colleges and universities, 11 were private two-year colleges and 15 were private four-year colleges and universities. Of those outside the central city, 5 were public two-year, 2 public four-year, 6 private two-year and 21 private four-year.

Opening fall enrollment data for 1972 were available for all but two of these institutions -- Pope John XXIII National Seminary and Weston College School of Theology, both private four-year colleges. (Table 1)

TOTAL ENROLLMENT

The 61 institutions in the Boston SMSA providing Fall 1972 data enrolled a total of 184,106 students, a 3.37% increase over the 178,107 enrolled in Fall 1971. Institutions in the Boston SMSA enrolled 57.4% of all students enrolled in the Commonwealth (320,952) in Fall 1972, and showed a slightly greater rate of growth (3.37%) than those outside the Boston SMSA (2.84%).

Public institutions in the Boston SMSA accounted for 29.9% (40,209) of the total enrollment (134,388) in the Massachusetts public sector in Fall 1972. Their enrollment increased by 14.27% between 1971 and 1972 compared to 4.20% for those outside the area and 7.02% for all public institutions in the state.

Institutions in the Boston SMSA under private control accounted for 77.1% (143,897) of the total enrollment (186,564) in the Massachusetts private sector in Fall 1972. They showed a 0.69% increase over 1971 compared to a slight decrease of 0.04% for those outside the area and to an increase of 0.52% statewide for private institutions.



LEVEL OF STUDENTS

Of the 184,106 students enrolled in the Boston SMSA in Fall 1972, 118,039 were undergraduates, 9,789 were first-professional students, 28,307 were graduate students, 12,148 were extension students, 8,105 were non-degree students and the remaining 7,718 were unclassified degree-credit students. he 184,106 students enrolled in SMSA in Fall 1972, 118,039 graduates, 9,789 were firstal students, 28,307 were graduate 12,148 were extension students, non-degree students and the 7 were unclassified degreed Thus 95.2% of the first-

professional students in Massachusetts were enrolled in the Boston SMSA as were 68.0% of the graduate students in the state.

Again, however, there are marked differences if the control of the institution is considered. with for example, 29.7% of the undergraduates attending public institutions enrolled within the Boston SMSA compared to 75.0% for the private

sector's undergraduate enrollment. At the graduate level, the figures are 6.3% and 87.6% respectively.

FIRST-TIME STUDENTS

A total of 30,029 first-time degree-credit students were reported by institutions located within the Boston SMSA; this was slightly over one half (52.7%) of the first-time degree-credit enrollment reported in the state.

Private institutions accounted for 23,507 of the Boston SMSA's first-time degree-credit enrollment with the remaining 6,522 matriculating at public institutions. These 23,507 students represented 72.2% of the total first-time degree-credit enrollment in the Commonwealth's private institutions. For the public sector, the 6,522 represented 26.7% of the total in the state.

Table I also illustrates the "home state" or residence (as available) for undergraduates enrolled in the Boston SMSA. For the state, 95.7% and 49.7% of the undergraduates attending public and private institutions respectively are Massachusetts residents. For the Boston SMSA, these figures are 98.4% and 51.3% respectively. And if Boston City alone is considered, they are 97.4% and 63.3% respectively.
