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ABSTRACT

Since 1967 the Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC) Clearinghouses have produced a total of 1,514 information analysis products--bibliographies, literature reviews, state-of-the-art papers, evaluative summaries, and other special reports. This volume is a five-year cumulation of citations and abstracts of these ERIC Clearinghouses' products. Included is a main entry section, a subject index, and an author index. The following information is provided for each entry: author, title, series name and number, journal reference, date of publication, number of pages, type of publication, ERIC document (ED) number, date of appearance in "Research in Education" (RIE), price, descriptors used to index the document, and a brief abstract. Also included in this publication are: (1) a list of the ERIC Clearinghouses including address, telephone number and scope note and (2) an ERIC Bibliography of selected references concerning the ERIC system. (Yearly volumes of "ERIC Products" are available as ED 029 161, 034 089, 041 598, 054 287, and LI 004 339.) (SJ)

The Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC) has established a firm reputation as the largest and most widely accepted computer-based educational information service in the world. ERIC is a nationwide system established to serve the field of education through the dissemination of information on educational resources and research materials.

The total system functions on both a decentralized and centralized basis, and consists of the following components:

- (1) The management group within the National Institute of Education, called ERIC Central;
- (2) A network of Clearinghouses, each with its own subject area of responsibility;
- (3) A central document processing and reference facility (currently operated by Leasco Systems and Research);
- (4) A central source for obtaining copies of documents in microfiche and hard copy called the ERIC Document Reproduction Service (EDRS) (currently operated by Leasco Information Products);
- (5) A centralized contractual endeavor to produce an index of the journal literature in education (currently operated by CCM Information Corp.).

The role of the ERIC Clearinghouses centers about three major functions:

- (1) To act as catalysts, focal points, and agents for the acquisition, document processing (cataloging, abstracting, and indexing), announcement, and dissemination of fugitive reports and journal literature;
- (2) To serve as information service centers which handle an increasing number of inquiries and serve as referral, or switching centers, to existing sources of information;
- (3) To be information analysis centers which identify burning issues of current need within a scope of coverage, and respond to these by the synthesis and analysis of information from the past and current literature.¹

Each of the Clearinghouses in the network performs similar functions within its particular subject area. These functions include:

- (1) Identification and acquisition of the so-called "fugitive" reports, papers, speeches, etc., which are not published through commercial channels, and the identification of core journal articles, within its subject field;
- (2) Evaluation of the documents received;
- (3) Cataloging;
- (4) Abstracting and indexing;
- (5) Forwarding the document resume forms (which contain the cataloging information, indexing terms, and abstracts) to the central document processing facility, along with a copy of the document itself;
- (6) Sending journal article resumes to the contractor for production of the journal index.

The Clearinghouses retain hard copies of each document received for their own library collections, and also maintain complete files of microfiche of all the documents which have been processed by the central document reproduction service. These activities provide each Clearinghouse with a fairly extensive bibliographical base of fugitive document literature.

The document resume forms, which are forwarded to the central processing facility by the Clearinghouses, are put into machine-readable form by the facility and the resultant tape is used to produce a monthly abstract publication called *Research in Education* (RIE). The journal resumes are also put into machine-readable form, for production of the monthly journal index called *Current Index to Journals in Education* (CIJE). Each Clearinghouse automatically receives copies of each of the two monthly publications for ready reference use. The input tapes for both of these publications, which are updated on a quarterly basis, provide machine searching and retrieval capabilities.

Building a data base of the document and journal literature in the field of education is a part of the mission of the ERIC system. This data base, along with the broad announcement and document availability service provided by the system, makes ERIC a complete information system, unique in the field of education.

The Clearinghouses work independently with their respective user communities in the way that best meets the needs of those communities and, at the same time, conform to rules and guidelines established by the National Institute of Education for processing documents to meet system standardization requirements. The Clearinghouses then feed the processed information into the central document and journal article processing contractors for the production of the magnetic tapes from which the two monthly announcement publications mentioned earlier are produced. The tapes themselves are made available for machine searching by system users and may be purchased from the central processing facility.

INFORMATION ANALYSIS

In view of the massive and overwhelming accumulation of the literature, the need for quality filters in information systems has become increasingly apparent.² The information crisis is due not only to quantitative increases in the literature but also to unmet qualitative requirements. More effective utilization of the mass of available information in relation to technical and social goals necessitates selection, compaction, integration, and synthesis of

literature. The major problem faced at the present time is not the manipulation or transmission of information, but rather its quality and use. Great importance must be attached to the consolidation and intellectual reworking of primary information. This process, called information analysis, can be a potent and effective instrument in the evaluation, condensation, interpretation, synthesis, and application of vast bodies of information.³

The process of analyzing the literature received much attention nearly ten years ago when the Weinberg Report⁴ pointed out that "the transfer of information is an inseparable part of research and development." It also noted that "we shall cope with the information explosion in the long run only if some scientists and engineers are prepared to commit themselves deeply to the job of sifting, retrieving, and synthesizing information." This process of correlating and systematizing many disparate pieces of information was compared by the Weinberg Panel with the inductive method in science. "Successful inductions all share the same pattern: the data is amassed, some one worries very hard and long about it, and, with luck, discovers the regularities." In times past, the amount of data was so small that it was possible for "the same person or a small group of persons to be bench scientist, amasser of data, correlator of data, and inventor of new syntheses." At the present time, considering the plethora of new facts, data, and observations, "a division of labor between those who create or discover the facts and those who sift, absorb, and correlate the facts seems to be inevitable."

Great importance must be attached to the consolidation or intellectual reworking of primary information gleaned from published literature, laboratory data, and other sources. Cranefield⁵ argues that: "the matter of science can be passed through the informed and critical intellect and, when it is, we gain not only synthesis and new insights but also recognition and selection of those publications which deserve serious attention. Such criticism is the *sine qua non* of a literature of science as distinguished from scientific information." Unfortunately, the cost of such creative synthesis is very high. The SATCOM Report⁶ notes that: "the selection of material to be included, its assimilation and interpretation (and evaluation if the review is a critical one), and finally its organization into a meaningful and useful article, are time-consuming and arduous tasks." One estimate⁷ places the cost at \$100 per professional paper evaluated. To facilitate the production of reviews and compilations, a further division of labor between those who gather the material to be reviewed and those who perform the creative and evaluative judgment might be desirable. This suggests a very useful supportive task for the librarian in relation to information analysis.

The mechanism suggested by the Weinberg Report for furthering the essential process of inductive consolidation is the information analysis center:

The activities of the most successful (information analysis) centers are an intrinsic part of science and technology. The centers not only disseminate and retrieve information, they create new information. . . . The process of sifting through large masses of data often leads to new generalizations. . . . In short, knowledgeable scientific interpreters who can collect relevant data, review a field, and distill information in a manner that goes to the heart of a technical situation are more help to the over-burdened specialist than a mere pile of relevant documents. Such knowledgeable scientific middlemen who themselves contribute to science are the backbone of the information (analysis) center; they make an information center a technical institute rather than a technical library.⁸

The information analysis function of the ERIC Clearinghouses was adapted from the scientific information system model as well as system design.⁹ The growth and size of the ERIC system demonstrates that there is a paucity of information in the educational field. The total number of references in the data base as of November 1972 stands at 119,996 including both journal and report literature, and growing at a rate of approximately 2,500 new references per month. This massive accumulation of information brings about the need for quality filters, distillation, and interpretation of the literature into coherent and comprehensible packages.

The ERIC Clearinghouses are listed in the *Directory of Federally Supported Information Analysis Centers* which reports some 119 centers as being information analysis centers with the following definition:

An information analysis center is a formally structured organizational unit specifically (but not necessarily exclusively) established for the purpose of acquiring, selecting, storing, retrieving, evaluating, analyzing, and synthesizing a body of information and/or data in a clearly defined field or pertaining to a special mission with the intent of compiling, digesting, repackaging, or otherwise organizing and presenting pertinent information and/or data in a form most authoritative, timely, and useful to a society of peers and management.¹⁰

ERIC PRODUCTS

Since 1967 the ERIC Clearinghouses have produced a total of 1,514 information analysis products — bibliographies, literature reviews, state-of-the-art papers, evaluative summaries, and other special reports. This is probably an astonishing amount to those who are unfamiliar with the fact that ERIC has been involved in information analysis for this length of time. (See the statistical summary of ERIC Products 1967-72.)

It is not enough, however, to produce these valuable products without an active and effective program informing educators as to the use and availability. To this end, one must make it easy for the user to find the relevant material at the time when it is needed and this material must be organized for quick and efficient use.

The ERIC Clearinghouse on Library and Information Sciences (ERIC/CLIS) has compiled an annual bibliography of ERIC products since 1967. *ERIC Information Analysis Products 1967-1972* is a five-year cumulation of citations and abstracts of those publications which reflect information analysis activities produced by the network of ERIC Clearinghouses. It is a significant step toward user education and accessibility. Included are all the bibliographies, review papers, state-of-the-art papers, and other special reports, directories, and evaluative summaries. All data were gathered by ERIC/CLIS staff.

Information Analysis Products 1967-1972 includes a main entry section, a subject index, and an author index. The main entry section is arranged by a product code number. The first two digits of this code number refer to the fiscal year (July 1 through June 30) during which the product was made available from ERIC. Within each yearly range of product numbers, the entries are sorted by clearinghouse acronym. These acronyms include:

Within each main entry, the following items of information, as appropriate and in the form supplied by the individual clearinghouses, are included:

1. Personal author(s)
2. Title
3. Series name and number
4. Journal reference
5. Date of publication, if not already included in a journal reference
6. Number of pages

7. Type of publication, e.g., Bibliography, Review Paper, etc.
8. ERIC (ED) number or clearinghouse accession number if the document has not yet appeared in *Research in Education*
9. Date of appearance of abstract in *Research in Education*
10. Price of document, in either microfiche (MF) or hard copy (HC) format
11. Descriptors
12. A brief abstract

The full text of about 75 percent of the documents cited in this bibliography is available in two forms: microfiche (MF) — a 4" x 6" sheet of microfilm, on which up to 98 pages of text are reproduced, and hard copy (HC) — a reproduction of the document on paper at the original size. Either may be ordered from the ERIC Document Reproduction Service (EDRS). In most cases, if the document is not available from EDRS, an alternate availability is given with the citation. For those documents available from EDRS, whether in microfiche or hard copy form, the following requirements apply:

1. All items must be ordered by ED number.
2. Book rate or library rate postage is included in the prices. The difference between book or library rate and first class or foreign postage (outside the continental United States) rate will be billed at cost.
3. Payments must accompany orders under \$10.00
4. All orders must be in writing; no phone orders are accepted.
