ABSTRACT

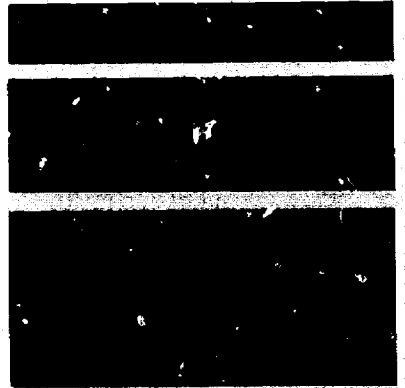
The State Council of Higher Education presents its annual report on head-count and fulltime-equivalent students enrolled for credit in Virginia's state-controlled institutions of higher education. Figures and tables are presented summarizing student enrollments for individual institutions by type of institution (2-year and 4-year), and for all state-controlled institutions for the 1972-73 year. Section I presents analysis of the resident head-count and fulltime-equivalent enrollments. Section II presents analysis of the off-campus course offerings and enrollments and the fulltime-equivalent off-campus enrollments. (MJM)

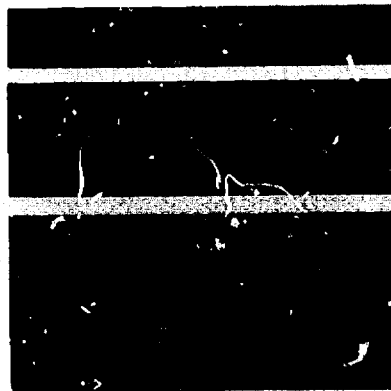

## INTRODUCTION

The State Council of Higher Education presents its annual report on head-count and full-time-equivalent students enrolled for credit in Virginia's state-controlled institutions of higher education. Its figures and tables summarize student enrollments for individual institutions, for groups of institutions (two-year and four-year), and for all state-controlled institutions for the year 1972-73.

The Council's annual reports on student enrollment are based on standardized data submitted by the various institutions on forms developed by the Council with the advice of its advisory committees. The analyses presented in this report are based on data submitted on the State Council's forms: B-3, Summary Head-Count Resident Enrollment by Term; A-1, Resident Classes Taught by Term; and A-2, Extension Classes Taught by Term.

Section I presents analysis of the resident head-count and full-time-equivalent enrollments. Section II presents analysis of the off-campus course offerings and enrollments and the full-time-equivalent off-campus enrollments.

The reader should be careful in arriving at any comparative analysis between the resident and off-campus data. Resident enrollments are reported by the level of the student, while the off-campus enrollments are reported by the level of the course. Also the resident head-count enrollment is a count of the number of individual students attending an institution. The off-campus enrollment represents the total number of registration for each course; therefore, persons enrolled in more than one off-campus course may be counted more than once.



**SECTION, I**

**RESIDENT ENROLLMENT**

## EXPLANATION OF DATA

Resident head-count enrollment is reported by residence, sex, course load, level of student and other categories. Definitions of the various enrollment categories may be found on pages 5-7.

The regular session resident head-count enrollment is the average of an institution's resident enrollment for the two semesters or three quarters of the regular academic year (September-June). This average has been calculated to counter-balance enrollment variations that occur within an institution from one semester or quarter to the next semester or quarter.

Full-time-equivalent (FTE) student enrollment is a convenient statistic derived from the student-credit-hour productivity of an institution. It is not a head-count of the individuals attending an institution. Based on methods developed by an advisory committee to the Council, FTE enrollment is derived, with exceptions for certain health professions fields, by dividing the total annual number of undergraduate and first professional semester credit-hours by 30 and by dividing the total annual number of graduate semester credit-hours by 24. (For those institutions on the quarter system, the divisors are 45 and 36, respectively.)

Resident full-time-equivalent enrollments are reported according to student levels and areas of study. (Summer Session 1972 full-time-equivalent enrollments are reported by course.) The seven student levels used for reporting FTE enrollment are Foundation, Terminal-Occupational, Bachelor's Credit, Upper, First Professional, First Year and Advanced Graduate. The thirty-four areas of study, with the subjects they include, are listed on pages 38-41.

Tables 1 through 7 report resident head-count enrollment, while tables 8 through 13 summarize resident full-time-equivalent enrollment in Virginia's state-controlled institutions of higher education for 1972-73.

## DEFINITIONS

### Advanced Student

A graduate student who has completed 30 or more semester hours of graduate credit. This category would apply only to institutions with doctoral degree programs.

### Bachelor's Credit Student

An undergraduate student enrolled in a two-year university parallel-college transfer program or in a 4- or 5-year bachelor's degree program who has not completed his sophomore year.

### First Professional Student

A student enrolled in a program leading to the first professional degree in dentistry (DDS), law (JD or LLB), or medicine (MD).

### First Year Student

A graduate student enrolled in a master's degree program or who has completed less than 30 semester hours of graduate credit.

### Full-Time-Equivalent (FTE) Student

A statistic derived from the student-credit-hour productivity of an institution.

- A. Undergraduate FTE: The equivalent number of students derived by dividing the total annual number of undergraduate semester credit-hours by 30 (for those institutions on the quarter system the divisor becomes 45). The number of FTE students in medical technology and physical therapy at the Health Sciences Division of Virginia Commonwealth University and in medical technology at the University of Virginia is equal to the total head-count enrollments in these fields.
- B. First Professional FTE: The equivalent number of students derived by dividing the total annual number of law semester credit-hours by 30. The number of FTE students in dentistry and medicine is equal to the total head-count enrollments in these fields.

- C. Graduate FTE: The equivalent number of students derived by dividing the total annual number of graduate semester credit-hours by 24 (for those institutions on the quarter system the divisor becomes 36). The number of FTE students in hospital administration is equal to the total head-count enrollment in this field.

Foundation Level Student

A student enrolled in developmental courses preparatory for admission to the occupational-technical, university parallel-college transfer, or 4- or 5-year bachelor's degree programs.

Full-Time Student

A student enrolled in credits equal to at least 75 per cent of the normal full-time load.

Graduate Student

A student enrolled in a master's or doctor's degree program (not including candidates for the first professional degrees in dentistry [DDS], law [JD or LLB], and medicine [MD]).

Head-Count Student

A student enrolled for one or more credits (excluding extension) in a state-controlled institution of higher education.

In-State Student

A student paying the tuition and fees specified by the institution for a resident of Virginia.

Lower Level Student

An undergraduate student enrolled in a post-secondary terminal-occupational, certificate, diploma, or associate degree program, in a two-year university parallel-college transfer program, or in a 4- or 5-year bachelor's degree program who has not completed his sophomore year.

Out-of-State Student

A student paying the tuition and fees specified by the institution for a non-resident of Virginia.

Part-Time Student

A student enrolled in credits equal to fewer than 75 per cent of the normal full-time load.

Regular Session

The standard academic year of two semesters or three quarters, usually beginning in September and ending in June.

Terminal-Occupational Student

A lower level undergraduate student enrolled in a post-secondary certificate, diploma, or associate degree program of less than four years which prepares for immediate employment or provides general education (but is not chiefly creditable toward a bachelor's degree).

Unclassified Student

A student who cannot be classified by level. Many unclassified students, although eligible for degree candidacy, have been formally permitted to take a limited or special selection of degree-credit courses without regard to requirements for a degree.

Undergraduate Student

A student who has not yet obtained a bachelor's degree.

Upper Level Student

An undergraduate student enrolled in a 4- or 5-year bachelor's degree program who has completed his sophomore year.

# RESIDENT HEAD-COUNT ENROLLMENT

## INTRODUCTION

The total resident head-count enrollment in Virginia's state-controlled institutions of higher education during the regular session 1972-73 averaged 128,966 which amounted to a 10.7 per cent increase from 1971-72. The four-year institutions enrolled 68.9 per cent of the students and the two-year institutions enrolled 31.1 per cent (page 13).

The total first semester resident head-count enrollment of 133,683 for the 1972-73 academic year was a 10.1 per cent increase over the first semester of 1971-72 (page 15). The four-year institutions had an average gain of 7.3 per cent (page 16) and the Virginia Community College System had an average gain of 17.4 per cent (page 17). The one two-year branch institution had a decrease of 6.7 per cent (page 17).

Of the total resident regular session enrollment of 128,966, 68.9 per cent were full-time students and 31.1 per cent were part-time students (page 19). The four-year institutions had a regular session enrollment of 88,805 with 78.5 per cent of the students enrolled full-time and 21.5 per cent part-time. The full-time students enrolled in the two-year institutions accounted for 47.5 per cent of the total two-year regular session enrollment of 40,161 while the part-time students accounted for 52.5 per cent (page 19).

Out-of-state students constituted 14.7 per cent of the total resident regular session head-count enrollment (page 21), as well as 10.4 per cent of the summer session enrollment (page 23). Male students accounted for 55.9 per cent of the total resident regular session enrollment (page 21). Males constituted 53.6 per cent (page 20) of the four-year enrollment and 60.8 per cent of the two-year enrollment (page 21).

Virginia institutions of higher education have experienced a rapid growth in enrollment over the past few years. During the 1968-69 academic year, the 31 state-controlled institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth had a total resident regular session head-count enrollment of 82,344 students. In 1972-73, the 39 state-controlled institutions of higher education had a total enrollment of 128,966 students, a gain of 56.6 per cent in the four-year period.

In 1968 there were 13 four-year state-controlled institutions of higher education in Virginia with a total regular session head-count enrollment of 64,380 students. Since that year, two new four-year institutions have been established with the transition of Christopher Newport and Clinch Valley from two-year to four-year status. Also a new urban university, Virginia Commonwealth University, was established in 1968 with the merger of the Medical College of Virginia and Richmond Professional Institute. In 1972-73, these 15 four-year state-controlled institutions reported a total regular session head-count enrollment of 88,805 students, a 37.9 per cent gain since the 1968-69 academic year.

In 1968 there were 18 two-year state-controlled institutions of higher education, two of which have since become four-year institutions. The 18 two-year institutions reported a total regular session head-count enrollment of 17,964 students during the 1968-69 academic year. In 1972-73, the 24 two-year state-controlled institutions reported a regular session head-count enrollment of 40,161 students, a 124 per cent gain since the 1968-69 academic year. This rapid increase in enrollment has come about primarily through the development of the Virginia Community College System which was started in 1966.

INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION, 1968-69 TO 1972-73

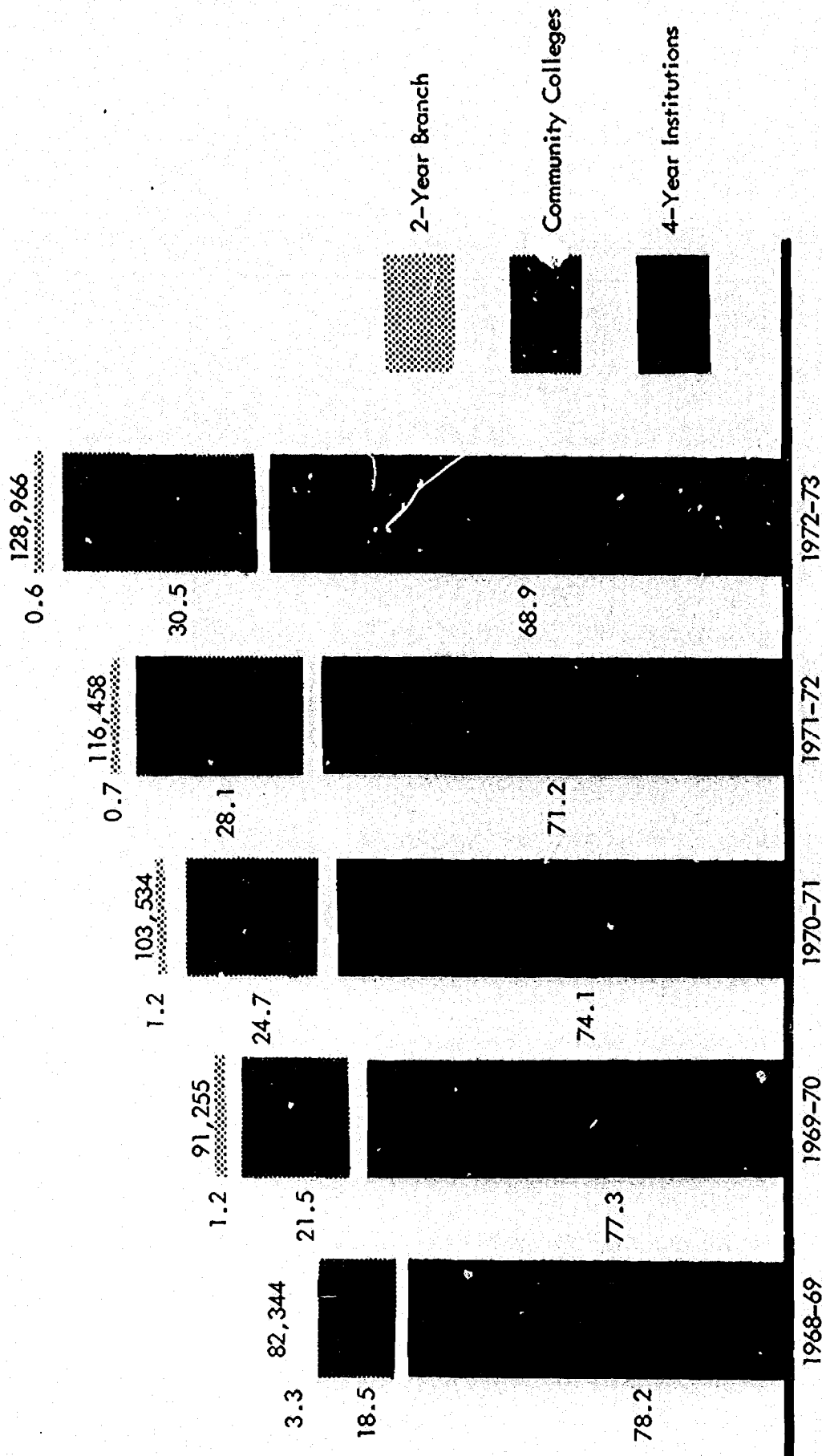

## INTRODUCTION

The total resident full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollment in Virginia's state-controlled institutions of higher education during the regular session 1972-73 averaged 106,692 students, an average gain of 9.1 per cent from 1971-72. The regular session enrollment was composed of 9.7 per cent foundation level students, 9.0 per cent terminal-occupational level, 43.3 per cent bachelor's credit level, 28.2 per cent upper level, 2.5 per cent first professional level, 5.8 per cent first year graduate and 1.5 per cent advanced graduate (page 36).

The total annual FTE enrollment for the 1972-73 academic year (regular session plus summer session) was 116,517 students, an average increase of 8.8 per cent from the total FTE enrollment for 1971-72 (page 37). The four-year institutions had a 7.0 per cent average increase in FTE enrollment during 1972-73 (page 35) compared with an average FTE enrollment gain of 14.5 per cent by the two-year institutions (page 37).

The five areas of study with the largest FTE enrollments during 1972-73 were (in descending order) the social sciences, 18,484 (page 48); letters, 15,345 (page 48); education, 12,324 (page 46); business and management, 9,763 (page 46); and mathematics, 9,690 (page 48). These five areas of study accounted for 56.3 per cent of the total FTE enrollment.

The resident full-time-equivalent regular session enrollment in Virginia's state-controlled institutions of higher education increased from 70,937 in 1968-69 to 106,692 in 1972-73, a gain of 50.4 per cent. The state-controlled four-year institutions experienced a 38.1 per cent increase while the two-year colleges showed a gain of 103.9 per cent during the same period.

In 1968-69, the two-year institutions accounted for 18.7 per cent of the total regular session FIE students. This percentage increased to 25.4 per cent in 1972-73. The two-year institutions' head-count enrollment is composed of a significantly larger proportion of part-time students than is the four-year institutions'; therefore, the ratio of head-count enrollment to full-time-equivalent students produced is greater at the two-year institutions.

Full-time-equivalent enrollments were derived by computer from student-credit-hour data submitted by each institution. The computer processing of the data may result in slight deviations from other published enrollment statistics for each institution due to the rounding of fractions to whole numbers.

INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION, 1968-69 TO 1972-73

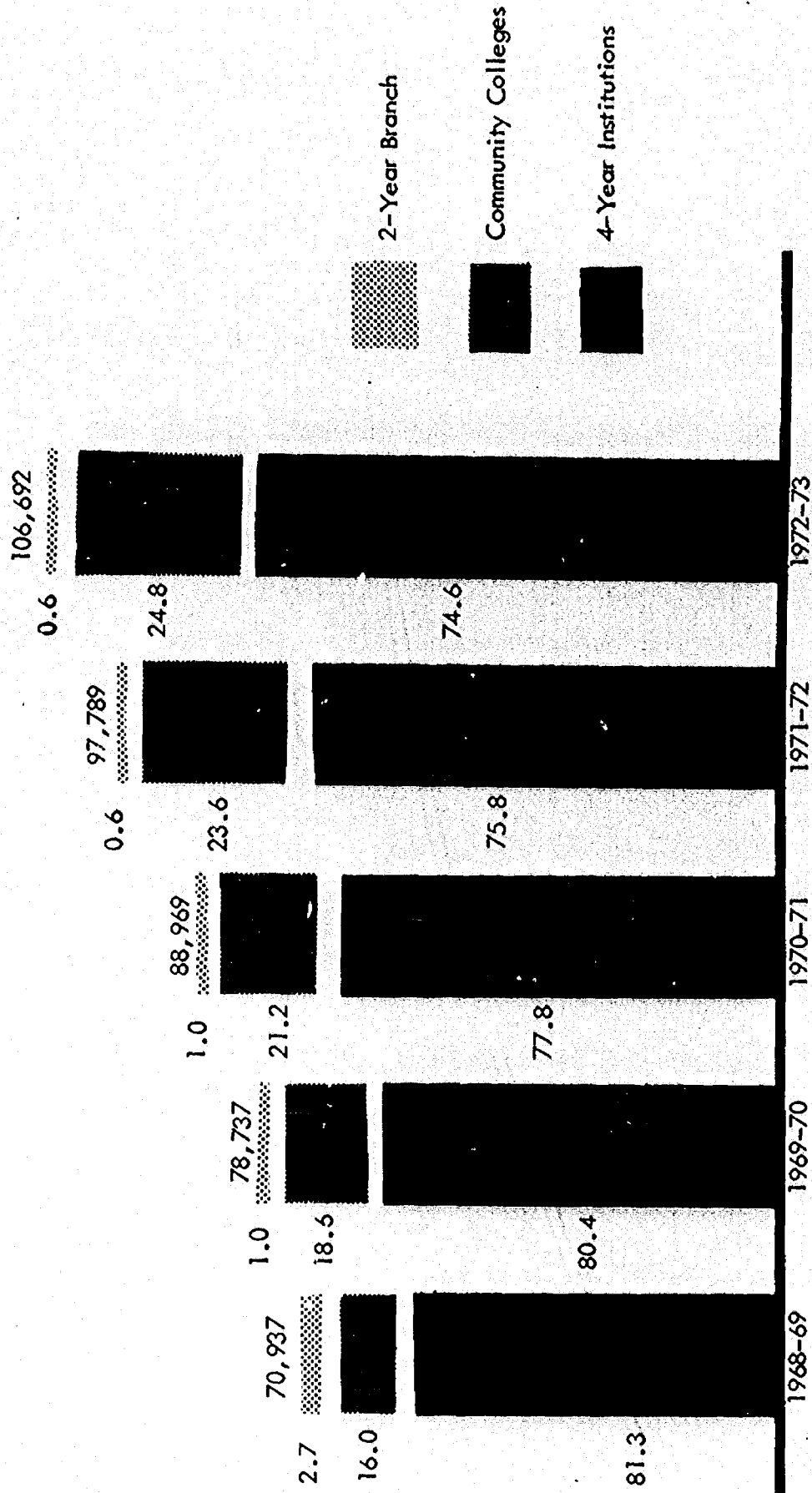

**SECTION II**

**OFF-CAMPUS CREDIT ENROLLMENT**

**OFF-CAMPUS CREDIT COURSE OFFERINGS  
AND ENROLLMENT**

The Code of Virginia provides that the State Council of Higher Education "shall coordinate the continuing education offerings of all state-controlled institutions of higher education, including all credit and non-credit academic courses and programs." In order to more efficiently and effectively meet these statutory responsibilities, the State Council, in cooperation with the Continuing Education Advisory Committee, developed a State Plan for Regional Consortia for Continuing Higher Education in Fall, 1972. Both the Plan and current legislation provide for dividing the state into continuing education regions along state planning district lines. Within each region a consortium for continuing higher education shall be established. The off-campus credit course offerings and enrollment data reviewed in this report are presented by geographical areas corresponding to the State Plan for Regional Consortia (see page 85 for map of consortia regions).

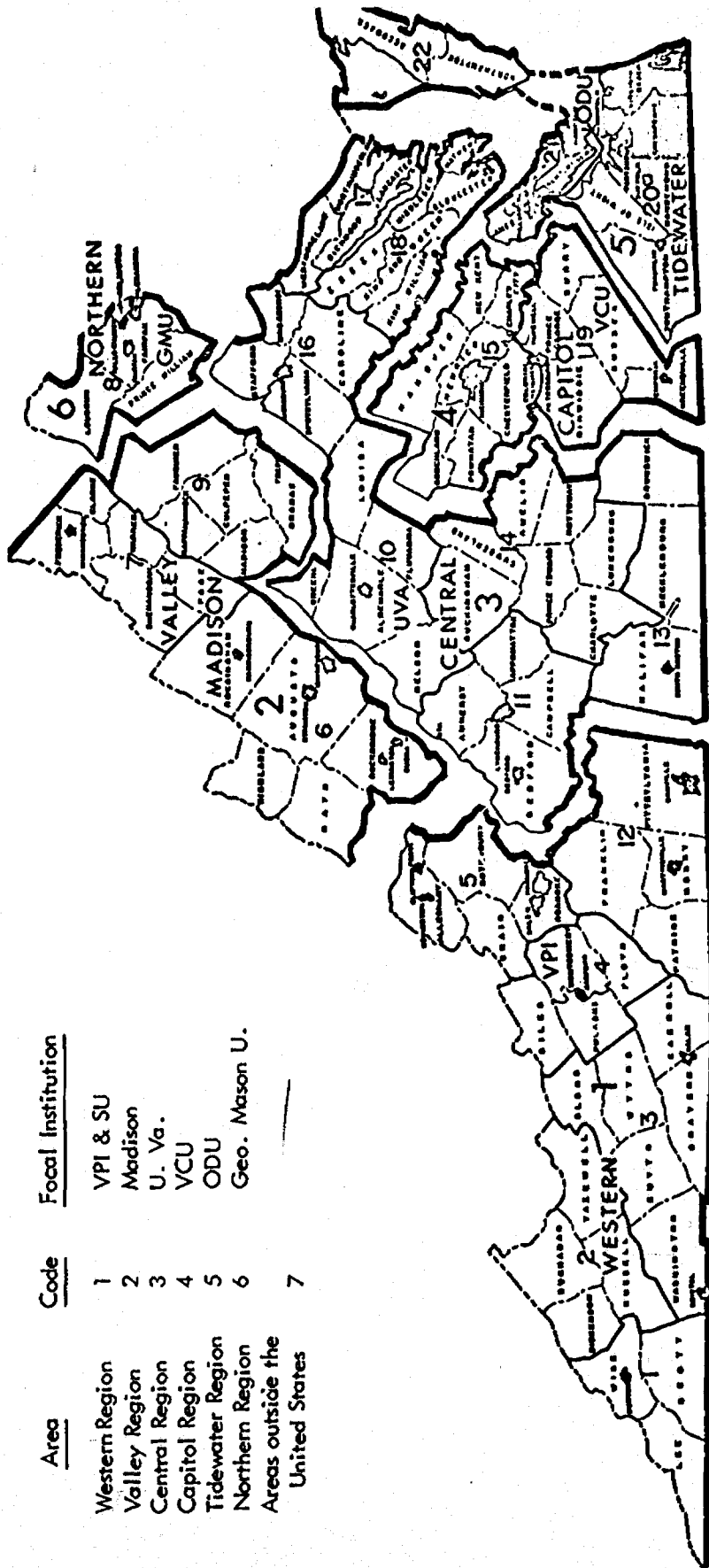
Twenty-two state-controlled institutions of higher education offered 2,431 off-campus classes for credit during the year 1972-73, an increase of 14.5 per cent over 1971-72. Of the 2,431 courses taught during the 1972-73 academic year, 1.4 per cent were foundation level courses, 27.0 per cent were lower level courses (freshman and sophomore), 24.9 per cent were upper level courses (junior and senior), and 46.7 per cent were graduate level courses. The number of off-campus classes offered by region ranged from 128 in the Valley Region to 772 in the Northern Virginia Region.



Enrollment in off-campus classes during 1972-73 totaled 50,116 students, a 15.9 per cent increase from 1971-72. Foundation level classes enrolled 347, or 0.7 per cent of the total; lower level classes enrolled 11,410, or 22.8 per cent of the total; upper level classes enrolled 15,055 students, or 30.0 per cent of the total; and graduate classes enrolled 23,304 students, or 46.5 per cent of the total enrollment. The number of students enrolled by off-campus region ranged from 1,991 in the Valley Region to 16,377 in the Northern Virginia Region. The average number of students enrolled in an off-campus class during 1972-73 was 10.2 at the foundation level, 17.4 at the lower level, 24.9 at the upper level and 20.5 at the graduate level.

The Northern Virginia Region accounted for the 31.8 per cent of the total classes offered and 32.7 per cent of the total students enrolled. Of the total classes offered in the Northern Virginia Region, 438 were graduate courses, 38.6 per cent of the total graduate classes offered in the state. Although the Northern Virginia Region is relatively small geographically, the sizable number of graduate offerings in that area is not surprising considering the presence of a large concentrated population and the absence of a state-supported institution of higher education offering a significant number of graduate courses.

**OFF-CAMPUS FULL-TIME-EQUIVALENT  
CREDIT ENROLLMENT**

Full-time-equivalent (FTE) student enrollment is a statistic derived from the student-credit-hour-productivity of an institution. The undergraduate FTE enrollment is derived by dividing the total annual number of undergraduate semester credit-hours by 30 (for those institutions on the quarter system the divisor becomes 45). The graduate FTE enrollment is derived by dividing the total annual number of graduate semester credit-hours by 24 (for those institutions on the quarter system the divisor becomes 36). The off-campus full-time-equivalent enrollments are presented by area of study and by the level of course.

The total off-campus FTE enrollment for the year 1972-73 (regular session plus summer session) was 5,146. Of the twenty-two state-controlled institutions of higher education offering off-campus courses, fifteen were community colleges and seven were four-year institutions. The University of Virginia led all institutions with an FTE enrollment of 3,481 or 67.6 per cent of the total, while Thomas Nelson had an FTE enrollment of 77 or 1.5 per cent for the largest enrollment among the community colleges.

The five areas of study with the largest FTE enrollments during 1972-73 were (in descending order) education, 2,600; public affairs and services, 572; social sciences, 467; business and management, 314; and letters, 230. Education accounted for 50.5 per cent of the total FTE enrollment, a decrease from 58.3 per cent in 1971-72.

During the regular session (the average of the two semesters or three quarters of the regular academic year), foundation level courses accounted for 0.4 per cent of the total FTE enrollment and lower level courses accounted for 20.6 per cent of the total, while the upper and graduate level courses accounted for 29.3 and 49.7 per cent, respectively.
