ABSTRACT

This compilation lists 247 print and non-print materials dealing with animal life, nature, and ecology and is designed to assist teachers and school librarians in selecting media suitable for pupils in grades 4 through 6 and 9 through 12. A few of the materials date back to 1951, but the majority are of more recent issue. The collection for elementary school students includes 65 books and 43 16mm films, each with a brief annotation. In addition, 33 assorted materials such as cassette tapes, phonodiscs, slides, study prints, and periodicals are cited. Eighty books appropriate for high school classes are mentioned, along with 26 other miscellaneous items. The collection also offers a bibliography of sources, indexes to reviews, sources of reviews, sources of teaching materials, and a list of distributors of non-print materials. (PB)

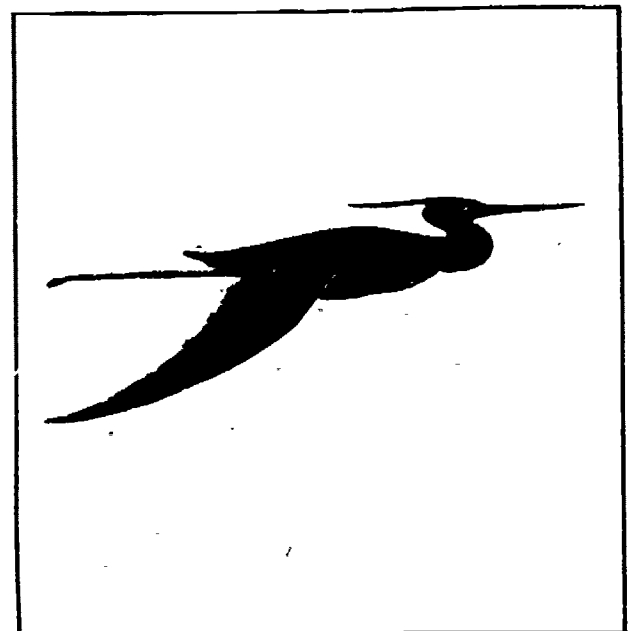

Because most teachers and students now prefer multimedia, the bibliography which follows includes both print and nonprint materials. These learning resources are intended for elementary pupils, grades 4-6, and for secondary students, grades 10-12. There is some overlapping, especially with the newer media. Materials are selected for their appeal to youngsters, and for qualities of text and format contributing to their value. Mediated learning can be at once more profound and more subtle than a recital of well-ordered facts, concepts, or even ideas; ideally, mediated experience involves the learner totally in a configuration--images, symbols, light, dark, color, sound, silence, rhythm, rhyme, motion, texture, line, shape.... Educators should select materials in anticipation of the learner's media involvement. Reference works have been excluded. Included are works relating to living animals in their native habitats.

Earth is the only livable land man knows. Only recently has man realized that the world is not his to do with as he chooses. "Mankind belongs to the world, and can have a future only as a cooperating part of its ecology" (The Arena of Life, Milne). Whether the generations inheriting this planet will prosper or perish may well depend upon their knowledge and application of ecological principles. Learning about animals and their habitats is an approach to ecology with built-in appeal to children and young adults. Infants-in-arms point to and name animals in picture books. Small children listen to folk stories and modern tales of creatures parodying humans (Frog and Toad Are Friends-Lobel). In the middle grades, children read about animals endowed with human thought and speech (Charlotte's Web-E.B. White). Most ten-year-olds are ready for the real thing, animals contending with man and nature (Bambi-Salten, The Yearling-Rawlins, Incident at Hawk's Hill-Eckert). Young adults may read natural history (Wild America-Teale) or become engrossed in a species study (The Year of the Whale-Scheffer). At any age youngsters may also listen to the mystical Songs of the Humpbacked Whale, recorded by Roger S. Payne, researcher in biological acoustics.

Animals living in their native surroundings fit in nicely up and down the developmental-curricular spiral.
