ACCREDITATION

Accreditation consists of voluntary self-evaluation by an institution and appraisal by a group of its peers. This process operates through nationally recognized accrediting agencies and associations which have established criteria for the evaluation of institutions in terms of their own objectives and to ascertain whether programs of educational quality are being maintained.

Colleges, universities and institutes in New England may be accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). Such regional accreditation applies to the entire institution and indicates that each constituent unit is achieving its own particular aims satisfactorily, although not necessarily all on the same level of quality.

The following abbreviations are used in this booklet to signify the various stages of accreditation by the NEASC:

NE Institution is accredited by the NEASC.

NE Cand Institution is recognized by the NEASC as a Candidate for Accreditation. This is not accreditation. It indicates an institution is progressing steadily and properly toward accreditation.

In addition to regional accreditation of the institution, certain professional and specialized schools and programs in New England may be accredited by the following national associations. Level of Highest Offering

- I A two- or three-year program of college level studies.
- II Bachelor's degree program (traditionally four-year) of first professional degree program which entitles the graduate to enter the profession indicated.
- III Program leading to a master's degree (the customary first graduate degree) or to a professional degree earned after the first professional degree in the same field.
- IV Program leading to a doctor's degree.
- V Post-doctoral only.

Type of Program

- a Terminal-occupational program (direct preparation for an occupation and not intended to prepare for advanced study).
- b Liberal arts program.
- c Both liberal arts and terminal-occupational programs.
- d Primarily teacher preparatory programs.

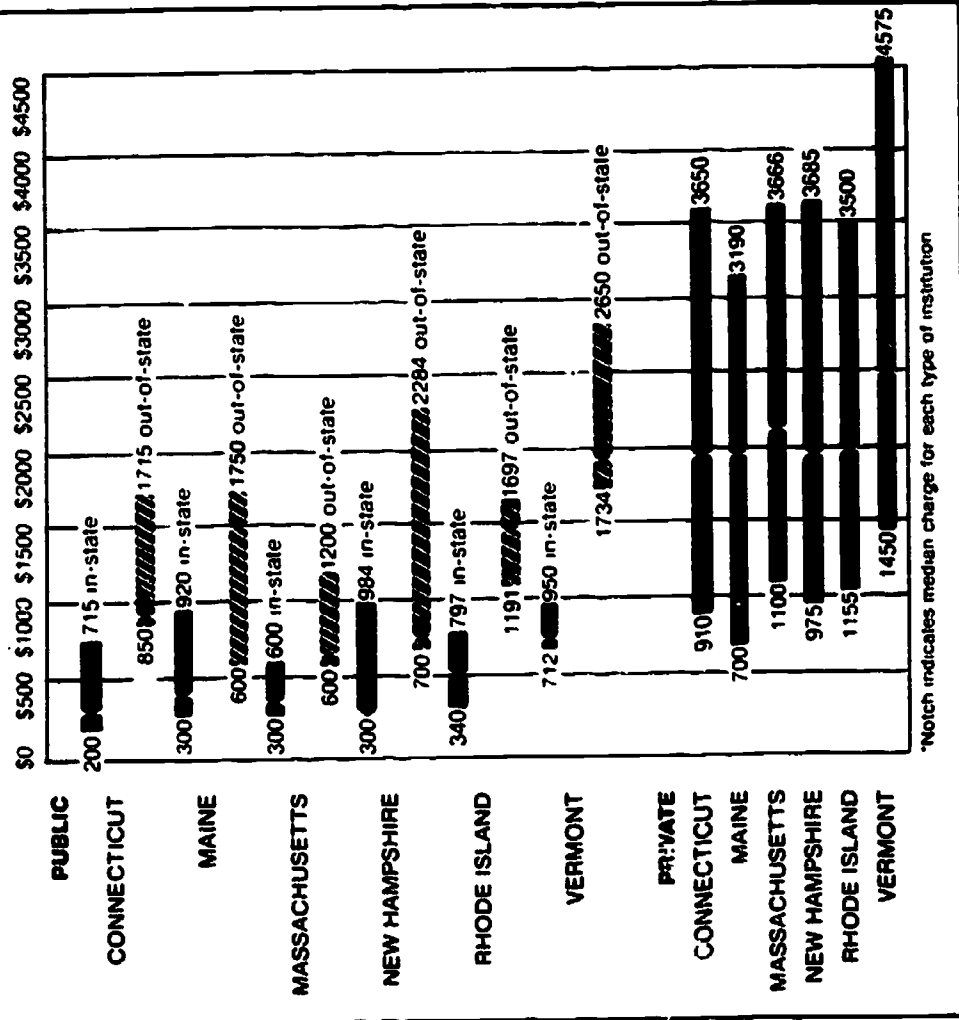

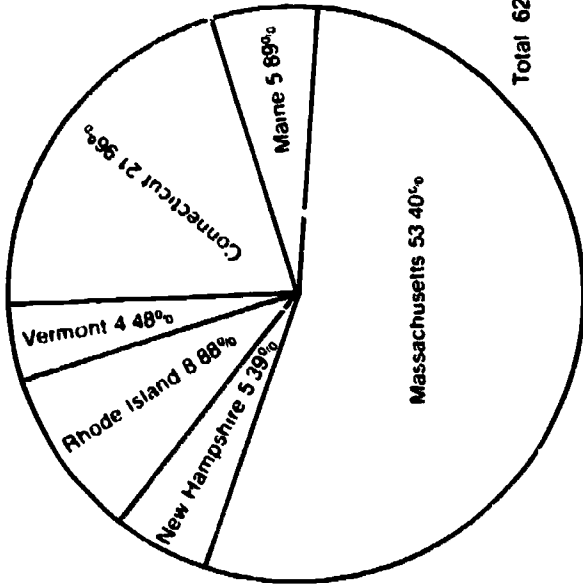
RANGE OF TUITION COSTS BY STATE, 1974-75

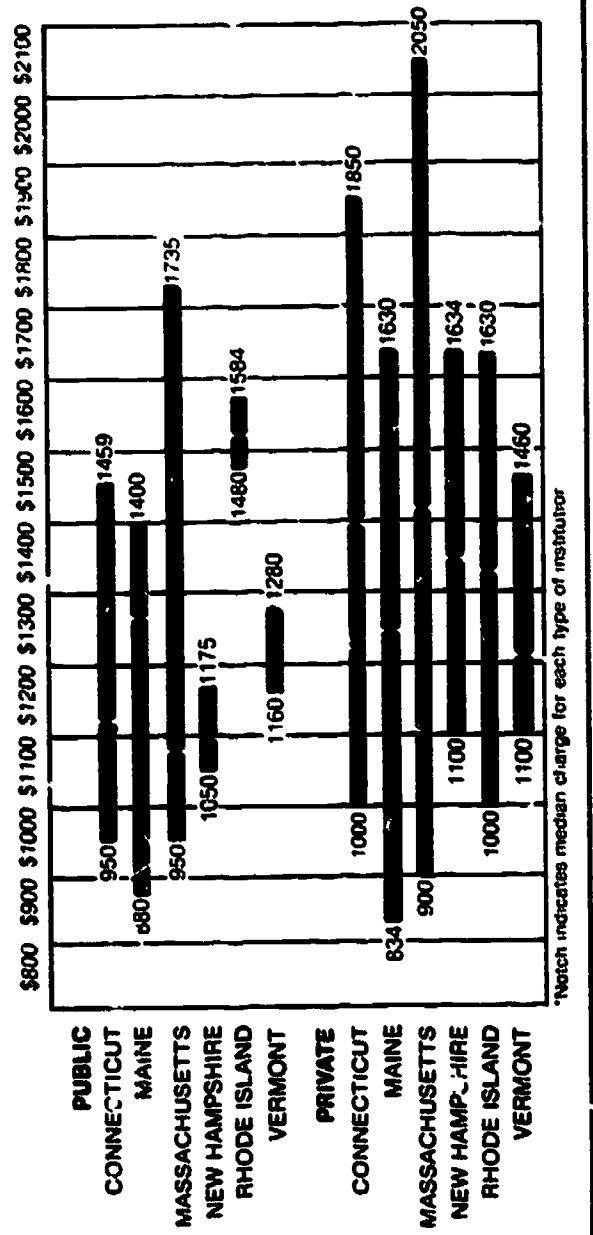
PERCENT OF TOTAL ENROLLED IN EACH STATE, FALL 1973

NEW ENGLAND REGIONAL STUDENT PROGRAM

Undergraduate and graduate opportunities at state universities, state colleges and public two-year colleges and institutes for New England residents—1974

New England residents have the unique opportunity of enrolling as regional students at public universities, state colleges, and two-year colleges in other New England states with resident tuition and, in most cases, preferential admissions status. The New England Regional Student Program provides this opportunity. It increases a student's choice of study programs and reduces duplication of teaching facilities and personnel among the state universities, 19 state colleges and 47 public two-year colleges and institutes.

Regional Student Program at State Universities and State Colleges

Each of the state universities, as well as the 19 state colleges, presently offer both undergraduate and graduate level study programs to qualified out-of-state New England residents under the New England Regional Student Program. All regional study programs are unavailable at one or more of the participating institutions.

Regional Student Program at Two-Year Colleges and Institutes

Beginning in 1968, each New England state agreed to admit a quota of out-of-state New England residents to its two-year colleges and to allow financial advantages to these regional students. Thirty state-supported community and junior colleges as well as 17 technical colleges and vocational institutes presently participate in the New England Regional Student Program. Qualified students of the six New England states may earn an associate degree and pay the in-state tuition of the recipient institution if accepted under Plan 1 or 2:

Plan 1 —When a study program is not offered at any in-state institution, a student may enroll at any participating out-of-state institution offering that study program.

Plan 2 —When a study program is offered at both in-state and out-of-state institutions, but the out-of-state institution is closer in traveling time to a student's legal residence, that student may enroll at the out-of-state institution under this program.
