ABSTRACT

A supplement to the earlier Aids to Media Selection for Students and Teachers is provided by this guide. It offers an annotated, selected roster of the book lists and periodicals published or revised since 1970 which review materials suitable for use in elementary or secondary school instructional programs. Section I deals with book selection sources, including book selection aids, periodicals, guides and handbooks. Section II covers sources of audiovisual materials, among them general and specialized lists of audiovisual materials for various grade levels, and general and specialized journals which review audiovisual aids. Section III treats sources of multiethnic aids, including teachers' resources for the selection and use of materials, multimedia selection aids, periodicals with literature about or bibliographies of multiethnic materials. PREFACE

This supplement to Aids to Media Selection for Students and Teachers (OE-34045) is a selected list of the book lists and periodicals published or revised since 1970 which review books, audiovisual materials or multiethnic instructional materials suitable for use in elementary and secondary school instructional programs. In general, no new listing is given for those publications for which there are only minor bibliographical changes such as price. Prices quoted for all book lists and journals are subject to change.

The format of the supplement is identical to that of Aids to Media Selection for Students and Teachers. It is divided into three sections:

- I. Book Selection Sources
- II. Sources of Audiovisual Materials
- III. Sources of Multiethnic Materials

An asterisk (*) preceding an entry indicates that the annotation appears in Aids to Media Selection for Students and Teachers (1971). A directory of publishers and an author-title index are included in the last pages of the publication. Inclusion of a list or periodical does not imply official endorsement of it or any item in it by the U.S. Office of Education.

Special acknowledgement is given to Mrs. Jeanne Chamberlin, Practicum Participant, The Catholic University of America, for her assistance in the preparation of the section on book selection sources.

A. Book Selection Aids

Part 1: Nonselective Bibliographies

Users of the supplement are referred to pp. 2-3 in Aids to Media Selection for Students and Teachers (1971) for a listing of inclusive bibliographies which are revised annually to provide current information about books in print and their subjects.

Books for Children Preschool Through Junior High School, 1970-71. 1972. 170 pp. \$4.50. Paperback.

- *284. Gaver, Mary, ed. The Elementary School Library Collection.

H.W. Wilson Company. Standard Catalog Series. Bronx, N.Y.: Wilson.

Each of these volumes is revised periodically, and the service is kept current with annual paperback supplements. In each, Part 1, which is classified by the Dewey Decimal System (DDS), provides bibliographic information for each book and suggests grade levels and subject heading; Part 2 is an author-title-subject index; Part 3 is a directory of publishers and distributors. Selection of titles by advisory committees and consultants.

285. Children's Catalog. 12th ed. 1971. 1,156 pp. \$25. Includes four annual supplements, 1972-1975.

Includes 5,119 titles. Part 2 gives 12,273 analytical entries for fairy stories, folklore, short stories, plays, collective biographies, and other parts of books. Revised every 5 years. Intent is to include "the best books for children in the fields of fiction and nonfiction."

286. Senior High School Library Catalog. 10th ed. 1972. 1,214 pp. \$30 in U.S. and Canada; \$35 elsewhere. Includes five annual supplements, 1973-1977.

Includes 4,760 titles, including adult titles considered appropriate to advanced high school curriculums. Part 2 provides 14,661 analytical entries. Revised every 4 years.

287. Senior High School Library Catalog, Catholic ed. 10th ed. 1,373 pp. 1972. \$35 in U.S. and Canada; \$40 elsewhere. Includes five annual supplements, 1973-1977.

Includes all services provided by regular edition, with the addition of bound-in Catholic supplement containing 658 titles selected for Catholic schools by a committee of the Catholic Library Association.

288. National Association of Independent Schools. Library Committee. Books for Secondary School Libraries. 4th ed. New York: R.R. Bowker, 1971. 308 pp. \$8.95.

Arranged by Dewey number, this list of 4,000 fully cataloged books is intended as "an up-to-date book selection guide, on the college-bound level, for librarians, teachers, administrators, and mature students working and studying both on formal assignments and independent projects." Also includes sections on reference and professional materials. Not annotated. L.C. subject headings given; an author-title-subject index.

293. Association for Childhood Education International. Bibliography of Books for Children. Sylvia Sunderlin, ed. Washington: The Association, 1971. 130 pp. \$2.25. Revised every 3 years. Paperback.

The 1971 edition has attempted to update selection of titles with only minor changes in categories and organization. Most of the newer titles have been reviewed in the Association's journal, Childhood Education. The Reference Insert was prepared by the 1968-71 Reference Books Revision Committee; Kathleen G. Fletcher, Chairman.

294. Association for Childhood Education International. Good & Inexpensive Books for Children. Washington: The Association, 1972. 62 pp. \$2. Paperback.

Formerly titled Children's Books...for \$1.50 or less, this revision lists about 500 books, (mostly paperback), arranged by author in such categories as Picture Books, Fiction (with three age-level divisions), Rhymes and Verses, Fairy Tales and Legends, Biography, Social Studies, Science, Recreation and Hobbies. Includes a section for parents and teachers. Briefly annotated; prices given; author and title indexes.

295. Child Study Association of America, Inc. Children's Books of the Year, 1972. New York: The Association, 1973. 41 pp. \$2.50. Annual revision. Paperback.

"Designed as a guide for parents and those working with children," this edition lists about 600 books, briefly annotating them. General arrangement is by age level, subdivided into such categories as Fantasy, Children in Other Lands, Easy to Read, Adventure and Mystery, Sports, Mostly About Animals, Science Fiction, title index.

296. Child Study Association of America, Inc. Reading With Your Child Through Age 5. New York: The Association, 1972. 34 pp. \$1.50. Paperback.

Includes about 225 titles selected by the Children's Book Committee in conjunction with other staff members of the CSA. Introduction suggests a basic guide to choosing books for this age group.

297. Library of Congress. Children's Books, 1972, compiled by Virginia Haviland and Lois B. Watt. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1973. 16 pp. 15 cents.

Ninth in a series compiled annually with the assistance of an advisory committee of city and county public and school library specialists and coordinators of public library services to children. Annotating usually about 200 books for preschool through junior high school age, the list covers such sections as: Picture and Picture Story Books, Stories for the Middle Group, Stories for Older Boys and Girls, Folklore, Poetry and Rhymes, Arts and Hobbies, Biography, History, Peoples and Places, and Nature and Science. Earlier lists available. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office. 16 pp. 15 cents each.

298. National Council of Teachers of English. Adventuring With Books: 2,400 titles for pre-k-grade 8. 2d ed. prepared by Shelton L. Root, Jr. and a Committee of the Council. New York: Citation, 1973. 395 pp. \$1.95. Paperback.

An annotated list of books which combine "the qualities of entertaining reading with literary merit." Most titles published since 1967 but older classics and award winners also included. Arranged by 14 broad subjects, with author and title indexes.

299. National Council of Teachers of English. Books for You: A Reading List for Senior High School Students. Rev. ed. Jean A. Wilson, editorial chairman. New York: Washington Square, 1971. 334 pp. 95 cents.

Prepared by a representative committee of the Council. Annotation of more than 2,000 titles, divided into numerous broad categories.

300. New York Public Library. Books for the Teen Age, 1972. New York: The Library, 1973. 48 pp. \$2. More than three copies, 50 cents each. Annual revision in February.

Prepared by the Library's Committee on Books for Young Adults; includes 1,256 titles, about 80 percent of them adult publications; 470 books published in 1970 are identified. Books are briefly annotated and grouped in some 71 categories; new subject headings this year include Young Voices (the writings of teen-agers), Drugs, Ecology, and Women; the index leads to these subjects. List is available without charge to anyone who requests it at any New York Public Library Branch.

301. Rosenberg, Judith K. and Kenyon C. Rosenberg. Young People's Literature in Series: Fiction, An Annotated Bibliographical Guide. Littleton, Colo.: Libraries Unlimited, Inc., 1972. 176 pp. \$7.50.

Describes 1,400 books for children in grades 3-9, published from 1955 to date. Arranged by author, then by individual volume's sequence in the series. Annotations are evaluative. Series and title indexes.

Part 4: Specialized Lists

302. American Library Association. Books from Other Countries, 1968-1971, compiled by Elana Rabban. Chicago: The Association, 1972. 48 pp. \$1.50; 6 copies for \$8.

Issued by the American Association of School Librarians "as its major contribution to the International Book Year," and

designed for use by "children and young people, parents, teachers, and library media specialists when focusing on any phase of international or intercultural relations." Annotates 186 titles, arranged by countries and classified by social studies themes, with reading range designated, preschool through junior high.

303. American Library Association. Children's Books of International Interest: A Selection From Four Decades of American Publishing, edited by Virginia Haviland. Chicago: The Association, 1972. 69 pp. \$2.50.

As an American project for International Book Year, some 700 books previously noted in annual lists of the Children's Services Division/International Relations Committee were reevaluated for literary worth and universality of interest. The resulting compilation includes 300 titles annotated in two categories: "Books for Younger Children" includes Picture Books and First Reading, while "Books for Older Children" includes Fiction, Folklore, Poetry, Biography, History, Peoples and Places, The Arts, and Science and Nature. A Directory of Publishers is provided.

304. American Library Association. I Read...I See...I Hear...I Learn.... Chicago: The Association, 1971. 104 pp. \$2. Paperback.

Prepared for the Children's Services Division by the Library Service to the Disadvantaged Child Committee. Divided into four broad age-level categories, along with a section of "Suggested Program Aids for Adults." Describes books, motion pictures, and recordings appropriate at each level, for a total of about 100 items.

305. American Library Association. Paperback Books for Children. New York: Citation, 1972. 130 pp. 95 cents. Paperback.

Compiled for the American Association of School Librarians by the Committee on Paperback Lists for Elementary Schools. Lists approximately 700 titles in five broad groups: Picture Books; Fiction; Nonfiction; Myths, Folklore, and Fairy Tales; and Poetry, Rhymes, Riddles and Jokes. Brief annotations and general grade levels given.

306. American Library Association. Periodicals for School Libraries: A Guide to Magazines, Newspapers, and Periodical Indexes, compiled by Marian H. Scott. Rev. ed. Chicago: The Association, 1973. 269 pp. \$4.95. Paperback.

Annotates and evaluates 500 periodicals for children and young adults in relation to curriculum needs, reading levels, and interest range, from kindergarten through grade 12; includes some foreign and ethnic periodicals.

307. American Library Association. Reference and Subscription Books Reviews, 1968-1970. Chicago: The Association, 1970. 148 pp. \$2.75. Paperback.

Sixth reprint (formerly Subscription Books Bulletin Reviews) including all reviews originally published in The Booklist from September 1, 1968 through August 1970.

308. American Library Association. Reference and Subscription Books Reviews, 1970-1972. 144 pp. \$3.50. Paperback.

Seventh in the series, reprinting 62 reviews published in The Booklist from September 1, 1970 through July 15, 1972.

- *309. Asia Society. Supplement to Asia: A Guide to Basic Books. New York: The Society, 1971. 47 pp. Original Guide and Supplement 50 cents each or both for 75 cents, plus 25 cents postage.

Annotates 156 titles; new title and author indexes cover the Guide and the Supplement.

310. The Children's Book Council. The Children's Book Showcase. New York: The Council, 1973. 72 pp. \$3.95. Paperback.

Twenty-eight titles selected by four judges (two children's author-artists, one children's editor, and one book designer) as best designed/illustrated children's books published in the U.S. during the previous year. Bibliographic and design information, judge's critique, and small b/w two-page illustration given.

311. Dierksen, Deane C. An Annotated Checklist of Children's Stories with Settings in Cities Outside the United States, 1960-1971. Unpublished Research Paper. Washington: The Catholic University of America, 1972. 50 pp.

Designed to aid librarians looking for reading materials about foreign cities, the list annotates about 100 fiction titles in English for elementary age children. Arranged alphabetically by country with city subdivisions.

312. Library of Congress. Creating Independence, 1703-1789: Background Reading for Young People, compiled by Margaret N. Coughlan. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1972. 62 pp. 75 cents.

"A Selected Annotated Bibliography" of about 85 books which met the compiler's carefully applied criteria. Included are histories, biographies and works of fiction.

313. Library of Congress. The Wide World of Children's Books: an Exhibition for International Book Year, compiled by Virginia Haviland. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1972. 84 pp. 50 cents.

Annotates 138 titles (representing 38 countries) which were chosen to honor UNESCO's designation of 1972 as International Book Year. Selection considerations involved contemporary writing and illustration, notable recent editions of folklore and classics, attractiveness for display, intrinsic excellence, relative importance within national body of literature, awards, and appearance on national "best lists."

314. Music Educators National Conference. Music Books for the Elementary School Library, compiled by Peggy Flanagan Baird. Washington: The Conference, 1972. 48 pp. \$3.

An annotated list of nearly 200 books personally reviewed by the author. Discusses educational and motivational values, appeal to children, illustrations, style of presentation and grade level. Subject classification list added.

315. National Aeronautics and Space Administration. NASA Educational Publications. Washington: NASA, August 1972. 11 pp. Free upon request.

Educational and informational books, pamphlets, fact sheets, posters and picture sets designed for educators, students, and the public. Annotations and prices given.

316. National Council of Teachers of English. High Interest-Easy Reading for Junior and Senior High School Students, edited by Marian E. White. New York: Citation Press, 1972. 140 pp. 95 cents. Paperback.

Prepared for the Council by a representative committee and designed for use by students. Annotates about 400 titles which teachers and librarians have observed to be popular with students who do not usually enjoy reading. Arranged in 18 broad subject categories.

317. National Council of Teachers of Mathematics. A Bibliography of Recreational Mathematics, compiled by William L. Schaaf, 4th edition. Washington: The Council, 1970. Vol. 1, 148 pp. \$4, Vol. 2, 192 pp. \$4.

Includes sources of games, puzzles, brainteasers, paradoxes, tricks, and other pastimes arranged by subjects such as number theory recreation, geometric recreations, magic squares, classical problems of antiquity, Pythagorean relationships, etc.

318. National Science Teachers Association/Children's Book Council. Science Trade Books. Washington: The Association, 1973. 8 pp.

Includes 102 books selected for and annotated by members of the Joint Committee representing the Association and the Council, and three articles: "Writing Science Books for Children" by Milicent E. Selsam, "Illustrating Science Books for Children" by Jeanne Bendick, and "Using Science Books with Children" by Glenn O. Blough. The compilation is reprinted from the April 1973 issue of Science and Children, and represents a special program developed for the NSTA Convention in March 1973.

School Library Journal's Book Review Staff.

Three pocket-sized paperback lists designed to be imprinted with name of distributing library or other agency. Each includes about 200 books, arranged by subject and age-levels, and briefly annotated; entry by title with illustrator, publisher, and prices. 100 copies for \$6.50 plus postage; imprinting rates on request. Available from R.R. Bowker Co., 1180 Avenue of the Americas, New York, New York 10036.

319. Growing Up With Books. 21st ed. 1972. 32 pp. Revised annually.
320. Growing Up With Paperbacks. 3rd ed. 1971. 32 pp. Revised biennially.
321. Growing Up With Science Books. 9th ed. 1972. 36 pp.

B. Periodicals

Users of this bibliography are referred to pp. 18-23 in Aids to Media Selection for Students and Teachers (1971). In the present Supplement, only those periodicals are listed which are new, or which carry a revised publication schedule, or have changed titles.

322. American Library Association. American Association of School Librarians. School Media Quarterly. Published four times a year in fall, winter, spring, and summer. Subscription price of \$1.25 a year, included in membership dues; AASL membership required. Single copies \$2.

Official journal of the AASL. While not primarily a selection tool it is included here because of the implications many of its articles hold for the process of book evaluation, and because of significant bibliographies published from time to time.

323. APA Publications, Inc. Children's Literature in Education. Published three times a year, in March, May, and September. \$7.50 a year.

A British journal, since 1970 prepared for publication by an editorial committee based at the Exeter University Institute of Education. Which the content is primarily literary criticism and detailed discussion of specific children's books and their relation to educational theory, the journal is listed here because of (a) the importance of the issues to school media people and (b) the value of the bibliographies, including those which support individual articles as well as those featured specifically (e.g. John Rowe Townsend's "A Working List of Children's Fiction" in the September 1972 issue).

324. Association for Childhood Education International. Childhood Education. Published six times a year in October, November, January, February, March, and May. \$2 a year (includes membership).

Annotations for 20-25 books each issue, prepared by members of the Book Review Committee. Reviews are cumulated and most incorporated in successive editions of the Association's Bibliography of Books for Children, revised every three years.

325. Children's Book Review Service. Published monthly with two special supplements in spring and fall. \$25 a year.

New in 1972, designed to provide "a service which is fast and whose reviews are understandable and reflect the reading needs of today's children" pre-school through eighth grade. Special attention will be given to "the relevance of new juvenile books to minority children...and specialists will be used to review titles related to their ethnic groups." Efforts will be made to use dual reviews so that the opinions of librarians and writers can be compared to benefit the book selector. April 1973 issue contained 30 initialed reviews, with alphabetical list of reviewers and their positions and an author index. Books were reviewed in three categories: Picture Books, Younger Readers, Older Readers.

326. H.W. Wilson Company. Book Review Digest. Published monthly except February and July. Service basis rate quoted on request. Cumulations available.

Lists reviews of approximately 6,000 books each year, representing adult and juvenile fiction and nonfiction, appearing in more than 70 American, British, and Canadian periodicals.

C. Guides and Handbooks

Included in this section are several varieties of professional literature related to book selection and to the training of book evaluators: reference tools, surveys of juvenile literature, literary criticism, and philosophy of book selection.

327. American Library Association. Paperback Books for Young People: an Annotated Guide to Publishers and Distributors, by John T. Gillespie and Diana L. Spirt. Chicago: The Association, 1972. 177 pp. \$4.50. Paperback.

Includes three sections: (1) directory of paperback publishers (including general information, series for young people, special services, prices and ordering information), (2) listing of paperback distributors arranged by State, and (3) a discussion and listing of selection aids.

328. Arbuthnot, May Hill and Zena Sutherland. Children and Books. 4th ed. Glenview, Ill.: Scott, Foresman and Co., 1972. 836 pp. \$12.25.

Reorganized and redeveloped; new section on "Areas and Issues Related to Children and Their Books." Includes material on the media center, minorities, censorship, and television. Extensive bibliographies of children's books, expanded and updated from previous editions, are an especially valuable feature.

329. Broderick, Dorothy. Image of the Black in Children's Fiction. New York: Bowker, 1973. 215 pp. \$12.50.

This "scholarly and controversial study" examines past and present treatment of blacks in juvenile literature, analyzes stereotypes and related manifestations of racism, and considers historical developments. Bibliographies, indexes, and references to standard selection tools provide provocative perspective for the book evaluator.

- *330. Carlsen, G. Robert. Books and the Teenage Reader: A Guide for Teachers, Librarians and Parents. Rev. ed. New York: Harper, 1971. 247 pp. \$6.95.

The revision includes updated bibliographies and a new chapter, "The Ethnic Experience in Literature."

331. The Children's Book Council, Inc. Children's Books: Awards and Prizes. New York: The Council, 1973. 192 pp. \$2.95. 3rd ed. Paperback.

Identifies the 60 awards in the field of children's books. The list includes distinctions conferred by professional organizations,

State agencies, regional and local agencies, newspapers, universities, and foundations, including some from abroad. For each award there is a brief statement of its history and its terms.

332. Eyre, Frank. British Children's Books in the Twentieth Century. New York: Dutton, 1971. 153 pp. \$7.95.

Originally published in 1952 as 20th Century Children's Books, this revised treatment includes chapters on Books with Pictures, In-Between Books, Fiction for Children and a Historical Survey. Appendixes on Regional Writing, Award Winners, and books about children's books are added.

333. Fisher, Margery. Matters of Fact: Aspects of Non-fiction for Children. New York: Crowell, 1972. 488 pp. \$11.95.

Critical discussion, by noted British writer, of main types of nonfiction: single topic, multiple subjects, biography, and career. The tone and many of the books discussed are British. However, some titles familiar to American readers are included, and the author's careful development and application of criteria make this a valuable resource for those concerned with selection and evaluation.
