ABSTRACT

This report is the 8th annual survey of college enrollments in Connecticut as prepared by the Commission for Higher Education. Highlights indicate: (1) After decreasing rates of growth in total enrollment for the years 1970, 1971, and 1972, the percentage increase in fall 1973 over fall 1972 rose to 3.7%. (2) In the independent colleges, fulltime undergraduate enrollment increased from 28,008 to 28,525 or 1.9%. (3) In the publicly supported colleges, fulltime undergraduate enrollment increased from 47,447 to 48,015 or 1.2%. (4) The number of first-time, fulltime students increased from 7,737 to 7,908 or 2.2% in the independent colleges. (5) For the second year, fulltime enrollment in the regional community colleges decreased slightly down from 10,737, or 0.9%. (6) Degrees numbering 25,001 were granted in the year ending June 1973. This is an increase of 8.9% over those granted in 1972. (7) 49.9% of all degrees granted were earned by women. Last year (1972) the percentage for women was 41.4%. (8) 44.5% of the fulltime undergraduates in the independent colleges were Connecticut residents. In the public colleges 92.0% of the fulltime undergraduates were Connecticut residents. (MJM)

## HIGHLIGHTS

...After decreasing rates of growth in total enrollment for the years 1970, 1971 and 1972, the percentage increase in Fall, 1973 over Fall, 1972 rose to 3.7%. In student count, total enrollment increased from 132,119 to 136,956. Percent increases over the preceding year were 7.9% for 1970, 3.1% for 1971 and 1.2% for 1972. It is not known at this time whether this indicates a change in trend in enrollments. It may reflect the increased number of high school graduates in June 1973 over June 1972. Also, there are indications that more of the earlier high school graduates, that is older students, are returning to formal study. (Fig. 1)

...In the independent colleges, full-time undergraduate enrollment increased from 28,008 to 28,528, or 1.9%. An unexpected increase occurred in full-time graduate enrollment in the independent colleges - from 5,036 in Fall 1972 to 5,595 in Fall, 1973, 11.1%. Total enrollment, all students, increased in the independent sector by 2.3%. (Table 1)

...In the publicly supported colleges: full-time undergraduate enrollment increased from 47,447 to 48,015, or 1.2%. Full-time graduate enrollment increased from 3,762 to 4,063, or 8.0%. Total enrollment, all students, in the publicly supported colleges increased by 4.5%. (Table 1)

...The number of first-time full-time students increased from 7,737 to 7,908, or 2.2%, in the independent colleges. This category in the publicly supported colleges increased from 15,022 to 16,018, or 6.6%. (Table 4)

...For the second year, full-time enrollment in the regional community colleges decreased slightly, from 10,838 to 10,737, or .9%. Part-time enrollment in these colleges increased by 28.2% from 9,717 to 12,458. The 12 community colleges enroll 21.7% of the total number of full-time lower division students, that is first and second year students, enrolled in all colleges in the State. (Table 1)

...25,001 degrees were granted the year ending June, 1973. This is an increase of 8.9% over the 22,966 granted in 1972.

...42.9% of all degrees granted were earned by women. Last year, 1972, the percentage for women was 41.4%. (Table 6)

...44.5% of the full-time undergraduates in the independent colleges were Connecticut residents. In the public colleges 92.0% of the full-time undergraduates were Connecticut residents. (Table 5)


## FOREWORD

This report is the 8th annual survey of college enrollments in Connecticut as prepared by the Commission for Higher Education. The principal data sources for this report are the Higher Education General Information Survey forms completed by the colleges. These forms are distributed, collected and forwarded to Washington by the Commission. Additional sources used this year were reports on enrollment received from the Central Offices of the Regional Community Colleges and the State Technical Colleges.

The tables and figures in this survey present a head count of all students by categories as reported on the HEGIS forms. Readers should be alert to the fact that enrollment as a head count of all students in the public colleges is not the same as the enrollment supported by State General Fund appropriations. If the operating expenditures of the public colleges are to be related to enrollment data, then the Commission report on General Fund supported enrollments is the better source of enrollment data.

The staff of the Commission is grateful to the staff members of the colleges who have supplied these data to us. The requests for statistical information made of the colleges are many, and we appreciate the efficient and pleasant manner in which the forms were completed.

Readers of this survey are invited to express their comments and suggestions to the Commission.

TABLE 1 - Opening Fall Enrollments, 1973

<b>Sources:</b>	HEGIS, 1973, Form No. 2300-2.3, Reports from Central Offices, Regional Community Colleges and State Technical Colleges
<b>Reporting Date:</b>	October 15 - November 1, 1973
<b>Full-Time Undergraduate:</b>	A student registered for 12 or more undergraduate semester hours credit.
<b>Full-Time Graduate:</b>	A student classified by the reporting college as a full-time graduate. Semester hours may differ depending upon independent study and research.
<b>Part-Time Undergraduate:</b>	A student registered for less than 12 undergraduate semester hours credit.
<b>Part-Time Graduate:</b>	A student classified by the reporting college as a part-time graduate. Usually implies three to six graduate hour credit program and not applying all of his working hours to study.
<b>Unclassified Students:</b>	Students not matriculated for a degree, diploma, or certificate, or equivalent award, although taking courses in regular classes with other students; this category also includes students who cannot be classified by level.
<b>Other Students:</b>	A student carried by the college in an organized occupation program not directly creditable towards a bachelor's degree.
<b>Public System:</b>	Includes the constituent units in higher education: the University of Connecticut; the four State Colleges; the twelve Regional Community Colleges; and the four State Technical Colleges.
<b>Independent College:</b>	A college licensed by the Commission for Higher Education which is not included in the Public System; excludes the U.S. Coast Guard Academy which is federally supported.

Usually conferred upon completion of two years planned study with issuance of either certificate or diploma. Includes both occupational and non-occupational programs.

**1st Professional  
Degree:**

Usually granted after one, two or three years of post bachelor study in the areas of law, architecture, dentistry, medicine, etc.



DEFINITION AND SOURCES OF INFORMATION (cont'd)

**Advanced Study**

Study beyond the Master's degree and less than the doctoral degree. Includes the 6th year specialist programs in education. Also includes further study beyond the master's in other academic disciplines.

**Master of Philosophy:**

A degree granted only by Yale after a minimum of two years of post baccalaureate study to students who have completed all the requirements for the PhD except for those relating directly to the dissertation.

**APPENDIX - Summer Session Enrollment, 1973**

**Source:**

Questionnaire from the Commission for Higher Education.

**Summer Session Student:**

A student who registers for study during the summer months. If the reporting college offers more than one summer session, the table may show duplications inasmuch as each summer session is counted separately.

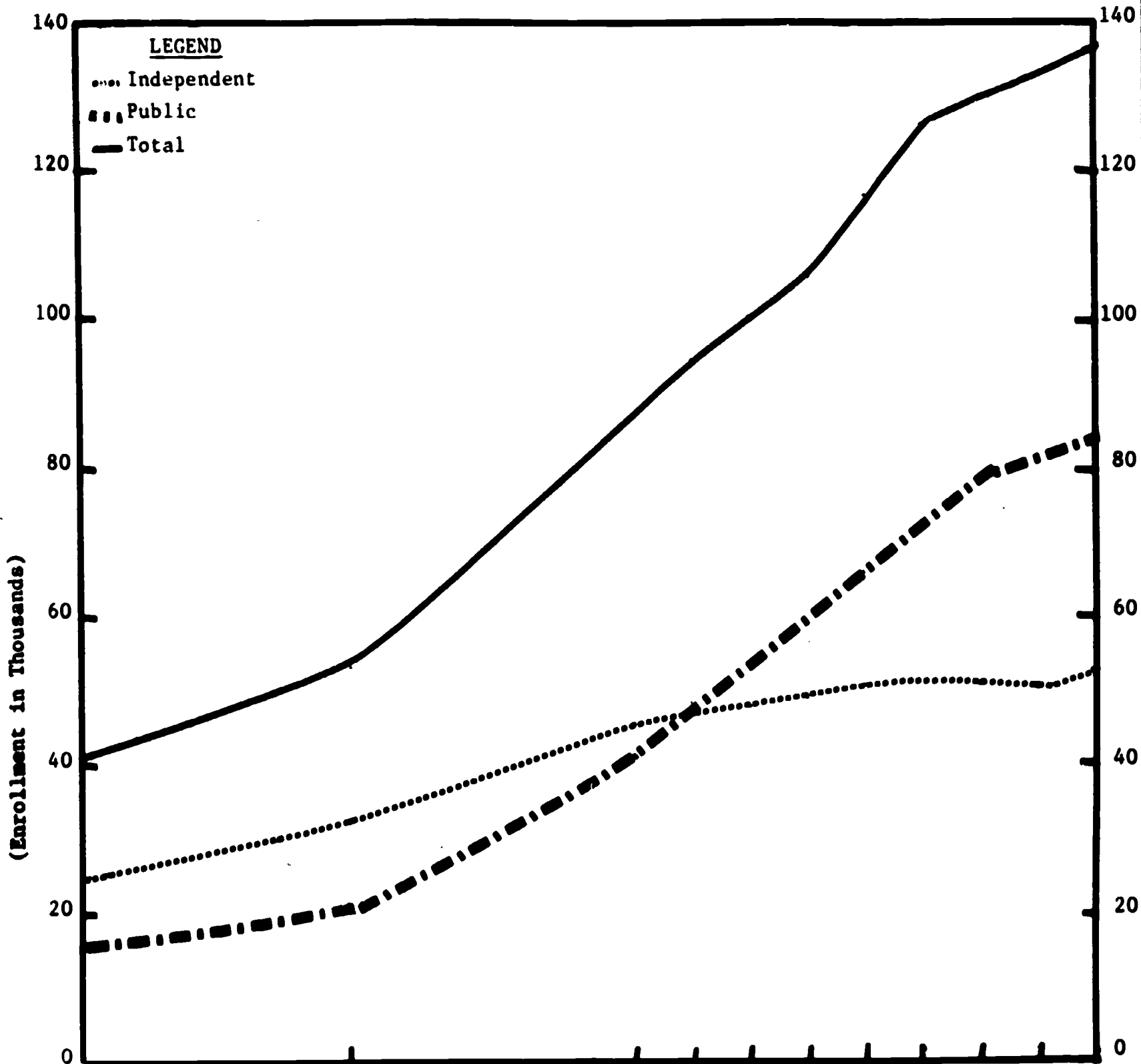
**Unclassified Student:**

Not matriculated at the reporting college for a degree, diploma, or certificate, or equivalent award, although taking courses in regular classes with other students.

Including All Students in Degree and Other Programs

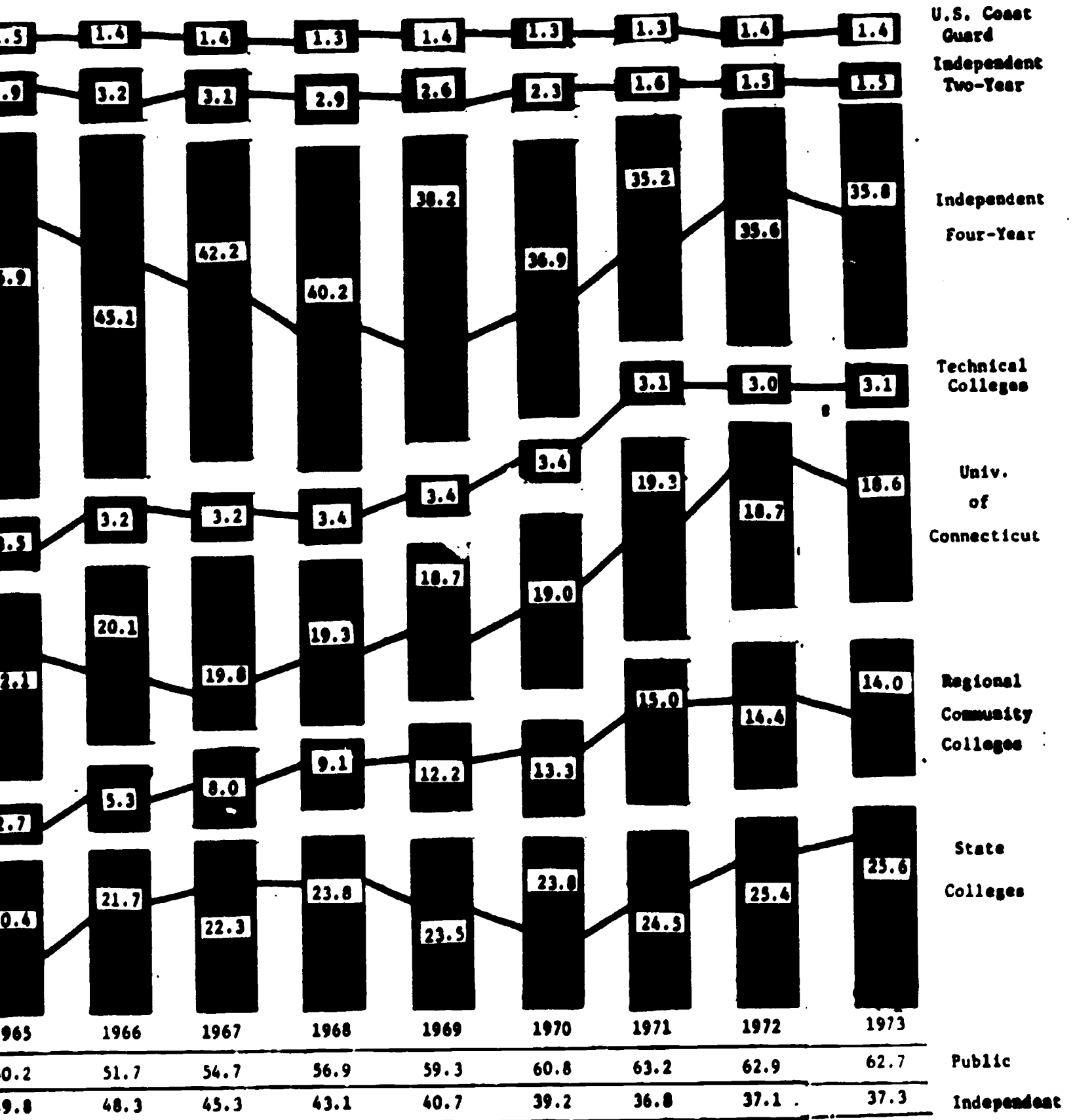

**DISTRIBUTION OF PERCENTAGES OF TOTAL FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT**

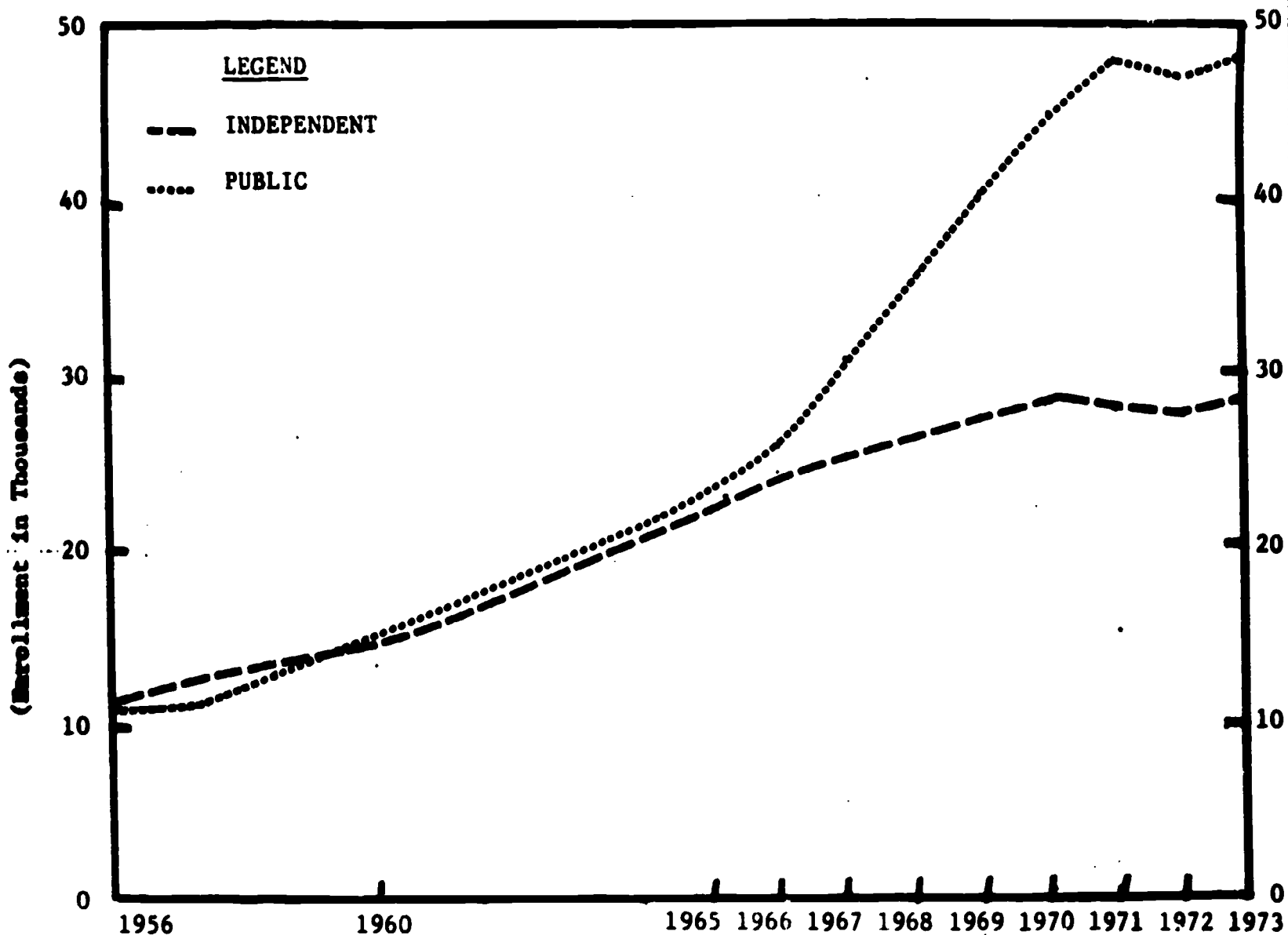
**BY TYPE OF INSTITUTION: 1965-1973**
