ABSTRACT

This second annual study of the application and enrollment patterns of university transfer students provided information concerning the intercampus mobility of students attending institutions under the program of the State University of New York. Data were provided by the enrollment survey conducted in 1971. This study sought to analyze the higher education backgrounds of transfer students through an input model. The data yielded information concerning a) admission level of transfer students; b) type of educational background; c) applications, acceptances, and enrollment; d) acceptances versus enrollment; and e) provision of transfer places in State University senior institutions. (Seventy-nine tables of data from the participating universities, eight basic summary tables and 21 related summaries, and a publication list from the Central Staff Office of Institutional Research are included.) PREFACE

This is the second annual study of the application and enrollment patterns of University transfer students to be published by the Central Staff Office of Institutional Research. It was conducted in response to the many requests for basic information about the inter-campus mobility of students attending institutions under the program of the State University of New York. Data were gathered as part of the official Fall 1971 enrollment survey conducted by this office. Similar data are available in selected summaries for previous years, but this and its Fall 1970 predecessor are the only published University-wide reports on this topic. Appreciation is due to the many people sharing in the data gathering, analysis and publication effort.

Transfer students defined

Because of the conventional usage of the term "transfer students" and because different sources of transfer data may exist, the definition of transfer students used for this study is of special importance. Transfer students are "those undergraduate students who were enrolled at a State University institution in the Fall 1971 term; but who have attended other colleges or universities prior to Fall 1971". Even if a student was originally enrolled at a given campus, attending elsewhere and then returning, he would be considered a transfer student. With this definition, we have transfer students moving from two-year to other two-year colleges, from senior to other senior institutions, from senior institutions to two-year colleges, as well as in the more conventional meaning of transfer student: from two-year to senior institutions. Even if no credits were transferable, albeit an uncommon case, the student moving from one institution to another would be a transfer student. However, students coming from business schools would be considered first-time students rather than transfer students. Students who simply change majors at the same institution are not considered transfer students in this study. Note that graduate students transferring from other graduate programs also are not included here. Therefore, the New York State Veterinary College and the State College of Optometry which only offer graduate programs are not included in this report. LaGuardia Community College reported no transfer students in its first year of operation and Empire State College did not have the information on transfer students so they are also excluded from this report.

The number of transfer students reported here are an understatement because of the difficulty some institutions have in obtaining background information on those students who are not admitted to specific degree programs by application. For example, 435 students were known to be transfer students but no information was provided about their prior higher education history. There are undoubtedly many others who are not even known to be transfer students, but these are not likely to be seeking upper division status.

Design of the study

Transfer student studies can be designed to follow identified students longitudinally, observing their successes and difficulties. The investment of effort and time required for such studies is substantial, particularly when 72 institutions are involved. For these reasons, a different approach was used in this study.

The paradigm used here was the analysis of the higher education backgrounds of transfer students enrolled in the various levels of the institutions under the program of the State University of New York except certain community colleges (see the footnote to Table 89, page 95). Some types of conclusions cannot flow from such a study; e.g., students who were unsuccessful in obtaining transfer acceptances anywhere in these institutions are not included even though they were formerly enrolled at one of the institutions included and may have graduated in a University-parallel program. Therefore, this study is based on an input model, not a true followup model.

Differences between this study and data from the Admissions Processing Center

It is unlikely that data from the Central Staff Admissions Processing Center (A.P.C.) would correspond with the data of this study. The major reason for the differences is that in this study, while there is only partial data for seven of the eight community colleges under the sponsorship of the New York City Board of Higher Education, and Empire State College is excluded, the A.P.C. data totally excludes the Statutory Colleges, the newer University Colleges, the Downstate Medical Center, and six other community colleges. Second, this study asked that incomplete applications not be reported and that only those applications upon which a decision was reached be included. Subtracting acceptances from applications then yields negative decisions. Third, included here are students who are not applying for admission to a program. These students are not known to the A.P.C. Fourth, this report shows enrolled transfer students, not only those who paid the final deposit to confirm their acceptance.

Regional statistics

The articulation of transfer students is an important consideration in regional planning and cooperation among the colleges of the State University. This year's report includes an index of the State University institutions in each coordinating area (page xiii). In addition, Tables 5 - 8 provide data on educational background and class placement of transfer students by coordinating area, Table 90 has undergraduate admissions information by coordinating area and Table 93 gives the upper division - lower division enrollments at the S.U.N.Y. colleges by coordinating area for the four years from Fall 1968 through Fall 1971.

SUMMARY

General findings (Table 2)

A total of 20,711 transfer students were enrolled in the Fall of 1971 at State University institutions: 11,678 (56 percent) in senior institutions and 9,033 (44 percent) in two-year colleges. The most common type of transfer student was the two-year to senior institution transfer (6,860), followed by transfers to State University two-year colleges from outside the State University (4,270). The next most numerous type was from non-State University institutions to our senior institutions (3,736). Other types of mobility are as follows: State University two-year to two-year colleges (2,491), State University senior to senior institution (1,077), and State University senior to two-year college (1,842). An additional 435 transfers had an unknown previous higher education history.

Class levels entered (Tables 3 - 8)

One measure of transfer student quality is the proportion of students being accepted with full junior standing, thus making it likely that they can complete a bachelors degree in the usual length of time if they choose to do so. Students transferring from State University institutions seem to have considerably more acceptability than non-State University transfers. For example, 65 percent of the State University senior institution transfer students (Table 4) entered as full juniors or seniors as compared with only 44 percent of those from outside the State University. Substantial differences were observed in the percentages by institution type of State University transfers awarded junior or senior standing as follows: from Community Colleges, 69 percent; from Agricultural and Technical Colleges, 60 percent; and from senior institutions, 47 percent. Only 5 percent of all State University transfers (Table 3) were enrolled without acceptance into a formal program as compared to 14 percent of the non-State University transfers.

A few transfer students were accepted with senior standing (292), 84 of whom were formerly enrolled at State University two-year colleges. Of the 292, 149 of these senior transfer students were from outside the State University.

The transfers from outside the State University were distributed rather differently across the class levels than the State University transfers. For example, the following pairs of percentages by class for total transfers

placed in each class (Table 3) compare the State University transfers with outside transfers: freshmen, 44 vs. 52 percent; sophomores 64 vs. 36 percent; juniors, 77 vs. 23 percent; seniors, 49 vs. 51 percent; and students not admitted to a program, 31 vs. 49 percent.

Tables 5, 6, 7, and 8 provide similar data on transfer's class placement and educational background by coordinating area. Any comparisons across areas must take into consideration the kinds of S.U.N.Y. colleges in each coordinating area and the numbers and kinds of private institutions of higher education in a particular area.

Transfers with unknown histories

Virtually all of the transfers whose higher educational history was not reported can be explained. Of the total of 435 of such transfers, 434 were not admitted to a program, and complete information may not have been available.

Type of educational background (Tables 3 - 88 and Table 94)

All but eight of the reporting institutions were able to provide information regarding the type of educational preparation of transfers from State University two-year colleges. While University-wide analyses on the transfers' background are not possible without complete data on the type of preparation of transfers from two-year colleges, Table 94 does show the relationship between the number and kinds of associate degrees granted in 1970-71 and the number of transfer students entering State University senior institutions. The detailed tables for most institutions and some summary tables show whether the student from a State University two-year college received an A.A. or A.S. degree, an A.A.S. degree, or no degree.

For illustration, the University Colleges alone enrolled 4,269 transfers from State University community colleges, 2,432 with A.A. or A.S. degrees, 662 with A.A.S. degrees and 1,175 without a degree (Table 14). Of the A.A. and A.S. degree transfers from community colleges, 88 percent were given junior or senior standing; of the A.A.S. degree transfers, 57 percent were entered as juniors or seniors; and of those transfers without degrees, 35 percent became juniors or seniors. Similar data are provided on each of these tables for agricultural and technical colleges, State University senior institutions, and other institutions.

Applications, Acceptances and Enrollment (Tables 89 and 90)

High interest seems to exist in the likelihood of a transfer applicant being accepted at different institutions of the State University. An applicant may present his application to several institutions, and their missions or relative capacity to take in new students may cause differential results with the same applicant. In this study an attempt was made to examine the acceptance and the enrollment of accepted transfer students. We have added Table 90 to this year's report to provide some admissions data by coordinating areas.

An "application" has a special meaning in this study, as described above on page viii. If the acceptance rates described below were based on the number of applications including those which did not receive a decision for reasons of incompleteness, etc., then the acceptance rates reported below would be overstated. Of the 58,277 transfer applications (not applicants), there were 27,205 acceptances (47 percent). This acceptance rate is quite similar to the first-time student application acceptance rate of 53 percent. Among senior institutions, the transfer acceptance rates are as follows: University Centers, 48 percent; University Colleges, 36 percent; Health Sciences Centers, 47 percent; Specialized Colleges, 56 percent; and Statutory Colleges, 41 percent. The two-year colleges have a higher acceptance rate of 69 percent, 60 percent at the Agricultural and Technical Colleges compared with 71 percent at the Community Colleges. Although no senior institutions accepted all transfer applications, eleven two-year colleges did.

Transfer students must compete for places against first-time students. Both types of students are new to an institution in a given term. The proportion of new student applications accepted for transfer students varies from campus to campus, as seen in these summary percentages: for all institutions, transfer admissions are 21 percent of all new admissions; all senior institutions, 39 percent; University Centers, 39 percent; University Colleges, 39 percent; Health Sciences Centers, 78 percent; Specialized Colleges, 29 percent; and Statutory Colleges, 28 percent. The two-year colleges as a group accept 12 percent of their new admissions as transfers; Agricultural and Technical Colleges, 6 percent; and Community Colleges, 14 percent.

From acceptances to enrollment

It has long been a rule-of-thumb that for every 100 students accepted, only about 50 will actually enroll. This "no-show" condition has been partially explained as due to multiple acceptances where all but one accepting institution will have no enrolled student for their effort. In addition, some students do change their plans, perhaps of necessity, and do not enroll for the expected term. Whatever the reasons, an institution would indeed be pressed if all its accepted applicants actually enrolled.

As in other studies comparing the "no-show" rates for transfers and first-time students, somewhat fewer transfer students than first-time students fail to enroll when accepted, except at the Health Sciences Centers, Statutory Colleges and the Agricultural and Technical Colleges. These comparisons for State University institutions are as follows: all institutions, transfer "no-show" are 34 percent vs. 44 percent "no-shows" for first-time applicants; senior institutions, 40 vs. 56 percent; University Centers, 47 vs. 64 percent; University Colleges, 36 vs. 54 percent; Health Sciences Centers, 45 vs. 30 percent; Specialized Colleges, 24 vs. 37 percent; Statutory Colleges, 20 vs. 19 percent; two-year colleges, 22 vs. 38 percent; Agricultural and Technical Colleges, 50 vs. 41 percent; and Community Colleges, 17 vs. 37 percent.

It is to be noted that if all transfer or first-time enrollment were to be included in the derivation of the above "no-show" rates, at many institutions more students would be enrolled than were accepted. The main reason for this peculiar finding is that many students do not proceed through the admissions process because they are not enrolling as a degree-seeker. They and other part-time students have been excluded from the enrollment used in these "no-show" calculations.

Providing transfer places in
State University senior institutions (Tables 92 and 93)

The 1968 Master Plan of the State University of New York enunciated a policy of an overall mix of lower division and upper division students to ensure that there would be sufficient capacity at its senior institutions for the transfers from public two-year colleges in New York State. That policy, as again stated in the 1970 Progress Report on the 1968 Master Plan, was to have senior institutions reach, as a group, a mix of 40 percent full-time lower division and 60 percent full-time upper division undergraduate enrollment. Table 92 (page 113) contains the results of working toward that policy from 1968 to 1971. For the Fall of 1971, the upper division full-time enrollment was 49,037, equivalent to 52.7 percent of all full-time undergraduate enrollment. Table 93 shows the same data for each of the four coordinating areas with full-time upper division enrollment for Fall 1971 ranging from 49.6 percent in area number one to 61 percent in area number four.

CONCLUDING REMARKS

A study of this complexity will undoubtedly raise further questions and lead to more insight about the extent and nature of inter-institutional mobility to and within the State University of New York. It is hoped that the basic information will be useful and that on the basis of these and other data, more students can find ways to further their search for appropriate and rewarding educational experiences.
