ABSTRACT

This study summarizes (in three tables) the 1972-1973 performance of the first-time Los Angeles City College (L. A. C. C.) transfers at the various campuses of the California State University and Colleges. The following are some observations from the findings of the study: (1) 16 of the 19 campuses sent reports to L. A. C. C.; 14 reported at least one transfer from L. A. C. C. during 1972-1973; (2) three local campuses accounted for nearly 90 percent of the total reported number of 1,119 (Los Angeles 65 percent, Northridge 16 percent, Long Beach 8 percent, all others below 3 percent); (3) at 8 of the 11 caupuses reporting fall 1972 entrants, grade point average (GPA) was higher at the state institution than at L. A. C. C. Over 40 percent of the total number of fall entrants earned a "B" average or above (50 percent for females) at the transfer institution; 15 percent earned below a "C" average (6 percent for females): (4) females' GPA for the fall 1972 entrants was 2.79, males 2.47, compared with respective L. A. C. C. GPA's of 2.59 and 2.45. Both groups improved their GPA at the state institution; and (5) transfers in the Schools of Letters and Science at the three local campuses averaged 2.6 or above; those in the Schools of Business averaged below 2.4; and the only group averaging below "C" (1.98) were seven Fine Arts transfers from Northridge. PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

The 19 colleges in the California State University and Colleges system report annually to the California Community Colleges on the performance of their transfers. In 1972-1973, Los Angeles City College received reports from 16 of the 19 campuses. It is the purpose of this study to summarize these reports.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

Format for the reports varies from campus to campus, making comparative analysis difficult. Some include all students, others first semester (or quarter) students only. Some indicate sex, major, and/or totals from the community colleges. Some send individual grade reports, other a summary only. With assistance from L.A.C.C. records, a considerable amount of detective work and some interpolations and extrapolations produced the findings of the next section. While the data presented cannot be guaranteed 100% correct, it is believed to be an accurate picture of the numbers and performance of L.A.C.C. transfers to the State University and Colleges in 1972-1973.

FINDINGS

Table 1 summarizes the numbers of students transferring from L.A.C.C. to one of the State Universities or Colleges in 1972-1973 as indicated by the reports received. A total of 1,119 transfers were reported. Estimating the missing data, one can infer the actual total was around 1,200.

FINDINGS (continued)

Table 2 summarizes academic performance by campus and by sex, while Table 3 presents a more detailed look by major field at the three large campuses in the grater Los Angeles area, viz., Los Angeles, Northridge, and Long Beach. Entrants for Fall, 1972 only are included in Tables 2 and 3.

- (5) Transfers in the Schools of Letters and Science at the three local campuses averaged 2.6 or above. Those in the Schools of Business averaged below 2.4. The only group averaging below "C" (1.98) were the seven Fine Arts transfers from Northridge.
