ABSTRACT

A study was done at the Purdue University Libraries to identify publishers of interest to Purdue, to characterize the subject areas by type of publisher after library selection, and to evaluate the performance of commercial and university presses. The majority of the document consists of tabular compilations of the data collected in the study. The first table ranks 184 publishers who furnished Purdue with four or more books in a six month period according to the total number of books received (categorized as approval plan books, books ordered by departments, and additional copies of approval plan books ordered). Table II shows the subject areas of the books catalogued during a six month period which were received from either commercial or university publishers. Tables III and IV compare the totals of books received with the claims made, the claimed books received and the claiming time for commercial and university publishers. (JG)

EVALUATION OF AN APPROVAL PLAN: VENDOR AND PUBLISHER PERFORMANCE

The Purdue University Libraries, a system with 25 departmental libraries, has had an approval plan for U.S. and selected foreign publishers for the last six and a half years. During that time we have changed vendors and reorganized the program five times, each time an attempt to preserve the part of the program that was working well and to better the part that was not.

It was clear from the beginning that the chief measure of success was coverage --the proportion of books volunteered promptly by the vendor to the number Purdue had to claim. Claiming rates have varied, but seem to cluster at 30%.

In talking with acquisitions personnel at other universities about approval plans and claiming, we sense a tendency not to claim but to place a firm order for a book if it is not volunteered by the plan. Other universities, therefore, may not have similar records of the extent to which they must ask for books.

Purdue, like other libraries, has had to retrench because of cuts in funds. To adjust the approval plan, we decided first to limit the number of copies available on approval-plan funds to one only, and later to reduce the number of publishers rather than tamper with a comprehensive subject profile. Purdue now has two plans: one for all university presses with one vendor, and the other, for selected commercial publishers with another vendor.

To select approval-plan publishers, we needed to know which publishers are of most interest to Purdue (Table I). Because of the one-copy system, we needed to know something about subject distribution in academic publishing (Table II). Because of our publisher selection and because it is evident that the responsibility for the success of an approval plan lies with publishers as well as vendors, we have adjusted record-keeping this past year to try to characterize publishers (Table III, commercial; Table IV, university).

TABLE I: Publishers of most interest to Purdue

The sample in Table I includes books copyrighted in 1971 and 1972 that were cataloged during the six months from July to December 1972. It covers 184 publishers; those with four or fewer books were not included. It identifies books received under the approval plan (A orders), those bought with departmental funds (H orders), and those bought with nonlibrary, mostly grant, funds (P orders). Four characteristics were considered:

1. Total number of books received (cataloged); i.e., the amount of publishing activity.
2. Total number supplied by the approval plan; i.e., how much of that publisher's output is germane to Purdue's academic interests (A orders).
3. Total number bought on nonapproval-plan funds; i.e., whether a department is willing to spend its own money on that publisher's books (H and P orders).
4. Total number of additional copies of approval-plan books purchased; i.e., whether a publisher is of interest to only one library or to more than one.

To weight these factors, publishers were ranked in each of the four categories and then ranked by the average of the four to supply a final rating.

TABLE II: Subject emphasis of commercial and university presses

The study compares university and commercial presses, showing, by specific department, subject emphases of publishing after selection by academic library and teaching faculty. It includes all books used by a library--reference and other--regardless of whether the book would be classed in that subject by LC or Dewey.

The study includes books cataloged from January 1972 to June 1973, U.S. publishers only, and all forms of ordering--departmental, nonlibrary, and approval-plan. It excludes institutional publishers, those specializing in a single subject, and those with fewer than 10 books cataloged during the time of the study.

TABLES III and IV: Volunteered and claimed books, commercial and university presses

Tables III and IV attempt to determine the response of both publishers and vendors, commercial and university, to an approval-plan commitment. To supply some standard against which to measure performance, 1972 publishing figures are given whenever available, although how much an academic library would want of total publishing is an unknown variable at this time.

Table III: Commercial publishers

The sample is approval-plan books received from October 1972 to October 1973.

Column 1: 1972 publishing

Column 2: Total number of books received from each publisher on the approval plan

Column 3: Number of books received that had been claimed

Column 4: Number of claims submitted to the vendor, to give an idea of how the vendor responds to claims

Columns 5 and 6: Percentages of claimed books received and claims submitted of the total number of books received

Column 7: The average in months of the time between date of claim and receipt of book

Table IV: University presses

Because the university-press approval plan on the whole is functioning better than the commercial, some of the record-keeping was delayed. The same information as in Table III is shown, but time periods, indicated in the table, vary.
