

ABSTRACT

The report is intended to provide current statistics on allied health careers as baseline data for evaluation, planning, and administration of allied health education programs. The document consists entirely of tables, except for the first three pages describing the problem, the collection of the data, and the limitations of the data, and for introductory comments describing each region preceeding regional statistics. In the first section, tables for a summary analysis, state personnel requirements and employment levels, and state allied health manpower by employer are provided. It concludes with a two-page discussion of allied health education and conclusions and recommendations. Part II is devoted to allied health manpower and education statistics according to region, Part III, according to county. For parts II and III, the tables list the number of fulltime employees, parttime employees, hours worked parttime, funded open vacancies, and anticipated additional vacancies for each health occupation. Appendixes on statistical procedures, survey instruments and instructions, and a page of references conclude the document. (AG)

INTRODUCTION

Good health as a social right is of increasing importance to the population of Texas. Factors of good health are many and varied; however, the health care delivery system is receiving a great amount of public attention. Public awareness extends to all aspects of health care, whether it be preventive, diagnostic, therapeutic or rehabilitative within the hospital, extended care facility, nursing home, rehabilitation center or practitioner's office. Due to its complexity the health care delivery system defies description beyond material components of facilities (including equipment) and personnel. The vast majority of resources expended on health care delivery fall into the latter component. Recent publicity has noted shortages in the more than 200 job descriptions of health personnel. Health manpower shortages have been adjudged by many to be the greatest debilicative factor to adequate health care delivery.

Description and study of health manpower is of extreme importance in planning for health care delivery. Education, employment, utilization and demand should be identified, quantified and evaluated in order that appropriate actions be taken to alleviate the manpower shortages. Health manpower can be divided on the basis of utilization, function or education, however, a general classification would be primary (including doctors of medicine and dentistry) and allied (including nurses, technicians, etc.). Allied implies health environment education, however, the general connotation is that those people who provide support for and act as extensions of the doctor are considered allied health personnel. Several terms such as "paramedical" and "paraprofessional" are used categorically in the same context; however, current usage seems to indicate a preference for the term "allied health personnei." For definitions of specific personnel classifications refer to Appendix .

STATEMENT OF PROBLEM

Since its beginning, the Governor's Office of Comprehensive Health Planning has been aware of the lack of basic data necessary for comprehensive health planning. In order for Comprehensive Health Planning to fulfill the mandate for a "State Health Plan" as set forth in the Partnership for Health Act, it is evident that the large "data gaps" which now exist must be filled.

In Texas, there has been no overall baseline statistical information that identified the total allied health manpower supply and needs. Several health agencies and organizations have conducted surveys of their own particular needs, but these statistics do not reflect the overall picture of allied health manpower needs, regionally or statewide, in Texas.

To facilitate effective allied health manpower planning for Texas, the Texas Health Careers Program of the Texas Hospital Association, proposed to conduct a study of current and projected needs for specific allied health careers on a statewide, regional, and county basis. In order to facilitate such a study, the Texas Health Careers Program initiated a proposal and entered into a contract agreement with the

Governor's Office of Comprehensive Health Planning.

The principal purpose of this study has been to gather baseline information concerning current and projected personnel requirements in selected allied health careers, and to collect and assimilate pertinent information on Texas allied health education programs in order to gain insight and understanding relative to state health manpower planning. Specifically, it is intended that this study identify specific allied health careers of continuing demand, by category of health care delivery, and study their geographic distribution, current employment, part-time employment, and obtain valid data on job vacancies. The study also determines the number of additional vacancies anticipated for 1971 and projected needs for 1972, 1976, and 1980. Utilizing data gathered, the study provides information on current student enrollment and student capacities in allied health education programs around the state.

The fifty-four careers included in the allied health manpower study were selected by key persons representing various health agencies. These fifty-four careers are further broken down into 63 professional and technical and 7 nonprofessionals identified by licensure, registration, certification, etc.

COLLECTION OF DATA

The primary method chosen for data collection was a mail questionnaire survey of all major allied health personnel employers. Instruments and definitions used by the Texas Health Careers Program in 1969 were utilized as basic sources for the 1970 Texas Manpower Resources Survey. This source was used because development, field testing, and validation were already accomplished, and data gathered would be compatible with that collected in the 1969 study. The one major difference in the 1969 and 1970 manpower surveys was the need in 1970 for information pertaining to future requirements for allied health manpower.

Universe description was accomplished through communications with professional associations, boards of licensure, or appropriate governing agencies. The universe includes 20,908 allied health personnel employers in 13 categories of health care delivery. The participants include hospitals and related institutions; nursing homes; community, county, and state public health facilities; home health agencies; social security approved laboratories; health care facilities in institutions of higher education; public and private elementary and secondary schools; community and state institutions of mental health and mental retardation; doctors of medicine; doctors of dentistry; doctors of osteopathy; doctors of podiatry; and doctors of optometry.

After the universe description was processed, each individual or institution was assigned a category and code number in order to facilitate selective processing. The exceptions to this procedure were the categories of state mental



health and mental retardation institutions and public secondary and elementary schools. Complete statewide informatic a was obtained on Texas state mental health and mental retardation institutions from the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, Austin, Texas. Statewide date on public secondary and elementary school allied health employees were obtained through the Texas State Department of Public Health, Austin, Texas.

The week of July 13 through 17, 1970, was selected as a reporting date. This was considered a week of average activities within the health care field. Five questions were asked pertaining to each personnel classification (i.e., Dietitian, Medical Technologist, etc.):

- How many full-time personnel are employed?
- How many part-time personnel are employed?
- How many hours are worked by part-time personnel?
- How many funded open positions exist?
- How many additional vacancies do you antitipate for 1971?

Two gummed, nonremovable labels for each member of the universe were obtained as computer print-outs of name, mailing address, and code number. One label was placed on a mailing envelope and another simultaneously placed on an appropriate instrument. The instrument, a cover letter appealing to professional responsibility from appropriate professional associations or governing agency, instructions, and definitions with a franked, addressed envelope were mailed to each member of the universe. A total of 20,908 packages were mailed between July 8, and July 13, 1970.

As each completed questionnaire was returned it was checked for cunsistency of information and remarks. Instrument return and telephone interviews clarified doubtful answers.

Initial response totaled more than 50 percent, which is considered adequate for baseline information. The follow-up procedure was identical to the initial mailout except that a different cover letter, appealing to civic responsibility and signed by Governor Preston Smith, was provided through 1 e Office of Comprehensive Health Planning. The follow-up consisted of 9,941 packages.

A cut-off date of September 15, 1970, was selected after greatest percentage of response had been received.

Several of the largest employers of allied health employees (i.e., hospitals, nursing homes, etc.) were telephoned from September 15 through September 16, 1970, in order that the most complete information on each county could be obtained. The final return count was 14,377 completed questionnaires. This total represents 68.8 percent return.

The Allied Health Education Program (AHEP) Survey was initially conducted in the same manner as the Manpower Resources Survey. Univers, description was accomplished through an updated listing of Texas allied health programs maintained by the Texas Health Careers Program, Texas Hospital Association. The following is a categorical list of the number of programs surveyed and returned:

The instrument was designed by adapting formats from previous AHEP surveys conducted by the Texas Health Careers Program. Five questions were asked pertaining to each allied health program:

- What is the approved student capacity of the program?
- " How many students are currently enrolled?
- What is the composition of the student body (i.e., How many first year students? Second year?, etc.)?
- · How many students were graduated in 1970?
- What is the approximate average attrition percentage over the last three years?

Several other questions were asked not relating to this report. The instrument, cover letter appealing to profes-

sional responsibility from the Texas Health Careers Program, and a franked, addressed envelope was mailed to each member of the universe. A total of 455 packages were mailed between September 28, and October 2, 1970. Initial response totaled more than 40 percent. The follow-up procedure included telephone calls to each program director not returning a questionnaire. The director was asked to furnish the required data over the phone. If he was unable to comply with our request at that time, a second survey form was mailed. A cut-off date of November 20, 1970, was selected after the greatest percentage of response had been received. The final count was 439 completed questionnaires. This total represents 96.5 percent return.

LIMITATIONS OF DATA

Data in this report should not be considered as absolute measures in establishing needs for personnel, but only as a statistical base from which to project. The variables of absolute measures are much beyond the scope of this report and should be considered as integral parts of any judgement based on information contained herein. The following are factors which indicate the conservative nature of all figures:

- 1. Fifty-four allied health occupations are included in this study, whereas over 200 allied health careers are employed in the health delivery system; therefore, this study does not indicate the complete allied health manpower employment and needs.
- 2. The survey included only 13 major categories of health care delivery services; that is, there are more categories of health services in the state of Texas than included in this study. For example, there are Private Duty Nursing Bureaus; Industrial Health Services not operated by medical doctors; social service agencies who employ nurses and other health personnel; laboratories not operated by medical doctors and not social security approved; and some 2,700 community pharmacies not included in the study. Therefore, the total nurses and other careers included do not reflect the total current employment and manpower needs.
- 3. Projections for additional health manpower needs for proposed new hospitals and nursing homes have not been included in the data.
- 4. "Funded open positions" is a conservative term. Many hospital administrators do not budget for those who are not available for employment. That is, if an administrator knows he cannot possibly find the ten nurses he needs, he will request only the number which he can realistically expect to employ. Moreover, doctors in private practice do not always operate on a formal budget; therefore, they would not have "funded open positions."
- 5. "Additional Anticipated Vacancies for 1971" is, of course, a subjective question and therefore only an estimate.
- 6. Projections for 1972, 1976, and 1980 are based on maintaining current health standards (i.e., current employment plus current vacancies) with estimated population increases. This relates the need for more allied health personnel, but not necessarily the optimum level of health care delivery or the availability of positions to be filled.

- 7. The number of hours worked by part-time employees in hospitals and nursing homes is based on a sample of hospitals and nursing homes and therefore subject to sampling error. As a rough guideline for use in assessing the reliability of "Full-time Equivalents" figure in the tables, the coefficient of variation or relative sampling error is approximately 3 percent.
- 8. In addition to sampling errors, the statistics in both manpower and AHEP surveys are subject to measurement errors. These include errors due to category of health care delivery nonresponse, occupational category nonresponse, information incompletely or inaccurately reported, and processing errors. With a total nonresponse rate of only 31.2 percent, a 100 percent verification of card punching, and several stages of editing, errors due to category of health care delivery nonresponse and processing errors are considered to be negligible. However, the data on manpower needs are subject to possibly large measurement error due to considerable nonreporting for these items. Also, the data on both employment and manpower needs for several career categories are subject to possible large measurement error due to misclassification of personnel, and either underreporting or overreporting of personnel.



ALLIED HEALTH MANPOWER

In July, 1970, there were nearly 230,000 persons (229,311) employed in allied health occupations in the 13 major health employer categories in Texas. Of this number, approximately two-thirds (136,922) were employed in the allied health professional and technical occupational categories. About 9 out of 10 health professional and technical employees were reported as working 35 or more hours per week. Persons who work in these specific health occupations have had special education or training designed to help them function in a health setting. Many other persons perform the business, clerical, and maintenance services essential to the operation of health facilities and agencies, but their occupations are not unique to the health field.

SUMMARY ANALYSIS

It is difficult to determine the number of individuals in each of the health occupations, yet it is desirable to know the number of persons who have had special education or training in the health work force. Information is needed on geographic location, employment status and type of activity, educational background and special training. Information on allied health manpower and education classified by career is shown in the report that follows. Manpower statistics discussed in the report are related to education, license to practice, certification or registration, association membership, place of employment, and other factors.

Nursing service personnel comprised the bulk of allied health professional and technical employees in 1970 with about 7 out of 10 health workers being reported in one of the nursing service categories. About 24 out of every 100

nursing service personnel were registered nurses (23,726) and 26 were licensed vocational nurses (25,300).

Of allied health professional and technical careers other than nursing services, medical technologists (6,699) comprised the single largest category. Other categories having at least 1,000 employees were: medical assistant (6,124), dental assistant (5,164), ward clerk (3,570), lab assistants and aides (2,872), dietitian (1,765), medical typist (1,746), inhalation therapist (1,275), food service manager (1,135), and hospital/nursing home pharmacists (1,004).

There were 7,364 positions, or less than 6 percent of the equivalent full-time positions (see table 4 footnote 1), that were reported as being budgeted and vacant in professional and technical categories at the time of the survey. Future needs for 1971 were expressed for 10,426 full-time health professionals and technicians in addition to budgeted vacancies. In total an additional need, for 1971, of 17,790 health professional and technical personnel (present budgeted vacancies plus additional anticipated vacancies, 1971), or about a 13 percent increase over present equivalent full-time positions, was reported.

Hospitals and nursing homes employ approximately 7 out of 10 of all allied health professional and technical employees while comprising less than 8 percent of the total number of health employers. Hospitals alone account for 6 out of 10 of all tended open professional and tech ical positions. Hospitals and nursing homes also account for 7 out of 10 additional anticipated vacancies reported for 1971.

PERSONNEL REQUIREMENTS AND EMPLOYMENT LEVELS

Any discussion of requirements for health manpower must include the fact that the assumptions underlying an nalysis of supply versus demand are not agreed upon, and hat much of the data required is not available. The most

important lack is an objective against which the present ability to provide health services can be measured. The difficulties are especially apparent in attempting to determine or forecast requirements for allied health manpower, since its utilization is related more to rising standards of health care than to simple growth of population or volume of health services.

There are, however, a sufficient number of reasons to base projected estimates of state needs for allied health manpower on estimated population growth which, while not based on uniform assumptions or definition of requirements, are in sufficient agreement to allow some general conclusions to be drawn. The sources are cited in appendix

Since the education and employment of allied health manpower over the next decade are of immediate interest and importance, "projected requirements" is given the special meaning of the number of workers who would find employment without major changes in the health system, in manpower utilization patterns, or in economics of health care. The term "projected requirements" is not used here to represent the number of allied health workers that would be necessary in order to have an optimum or adequate health system, or to achieve some improved level of health care.

In an assessment of our current situation it is possible to draw some general conclusions about the extent to which projected requirements for allied health manpower exceed employment. The attempt to project these requirements into the future obviously involves uncertainties which minimize the value of the prediction.

Projections of future supply have been made and cited in this report (table 4). However, these are not predictions of requirements, which must be based upon health care goals and which must also take into account a variety of other factors. The manpower projections here are based on projected population estimates with the assumption that allied health worker needs will increase in a ratio with population expansion. This growth, if realized, will impose great demands upon the educational programs that serve these allied health careers. It seems unnecessary to state any higher level of future manpower requirements than 1980 in order to appreciate the magnitude of the educational tasks ahead.

Texas population has increased at a rate in excess of 14 percent over the last ten years. With over 275,000 square miles, Texas counted 10,989,123 in the 1970 preliminary census. This was an increase of 14.7 percent over 9,579,677 residents included in 1960. Table 4 shows that the present number of budgeted but unfilled jobs in the sixty-three individual allied health professional and technical positions surveyed is already a cause of much concern. When reviewed in relation to 1980 projected needs, the shortage is critical.


Anticipated personnel needs in four of the sixty-three allied health professional and technical careers will more than double the number of currently filled full-time equivalent positions in the next ten years. Twenty-three will expend by more than 50 percent. These are the positions that have the highest number of vacancies at present. Therefore, to fill 1980 allied health personnel needs will require not only raising the total number of those qualified by a rate consistent with the increase in budgeted positions, but also filling present vacancies. Table 3 shows personnel increases in the next ten years for eighteen major licensed, registered, wiffied health careers in Fexas.


Overall, an increase of 37 percent (over 52,000 personnel) is anticipated over current personnel requirements in the sixty-three selected allied health professional and technical positions. Among the major occupational categories. Therapeutic Services (58%) composed the single largest projected increase in professionals and technicians over the next ten years followed by Medical Records (42%), Diagnostic Services (41%), Nursing Services (38%), Radiology (37%), Pharmacy (35%), and Dietary Services (35%). In numbers, Nursing Services requires a projected increase of over 34,000 more employees by 1930, while Diagnostic Services requires 4,000 and Therapeutic Services 2,400. It should be pointed out that many of the positions expanding by impressive percentages have at present very low base figures for currently filled positions. This tends to exaggerate percentage needs.

SELECTED ALLIED HEALTH OCCUPATIONS



TEXAS: HOSPITALS

Hospitals are a major component of the health services industry, one of the largest and fastest growing industries in Texas. Based on data presented in this report, allied health hospital personnel account for 54 percent of all workers employed in Texas' total health services industry. In July 1970, over 122,000 allied health personnel were working in Texas hospitals, 14 percent of them as part-time workers (table 5).

The tremendous increase in hospital personnel over the past two decades may be illustrated with the following statistics from the *Guide* issue of *Hospitals*, the Journal of the American Hospital Association (A.H.A.). In the 1940's, hospitals in the United States had approximately one professional nurse for every 15 beds and one L.V.N., aide, or attendant for every 10 beds. In Texas, thirty years later, there is one professional nurse for every 5 beds and one auxiliary person to every 2 beds. "In addition to nursing personnel, hospitals have been increasing the number of personnel in other occupational categories at a rate that

exceeds the growth rates in both hospital beds and total annual admissions to short-term general hospitals."1

In July 1970, there were nearly 122,000 persons employed in allied health occupations in Texas hospitals. Of this number, approximately two-thirds (76,612) were employed in the allied health professional and technical occupational categories. About 84 percent of the professional and technical employees in hospitals were reported as working 35 hours or more per week. The universe of the hospital study was 642 hospitals. The returns from 507 hospitals have been used to estimate data for that total.

More than 55,000 employees were reported in nursing services—nearly three-fourths of the total were nursing aides, orderlies, and attendants (22,000). Licensed vocational nurses made up the next largest group (16,000), fol-

lowed by registered nurses (15,500). Among nonnursing personnel, the largest categories of professional and technical allied health employees were medical technologists (3,374) and radiologic technologists (1,755).

More than 4,400 budgeted positions for professional and technical personnel in hospitals were vacant in July of 1970. This represented a vacancy rate of almost 6 percent. The highest number of vacancies was for registered nurses (1,656). Among nonnursing personnel, the greatest number of budgeted vacancies was for medical technologists (276).

Texas hospitals reported a need for 10,749 additional professional and technical personnel for 1971 (i.e., 4,448 funded open positions plus 6,301 additional anticipated

vacancies for 1971). This number represents a 13 percent increase in full-time equivalent personnel presently employed. While the 3,200 needed registered nurses represented the greatest numerical shortage for 1971, the required proportional increase of 19 percent was not the largest in terms of all hospital professional and technical personnel. A 22 percent increase in the apartic service personnel represented the greatest proportional need for 1971. Within the therapeutic services, hospitals reported a need for a 78 percent increase in speech pathologists and audiologists, a 40 percent increase in social workers, and a 29 percent increase in physical therapists for 1971.

TEXAS: NURSING HOMES

In July 1970, there were nearly 36,000 persons employed in allied health occupations in Texas' 897 nursing homes. Of this number, approximately 25,000 were employed in the allied health professional and technical occupational categories. About three-fourths of the health professional and technical employees were reported as working 35 or more hours per week.

Nursing service personnel comprised the bulk of allied health professional and technical employees in nursing homes in 1970 with about 9 out of 10 allied health workers being reported in nursing service categories. About 75 out of every 100 nursing service personnel were nursing aides, orderlies, or attendants, 20 were licensed vocational nurses, and 5 were registered nurses. Among nonnursing services,

Dietitian, A.D.A. comprised the single largest category. Of the 599 A.D.A. Dietitians in Texas nursing homes 432 were employed on a part-time basis. Other categories having at least 200 employees were: food service manager (556), other dietitians (208), and licensed pharmacists (206 including 136 part-time). Only 391 positions, or less than 2 percent of equivalent full-time positions were reported as being budgeted and vacant in allied health professional and technical categories at the time of the survey. Needs for 1971 were expressed for 1,300 full-time professionals and technicians in addition to budgeted vacancies. In total an additional need of 1,691 health professional and technical personnel, or about 7 percent increase over present equivalent full-time positions, was reported for 1971.

Full-time equivalents were based on full-time employees plus part-time hours divided by 40 hours per week. The part-time hours for nursing home personnel were based on a mean of parttime hours worked by each occupation, generated by a sampling of 118 nursing homes.

TEXAS: PUBLIC HEALTH

In July 1970, there were over 3,500 allied health personnel employed by public health departments in Texas. Of this number, approximately 45 percent (575) were employed in the allied health professional and technical occupational categories.

The universe of this study was 69 full-time Local Health Departments and Districts and the Texas State Department of Health main offices in Austin. The returns from 64 Local Health Departments and Districts along with the State Health Department offices have been used to estimate data for that total.

Nursing services personnel comprised the greatest number of allied health professional and technical employees in Texas' public health facilities with about 7 out of 10 professional and technical health workers being reported in the nursing services category. About 67 out of every 100 nursing services personnel were registered nurses; 12 were licensed vocational nurses; 11 were nursing aides, orderlies and attendants; and 10 were surgical technical aides.

Among other allied health professional and technical occupations, laboratory assistants and aides (95) comprised the single largest category, followed by medical technologists (64).

There were 132 positions, or less than 8 percent of the equivalent full-time positions, reported as being budgeted and vacant in allied health professional and technical categories at the time of the survey. The highest number of vacancies was for registered nurses (61).

Texas' public health facilities reported a need for 196 additional professional and technical personnel for 1971 (i.e., 132 current funded open positions plus 64 additional anticipated vacancies for 1971). This number represents a 13 percent increase in full-time equivalent personnel presently employed. While the 88 needed registered nurses represented the greatest numerical shortage for 1971, a 29 percent increase in therapeutic services personnel represented the greatest proportional increase needed for 1971.

TEXAS: INSTITUTIONS OF MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION

There are 47 institutions of mental health and mental retardation in Texas. Of these, there are 23 community mental health and mental retardation services and 24 state institutions.

Statistical data for 24 state institutions was obtained from the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation Central Office, Austin, Texas. State mental inalth and mental retardation institutions include eight stall mental hospitals, nine special schools for the mentally retarded, two mental health out-patient clinics, three state centers for human development, the Rio Grande State Center for Mental Health and Mental Retardation, and the Texas Research Institute of Mental Sciences in Houston. Data presented by the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation described full-time equivalents only, with part-time personnel listed when less than one full-time equivalent was indicated. No additional anticipated vacancies were provided for state mental health and mental retardation institutions.

Twenty-three community mental health and mental retardation institutions were surveyed during July 1970, and returns from 18 have been used to estimate data for that total. Additional anticipated vacancies for 1971, presented in table for the total of state and community institutions, actually are representative of only community institutions.

In July 1970, there were nearly 13,000 full-time equivalent persons employed in allied health occupations in Texas' 47 mental health and mental retardation institutions. Of this number, approximately 8,500 were employed in the allied health professional and technical occupational categories.

Nursing services personnel comprised the bulk of allied health professional and technical employees in 1970 with about 9 out of 10 allied health workers being reported in nursing services categories. About 95 out of every 100 nursing services personnel were nursing aides, orderlies and attendants, 4 were registered nurses, and 1 was a licensed vocational nurse. Among nonnursing services, social workers (278) comprised the single latest category, followed by "other professional and technical personnel" (274) which includes therapy technicians, rehabilitation technicians, health educators, research assistants, bacteriologists, etc.

There were 623 positions or 7 percent of the equivalent full-time positions, reported as being budgeted and vacant in allied health professional and technical categories at the time of the survey. The highest number of vacancies was for aides, orderlies and attendants (412). Greater than 14 percent of therapeutic services positions were budgeted and unfilled including 40 social workers, 11 social worker assistants, and 7 occupational therapists.

HEALTH CARE FACILITIES IN INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION

In July 1970 there were over 6,600 allied health personnel employed by senior and junior colleges in Texas. These personnel were primarily employed in college infirmaries and college health care centers and related facilities. Of this number, approximately 60 percent (3,822) were employed in the allied health professional and technical occupational categories.

The universe of the college survey was 127 Texas senior and junior colleges as reported by the Texas College and University System Coordinating Board in Austin. The returns from 106 colleges have been used to estimate data for that total. Included in the study were 30 public colleges and universities with a total enrollment of 227,515 students; 41 private senior colleges and universities with a total of 64,948 students enrolled; 40 public junior colleges with 96,524 students enrolled; and 16 private junior colleges with a total enrollment of 9,145 students.

Nursing-service personnel comprised the bulk of allied health professional and technical employees in colleges in 1970 with about 5 out of 10 health workers being reported in the nursing-service category. About 48 out of every 100 nursing-service personnel were registered nurses and 22 were licensed vocational nurses. Among other allied health occupations, ward clerks (184) comprised the single largest category. Other categories having at least 100 employees were: laboratory assistants and aides (183), medical technologists (172), and radiologic technologists (100).

There were 816 positions, or more than 19 percent of the equivalent full-time positions, reported as being budgeted and vacant in allied health professional and technical categories at the time of the survey. However, caution should be exercised in interpreting the figures shown for the category "Other Pro. and Tech." The relatively large numbers for both full-time employees and funded open positions (492) probably represents, in part, errors in reporting and inclusion of some faculty considered to be unrelated to allied health care (i.e., biology professors, chemistry instructors, etc.). Future needs were expressed for 302 full-time health professionals and technicians in addition to budgeted vacancies for 1971. Among the major occupational categories, Therapeutic Services (51%) reported the single largest increase in currently filled allied health professional and technical positions for 1971 followed by medical records (46%), radiology (28%), and nursing service (24%)

TEXAS: SECONDARY AND ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

The Texas Department of Public Health reported in July 1970 that there were 1,438 registered nurses and 22 licensed vocational nurses in the employment of 412 Texas public school districts and county offices. In addition, 111 private schools were surveyed and it was found that 32 registered nurses, 13 licensed vocational nurses and 4 nurses aides were employed. These positions are fairly lucrative

and therefore no funded vacancies were reported. These positions are fairly lucrative and therefore no funded vacancies were reported. In many cases Public Health facilities within the community have furnished public health nurses for use within the school system in that community. These positions are covered under *Texas: Public Health*.

TEXAS: HOME HEALTH AGENCIES

There are 63 Home Health Agencies certified by the Division of Home Health Services of the Texas State Department of Health. Of these, 18 are City and County Health Departments and units, and 45 are Home Health Services, Home Health America, and visiting nurses associations. The 18 Heat to the nents and units have been surveyed along with sty, County, and State Health Departments and the ⊸∈ited in *Texas: Public Health* (page 12). The ur, home health services here presented includes the abovementioned 45 home health services. The returns from 27 home health services have been used to determine data for that total. Special thanks is given to Mr. Richard Bergen, Home Health Association of Texas, Incorporated, for his assistance in conducting this study.

In August 1970, there were 904 persons employed in

allied health occupations in Texas home health services. Of this number, approximately 85 percent (768) were employed in the allied health professional and technical occupational categories.

There were 638 employees reported in nursing services—270 were registered nurses, 208 were home health aides, and 160 were licensed vocational nurses. Home Health Aides—also called home aides or visiting health aides—give supportive services which are required to provide and maintain normal bodily and emotional comfort and to assist the patient toward independent living in a safe environment. The services are given under the supervision of a nurse, or, when appropriate, of a physical, speech, or occupational therapist. Future needs were expressed for 53 full-time home health aides for 1971, or an increase of 28 percent of current equivalent full-time positions reported.

TEXAS: SOCIAL SECURITY APPROVED LABORATORIES

There are 183 laboratory facilities certified by the Social Security Administration for Medicare in Texas. This number is not, by any means, representative of the over 1,500 clinical, medical, pathological, and analytical laboratories active in Texas. However, the majority of these facilities are prated by physicians and their personnel are included in sections on medical doctors, dentists, osteopaths, etc.

This section is intended to show only laboratory manpower not included in the survey of practitioner's offices.

In July 1970, there were over 1,450 persons employed in allied health occupations in Texas' 183 social security approved laboratory facilities. Of this number, approximately 1,200 were employed in the allied health professional and technical occupational categories.

Diagnostic services personnel comprised the bulk of allied health professional and technical employees with about 7 out of 10 allied health workers being reported in diagnostic services categories. About 61 out of every 100 diagnostic services personnel were medical technologists, 22 were laboratory assistants and aides, 7 were histotechnologists, 6 were cytotechnologists, and 2 were Certified Lab Assistants. Among nondiagnostic services personnel, radiologic technologists comprised the single largest category (36).

Only 37 positions, or less than 4 percent of equivalent full-time positions, were reported as being budgeted and

vacant in allied health professional and technical categories at the time of the survey. The highest number of vacancies was for medical technologists (22).

Texas Social Security approved laboratories reported a need of 126 additional professional and technical personnel for 1971 (i.e., 37 current funded open positions plus 89 additional anticipated vacancies for 1971). This number represents a 13 percent increase in full-time equivalent personnel presently employed. The greatest need for 1971 was for 67 more medical technologists than currently employed.

TEXAS: DOCTORS OF MEDICINE

Because doctors of medicine play an important role in the production of health care services, there is considerable emphasis placed on physicians in the study of health manpower. The physician's traditional role includes not only the performance of examinations and diagnostic, surgical, and therapeutic procedures, but also the coordination or management of health care services provided by allied health personnel. The much greater use of allied health workers in recent years has greatly increased the physician's flexibility and productivity. As an employer the doctor of medicine indicates an ever increasing demand for allied health manpower.

in July 1970, there were nearly 30,000 persons employed in allied health occupations in medical practitioners' offices. Of this number, approximately 60 percent (17,315) were employed in the allied health professional and technical categories. The universe of the medical doctor study was 12,441 doctors licensed in Texas. The returns from 8,023 doctors have been used to estimate data for that total.

Nursing-services personnel comprised the majority of health professional and technical employees in medical practitioners offices, accounting for about 37 percent of all allied health professional and technical office personnel. About 49 out of every 100 nursing-service personnel were registered nurses and 49 were licensed vocational nurses. Among other allied health professional and technical occupations, medical assistants (5,514) comprised the single largest category followed by medical technologists (2,410), radiologic technologists (1,551), and laboratory assistants and aides (796).

There were 594 budgeted positions for professional and technical personnel vacant in July of 1970. This represented a vacancy rate of almost 3 percent. The highest number of vacancies was for medical technologists (138) followed by registered nurses (124), licensed vocational nurses (107), and medical assistants (102).

Texes medical doctors reported a need for 1,525 additional professional and technical personnel for 1971 (i.e., 531 funded open positions plus 931 additional anticipated vacancies for 1971). This number represents a 10 percent increase in full-time equivalent personnel presently employed. The greatest numerical increases included 334



registered nurses, 292 licensed vocational nurses, 291 medical assistants, and 285 medical technologists. In terms of allied health professional and technical personnel, the great-

est proportional increase for 1971 was a 36 percent increase in certified laboratory assistants.

TEXAS: DOCTORS OF OPTOMETRY

Optometrists examine the eyes and related structures to determine the presence of vision problems, eye disease, or other abnormalities. They prescribe and adapt lenses or other optical aids and may use visual training aides, when indicated, to preserve or restore maximum efficiency of vision. In July, 1970 there were 805 practicing optometrists in Texas. There were 1,851 allied health personnel employed by optometrists. Of this number, 1,390 were employed in optometric professional and technical occupational categories. Among these professional and technical occupations, optometric assistants (714) comprised the

single largest category. Other categories include: dispensing optician (423), optometric lab technician (162), and optometric technician (55). Of these four primary optometric allied health occupations only 53 positions, or less than 4 percent of equivalent full-time positions, were reported as being budgeted and vacant at the time of the survey. Requirements for 1971 were expressed for 161 full-time optometric assistants, technicians, lab technicians, and dispensary opticians, in addition to current budgeted vacancies.

TEXAS: OSTEOPATHIC PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS

In July 1970, there were nearly 1,900 persons employed in allied health occupations by Texas Osteopathic physicians and surgeons. Of this number, approximately 60 percent (1,124) were employed in the allied health professional and technical occupational categories. The universe of the osteopathic physicians and surgeons study was 839 Doctors of Osteopathy. The returns from 506 osteopaths have been used to estimate data for that total.

The largest categories of professional and technical allied health employees were medical assistants (505), licensed vocational nurses (272), medical technologists (82), regis-

tered nurses (82), and laboratory assistants and aides (62). Only 17 budgeted positions for professional and technical personnel in practitioners offices were vacant in July of 1970. This represented a vacancy rate of less than 2 percent.

Texas Osteopathic physicians and surgeons reported a need for 79 additional professional and lical personnel for 1971 (i.e., 17 funded open positions plus 62 additional anticipated vacancies for 1971). This number represents an 8 percent increase in full-time equivalent personnel presently employed.

TEXAS: DOCTORS OF DENTAL SURGERY

"Although the ratio of dentists to population is expected to remain about the same in future years, this does not mean that adequate dental care will be available for all persons. By 1980, demands for dental care are expected to almost double as a result of rising incomes and education levels, increasing population, and new methods of financing dental services." In as much as Texas' future supply of dentists will not be adequate, it is necessary that dentist

productivity be substantially increased, primarily through much greater utilization of dental allied personnel. Despite the rapid expansion in training facilities for dental auxiliaries that has occurred in recent years, the present prospect is for a continuing shortage of trained dental auxiliaries.

The Texas dental allied work force of about 9,000 now employed by the 4,096 Texas dentists comprised three primary occupations—dental hygienist (762), dental assistant (5,680), and dental laboratory technician (479). The remaining allied health workers include nursing personnel and

clerical employees. Dental hygienists are required to complete at least two years of preparation beyond high school for an associate degree or the basic certificate. Relatively a few dental assistants and only a small number of dental laboratory technicians have had technical training. Accredited programs for training dental laboratory technicians, which must be at least two years in length, have just begun to be established. Dental assistant training programs, which must be at least one academic year in length, have been in existence for a longer time.

Presently, over 19 percent of the full-time equivalent

budgeted positions for dental hygienists are vacant. There are vacancies for 9 percent of the full-time equivalent budgeted positions for dental laboratory technicians and over 2 percent of the positions for dental assistants.

In order to fill required needs for 1971 it has been anticipated by doctors of dentistry that there is need for a 64 percent increase over the present number of full-time equivalent dental hygienists, 11 percent increase over present dental assistants and 22 percent increase over present dental lab technicians.

TEXAS: DOCTORS OF PODIATRY

Podiatry is that profession which deals with the examination, diagnosis, prevention, treatment and care of conditions and functions of the human foot. The podiatrist performs surgical and other operative procedures on the foot, prescribes corrective devices, and prescribes and administers drugs and physical therapy.

In July 1970, there were 183 podiatrists licensed in Texas. Probably 95 percent of these registered podiatrists are active practitioners. There were at the time of the survey some 285 allied health employees working for podia-

trists in Texas. Of this number, approximately three-fourths (204) were employed as podiatry assistants. Twelve positions, or 12 percent of equivalent full-time podiatry assistants, were reported as being budgeted and vacant in podiatrist's offices at the time of the survey. Requirements for 1971 were expressed for 31 full-time podiatry assistants in addition to budgeted vacancies. In total, an additional need for 43 podiatry assistants, or about a 23 percent increase over the present number of occupied full-time equivalent positions, was reported.

ALLIED HEALTH EDUCATION

Allied Health Education Programs are quite diverse in characteristics. Time references range from years of formal education to e few weeks or days of on-the-job training. Expertise of instructors ranges from medical specialists to experienced housekeepers. Facilities range from hospital laundry rooms to multimedia classrooms with computer assisted institution adjacent to operating suites. Allied health education programs are administered from secondary schools, hospitals, technical institutes, doctors's offices, community colleges, and universities. Some programs have been in existence for many years while others are opened only as newly trained personnel are needed. These great diversities have been one of the greatest contributing factors to the allied health manpower shortages. No statewide and little regional planning to alleviate the shortages has been possible because heretofore few attempts have been made at defining allied health education programs and their effect on shortages.

Historically those health workers which are now called allied health personnel have been trained in hospitals or doctor's offices. Due in main to increased societal pressures, educational programs have become more formalized in recent years and at the same time been accepted as a public responsibility. As a resultant, more and more allied health education programs are opening in public educational institutions. There are many good reasons that allied health education programs should be located in public education institutions. Some of the reasons are efficiency of administration and operation, education by professional educators, and effectiveness of many specialists. However, it behooves all concerned that assurances be made in order that allied health education not follow the pattern of many other such programs which have been turned over to public education. Should educators become insensitive to needs and desires of the health care delivery system then the trend from private to public education will reverse.

Terminology of allied health is almost as complex and diverse as the system of education. It has been generally accepted that the professional nurses, technologists, therapists, librarians, administrators and a few others are professionals and require minimums of baccalaureate education in accredited colleges and universities. Technicians assistants, and some specialists (such as dental hygienists) require one or two years beyond high school while many others require high school level or only a small amount of training beyond. There are many exceptions to the above, one of which are the Diploma nurses who, with a three year educational program located within a hospital, represent the vast majority of professional nurses in Texas. This serves to remind all that theory and concepts are an absolute necessity, but there is no substitute for real experience. As public emerging as the educational entity most attuned to the local needs for allied health. Of particular interest is the

allied health education gains in popularity and sophistication, more private programs will close simply as a replacement process. The public community college seems to be

school of allied health sciences concept which is presently

in its infancy stages. Additionally, the pedagogical terminology of "career ladder," "modular approach," and "lateral mobility" hold bright spots for the futureprovided the end products are of the quality to provide adequate health care for the populace of Texas.

Even though many new allied health educational programs have been established in recent years and despite a rather high rate of expansion foreseen for coming years, the anticipated requirements are far in excess of what is expected.

In October 1970, there were 7,079 students enrolled in registered nursing programs in Texas. Of this number, 3,727 were at the baccalaureate level and 3,352 were at less than baccalaureate level. The total enrollment of registered nurses was an 18 percent increase over the number of students enrolled in the 1969-70 school year. There was a 116 percent increase in Inhalation Therapist program enrollment; an 85 percent increase in Medical Assistant program enrollment; and a 17 percent increase in Licensed Vocational Nurse program enrollment.

In 1970 there were 4,806 graduates of the selected allied health education programs found in table 18 Of this number, 882 were at the baccalaureate level and 3,924 at less than baccalaureate level. At the baccalaureate level, the largest number of graduates was in baccalaureate nursing (557), followed by medical technology (235), physical therapy $(65)^1$ and occupational therapy (25).

At less than baccalaureate level, licensed vocational nursing had the largest number of graduates (2,605). There were 472 graduates of associate degree nursing, 380 for diploma nursing, 231² for radiologic technology, and 85 for dental hygiene.

The reported approved student capacity for the selected allied health education programs in table 18 was 12,137 seats. However, this figure does not include student capacities reported as "unlimited" nor does it include those programs not reporting an approved student capacity. There were three programs with "unlimited" capacities which had a combined total of 2,155 students enrolled. In addition,



there were six programs that did not report an approved student capacity, but which did report a total of 833 students enrolled. This would indicate that the total student capacity for these selected allied health programs is at least 15,125. Table 19 shows a comparison between the student capacities mentioned above for the schools terms 1969-70 and 1970-71.

Any comparison made between figures in table 18 and table 19 should be considered with the greatest caution. The fact that there is a greater number of approved seats than student enrollment encourages the consideration of many factors which are beyond the scope of this report. Some points to consider include:

- (1) Student attrition over the course of the program substantially increases the gap between approved student capacity and student enrollment.
- (2) Many schools include pre-allied health occupational studies in their first year, and thus have large first year student enrollment which substantially drops by the second year.
- (3) For some programs, "approved student capacity" does not necessarily mean that the program always has the required space, equipment, or faculty to adequately train the approved number of students.
- (4) In many schools with programs of more than one year, capacities have recently been increased. For this reason, it will take some years for the student enrollment in second, third, or fourth year classes to increase.

CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

For almost every allied health occupation, survey results which enumerate the persons performing the professional and technical function yield larger estimates of the number employed than of the number of registered or certified active workers. For example, in 1970 there were approximately 1,200 active dietitians who were members of the American Dietetic Association. (Membership in the Association or completion of an ADA-approved-internship provides the standard of proficiency in this field, in lieu of certification or licensing.) However, about 600 additional persons were estimated to be working as dietitians at the time. A more strict or more lenient interpretation of who should be classified as a professional dietitian could change this estimate considerably.

Employment statistics for major allied health occupations, therefore, reflect the persons working regardless of their qualifications. Requirement statistics, represent, for the most part, a demand for persons trained up to a level of proficiency compatible with modern standards of medical care. Also the work force has grown to the point that as a practical matter, formal training programs can be counted on to produce a major portion of the numbers required.

These requirements are now large and show every evidence of continued growth. Before looking at the future, however, it would be useful to know the extent of the present shortage of major allied health workers. The data available conservatively indicates a statewide need of approximately 20 percent more allied health personnel. The additional workers required by this estimate are not all that are needed to meet present objectives in adequate medical care, but they do represent a number which, if available, would find employment with little difficulty.

Estimates of future supply of selected major allied health occupations are shown in Table 21. These estimates are based upon predictions of the increase in Texas' population. The 1970 total of 59,000 selected allied health workers in Table is expected to increase to about 68,000 by 1976. Although it is difficult to anticipate the economic conditions governing the employment of these workers in 1980, it is probably conservative to predict a supply in that year of 85,000.

These projections are derived from population trends and they imply that future requirements will be at least at the levels mentioned above. Most probably there will con-

tinue to be a substantial manpower deficit. The present deficit is a product of full-employment of professional and technically-trained manpower combined with expansion, technological change, and increasing administrative complexity in the health services industry. Assuming these conditions to continue, employment will lag behind requirements.

These projections of current employment trends are subject to a number of uncertainties. Notably, if adequate numbers of allied health manpower at the baccalaureate level are not prepared, it can be expected that additional subbaccalaureate personnel will be pressed into service. Furthermore, it is not implied that such numbers of adequately trained manpower will be available in 1976 or 1980. The projections include, as do the data on current employment on which they are based, all persons working in the specified occupations, whether or not they have training considered to be appropriate.


Although the number of graduates is increasing, the current output of new workers is small in porportion to the work force. Relevant educational data for selected allied health occupational categories are given in Table 22. Where the number of expected graduates for 1971 is given, the

Only a fraction of the educational effort for the above selected occupations has been identified. Table 22 accounts for approximately 10,000 annual graduates for these 13 selected allied health occupational categories, although the size of the current work force requires many times this number of annual additions merely to replace future losses due to marriage, mobility, and retirement from the occupational category. Many individuals in this group continue to be trained in apprentice programs and on-the-job. For many of these occupations, professional life expectancy (that is, the total years worked in the occupation by an individual) in short, and institutional turnover is very high. Education capabilities, therefore, will continue to be strained.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Studies of health manpower made over the years have shown repeatedly that, despite the increasing supply, demands for allied health personnel continue to out strip the resources for producing them. Supply and demand, according to present evidence, will not soon be in balance. The task ahead is not only to increase the supply of well-qualified allied health workers, but also of equal urgency to make the best use of the resources which are available.

Allied Health Manpower in Texas, 1970 points out opportunities for study, experimentation, and action in these directions. The main purpose is (1) to increase the allied health manpower supply; (2) to improve education and training; (3) to use allied health manpower more effectively; (4) to provide a sound basis for more effective and better coordinated planning, and formulating policies.

Underlying all the discussion is the expectation that continuing study and experimentation will help all manpower programs to respond to the needs of the society, even though these needs may change rapidly.

Increasing the Health Manpower Supply. The greatest impact on allied health personnel shortages are graduates from training facilities. In order that these facilities maintain present levels of enrollment and fill future enrollment needs, it is recommended that existing health personnel recruitment programs be encouraged to continue their efforts, that research into ethnic recruitment into the health care field be facilitated, and that allied health training facilities should be encouraged to utilize recruitment resources on both the short and long range operational levels.

Young people should be made aware of the opportunities in the field of health early in their school experience, as well as when they complete high school and junior or senior college. The opportunities to recruit the over thirty employees, are also substantial, as shown by the increasing number of women returning to the labor market.


Improving Education and Training. Allied health educational resources are presently fragmented. Efforts should be made to study curriculums in recognized job categories, as well as "new" allied health careers. The design of curriculums that would be consistent throughout all training programs should be undertaken in order that graduates have a common level of knowledge. Efforts should be made to investigate the core approach to facilitate lateral and vertical mobility. Finally, efforts should be made to open new and expand existing educational programs.

Health Manpower Utilization. Nothing is more impor-

tant than using the existing supply of allied health manpower most effectively. The first step is to examine carefully how our limited supply of allied health personnel functions at present. The problem must be viewed as a statewide one and the approach must be systematic, based on sound knowledge of the operations, with the needs of the patient identified and kept paramount. Planning for the use of allied health personnel must be quickly responsive to changing knowledge, social changes, and the increasing expectation of health service consumers.

SOUTH TEXAS STATE PLANNING REGION

POPULATION: 94,403



Excitement and languor abide side by side in the four-county (6,643 square miles) South Te Planning RegionWEBB which has Laredo in Webb County as its focus point. This strong south-of-the-border-flavored city is Teless' major Mexico entry p int. Webb County shares farming, ranching, mineral resource production, and a predominantly Spanish surname population with other counties in the region—but its entry port role is unique. More than two and one-half million vehicles and eight million persons annually cross the International Bridge spanning the Rio Grande between Laredo and Nuevo Laredo.

Hebbronville in Jim Hogg County is the center of a predominantly oil economy in contrast to other regional counties. Most of the terrain in the Laredo to Hebbronville area is bushy, caccus-thick native pasture, little changed from the landscape of previous centuries.

South Texts Planning Region has 1,420 allied health employees working for 81 health employers. Nearly 80 percent of the allied health employers work in Webb County. The region's six hospitals, two nursing homes, and 49 medical doctors are the major employers of allied health workers.

Needs were expressed for 188 full-time allied health personne, in addition to those currently employed, for 1971. The most immediate needs for allied health manpower are in nursing services. By 197 South Texas Planning Region needs 35 registered nurses; and 52 more nursing aides, orderlies, and attendants.



Corpus Christi is the focal point for the 12-county (12,193 square miles) Coastal Bend Planning Region. It is the communication, shopping, and marketing center for the coastal region. Millions of cargo tons are handled annually by this Nueces County port city through its 40-foot-deep channel.

From populous Nucces County to Kenedy County, one of the least populated counties in the State, the region is linked with common interests in cotton, oil, and ranching. The farther the county is from the Gulf Coast, the more cotton and ranching increase in economic importance while oil declines

Coastal Bend Planning Region has 7,264 allied 2health employees working for 665 health employers. Over 70 der-

cent of the allied health employers workin Nueces County. The region's 22 hospitals, 20 nursing homes, and 379 medical doctors are the major amproyers of allied health workers.

Needs were expressed for 1312 full time allied health personnel, in addition to those cuttently employed, for 1971. The most immediate needs for allied health manpower are in nursing services By 1971, Coastal Bend Planning Region needs 253 more registered nurses; 184 more licensed vocational nurses; and 238 more nursing aides, orderlies, and attendards. There is also need for 48 more therapeutic services employees by 1971. This is an increase of 33 percent over the present number of therapeutic services workers.

Today, the Valley is such a strip of urban and urbanizing areas that no one city can be identified as the focal point for the three-county (3,019 square miles) Lower Rio Grande Valley Planning Region. Three cities, McAllen, Harlingen, and Brownsville share the primary influence.

McAllen in Hidalgo County is economically bolstered by tourists, the citrus industry, truck fartning, international trade and oil and gas. Harlingen in Cameron County combines small town friendliness with big city facilities. Train loads of grapefruit and oranges are shipped in winter and tons of cotton are shipped in summer. Brownsville is the southernmost incorporated city in the nation and home of Texas Southmost College. Although 17 miles from the sea, a ship channel has made Brownsville an important port for both Texas and Mexico. It docks the largest fleet of fishing trawlers in the United States and boasts the largest annual

hauliof shrimp of any port on earth.

Lower Rio Grande Palley Planning Region has 4,389 allied health employees working for 383 health employers. The region's 14 hospitals 25 nursing homes, and 221 medical doctors are the major employers of allied health workers.

Needs were expressed for 349 full-time allied health personnet cinvaddition to those currently employed, for 1971. The most immediate needs for allied health manpower are in marsing services. By 1911, lawer Rio Grande Valley Planning Region needs 27 more rigistered nurses; 77 more licensed vocational nurses; and 69 more nursing aides, orderlies, and attendants. There is also need for 23 more therapeutic services and loves by 1971. This is an increase of 33 percent over the present number of therapeutic services workers.



PART III

COUNTY ALLIED HEALTH MANPOWER AND EDUCATION



INTRODUCTION

The following pages describe allied health manpower and education in Texas' 254 counties. Texas counties range in size from Brewster County, comprising a land area equal to that of Connecticut plus Rhode Island (6,208 square miles), to Camp County, Texas' smallest (109 square miles). County populations range from 150 (1970 Preliminary) in Loving County to 1,722,533 (1970 Preliminary) in Harris County. With such great extremes in size and numbers it is only natural that allied health manpower figures are also extremely diversified in Texas counties.

Harris County and Dallas County, Texas' most populated, are also the largest employers of health manpower. Harris County has 55 hospitals, 64 nursing homes, and nearly 3,000 doctors of medicine among a total of 4,015 health employers. Dallas County has 57 hospitals, 61 nursing homes, and over 2,000 doctors of medicine among a total of 3,262 health employers. These counties alone account for over 34 percent of all health employers in Texas, and 56,222 of the reported allied health employees. On the other extreme, there are 13 Texas counties that have no health employers or employees at all.

The data presented in the following pages on manpower

is unadjusted (i.e., represents only those totals *reported* for each county). Each county is reviewed as to number of health care employers surveyed and number of survey returns. Following the survey information table for each county is the manpower data table describing, by occupation, the total number of full-time employees, part-time employees, hours worked by part-time employees, funded open positions, and additional anticipated vacancies for 1971 reported by those employers returning their survey questionnaires.

There are 457 allied health education programs scattered throughout 127 Texas counties. Harris County, with 51 allied health education programs, has the most of any county in Texas. However, there are 62 programs in the Dallas-Ft. Worth area to combine for the most concentrated number of allied health programs. Licensed Vocational Nurse programs are the most widely distributed programs in Texas with 124 counties having at least one L.V.N. program. Every allied health program in Texas is presented by institution in its respective alphabetically listed county.







STATISTICAL PROCEDURES

The statistics presented in this report were derived from responses to a questionnaire mailed to a universe of 20,909 major health employers. Of the 14,377 questionnaires returned, 524 were found to be out-of-business in Texas at the time of the survey. These included those closed, moved out of state, retired, or deceased. Completed questionnaires were received from 13,853 or 67 percent of the 20,379 in-business employers.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE). Full-time equivalents are presented in order to statistically compare manpower data totals that might otherwise be unrelated because of differences in part-time employment practices. Full-time equivalent is defined as follows:

Projections. The projections presented in Table 4., Texas Allied Health Manpower, 1970 were based on projected population estimates of The University of Texas Bureau of Business Research. The year 1971 was used as the base year from which manpower projections were made. The base number of 1971 full-time equivalent personnel in each career category was established from information reported by each health employer.

Sampling. The statistics in this report on hospital and nursing homes "part-time hours worked" were based on a stratified sampling of 113 hospitals and 118 nursing homes. Strata were designed on the basis of (1) hospital and nursing home bed size, (2) geographic location, and (3) size of community where institution was located. For those occupations where too little data was obtained, one part-time employee was assumed to work half-time or twenty hours per week. Since these statistics are based on a sample of hospitals and nursing homes rather than all such institutions, they are subject to sampling error. As a rough guideline for use in assessing the reliability of any PART-TIME HOURS WORKED figure in the tables presented in this report, the coefficient of variation or relative sampling error for estimates of employment in occupational categories is approximately 3 percent.

Adjustments. Returns from Texas' 13 major health employer categories have been adjusted upward to reflect 100 percent return. Adjustments were made on a regional as well as a state level.

(1) Hospitals. Adjustments of hospital manpower data were based on the assumption that hospital staffing patterns depend on hospital bed size. A 79 percent response (507 of 642 hospitals) of all hospitals surveyed accounted for 89 percent (53,385 of 59,751 hospital beds) of all hospital beds. The following formula reflects the adjustment of each figure (full-time employees, part-time employees, full-time equivalent, funded open positions, and additional anticipated vacancies for 1971) within each occupational category:

- (2) Nursing Homes. Adjustments of nursing home manpower data were based on the assumption that nursing home staffing patterns depend on nursing home nursing bed size. An 80 percent response (718 of 897 nursing homes) of all nursing homes surveyed accounted for 81 percent (41,420 of 51,084 nursing beds) of all nursing home nursing beds. Adjustments were based on the formula above.
- (3) All Others. All other employer category adjustments were based on percentage of returns and are represented by the following formula:
