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ABSTRACT

A summary is provided of a computer printout of grade point average of all first-time freshmen entering Los Angeles City College in fall 1973. High schools in California (public and private) are included if the number of students entering L. A. C. C. totaled six or more; all other states and foreign countries with two or more students entering the college are included. The findings are provided in three tables. In Table 1, data for California public high schools, California private high schools, other states and foreign countries are listed in alphabetical order for each group. Table 2 lists, in order of number of students, the 20 high schools sending 25 or more students. Included in this table are the mean raw scores made on the fall 1973 L. A. C. C. Guidance Examination for students from these high schools, with the exception of two that were not available. Table 3 presents some Pearson correlation coefficients for the variables of Table 2, and Table 4 shows the relative ranking of the 18 local high schools on GPA and on three parts of the Guidance Examination. 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PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

Last March the District Computer Center, for reasons not known to the Research Office, furnished Los Angeles City College with a printout of grade point averages of all first time freshmen entering L.A.C.C. in Fall, 1973. These statistics were grouped according to high school source and averages presented for each group. The purpose of this study is to summarize this information, the first such available.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

The computer printout presented name, social security number, units completed, grade points, grade point average, and day or evening status for each entering freshman. These were grouped for each California public high school, each California private high school, each State (other than California) and each foreign country. Average units attempted, average units completed and average GPA were given for each group. Unfortunately, no figures were given for the grand total or any sub-totals. For the purposes of this study, high schools in California (public and private) were included if the number of students totaled six or more; all other states and foreign countries with two or more students were included.

A more detailed analysis was made for schools with 25 or more students.

FINDINGS

Table 1 lists, in alphabetical order for each group, data for California public high schools, California private high schools, other states, and foreign countries.

FINDINGS (continued)

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Table 2 lists, in order of number of students, the twenty high schools sending 25 or more students. Not surprisingly, these are all local high schools. Included in this table are the mean raw scores made on the Fall, 1973 L.A.C.C. Guidance Examination for students from these high schools (2 not available). Table 3 presents some Pearson correlation coefficients for these variables of Table 2. Caution should be observed in interpreting these coefficients as they involve only 18 sets of measures, and the measures are for averages of groups rather than for individuals. However, they can indicate relationships; coefficients of 0.6 or above can be considered statistically significant from zero, meaning that a relationship can be inferred. Table 4 shows the relative ranking of these 18 local high schools on GPA and on the three parts of the Guidance Examination.

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SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

This study presents an analysis of some data furnished by the District Office Computer Center showing Fall, 1973 performance of entering freshmen according to high school source. In addition to hundreds of schools in California, almost every other State and thirty foreign countries furnished entering freshmen to L.A.C.C. in Fall, 1973.

Grade point averages for students from local high schools ranged from about 1.7 to 2.7. With a few exceptions, ranking of local high schools according to first semester L.A.C.C. average GPA matches closely that of average raw score on the college Guidance Examination. This suggests that a possible wider use of the examination in counseling entering students might be advisable.

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
