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ABSTRACT

This booklet is the sixth in a series of informative publications from the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM). The statistical information is based on the 1971-72 annual reports of member institutions of the association and on an addendum filed in the fall of 1972. Of the 384 institutional members of the NASM in 1971-72, 320 submitted annual reports and 287 filed the addendum. In most cases statistical information is reported by size and type of institution. Two categories, private and tax-supported, were employed for type of institution; size categories were determined according to numbers of music major students. Statistics from 2-year college members are included in all categories except enrollments, where they are not appropriate. The contents are divided into four sections: enrollments; admissions policies; budgets and equipment (including library expenditures, expenditure per student, and use of music synthesizers); and faculty (including salary and teaching load). 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PREFACE

This booklet is the sixth in a series of informative publications from the National Association of Schools of Music. The statistical information contained herein is based on the 1971-72 annual reports of member institutions to the Association, and on an addendum to that report filed in the fall of 1972. Of the 384 institutional members of the NASM in 1971-72, 320 submitted annual reports and 287 filed the addendum.

Every effort has been made to preserve the confidentiality of institutional annual reports. In most cases statistical information is reported by size and type of institution. Two categories, private and tax-supported, were employed for type of institution; size categories were determined according to numbers of music major students. The number of institutions reporting the various types of information varies because some reports were incomplete. Statistics from two-year college members are included in all categories except enrollments, where they are not appropriate.

The following is a sample of the form in which most of the statistical information is presented. (Figures are for library expenditures per music major student in private institutions with 101-200 music majors.)

Forty institutions of this size and type reported this information. The range is indicated by the lowest reported figure and the highest reported: \$2-\$64. The lowest and highest reported figures are, in most cases, single incidences.

Twenty-five percent, or ten, of the institutions of this size and type reported a library expenditure of less than \$13 per music major student. The median figure is represented by the 50th percentile: fifty percent, or twenty, of the institutions reported a library expenditure of less than \$19 per music major student and fifty percent reported an expenditure greater than that amount. Seventy-five percent, or thirty of the forty institutions in this category, reported an expenditure of less than \$34 per student. The mean, or arithmetic average, expenditure was \$24 per music major student.

In reading these charts it is important to keep in mind that the lowest and highest reported figures, or range, are extremes. The best overall indicators are the mean (average) and median (50th percentile). The reader will note that in most instances these two figures are quite comparable, usually indicating a basically normal distribution.

This publication, MUSIC IN HIGHER EDUCATION: 1971-72, represents a continuing project. It is our hope that the members of the National Association of Schools of Music will be generous in sending suggestions for corrections, modifications, and additions.

ENROLLMENTS

In reporting percentages of students in "specific" undergraduate degree programs, the labels "BM," "BA," and "BME," were used in the interest of brevity. The Annual Report Form by which these data were gathered defined the degree types as follows:

"BM"	Pre-professional undergraduate <u>music majors</u> (curricula with approximately 2/3 music; e.g., B.M. Exclude music education majors.)
"BA"	Undergraduate liberal arts <u>music majors</u> (curricula with approximately 1/3 music, normally called A.B.)
"BME"	Undergraduate <u>music education majors</u> (curricula leading to teaching certificate.)

Masters degree enrollment statistics are reported in two categories: music education, and all others, exclusive of music education.

Doctoral degree programs, however, are defined as follows:

"DMA"	Doctoral programs in musical practice (e.g., D.M.A.; Music D.; Ph.D. in Applied Music, Composition, etc.)
"Educ"	Doctoral programs in music education (e.g., Ed.D. in Music Ed.; Ph.D. in Music Ed.; D.M.A. in Music Ed.)
"Ph.D."	Doctoral programs in musical research (e.g., Ph.D.)

FACULTY
