ABSTRACT

In this report, an analysis is made of the academic achievement of 755 new transfers from Pasadena City College at the University of California. The time period covered was from fall 1966 to spring 1972. Three tables comprise the major portion of the report. Table I details the cumulative GPA's earned by all new Pasadena City College transfers at each institution. In Table 2, the cumulative GPA's for the first three quarters of each year at each institution are listed. The mean GPA's for all new community college transfers for the fall quarter at the University of California during 1967-1971 are given in Table 3. The report concludes with a summary and comments. AN ANALYSIS OF ACADEMIC SUCCESS OF NEW PASADENA CITY COLLEGE TRANSFERS at UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA Fall 1966 - Spring 1972

For several years it has been the policy of the University of California to report to Community Colleges academic success of new students only. Grade reports have covered only the first three quarters of each student's enrollment.

This report concerns the academic achievement of 755 new transfers from Pasadena City College at the University of California. The period covered is from fall 1966 to spring 1972.

Grade reports were divided into two groups for purposes of data analysis. One group consisted of all transfers who were eligible for entrance into the University of California at time of high school graduation. The second group was composed of transfers ineligible for the University of California at high school graduation.

Table I details the cumulative GPA's earned by all new Pasagena City College transfers at each institution from fall 1966 through spring 1972.

Example: At Berkeley a total of 99 students were reported to have enrolled during the six year period. Only 79 were charged to Pasadena City College, earning a -.234 differential.

Of the 79, 42 who were eligible for entrance to the University at high school graduation earned a -.257 differential. The 37 who were not eligible earned a -.209 differential.

Over a six year period 1,008 students enrolled at the eight campuses of the University of California, 755 of whom were charged to Pasadena City College for GPA calculations. (See bottom Table I for explanation of term "charged".)

The Los Angeles campus enrolled 50% of the transfers (504 of 1,008), and charged 375 of the 755 ($l_{1}9.7\%$).

Cumulative GPA differentials were negative at all campuses, ranging from -.077 at Irvine to -.322 for Santa Barbara.

The 454 transfers who were eligible from high school had a higher negative GPA differential than the 301 not eligible (-.247 to -.223).

Table II lists cumulative GPA's for the first three quarters of each year at each institution. Table I was derived from Table II.

Both eligible and ineligible groups of Pasadena City College transfers entered the University of California with lower mean GPA's, and earned higher mean GPA's at the University, than comparable groups from all community colleges.

The mean University of California GPA difference between Pasadena City College and all community college transfers' was larger for ineligible than eligible group (.050, .015).

SUMMARY AND COMMENTS

1. According to the number of grade reports received, the eight campuses of the University of California enroll approximately 9% of students who transfer from Pasadena City College to four year institutions. An unduplicated count of grade reports received in 1972 was as follows:

- 2. The following data concern students charged by University of California to Pasadena City College from fall 1966 through spring 1972.
 - a. 74.9% (755 of 1,008) transfers were charged.
 - b. 49.7% were attending University of California at Los Angeles.
 - c. Excluding Santa Cruz, the per cent of transfers charged by each campus ranged from a low of 63% at Riverside to a high of 100% at Davis.
 - d. 60% of the charged were eligible from high school, 40% were ineligible.
- 3. Although both eligible and ineligible groups posted negative GPA differentials in their first three quarters, the differential of the ineligible was smaller.

The mean difference between the two groups in entry GPA was .129 in favor of cligibles. The difference between two groups in cumulative GPA's earned at the University was reduced to .105 in favor of eligibles - the gap was narrowed by .024 GPA.

The ineligable group, in spite of apparent poorer academic performance in



high school, began to "catch up" to the eligible at the University. This, coupled with the fact that the Pasadena City College ineligible group earned a higher University of California GPA advantage over their community college counterparts than did the Pasadena City College eligibles over theirs, could indicate effective preparation at Pasadena City College for upper division work.

4. An adequate basis for comparing academic success of Pasadena City College transfers at University of California with those enrolled in California State College-University System is not readily available. The following data, however, offer a comparison of their GPA's for the period 1966-1972:

On the basis of the above GPA differentials, students attending California

State University-College System appear to have been more academically successful
than those enrolling at the University of California. However, two cautions should
temper this interpretation:

- A. The high negative differential (-.237) earned by transfers to University of California (in contrast to +.150 at California State College-University) is due mainly to their higher entry GPA (+.380). Actually the difference between GPA's earned by the two groups at four year institutions was only .007.
- B. GPA' earned at University of California were based on first three quarters performance only, whereas GPA's for California State College-University were determined from time of entry until graduation. It is very possible transfers to University of California were handicapped by

being evaluated while under effects of the "transfer syndrome". Evidence indicates GPA's earned at California State College-University

System increase with increase in college grade level. (Reference

IR7/73/17.) Further investigation is needed to determine the relation—
ship between grade level increase and cumulative GPA at University of
California.
