ABSTRACT

OCCUPATIONAL INFORMATION

It is hoped that this listing of materials may be of assistance to the instructor in classes wherever information concerning various occupations is a part of the curriculum.

In 1970's schools should be especially concerned with attitudes and habits which go with successful job performance. This cannot be achieved in one course or one year; rather, this should be an integral part of the emphasis of each course. It is with this in mind, that many of the sources listed may prove helpful not only in securing occupational information but also in assisting students to develop successful job performance attitudes and habits.

SECONDARY SCHOOL CONCERNS

Making academic and career decisions

Acquiring needed educational and vocational information

Developing attitudes and habits for successful job performance

The student develops awareness of his need for more specific implementation of his career purposes.

The student develops more specific plans for implementing his career purposes.

The student executes plans to qualify for entry level jobs by taking appropriate courses at the high school level, by on-the-job training, or by pursuing further training in college or post-secondary vocational education leading toward qualification for some specific occupation.

During the later adolescent years (high school 9-12) individuals are confronted with the necessity of making decisions which will permit them to make the transition from adolescence to adulthood. Consequently, individuals need skills and knowledge in assessing their capabilities, and specific information for decision making. More specifically:

a. The need for opportunities for self-enhancement or humanization---the implementation and articulation of self-image----the socialization
process.



- b. The need to recognize and enhance the contextual variables which implings upon a decision making continuum.
- e. The need for actual support for the notion that change or indecision is not tantamount to failure.

Educational objectives in occupational information studies:

- a. To develop an awareness of individual differences and a knowledge of the positive relationships between individual characteristics and career development.
- b. To develop self-understanding and self-acceptance.
- c. To develop a positive self-image which will promote self-esteem motivation for achievement consistent with individual potential.
- d. To develop an awareness and understanding of the place of work in the lives of people.
- e. To develop an awareness and understanding of the increasing array of educational and career opportunities available.
- f. To develop ability to make decisions and plans based upon factual information, relationships, and inferences.
- g. To make educational and career decisions and plans appropriate to the individual's level of maturity and development.

PROGRAM CONTENT AND PROCEDURES

- a. Introduce in the curriculum appropriate experiences to provide career exploration, decision making, and reality testing for all students.
- b. Develop, distribute, and interpret educational media to facilitiate career development experiences at all age levels.
- c. Expand and encourage the use of simulated and real work situations for career exploration and reality testing.
- d. To teach decision making skills through opportunities in actual participation in making educational, career, and social decisions appropriate to the individual's level of maturity.
- e. Create motivation through active participation and interactions of youth in relating educational experiences to career exploration and decisions --- make education relevant to career-life situations.



- f. Develop and support a program of educational and job placement which will appropriately involve educational personnel in all placement actions.
- g. Incorporate as many laboratory type activities as feasible to enable the student to achieve visible and concrete success as opposed to abstract and delayed symbols of success. This procedure should be investigated as a means of improving the motivation of many "hard to reach" youth.

School administrators, counselors and teachers should be aware of the major objectives of this instruction:

- a. To provide experiences which will enable students to gain fuller awareness and appreciation of the occupational avenues, and the nature of the role played by workers in these occupations.
- b. To contribute to the student's testing of reality by showing the relationship between the requirements of these vocational and the education or training needed to meet them.
- c. To develop attitudes of respect for and appreciation of social usefulness of all types of work.
