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ABSTRACT

This publication is a compilation of data on a variety of subjects in the field of education in the twelve states of the Federal Republic of Nigeria. The structure of the educational system is described. Statistics cover all government, local and native authority, and aided voluntary agency schools depending on or registered by the Ministries of Education. Unaided private schools approved or under approval by the Ministries of Education are also included, if operating. Tables in Part One summarize general and retrospective data concerning primary education, secondary education and higher education (number of schools, number of teachers and pupils, statistics related to general education, technical and vocational education and teacher training). Part Two contains the following statistics on educational institutions for the year 1968: number of schools, number of classes, number of teachers, pupil information, teacher information, and information on enrollment in institutions of higher education. Tables in Part Three include information on the number of degrees and certificates of education granted. (SHM)

FOREWORD




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INTRODUCTION

The educational system in the Federation of Nigeria is not uniform in its organisation, though pupils and students appear to reach the same state of development by the time they graduate from any of the universally acknowledged stages of education.

Educational Administration

Education is primarily a State matter. The Federal Republic of Nigeria comprises twelve states. Each State is the legislative and administrative authority on all matters concerning education up to secondary school level in its own area. But the Federal Government plays a co-ordinating role with particular regard to broad direction of educational policy, planning and finance. Co-ordination of policies and administrative procedures in matters of common interest are promoted by the Federal Ministry of Education through the Joint Consultative Committee on Education, comprising all the State Ministries of Education.

The Federal Ministry of Education also plays a vital role in the maintenance of national educational standards by operating national organisation which are devoted to the development of education in all its ramifications. The National Educational Research Council, for example, concerns itself, *inter alia*, with curriculum development and appraisal.

External aid for education in the whole Federation is channelled through the Bureau for External Aid on whose co-ordinating Committee all the States are represented, while grants received from the Federal Government are administered to Nigerian universities by the National Universities Commission. In addition to state awards, the Federal Government awards scholarships for undergraduate and post-graduate studies to students from all parts of the Federation. Finally, the Federal Ministry of Education acts as liaison on educational matters between Nigeria and foreign countries, international and national organisations, Agencies and Foundations.

Educational institutions comprise Government Schools, Local Authority Schools and Voluntary Agency and Private Schools. All educational institutions, except the universities, which are autonomous, are supervised by government inspectors and other officials, regardless of the body or persons maintaining them.


Schools Organisation and Controlling Authority

Primary education in some states—Lagos and Western States—is completely free but not compulsory; there are varying degrees of free primary education in the other States. Where there is free primary education, teaching materials, especially textbooks and exercise books, are usually supplied free of charge to the pupils, and no school fees are charged.

The curricula are determined by the state and each school organisation draws up its scheme of work from the syllabus provided by the State. Each secondary school draws up its own syllabus but in practice this freedom is limited by the syllabuses for the West African School Certificate and the General Certificate of Education, the certificates which successful students obtain at the end of their secondary education. These examinations are generally controlled by the West African Examinations Council.

The State Governments are responsible for the establishment and maintenance of government owned schools, which form only a very small fraction of the schools in the country, and the teachers in such schools are civil servants of the respective states. Fees collected from the students are paid to Government revenue.

Local Authority schools are operated either directly by the Authority or by an Agency on behalf of the Authority ; such schools are financed by the Authority with or without the participation of the Government, and in some cases are maintained with voluntary or obligatory local contributions. Aided schools are operated by Voluntary Agencies or other approved bodies and receive grants-in-aid either from the Government or the Local Authority or from both on a proportional basis. Unaided schools are usually operated by private bodies or persons, but in some cases also by religious bodies. They do not receive any support from public funds, often because they either fail to meet the requirements of the state governments or are prestige schools where fees are very high.

The Structure of the Educational System

Primary Education

At present there is no uniform school age. The age at which pupils enter the Primary schools is either 5 or 6 years. In the Lagos State the age of entry is 6, Northern States 5-6, Eastern, Western, and Mid-Western States 6.

The duration of the first level of education ranges from six to eight years, and like the school age, differs as between the States. But the general tendency is to reduce Primary School course to six years. Generally, at the end of the course a First School Leaving Certificate Examination is taken.

Younger children, especially in urban areas, attend Kindergarten or Nursery Schools which are usually private institutions and in no case part of the school system.

Secondary Education (General)

Secondary Education includes all Post-Primary Schools, excluding Technical and Teacher Training institutions. The term covers studies carried on in a variety of institutions particularly, the following :

- (i) Secondary Grammar Schools including those teaching technical subjects ;
- (ii) Secondary Commercial Schools ;
- (iii) Secondary Modern Schools ;
- (iv) Comprehensive Secondary Schools

Secondary Education is also given in institutions catering for pupils of school age in what are known as Evening Classes, as well as institutions preparing candidates for University especially in Science.

2. Secondary Grammar Schools provide normal literary education and are generally recognized and approved for courses leading after 5 or 6 years to the West African School Certificate Examination conducted by the West African Examinations Council. Some, which are not yet of a standard to secure recognition by the State Ministry of Education, prepare their pupils for the London University General Certificate of Education taken at the ordinary level. This is considered the equivalent of the West African Schools Certificate Examination. A smaller number of Grammar Schools offers a further two year course leading to the Higher School Certificate examination of the University of Cambridge. This is generally regarded as a preparation for admission to University or other institutions of higher education.

3. A few Secondary Grammar Schools also provide Technical education laying the emphasis on Physical Sciences and such technical subjects as Geometrical and Mechanical Drawing, Metal and Wood Works, etc. in addition to the standard literary curriculum. Such schools provide the feeders for higher Technical/Technological institutions.

4. All Secondary Schools are fee paying with very few exceptions mostly in the technical field. Admission to Secondary Grammar Schools is generally by competitive entrance examinations taken at the end of the Primary School course and intake is only limited by available facilities. Most of these schools are boarding especially in the rural areas, although in large cities, as small proportion are only partially boarding or entirely day schools.

5. Secondary Commercial schools are similar in many respects, to Secondary Grammar Schools except that their curriculum lays emphasis on Commercial subjects such as book-keeping, Accountancy, Shorthand and Typewriting, etc. Like the Grammar Schools, they too prepare their students either for the West African School Certificate Examination, the G.C.E. ('O' level) or for other examinations conducted by Professional bodies such as the Royal Society of Arts of London.

6. Secondary Modern Schools generally offer a two/three-year course for Post-primary school pupils and exist in a few States in Nigeria. There are strong indications that because the "Modern School" has not evolved a concrete educational target or professional training which can be easily identified in our society, it will be replaced or re-modelled. In the Western State where the largest number exists, the future trend of the Modern School remains undecided; but it has been suggested that they should become Junior High Schools somewhat of the American type which will provide preliminary training leading either to Senior High Schools or Vocation-Oriented institutions.

7. Comprehensive or multi-lateral schools have become increasingly favoured and a few exist, providing mainly Grammar but also Commercial and Technical courses at the secondary level. They are comprehensive more in the sense of large numbers than the type of streams/courses provided. At present, the large majority are simply multi-lateral, and with a few notable exceptions, are private institutions, i.e. not owned by Government.

8. Secondary grammar schools are generally recognised and approved to provide courses leading to the West African School Certificate examination. Some, which are not yet recognised, prepare their students for the London University General Certificate of Education at the Ordinary Level. The course generally lasts for five years and some of the grammar schools offer a further two-year course leading to the Higher School Certificate examination of the University of Cambridge.

9. Secondary grammar schools with technical bias lay emphasis on the physical sciences and such technical subjects as Technical Drawing, Metal Work, Wood Work, etc. in addition to normal Grammar School Curriculum.

10. All grammar schools are fee-paying, and admission to them is generally by competitive examinations usually taken after the primary school course. Many of these schools, especially in the rural areas, are boarding schools, though in the large cities a few are partially or wholly day schools.

Technical and Vocational Education

Most of the technical institutions and colleges are established and maintained by the Ministries of Education. Formal vocational education is principally offered by the Governments and to small extent by private industrial and commercial firms. Non-formal education in these fields is offered by some Government Ministries such as Agriculture, Works, Economic Developments, Transport, Communications and Health.

Holders of the First School Leaving Certificate (obtained at the completion of primary education) are eligible for selection for admission to any of the junior technical schools, commercial schools, craft schools and trade centres, depending, of course, on the State where admission

is sought. In the case of admission to trade centres, a three-year post primary education is usually required except in Lagos where candidates with the First School Leaving Certificates are not debarred from admission, although a minimum age is imposed, this being usually fourteen years. The courses in these institutions range from three to five years, three years in craft schools, three in trade centres, five in secondary commercial and secondary technical schools, three in junior technical and junior commercial schools. Pupils who complete their courses in craft schools and junior commercial schools, may proceed respectively to technical training schools (as trade centre are called in the Northern States) for three years and senior commercial schools for one to three years.

Technical colleges or colleges of technology are post-secondary institutions. These have course in engineering and allied fields, and in commerce. For admission, candidates are expected to have completed a full secondary education and possess the West African School Certificate or the equivalent. In some cases, candidates who have successfully completed courses at technical training schools (trade centres) may be admitted. The duration of the courses is usually two years for the Ordinary Diploma and a further two years for the Higher Diploma. In addition to full-time courses, most of the technical colleges provide facilities for evening courses in various technical and commercial disciplines.

Teacher Training

Teachers are trained in institutions established and maintained by the Governments or Voluntary Agencies. Before the 1960's, when emphasis was on the quantity of trained teachers to meet the need of the then rapidly expanding schools, primary school leavers were absorbed direct into the teaching profession as "pupil teachers" or admitted into a year's course which led to a qualification known as a Preliminary Training College (P.T.C.) Certificate, holders of which either took up teaching appointment or passed on to further training. Qualified candidates were eligible for admission into teachers' training colleges either for a two-year course at the end of which the Grade III Teachers' Certificate was awarded (if successful) or for a four-year course for the award of a Grade II Teachers' Certificate.

Now that stress is laid at least as much on the quality as on the quantity of teachers' Grade III teachers' training colleges are being discontinued in favour of Grade II colleges which offer four/five years courses to holders of First School Leaving Certificate with some teaching experience and holders of Secondary School Certificate Class IV, and two-year courses to holders of either the Grade III Teachers' Certificate or the West African School Certificate or the General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level) in an approved number of subjects. Grade I Teachers' Training Colleges are open to holders of the Grade II Teachers' Certificate. Practising Grade II teachers may be awarded Grade I Teachers' Certificate without necessarily attending a Grade I Teachers' College, provided they fulfil certain conditions.

In-Service-Teacher Training programmes are run throughout the Federation in order to improve the quality of some serving teachers. Many Grade III teachers and others avail themselves of this opportunity.

The need to provide teachers to teach in the lower classes in Secondary schools and teacher training colleges as well as in primary schools, has led to the opening of Advanced Teachers Training Colleges in some states. Holders of both Grade II Teachers' Certificate and either West African School Certificate or General Certificate of Education in five subjects at Ordinary Level or its equivalent are eligible for admission.

It provides a three-year course at the end of which the students are awarded the Nigeria Certificate in Education (N.C.E.). In addition to Education, each student is expected to study two school subjects up to the G.C.E. (A) Level standard.

Both the Grade I teachers' institutions and the Advanced Teacher Training Colleges come within the Higher Education level. Holders of N.C.E. are eligible for direct entry into universities for a two-or-three years course leading to a degree.

University graduate students who wish to teach can be offered teaching appointments in the secondary schools and teacher training colleges but, to be better equipped, such students are encouraged to do a one-year post-graduate diploma course in a University Institute of Education. At the completion of such a course the student is awarded a Post-graduate Diploma or Certificate in Education. It should be mentioned, however, that some of our universities, as well as some universities overseas, offer courses leading to the B.A. or B.Sc. (Education) or Bachelor of Education degree.

In order to produce qualified teachers in the field of technical education, the Federal Ministry of Education has opened a new institution—the National Technical Teachers Training College—for this purpose. Two types of courses are offered, namely, a one-year pedagogical course for those qualified in their various technical fields but lack teacher training, and a three-year course for holders of the West African School Certificate or equivalent qualification. This latter course is similar to the N.C.E. but has a technical bias. Successful products of the college are in fact awarded the N.C.E. (Technical).

Higher Education

Owing to inadequate supply of qualified candidates for admission direct to degree courses in our universities, especially in science technical subjects, some of the universities run preliminary courses in certain disciplines for students who are not well qualified to embark on degree courses. Duration is one academic year.

In general, a first degree course in most disciplines lasts for a period of three years after the Higher School Certificate or its equivalent.

Facilities for higher degrees and research are increasing ; these are also attracting foreign students. At present, owing to the national crisis, only four of the five Universities in the country are functioning.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

1. Source of Information

The statistical data contained in this volume are supplied by the Federal Ministry of Education, and ministries of education in the States.

Information concerning the universities and the results of examinations held by the West African Examinations Council are supplied directly by such institutions. Sources of information are also indicated in the footnotes.

Retrospective data have been derived from the previous issues of the Annual Digest of Education Statistics and Statistics of Education in Nigeria.

2. Coverage of Statistics

The statistics cover all Government, Local and Native Authority, Aided Voluntary Agency schools depending on or registered by the Ministries of Education. Unaided private schools approved or under approval by the Ministries of Education are also included, if operating.

Formal and non-formal education conducted in schools attached to private industrial and commercial firms, when not under the control of educational authorities is excluded. Also excluded are the so-called 'illegal' schools, *i.e.*, schools which have not been approved by the educational authorities. Schools carrying out evening courses only, correspondence schools and all schools giving non-formal education and training prospective job seekers for clerical or trade occupations are also excluded.

Schools depending on Ministries other than the Ministries of Education and pursuing particular aims such as in-service training or training of schools leavers for posts offered by governmental institutions, such as clerical jobs, nurses, communication and transport engineers, agricultural technicians, etc., are also excluded from the statistics.

3. Controlling Authority

Government schools are operated directly by the Governments and are entirely supported ; the fees collected from the students are paid back to Government Revenue. Local Authority schools are operated either directly by the Authority or by an Agency on behalf of the Authority; such schools are financed by the Authority with or without the participation of the Government and in some cases are maintained with voluntary or obligatory local contributions. Aided schools are operated by Voluntary Agencies or other approved bodies and receive grants-in-aid either from the Government or the Local Authority or from both on a proportional basis. Unaided schools are usually operated by private bodies/persons, but in some cases also by moral or religious bodies, they do not receive any support from public funds, often because they either fail to meet the requirements of the State Governments or they are prestige schools where fees are very high.

4. Year of reference

The year of reference indicated in the statistics normally refers to the school year beginning in January-February and ending in December. A few schools, however, like the Technical Institutes and Advanced Teachers' Colleges, adopt a different school year beginning in September-October and ending in June-July of the subsequent year. In all cases except when otherwise stated, the year indicated in the statistics refers to the school year in which the courses begin. The same applies to the Universities, whose academic year commences in October and ends in June of the succeeding year.


