#### ABSTRACT

This research report presents findings from a survey questionnaire designed to obtain information about current university programs in extracurricular athletics. The survey encompasses responses from 29 colleges: 11 in British Columbia, 8 in other Canadian provinces, and 10 in the United States. The responses indicate a general trend toward basketball and volleyball as the most common intramural activities for men. Badminton and volleyball are the most common for women as co-recreational activities. Basketball is the most common activity among men and women in intercollegiate athletics. From individual responses, however, other activities appear at least as often as basketball. Two tables of data are presented, citing the most frequently mentioned activities for intramural and intercollegiate athletics by men and women from the three different geographic areas. #### SURVEY OF EXTRA-CURRICULAR ATHLETICS

(both intercollegiate and intramural)

A questionhaire (see Appendix A) was directed to twenty-nine colleges (eleven in British Columbia, eight in other Canadian provinces and ten in the United States) to obtain information about the current programs of extra-curricular athletics. There was a 96.6% return. (See Table I)

From this sample, it would appear that American institutions give credit courses in physical education while their counterparts in Eastern Canada generally do not. In British Columbia about one-half of the institutions offer credit courses in physical education. It is also clear, too, that the American schools offer a greater number of credit courses in physical education.

(The differences among the three groups are significant at the .01 level; x = 9.79.)

While there are differences in the popularity of certain activities due to location or cultural differences, the same trends were present for British Columbia, other provinces and United States colleges. For intramural athletics, basketball and volleyball are the most common activities for men, badminton and volleyball for women and as co-recreational activities. For intercollegiate athletics the most common activity for men and women is basketball, however, on an individual group basis other activities appear at least as often as basketball. For example, colleges from other Canadian provinces marked basketball, curling and ice hockey an equal number of times for men. Tables III and IV indicate the most frequently cited activities for intramural athletics and intercollegiate athletics by sex and by location.
