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ABSTRACT

This bibliography emphasizes evaluating materials, rather than cataloguing information. It is intended to aid the secondary reading specialist by sorting available materials according to instructional value and indexing them by skill emphasis so that high school teachers may easily refer to appropriate remediation material. This bibliography is limited to four basic skills: decoding, comprehension, vocabulary, and recreational reading. The materials included were evaluated according to the following standards: (1) Does the material perform the function it purports to perform? (2) Is the material or any part of it appropriate for remedial work? (3) Is the material instructional or does it primarily provide practice in a skill or skills? Some of the more useful materials have been starred. This mark signifies that the authors would recommend these particular materials as especially valuable parts of a total reading program. (WR)

INTRODUCTION

This annotated bibliography of materials is primarily intended to aid the secondary reading specialist by (1) evaluation and sorting the mass of materials available according to instructional value, and (2) indexing this material by skill emphasis for efficient referral to appropriate remediation material after diagnosing the skill or skills that are deficient.

Content

Every attempt has been made to include all known secondary materials for reading remediation. However, because of limited time, the speed with which new materials are being published, and the volumes of redundant (often worthless) material that had to be sorted, we found the task formidable. This bibliography is not a finished product, but only the beginning, and it is strongly urged that each and every reading professional continue the task of sorting and evaluating materials. This bibliography is limited to four basic skills--decoding, comprehension, vocabulary, and leisure reading. (Rate was not included because it was the studied opinion of this committee that instruction in rate is more a function of method than of materials.) It is recommended that others consider developing bibliographies in the

following areas: spelling, writing, reading in the content areas, audio-visual materials, and methods (for example, see Appendix).

Evaluation

The materials included in this bibliography were evaluated according to these standards:

- (1) Does the material perform the function it purports to perform?
- (2) Is the material or any part of it appropriate for remedial work?
- (3) Is the material instructional or does it primarily provide practice in a skill or skills?

Because so many teachers have requested it, we starred (*) some of the more useful materials. Such a mark only signifies that we would recommend these particular materials as especially valuable parts of a total reading program. No one set of materials is a panacea and all the best materials cannot replace direct instruction. When a set of materials is starred we urge you to read the annotation provided so that you may be as aware of the materials' shortcomings as you are of its merits.

The emphasis of this bibliography is on evaluation of materials, rather than on catalog information. When possible we included as much information about the materials as we had available

to us. However, for more detailed information, we refer the reader to the publisher's current catalogs. The addresses of all publishers cited in this manual are listed in the Publishers' Guide at the end.

1. ACTION Decoding and Comprehension

Scholastic Book Services. Cebulash, Mel (Editor). 1970. Kit and Paperback texts.

Level: 2 - 4. Interest: Senior high school
Price: Kit \$87.75; Paperbacks \$1.35.

A ninety lesson reading program including unit books, paperbacks of short stories and plays, posters and recorded readings. Readability based on on Spache Formula. All of the vocabulary in on the Dale-Chall Easy-Work list (900 words). Well developed and provides good practice. Very good at junior or senior high school level.

2. ACTION: A READING Decoding and Comprehension BREAKTHROUGH PROGRAM

Houghton-Mifflin Publishers, Inc. Stanfield, Jo M. and others. 1970-72. Clothbound, or paper bound.

Level: 4 - 8. Interest: 7-12. Price: Text \$1.80, Teacher's edition \$2.40, Workbook \$1.20, Teacher's edition \$1.80.

Variety of literary types arranged thematically. The texts contain no study exercises so could be used for leisure reading. The word-analysis skill presentation is a bit confusing. The instructions and exercises for building comprehension skills appear to be good when used in a teacher-directed reading program. The main criticism of the readers is that the reading level is higher than indicated in the publisher's catalogue, and sometimes the stories are long. The print is light and the lines close together.

3. ACTIVITIES FOR READING Total Program IMPROVEMENT

Stack-Vaugh and Company. Just for Fun Series. Schachter and Whelan. 1963. Paperbound.

Interest level: Junior high. Price: \$1.28

Workbook includes comprehension, skimming, word-building, vocabulary and reading for enjoyment. Three worktexts have proven helpful in

preparing for senior high.

4. ADAPTED CLASSICS Comprehension

Globe Book Company, Inc. Varied authors. 1968. Clothbound.

Reading level: 4 - 8. Interest: Junior and senior high. Price: \$3.60 each. \$120.00 for set of 47.

This series includes such titles as Ben Hur, Jane Eyre, Moby Dick and Robinson Crusoe. The story content and interest have been maintained as long descriptive passages have been abridged, difficult vocabulary simplified, and long sentences broken down. Teaching aids and test materials are included in the books. Reading levels are indicated for each book. These could be used mainly for leisure reading.

5. ADVENTURE IN LITERATURE Comprehension

Harcourt, Brace and World, Inc. New Companion Series. Christ, Henry J., (Editor). 1969. Hardbound.

Level: 7 - 12. Price: \$3.05.

First two books include short stories, non-fiction, poetry and plays. Next four present adventure, sports, mystery, true narratives, scientific stories. Reading and writing skills developed through reading and composition supplements. Be careful in ordering this, as there are several series with this title. Adventures in Literature, New Companion Series is the one recommended.

6. AMERICAN FOLKLORE AND LEGENDS Comprehension

Globe Book Company. Marcetante and Potter. Revised, 1968. Hardbound.

Level: 4. Interest: Junior and senior high. Price: \$3.60.

Anthology of short stories including such favorites as Paul Bunyan, John Henry and Casey Jones which have a lowered reading level with no loss of activities. Free teacher's guide.

7. AMERICAN INCENTIVE TO READ Decoding

American Incentive to Read, Los Angeles, Ca.

Level: 1 - 3. Interest: Junior and senior high school and adult. Price: \$89.50.

Contents include:
Teaching text which includes lesson and instruction.

Record Album - 24 phonograph records covering sounds and supplemented with drill work.
Student supplement - five measurement of progress tests are criterion-referenced to specific skills taught.

Student tests - basic reading and spelling. Books 1 & 2.

Space test - structural phonics.

Matrices for Space test and progress measurement tests.

Carrying case.

This is an audio-visual program which provides controlled instruction in phonics. There is a slow pace, constant drill and "hearing the sounds" aspect especially recommended for remedial instruction in sound-symbol relationships.

8. AMERICANS MEET THE CHALLENGE Comprehension

Globe Book Company, Inc. Potter, Robert B. 1968. Hardback.

Level: 4. Interest: Senior high school. Price: \$3.84.

Stories about nine Americans who overcome obstacles in their lives (John Glen, Martin Luther King, Helen Keller, etc.). Series of seven books, four are anthologies. Reading aids and questions are included. Teacher's guide is free.

9. *BASIC READING SKILLS Total Program

Scott, Foresman & Company. Monroe, Artley & Robinson. 1970.

Level: 6 through adult. Price: Junior high school, \$1.40. Senior high school, \$1.44.

Areas of study are conveniently arranged with notation ("main idea," for example) at the bottom of the page. Answers are given in the guide; students use a separate key. This workbook, like all workbooks, can be used in several ways, sections can be used for specific student needs--he shouldn't have to cover all blending exercises for example. The workbooks cover a wide range of skills thoroughly, however they are not designed to help extreme reading difficulties. They are helpful for those reading at least at a 6th grade level, and can be used well with adults.

The Junior high school workbook includes the following: The task analysis subskills for Decoding (auditory discrimination and sounds in isolation); Vocabulary work (root words, prefixes, suffixes, synonyms & antonyms, and figurative language); Paraphrasing (phrase, sentence, paragraph meaning); Main Ideas (inferences); Critical Reading (author's purpose, competence). The general sequence followed is that of Word Study, Comprehension and Study Skills.

The Senior high school workbooks are a good refresher course for students who are reading up to grade level and they provide a steady growth in reading skills. The sequence followed is:

Essentially capsule lessons, they are written to provide reading and practice experience for identified skills.

10. *BASIC SKILLS SYSTEM Comprehension

McGraw Hill, Collection, 1969.

Level: Junior and senior high school. Price: \$250.00

The publisher says this is a "flexible, integrated group of texts designed to provide training in the basic academic areas."

There are 24 texts which may be purchased separately, 6 tapes, 2 sets of boxed cards with answer pads, 6 test specimen sets and Instructor's Manual and 2 wall charts.

This kit covers six basic areas: reading, study skills, spelling vocabulary, writing, and math.

Although primarily geared for advanced students the sequencing of basic comprehension and rate skills make a useful guide for instruction for remediation and a source for ideas as to how to teach more difficult comprehension concepts.

11. BASIC WORD-STUDY SKILLS FOR MIDDLE GRADES Decoding

Ginn and Company. Series of individual cards. Part 1 - \$.72: Part 2 - \$.72: Binder with sliding mask - \$2.00. Paperbound

Level: 4 - 12

This self-instructional program, while developed for middle grades, is not necessarily appropriate for that age level alone. The workbook presents skills which are reinforced with additional instructions in phonetic and structural analysis of words. An attempt is made to improve vocabularies. Students can proceed independently. There is immediate confirmation of correct responses in this programmed material. The binders are not essential, students may construct a marker for use in checking responses.

Part 1 - The letters and Sounds in Words; Part 2 - Words and Their Parts.

12. **BE A BETTER READER, FOUNDATIONS A, B, C** Total Program

Prentice Hall. Smith, Wila Benton. 1963, 1971 revised.

Levels: 4 - 5

Price: \$25 for kit which includes textbook, workbooks and teachers manual.

Three books, Foundations A, B, C, at reading level 4 - 6, developed for remedial secondary students. Classroom set includes indexed answer cards for student self-checks. Books also sold individually at earlier date. Books of succeeding difficulty.

Each reviews decoding skills briefly, assumes student can read at level 4 - 6. Additional instruction and practice necessary for student below that level . . . in decoding skills.

Provides detailed instruction and practice in comprehension, both at literal and inference level.

Skills taught not sequenced, but those taught are indexed. Teaches reading for different purposes, as type of reading for social studies, math, science and english.

(Books I-VI are similar, but higher reading level--7 - 12-- and concepts more difficult.)

13. **BETTER READING BOOKS** Total Program

Science Research Associates, Inc. Simpson, Elizabeth A. 1962.

Level: Book I: 5 - 6; Book II: 7 - 8; Book III: 9 - 10.

These three books, covering grades 5 - 7, 7 - 9, and 9 - 11, respectively, present excellent reading selections--20 per book. Each selection is followed by 20 multiple-

choice vocabulary and comprehension questions. This is a very successful comprehension exercise book and has been used with all types of populations. By providing answer keys, individual progress folders, and structured response sheets, the books become self-directing for individualized instruction. One method used is to have a student read a selection each day. On the first day, he answers only the odd-numbered questions of the first selection to test immediate recall. On the second day he answers first even-numbered questions of selection 1 (delayed recall), and then reads the second selection, answering the odd-numbered questions from the previous day's reading, reads a new selection, and then answers questions on the new selection. Each selection requires about 40-50 minutes; the stories are generally adventure types and quite interesting; high interest and could be used with adults. These materials can be used with a controlled reader with good results.

19. **BREAKING THE READING BARRIER** Comprehension

Prentice Hall. Gilbert, Doris W.

Level: Secondary Price: \$4.95

This text-workbook offers a proven method for teaching reading skills above the level of simple phrases. The author considers separately each of the basic units of writing--words, sentences, paragraphs, and passages; defines and examines specific reasons for reading difficulty; offers an abundance of corrective exercises designed to develop speed in both reading and comprehension; requires the reader to visualize, discriminate, criticize, and organize, draw inferences and conclusions, and to read between the lines. Each selection in the book has been judiciously chosen to appeal to even the most reluctant reader. In every case, excellence of literary quality is maintained, in addition to interest and entertainment values.

20. **BREAKTHROUGH** Comprehension

Allyn and Bacon, Inc. Sheldon, W. D. and others. 1969-71. Paperback.

Level: 2 - 6. Interest: Junior high school. Price: \$1.32 to \$2.28.

Collections of short pieces, each containing a synopsis, introduction of concepts, vocabulary and over-all comprehension. Reading skill activities in the form of duplicator masters and brief exercises to give practice on reading skills. Titles: Winner's Circle, Time is Now, Beyond the Block, This Cool World, The Big Ones.

21. **BUILDING Comprehension Vocabulary
READING POWER**

Charles E. Merrill Books, Inc., 1964.

Level: 4 - 6 Interest: Junior-senior high school. Price: 15 booklets at \$35.00 per kit.

This series is a programmed course in comprehension techniques; the format is similar to Sullivan Programmed Readers.

Periodic tests are provided for evaluation. The logical progression of steps through comprehension exercises lends itself to self-instruction, but it is recommended that this series serve as a supplement to direct teacher instruction.

22. **CONQUESTS IN READING Decoding**

McGraw Hill, Webster Division, Kottmeyer and Ware, 1963.

Level: 7 - 9 Price: \$1.44 each.

This is a remedial workbook, building phonetic and structural analysis in both reading and spelling. There is also material for developing a sight vocabulary.

23. **CRACKING THE CODE Decoding**

Science Research Associates, Rasmussen & Goldberg, 1969.

Level: 4 - 6 Interest: Junior-senior high school.

Price: Student work text,	\$1.52
Student reader	2.36 (pap)
Student reader	4.35 (cloth)
T. guide	1.16

Decoding begins with simple, regularly spelled patterns and progresses to irregular, less frequently concurring patterns. Recommended for remediation of sound/symbol relationships, word clusters or patterns, and blending. Workbook exercises help establish pattern, with supplementary practice in readers.

Designed for children in grades 4-6 who cannot read independently or decodes words. Suitable as crash program for secondary remedial reader.

24. **DESIGNS FOR GOOD READING Total Program**

Harcourt Brace, Jovanovich; Schumacher, Schick & Schmidt, 1965.

Level: 9 - 12 Price: \$1.50/workbook, \$.30 teacher's manual.

The contents include 16 essays designed to increase rate and improve comprehension. Each is followed by a comprehension check, vocabulary exercises, and "What do you think" section with more essay questions about the story, and recommended reading. Keys follow the essays, giving answers, and conversion tables to figure reading speed. A number of short exercises follow to test judgment and grasp of ideas, a combined literal and critical reading practice.

The workbooks cover etymology, word origin, dictionary study; prefixes, suffixes and root words; denotation and connotation; words frequently confused; supplementary vocabulary drills for content areas; and using words appropriately.

The workbooks are attractive and designed for the student to work through on his own, although the reading selections require him to read at least at the 6th or 7th grade level. They are very interesting but appear more difficult occasionally than stated by the publisher. The student is able to chart his own progress on a scale provided and to compile a "personal" word list.

Called "one of the best tools for practicing rate and comprehension," these materials are very interesting and attractive and students don't lose interest. The fourth book ("D") is quite difficult, however. The introductions explain exactly what the student will be achieving, the record-keeping is simple and the selection of stories excellent.

25. **DEVELOPING Rate and Comprehension
READING EFFICIENCY**

Burgess Publishing Co., Miller, Cyle L. 1965.

Level: 7 - 10 Interest: Junior-senior high school Price: \$4.00.

The purpose of this book is to increase rate and comprehension efficiency. Certain eye-training exercises are provided for rate building. The actual efficiency of this program in terms of rate is questionable at any level. However, the reading passages are marked for readability and length, and for this reason, might be useful in a lab situation for comprehension or oral reading practice.

26. **DEVELOPING YOUR VOCABULARY Vocabulary**

Science Research Associates, Inc., Witty, Paul and Grothenberg, Edit. 1960.

Level: 7 - 12

The workbook includes a pre-test and post-test. The procedure is a matching sentence completion and

answers are given after each exercise group. Each section is short and essentially a capsule lesson. It provides skills in well-developed units with good variety so the lesson doesn't bog down.

The sequence is as follows: the learning of vocabulary by word structure, context, dictionary use, synonyms, homonyms, antonyms, and then connotations, figurative language, double meanings, and poetry, and word derivations. It concludes with exercises in the imaginative use of words and backgrounds of English.

The workbook is self-instructional. The material and vocabulary are at an advanced high school level, and would be good, perhaps, for an accelerated or Advanced Reading Course. For an average or below-average student, more practice and ongoing skill work would be necessary for transfer.

This text is recommended, but for students with at least an 8th grade reading level.

27. DIMENSIONS IN READING Comprehension

Science Research Associates, Inc.

Level: 7 - 12 Price: \$67.50.

Designed to enrich basic reading programs, it contains over 300 selections. These selections are followed by questions designed to work on comprehension skills.

This kit is a good base from which to build a supplemental program. It should not be used without direct instruction as no kit can adequately teach comprehension on its own.

28. EDL WORD CLUES Vocabulary

Educational Development Laboratories; Taylor, Franckenpohl, McDonald, Joline, 1962.

Level: 7 - 13

This "teaching machine in book form" teaches step-by-step vocabulary and gives the student the correct answers immediately. Essentially the student learns new words from context clues and dictionary practices it requires the learner to divide the word into syllables, to pronounce the word, to read it in a sentence, and to write a definition. It is accompanied by tests, flash-X sets with filmstrips and discs, and Tech-X sets with filmstrips.

It is in a complicated, difficult to follow format, however. These program materials are good if the student's an average or above-level reader, highly motivated, and doesn't have to fight the format.

29. GALAXY Total Program

Scott, Foresman Co.

Price: Cost per reader is four to five dollars; Teacher's manuals about \$1.50.

Publisher's description:

THRUST, grade 7, skills taught throughout book

FOCUS, grade 8, decoding and comprehension skills (critical reading, time-order relationships, thought patterns)

VANGUARD, grade 9, similar to 7 and 8

PERSPECTIVE, grade 10, no section on structure

ACCENT USA, grade 11, no section on structure

A program for students who need special motivation and guidance in reading. Selections are action-oriented.

Special skill-development sections are closely coordinated with the reading of selections. Average length of selection is 4-6 pages; print is large. Variety of stories, poetry, plays and novel.

Skill development includes working with words, grammar, structure, context, writing.

30. GENERAL RFU: Comprehension

Science Research Associates, Inc.; Thurston, Thelma G. 1963.

Level: grade 8 - 12; grade 5 - college. Price: Senior Edition (8-12) \$59.40 list, General Edition (5-college) \$59.40 list.

The program is designed to help students develop reading comprehension, analyze ideas, and draw logical conclusions. Short reading exercises cover areas such as education, politics, history, art, and philosophy. The student reads through a selection, then chooses the best of four suggested conclusions. Correct choice is implied but not stated. An answer key provides immediate reinforcement or correction.

Suggested use: Multilevel flexibility makes these kits an ideal reading supplement for any classroom.

Highlights: High student interest because of the individualized approach. The exercises are arranged in progressively difficult levels. A simple placement test indicates the level at which each student should begin. He can then work alone at his own pace. His Student Record Book provides space for responses and charting progress.

Components: 400 exercise cards, 40 answer key booklets, a placement test, a student record book,

Skill development is not sequenced; therefore this material should be used primarily for low level reading practice.

36. IMPROVE YOUR READING THROUGH PHONICS Decoding

ERA Publishers, Inc. Herr, Selma E. 1959. Paperbound workbook.

Reading level: 4 - 6. Price: \$1.20.

Small print hard to read. The various pronunciations of each vowel are presented together. Not recommended for students who are having problems with decoding skills. Present generalizations then practice.

37. INCREASE YOUR VOCABULARY Vocabulary

Cambridge Book Co. Mathis, Phyllis. 1971.

Level: 7 - 12.

This booklet is divided into two parts: vocabulary with work on new words, antonyms, homonyms, and synonyms, and word analysis; and spelling with hints and rules for improvement. The workbook is self-instructional with diagnostic tests provided at the beginning, practice exercises and progress checks throughout and a final evaluation at the end. The section on "words commonly confused and misused" is helpful.

38. INSIGHT/OUTLOOK Comprehension

Globe Publishing Co. Rockovits, Murray, (Editor). 1970. Paperbound.

Level: 5 - 8.

Anthology of stories in author's original language.

Includes: Comprehension, vocabulary, ideas for writing original stories, and exercises.

Subjects include: generation gap, dropout problems, racial discrimination and poverty.

Teacher's guide includes: story synopsis, suggestions for presentation, and model lesson plans.

This series is too advanced for remediation classes.

39. THE KALEIDOSCOPE READERS Total Program

Field Educational Publications, Inc. Wyatt, Diagan, Benmen

Level: Mid-2nd - Mid-9th Interest: Through adult.

The series includes eight different pamphlet-workbooks, ranging in reading levels from mid-2nd to mid-9th grade. The authors assume that the materials should be interesting to young people, and they are also intent on providing for these skills:

word attack: phonetic analysis, structural analysis, words in context, and syllabication

vocabulary skills: homonyms, synonyms, antonyms, multiple meanings, derivations and connotations.

comprehension skills: main idea, identifying essential details, inferring meanings, organizing ideas, reacting on the basis of personal knowledge and experience, and reading creatively.

study skills: using major reference works, reading maps, tables and graphs, outlining, and taking notes

The format is essentially that of 10 different sections, each with a story, sometimes a poem, the vocabulary to be covered, a short comprehension test, and vocabulary work. Critical, analytical from jobs and careers, griefs and gripes, to drugs, sports and arts, all in a very good layout with pictures and illustrations. The general format organization, variety, and attractiveness are exceptionally nice. The sophistication of these publications, in fact, make them quite alluring to adult readers.

40. KEYS TO YOUR READING IMPROVEMENT Total Program

J. Weston Welch. Cramer, Ward. 1961.

Level: 4 - 9.

This workbook includes work on the following task analysis subskills:

Reading speed
Reading comprehension
Main idea
Details
Vocabulary
Meaning in other subject areas

The format is that of practice exercises needing some teacher direction, fill in and sentence completion.

The materials are self-administering for the most part, an excellent total program with a clear, exceptionally well-organized and easy-to-follow format. The phonics section is complete and well-planned; much practice material is provided. The directions and discussions are easy to understand, there are illustrations, and the text is simple but non-childish. These materials could be used successfully with adults.

41. LANGUAGE ARTS AWAY Vocabulary

Coronet Learning Programs, 1962.

Level: 9 - 12. Price: indiv. copy \$1.20
pack of 25, \$30.00.

This program is on the whole too advanced for remediation work. However, the section entitled, "Divide and Conquer Words" on vocabulary growth is appropriate as a reinforcer and supplement to instruction. The format is self-instructional and sequenced, patterned after the Sullivan Programmed Readers, and therefore, suited to remediation.

Although some of the pictures are elementary, many of the puzzles can be used for vocabulary development and spelling.

Supplementary books provide additional reading practice, level 3 and above: format is like directed reading activity. Reading in 600 and 900 series (grades 4-6) is strongest part of program. (Both skill lesson and the readings follow a format that introduces new words to decode in a "word study", supply them in "read aloud"; in addition, new sight words are memorized each lesson.)

Teacher needs to study total program to determine which parts are suitable for remedial students.

An individual story is graded and coded by reading level and offers a step-by-step easily controlled enrichment program that can complement the brief materials of basic reading selections.

The program was designed to bridge the gap between reading training and independent reading. The excerpts were chosen for their interest, appeal, and reading level to what the student's appetite and lead him to the original work. The publishers suggest using it as enrichment materials related to Power Builder selections in the SEA Reading Laboratory Series, but says it can also be effective with other reading program.

Book I begins pre-primer level of reading for adults. It is made especially for adults and has an adult approach to reading. The book goes as far as advanced fourth or beginning fifth grade. It starts with the alphabet and runs through the consonant sounds as well as initial and final consonant blends. It contains functional exercises such as writing letters, filling out checks and filling in forms.

Book II takes up the more difficult blends. The sounds of double "o," double "e," the ea sounds, and long "e" sound, etc. It is more in-depth as an approach to phonics. There are a number of readings sprinkled throughout the exercise such as President Teddy Roosevelt's, "Will the bill be conquered?" "A Day at the Lake." As the students progress further through the phonetic exercises, more readings are encountered. It begins around the fourth grade level and goes as far as beginning junior high school in readability.

A highlight is the bibliography at the end of each Pilot Book which refers students to other books of similar content and difficulty. There is also immediate feedback for comprehension exercises. The ultimate goal is that students learn reading can be fun.

The teacher's manual and an orientation period should be used with this set. After the student finishes book 8, the publisher says he should be able to read with understanding through grade five.

There is a 1500 word vocabulary introduced along with phonics rules, syllabication, punctuation and grammar.

This might be a good way to supplement a reading program as the material seems very well sequenced. It would have to be used with a comprehension program as the series is rather weak in this respect and also in the area of concepts.

70. READING AND WORD STUDY: FOR STUDENTS OF ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE Vocabulary

Prentice-Hall. Croft, Kenneth.

Level: 9 - 12. Price: \$4.95.

This book helps the student of English build his vocabulary. The readings are stories and talks by authors such as Stephen Crane, Zane Grey, Nathaniel Hawthorne, Sherwood Anderson, and Washington Irving. It includes an extensive study of word patterning.

Level: 3 - 6. Interest: Junior-senior high.

Kit includes skill cards, answer key, record book. There are 120 reading selections tested on the Spache Readability Formula. The skill cards allow practice only in comprehension skills and vocabulary development. The selections do appear to be of high interest to motivate senior high students. Questions following selections appear to be mainly for recall or scanning abilities.

This program provides only minimal decoding coverage and should be supplemented with more extensive decoding instruction.

The content organization is based on the premise, indicated by research, that speed reading practice is most effective and has the most value through daily exercising. The 15 lessons, designed to be covered in 3 weeks include chapters on:

- efficient reading rate
- common reading faults
- eye movements
- building vocabulary
- establishing a reading purpose
- reading in thought units
- learning to skim
- skimming for the main idea
- skimming for details
- improving speed in content areas
- study-reading and memory
- continued progress through practice

The workbook aims at treating the common reading faults of vocalization, subvocalization, pointing and head movements, but is designed for the student reading at his grade level or above. The exercises are fairly difficult, as are the introductory explanations the student is expected to read on his own. The lessons don't always seem relevant to the exercises, but the materials are quite thorough.

Although it appeals to the average student, this workbook could probably not be used with a student reading below 8th grade level, because of the difficulty of the content. Practice in discrimination is excellent, however, and perception and comprehension exercises are also good.

The series emphasis is on literal comprehension but some attention is given to high level comprehension skills. The series provides practice in comprehension skills, but does not teach them. Recommended for remedial use because of low readability and high interest.

Series was developed as a basic materials program. Originated at Indiana Reformatory, Pendleton, Indiana. An Educational Opportunities Project.

This program is recommended for high motivational purposes in reading. However, poor sequencing of skills and minimal attention to reading are weak points for remedial work.

The pattern of progression in this workbook is very logical and tight, and easy for the student who needs to rely on a highly structured material. Unfortunately the unattractive yellowish paper receives negative comments. Although good material, it isn't very motivating for students, and a student would have to be quite self-directed to work through it.
