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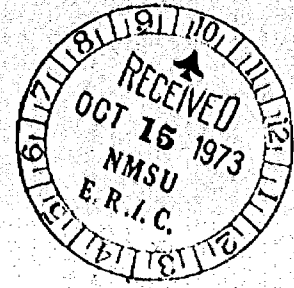
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ABSTRACT

A collection of 1971-72 racial/ethnic data for the New York school population is given in this paper. Since 1966 such information has been collected annually from all public elementary and secondary schools and is now a part of the Education Department's Basic Data System. It is used within the Department to provide a statewide longitudinal record of school integration. The information includes the racial/ethnic distribution of public school students for the districts of Albany, Buffalo, New York, Rochester, Syracuse, and Yonkers (individually and combined), for the rest of the state, and for the state as a whole; the distribution of black and Spanish surnamed students by location in the state; the distribution of public school students by racial/ethnic origin for 1967-68 through 1971-72; the number of schools and the number and percent of minority students in schools of differing racial composition; the number of schools and the number and percent of black and Spanish surnamed students in schools of differing racial composition; the distribution of public school staff by racial/ethnic origin; and the distribution of public school staff by racial/ethnic origin for 1967-68 through 1971-72. The appendices give the distribution of the public school students and staff by racial/ethnic origin for each school district in the state. (Author/NQ)

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INTRODUCTION

The collection of racial/ethnic data on the school population of New York State was initiated in 1961 with a census of public elementary schools. Since 1966 such information has been collected annually from all public elementary and secondary schools and is now a part of the Department's Basic Educational Data System. The information is used within the Education Department in providing a longitudinal record of school integration throughout the State.

Table 1 presents the 1971-72 racial/ethnic distribution of public school students for the State's "Big Six" * school districts (individually and combined), for the rest of the State and for the State as a whole. Examination of table 1 shows, in part, that (1) excluding the "Big Six" cities, 5.4 percent of the students enrolled in New York State's public elementary and secondary schools are classified in the two major minority groupings--black and Spanish-surnamed American; (2) within New York City, 61.5 percent of the students are of a major minority group, and 36.9 percent are classified as "Other", i.e., neither black, Spanish-surnamed American, American Indian, nor Oriental; (3) in four of the State's six largest cities, over 30 percent of the students are classified as black.

Table 2 details the 1971-72 distribution of black and Spanish-surnamed American students by location in the State. It can be seen that of all public school black students in the State, 72.2 percent attend schools in New York City, while an additional 10.5 percent attend schools in the other five major cities. Some 91.4 percent of the State's Spanish-surnamed American students attend schools in New York City.

Table 3 shows a percent distribution of public school students, by racial/ethnic origin, for the years 1967-68 through 1971-72. In the large cities of the State, the major minority group population of the public schools rose from 48.5 percent in 1967-68 to 57.9 percent in 1971-72. The increase was most pronounced in Rochester where black and Spanish-surnamed American representation in the public schools rose 10.5 percentage points over the 5-year period. The next largest increase was in New York City which showed a 9.5 percentage point rise.

Table 4 shows the number of schools and the number and percent of minority students (black and Spanish-surnamed American) in schools of differing racial composition, i.e., the percent of minority students in the school. Examination of table 4 shows, in part, that (1) there are 653 schools in New York with no black or Spanish-surnamed American students; (2) there are 57 schools in which all students are of a major minority group and that the enrollment in these schools accounts for 6.0 percent of the State's total black and Spanish-surnamed American enrollment; (3) nearly three-quarters (74.6 percent) of the black and Spanish-surnamed American students in New York State's public schools attend a school that can be classified as a minority school, i.e., 50 percent or more of the students are black or Spanish-surnamed American.

Table 5 shows the number of schools and the number and percent of black students in schools of differing racial composition. Examination of table 5 shows, in part, that (1) there are 912 schools in New York with no black students;

(2) there are 13 schools which are all black and that the enrollment in these schools accounts for 1.8 percent of the State's total black enrollment; (3) almost one-half (48.1 percent) of the black students in New York State's public schools attend a school that is predominantly black, i.e., 50 percent or more of the students are black.

Table 6 presents data similar to that of table 5 for Spanish-surnamed American students. It may be seen that while there are no "all Spanish" schools in the State, 44.3 percent of the Spanish-surnamed American students attend schools with enrollments that are predominantly (50 percent or more) of the same ethnic group.

Table 7 shows the distribution of public school staff by racial/ethnic origin. Examination of this table in comparison with table 1 shows that, for the State as a whole, 25.2 percent of the students belong to one of the two major minority groups, while 5.5 percent of the staff fall in these two categories. Similarly, for the "Big Six" cities, 57.9 percent of the students are black or Spanish-surnamed American, while 10.4 percent of the staff are so identified.

Table 8 shows a percent distribution of public school staff, by racial/ethnic origin, for the years 1967-68 through 1971-72. The percent of minority group staff rose from 9.5 to 10.4 in the large cities of the State between 1967-68 and 1971-72. For the total State, minority groups increased from 4.4 percent of public school staff in 1967-68 to 5.3 percent in 1971-72.

Appendix A distributes public school students by racial/ethnic origin for each school district in the State. Appendix B distributes public school staff by racial/ethnic origin for each school district in the State.
