#### ABSTRACT

The annotated bibliography cites over 500 audio-visual materials in the Afro-American Resource Center of the Toledo Public Schools. Black history and culture are emphasized, although some of the materials treat other ethnic and minority groups. Some items cited were published in the 70's, but most date from the 60's. The publication is divided into sections, which group the audio-visuals by type of material, and include: 1) motion pictures; 2) filmstrips; 3) records; 4) cassettes; 5) games; 6) maps; 7) slides; 8) study kits; 9) transparencies; 10) visuals. Within each section, materials are listed alphabetically by title. Each annotation gives the classification number, a complete physical description, a brief synopsis of content, and grade level. Using the same format, the supplement lists materials not included in the original audio-visual bibliography. The supplement also contains a subject index, divided into twenty-seven subject areas. Within each individual subject area, materials are grouped by type and then listed alphabetically by title. Individual titles are followed by grade level and page number where the complete description of the material may be found. (Author/RM)

Tells about life in Africa through the tale of a red bicycle which is assembled, painted, sold, and changes hands in the country of Nairobi.

Jazz composer, Calvin Jackson, traces the history and evolution of black music from tribal communications through plantation life, origins of spiritual and gospel music to the eras of the "blues", "ragtime", "dirieland", "jazz", and "swing", climaxing with the Afro-Cuban music and the "rhythm and blues" of today.

Narrated by Walter Cronkite.

The story of the late Charles Drew, Negro doctor, whose pioneering research in blood plasma led to the modern blood bank system. The film follows Dr. Drew's determined hurdling of racial barriers, from his diligent drive for honors at Amherst college through his struggling research in blood plasma to his breakthrough achievement in establishing the first blood banks for the American Red Cross.

A study of the different forms of black-white relations in Africa. Examines the Atlantic slave trade, the position of white sectlers in Kenya, and Kenya's current race policies. I. J. H.

MP 323.1-7 Martin Luther King, Jr., A Man Of Peace. Journal Films.

30 min. sd. b&w. 16mm.

Portrays events in the life of Dr. King, showing him at home, at church, in exclusive interviews, and finally receiving the Nobel Peace Prize in Stockholm. Examines his philosophies and his teaching.

Shows the changing climate of Africa; discusses trans-Saharan transportation and the growth of Islam as a prelude to the emergence of several prosperous and mighty empires in tropical Africa. Presents the story of medieval Senegal, Mali, and Ghana. Describes the initiation of slave trading and the emergence of new African states.

Presents in detail a traditional African process involving a simple blast furnace. This work process blends music, design and ritual in an integrated way of life which is rapidly disappearing.

Shows how the lives of the nomad herdsmen of the Tuareg and Peubl tribes are changing with the coming of modern technology. A realistic appraisal of nationalsim in Africa, particularly in Nigeria. A useful tool for understanding the underlying forces in tropical Africa. The Nigerian civil war is treated in historical perspective as a conflict between rival tribal loyalties.

Presents the work of Negroes who have contributed to the progress of the Civil Rights movement in the United States.

The first part of this publication is a descriptive list of the audio-visual materials in the Afro-American Resource Center which were not included in the original Audio-Visual Bibliography. Materials are grouped by type and then listed alphabetically by title. Consult the original Audio-Visual Bibliography introduction for information on the use of the title annotations and grade level code.

The second part is a subject index to all audio-visual materials listed in both the original Audio-Visual Bibliography and in the Audio-Visual Bibliography Supplement. The subject index is divided into twenty-seven subject areas (see table of contents) which will facilitate finding appropriate materials for particular user needs.

Within each individual subject area, materials are grouped by type and then listed alphabetically by title. Individual titles are immediately followed by grade level code and the page number where the complete description of the material may be found. The letter "S" following the page number indicates the description will be found in the Audio-Visual Bibliography Supplement rather than in the original Audio-Visual Bibliography.
