ABSTRACT

Guidelines and forms used in staff and development efforts in Florida's public community colleges are provided. Following these are a tabulation and brief summary of the staff and program development activities at each of the community colleges. After the title and a brief description of each program, the following types of information are coded for each: functional area primarily served, college program primarily served, success of the activity (institutional judgment), and value of the activity (institutional judgment). An analysis of the programs according to resource allocations and expenditures concludes the report. (KB)

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INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this document is to report 1973-74 Staff and Program Development guidelines and forms and to report institutional activities supported by Staff and Program Development appropriations for 1972-73. Some institutions may have engaged in staff or program development activities supported by funds additional to funds provided through the State program for Staff and Program Development, and those activities may not be reported herein. An analysis of Staff and Program Development activities is reported on the final pages of this document.

Enactment of a new procedure for determining the apportionment of state funds to community college districts became effective July 1, 1973. Prior to that time, the authority for Staff and Program Development as a special funding program was §230.767, Florida Statutes. State Board of Education Regulations and administrative directives from the Division of Community Colleges provided direction for administering the SPD program. Funding was at the rate of three percent of salaries.

The new funding procedure law removed Staff and Program Development authorization and formulation from law. State Board of Education Regulations (6A-8.761) now provides the authority for the SPD program and provides the allocation formula. Further direction for administering the SPD program remains with the Division of

Community Colleges. Funding is at the rate of two percent of the previous year's apportionment for current operation.

A Staff and Program Development Guidelines Committee consisting of representative members of the community college system aids the Division of Community Colleges in maintaining guidelines for the SPD program. Coordination of the SPD program is through a system of SPD coordinators with one from each community college.

State Board of Education Regulations (6A-8.761) reads:

Staff and program development funds.-- Funds included in the minimum foundation program for staff and program development shall be expended by each community college in accordance with a plan for staff and program development. Such plan shall be submitted for review and approved as required by the director. Beginning July 1, 1973, each community college shall allocate from its resources available for current operations during the fiscal year an amount equal to not less than two percent (2%) of the previous year's allocation from the state community college program fund or minimum foundation program for the purpose of funding staff and program development activities. In the event that current allocations from the state community college program fund are less than the allocations for the previous year, the director may authorize a decrease in the allocation to support staff and program development activities to an amount not less than two percent (2%) of current year program fund allocations.

GUIDELINES

The following guidelines apply to the staff and program development plans and activities within Florida's community colleges as provided for in State Board of Education Regulations, 6A-8.761.

I. Definitions.

- A. Staff Development.-- The development of existing staff includes the improvement of staff competency for both current requirements and new applications through interacting and updating experiences in human relations, in occupational skills, in subject matter, in teaching techniques, in foundation disciplines, and in resources utilization. "Staff" is interpreted to include all personnel employed by the colleges.
- B. Program Development.-- The development of programs includes the improvement of existing offerings as well as the designing of new programs. It is program initiation or improvement rather than expansion of existing programs. Development may be in any or all of the program categories: instructional, academic support, student support, institutional support. Program development includes researching, planning, and evaluating; staff retraining; salary payment (see restrictions); and purchasing of specialized equipment (see restrictions).
- C. Goal.-- A goal is the end toward which effort is directed. Staff and program development goals are those goals within the overall goals of the institution which are expressions of the mission or purpose toward which staff and program development efforts are directed.
- D. Objective.-- An objective is the specification of what is to be achieved within a given time. Staff and program development objectives are expressions of the intended extent and direction of change (planned outcome) or of the intended quantity or quota of production (planned output). Characteristic of an objective is its statement in terms that are measurable, such that its accomplishment is observable and verifiable by applying results against the phrasing of the objective.

- E. Activity.-- An activity is the action taken by a college toward achieving a staff or program development objective.

II. Forms.

Three forms are required in the planning and evaluation of staff and program development activities.

- A. Five-Year Goals Plan (SPD-1).-- On this form are identified the long-range goals for staff and program development as determined by a college. The span of the Goals Plan is five years. The Goals Plan is to be reviewed annually by the college and updated or continued without modification.

The Goals Plan reflects a college's commitment to certain staff and program development goals identified by the college based on the study of its staff and program development needs. The Goals Plan identifies the areas of activity toward which the Activity Plan will be addressed.

The updated or continued Goals Plan for the subsequent five-year period is to be submitted annually for approval to the director of the Division of Community Colleges by March 1.

- B. Activity Plan (SPD-2).-- On this form are identified the staff and program development activities planned by a college for the forthcoming year. The collection of Activity Plans comprising the planned staff and program development activities of a college for the forthcoming year is to be submitted annually for information purposes to the Program Section of the Division of Community Colleges by June 1. A budget summary is to accompany the set of Activity Plans.
- C. Activity Evaluation (SPD-3).-- On this form are reported the evaluations of staff and program development activities. An Activity Evaluation is to be prepared for each discrete activity.

The collection of Activity Evaluations, including a financial report summary, that pertains to the activities of the immediately preceding year is to be submitted annually to the director of the Division of Community Colleges by September 10.

III. Restrictions.

Basic to the staff and program development concept is that it is not a device to obtain more operating funds for the colleges. The use of staff and program development funds to pay for normal operating expenses is not appropriate. Since staff and program development funds are appropriated for staff and program development purposes, the following restrictions apply.

- A. Salaries.-- Funding new positions with staff and program development money, when authorized, is limited to planning and initiating new programs. The payment of salaries for such positions from staff and program development funds is limited to a maximum of three years.

Funding existing positions with staff and program development money, when authorized, is limited to providing released time for planning or study which contributes directly and measurably to program development. Staff and program development funds may be used for salary increases or fringe benefits only for positions supported from staff and program development funds.

Salary payments are to be limited to program initiation or improvement rather than expansion of existing programs.

- B. Equipment.-- Purchasing equipment with staff and program development funds is limited to program initiation or improvement rather than expansion of existing programs. In addition, the equipment may not merely duplicate or replace existing equipment; merely increase existing inventories; or meet regular, ongoing equipment needs.

Equipment purchased with staff and program development funds must not account for more than fifteen per cent of the staff and program development allocation of the college for the year of purchase. A college may request authorization from the Division of Community Colleges to exceed this limitation on the basis of special justification.

A limitation of three years applies to equipment rental and equipment incremental purchases by generic types.

- C. Contingency.-- A budgeted contingency is permitted in an amount not to exceed two per cent of the staff and program development allocation of the college for the year of the contingency. Expenditure of contingency funds must be consistent with the guidelines.
- D. Self-Study.-- Staff and program development funds may not be used to pay the direct costs of meeting Southern Association or other accrediting agency self-study requirements.
