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ABSTRACT

The first in a series of bulletins prepared for each region and with a national summary, this report presents relevant data about the South's rural youth (persons under 25). The total rural population of the South includes some 22.2 million persons, representing slightly higher than 41 percent of the rural people in the entire nation. There are 29.4 million persons under 25 years in the South with slightly over 10.4 million in the rural areas, constituting 41.6 percent of all American youth in this age group who live in rural areas. These youth are unevenly distributed by State and include a sizeable proportion of blacks. A large proportion of these youth were born during the decade of high birth rates following the end of world II: others are younger and may relfect more recent developments in the South's population characteristics. The numerical data (extracted from various 1970 U.S. Census of Population reports) deal with the distribution of the rural youth by State, the sex ratios characteristic of various groups among these youth, and their racial composition. The appendixes, which comprise the majority of the report, contain tabular information on the South as a region, for each State, and on the United States having general comparative and background value for this report, and definitions of technical terms. 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INTRODUCTION

In order to deal with the general issues of education, voting, migration, employment and life style as related to the younger sector of the rural population of the South, a compilation is required of the descriptive information available regarding the population characteristics of these persons. However, a simple overview of the data which is needed to construct a fair picture of this important — and often neglected — segment of the American society, will reveal at least two conspicuous limitations:

- a) The relevant data are scattered throughout the census reports for the individual states, which hinders substantially the ready emergence of a cogent view of the Southern region from the information.
- b) There is, consequently, a need for conveniently available efforts which bring together the data in the manner of handy sources for potential consumers, including educators, policy makers, researchers and others.

A central justification for this report arises from the need to provide a source which offers relevant data regarding the rural youth of the South - including percentages and other comparative rates - in a simple ready-to-use source. In addition, it is believed that some of the demand for data on the rural portion of the population - separately from the total society - is answered by the information contained here.

Objective. The principal objective of this report is to present data on certain characteristics of persons under 25 years of age living in the rural areas of the South. In the present context, these persons



will be considered as the rural youth of this important region. A large proportion of these persons were born during the decade of high birth rates which followed the end of World War II. Others are younger and may reflect more recent developments in the characteristics of the population of the South.

The numerical data presented here deal with the distribution of the rural youth by State, the sex ratios which are characteristic of various groups among these youth, and their racial composition. In attempting to provide unity and simplicity to these numerical data, they have been combined in the form of two appendices, which contain the sum and substance of this effort. These appendices, together with additional data and a brief text accompanied by a number of graphs and figures, assemble the information to which the report directs itself. Such information may serve as an elementary step toward an understanding of the national population. It is hoped that the present report makes a modest contribution towards tilling this need as well.

All data have been extracted from reports of the 1970 U.S. Census of Population. 1/

Organization and Content. The text is organized into two basic sections; the first deals with general information regarding the population of the 16 Southern States, including more directly the rural population. The

Appendices A and B contain information on the South as a region and for each state, respectively. As it can be observed, Appendix B provides the data which is fundamental to the objective of the report. Two more appendices appear subsequently, of which Appendix C covers information on the United States having general comparative and background Value for the report. Appendix D provides the definitions of technical terms used throughout the study.



I. AN OVERVIEW OF THE SOUTH

In this section, the population of the South is briefly sketched to set in proper context the data on the rural youth of the region. For this report the "South" is defined in the usage of the Census Bureau (See Appendix D). The sixteen states included are Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Kentucky, Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi, Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma and Texas. In addition, the District of Columbia is counted, but since its population is entirely urban, it does not figure in any of the rural totals for the region.

A. The South As A Region

1. Age Structure. There were about 62.8 million persons in the sixteen Southern states and the District of Columbia in 1970. These people constituted nearly 31 percent of the nation's population, a slightly greater proportion than in 1960.

In 1970 the people of the South had a slightly higher percentage of children and youth among them than the nation as a whole, and a smaller relative number of the aged. In fact the median age of the population of the South was 27.3 years -- younger than that of any other region.

The age-sex pyramid for the population of the South in its entirety is shown as Appendix Figure A-1. The general pattern revealed there, and the actual percentages in each age group are roughly the same as in the nation as a whole. It is at age 25 that the dividing line occurs -- that is,



below 25 years of age the proportion of the people in every age group is higher in the South than in the nation. The reverse is true for nearly all ages above 25. As in the country at large the 10-to-14-year old group is the most numerous of all. Taken together the children and youth under 25 years of age make up 46.9 percent of the entire Southern population, and those under 18 total 34.9 percent. Persons 65 years of age and over constituted 8.9 percent of the populace of the South in 1970 compared to 9.9 percent in the nation. The age structure of the several racial and ethnic groups in the South shows obvious variations. In order to provide a basis for comparison among the major sectors of the rural population, the age sex pyramids of each of the three major groups are shown in Appendix Figures A-2, A-3 and A-4. It is apparent that the white population has a narrower base -- thus a relatively smaller youth component -- than either the black or Spanish heritage populations. The aged population makes up a correspondingly greater proportion among whites than either other group. The groups above age 20 show a great diminution in the black pyramid as a reflection of considerable migration out of the South by this group, while there is less evidence of such movement among the Spanish.

2. Southern Youth. In 1970 there were 29.4 million persons under 25 years in the South. The racial composition of this group was considerably different from that of the nation as a whole. Approximately one young person in five in the South was black, and four-fifths of this population was white. Most of the remainder were American Indians, and most of these were in Oklahoma, North Carolina and Texas. The



Spanish heritage population (mostly white) included only 4.6 percent of the total youth in the South.

As indicated in Table 1 below, the sex ratios of the Southern youth populations in the three major subgroups are different (See Appendix D for definition of sex ratio).

When the population under 25 years of age is further subdivided into five-year age groups and the corresponding proportions are computed (See Appendix Tables A-1 and A-2) the differences are considerable in magnitude. Only 45 percent of the Southern white population is below age 25, whereas for both black and Spanish groups the percentage is 55 or higher. Again, only 33 percent of the former are under 18 years of age, whereas the same age group constitutes at least 43 percent of the two minority groups.




Figure 1. Sex ratios for the Total Population under 25 years of age in the South, 1970, by age and race.

The sex ratios of the five-year groups are also different -- both within and between the subgroups of the population (See Figure 1 below and Appendix Table A-3). In general, the pattern existing here is similar to that for the United States, in that the sex ratio remains relatively constant in each group to age 15 and then begins to decline. The sex ratio for all three groups drops below 100 by age 24, and as in the

United States as a whole, the line for the black population shows the greatest disequilibrium between the sexes by age 24.

B. The Rural South

The total rural population of the South includes some 22.2 million persons. This total represents slightly higher than 41 percent of the rural people of the entire nation, and it also makes the South the region displaying the greatest proportion of its people dwelling in rural areas (See Table 2 below).

Within the South, the largest number of rural people live in North Carolina (some 2.8 million), followed in order by Texas (nearly 2.3 million), Georgia (1.8 million) and Virginia (1.7 million). The figures, divided between farm and non-farm residences, are given in Appendix Table A-4. In every case the farm population is a relatively small minority of the whole rural population.

The <u>rural</u> South has roughly the same racial distribution as the South as a whole -- but the percentage of whites is somewhat greater (81.9 percent) and that of blacks is smaller (17.6). The population of Spanish heritage in the rural south is so small in relation to the other major sub-groups (425,053) that no special effort will be devoted to it at the present.



1. Age Structure. The rural population has a distinctive pattern of age distribution which does not coincide with either that of the United States or that of the South as a whole. Instead, the rural South shows clear evidence of a probable migration out of the region by its youth, since its age-sex pyramid reveals a definite and sharp decline in numbers above age 20 (See Appendix Figure A-5). In the Southern rural age pyramid there are 20.9 percent in ages 10 to 19, but only 13.0 percent in the group 20 to 29. Comparable figures for the rural United States would be 20.8 percent and 13.3 percent respectively, and for the nation as a whole 19.6 percent and 14.7 percent. Presumably, the pattern of migration out of rural areas would be found greater for the South than for the nation as a whole.

The age structure of the rural white and black populations of the South are given in Appendix Figures A-6 and A-7. It could be claimed from the differences in these pyramids that probable migration out of the rural areas has removed a very large part of the black young adult population over a period of many years. In fact no age group above 25 years has as many as 2.5 percent of the population, while in the country at large a proportion of this magnitude could be expected at each age up to 45 years or older among blacks. A presumably higher fertility of blacks would also help to account for the different age distributions.

The differences between the white and black age structure in the rural areas of the region are generally apparent from the two figures mentioned above; however, it is also true that there is a good deal of variation across the region. One way to appreciate this is to compare the dependency ratios of the two race groups in each state (See Appendix



D for definition). This figure compares the number under 20 and over 64 years of age to those in the 20-64 age group. For the rural population of the United States this index was 99.3 and one can say, roughly, that a figure greater than 100 shows a relative shortage of people in the "working adult" years or a surplus of the young and aged. In this index the young greatly outweigh the aged as a contributing factor.

Throughout the rural South the dependency ratio is consistently greater for black than white populations (Appendix Table A-7). In the rural South as a whole the figure for blacks of 147.2 is about 60 percent greater than the 92.5 of the white population. The greatest differences occur in Mississippi and Arkansas, where the ratio for blacks is over 80 percent greater than that for whites. The other extreme, where the ratios are most nearly equal, is found in Maryland (33.2 percent greater for blacks) and Kentucky (33.9 percent).

In the Southern rural population, taking all ages together, there are more women than men. The sex ratio for the races combined is 98.4 males for each hundred females. For whites the ratio is 99.0, while for blacks it is 96.0.

2. Summary. The South has a relatively large rural population — more than 10 percent of the American people live in rural locations in this region. About 82 percent of these persons are white. The area has experienced the probable effects of the migration of its youth to cities or to other regions — which leaves it somewhat short of young adults, especially regarding the black population. In turn, a distinct difference results between whites and blacks regarding the proportion



of these groups in the younger age-brackets. A much higher proportion of the black population is young -- these youth may be possibly destined to leave the rural areas once they reach adulthood.



II. RURAL YOUTH IN THE SOUTH

This section aims to articulate briefly the general population characteristics of persons under 25 years of age living in the rural areas of the South. The tables and figures which accompany the text focus attention on certain alient aspects of the data subsequently presented in more detail in Appendix B.


1. <u>Data and Procedure</u>. As it is stated in the Introduction, the data presented here have been taken from the 1970 U.S. Census of Population reports, the major sources being the Final Reports for the individual states (see references).

A simple, yet thorough, extraction of the information from the sources, followed by tabulation of these data, by state, accomplished the major procedural tasks.

2. Findings and Discussion. There are slightly over 10.4 million persons under 25 years of age in the rural areas of the South, constituting 41.6 of all American youth in this age group who live in rural areas. They are distributed state-by-state in a relatively uneven pattern — see figure 2 below. The largest total number corresponds to North Carolina, followed in order by Texas and Georgia (Table 3). These three states contain approximately 31 percent of all rural Southern youth.

There is also considerable variation from one state to another regarding the proportion of the total state population of the same age, represented by rural youth under 25 --- see Table 4. Louisiana, for instance, displays the highest proportion of its rural population

under 25, 51.0 percent; whereas Oklahoma shows the lowest proportion, 42.1 percent. The same table indicates a considerable difference between the two major racial subgroups regarding the proportion of rural persons under 25 years of age in each state. Louisiana shows the highest percentage of the white population under 25, whereas the highest proportion of rural black youth is found in South Carolina —60.3 percent. In order to add comparative value to these figures, Table 4 includes the corresponding data on the proportion of youth under 18 years of age. See also Table 5.

Younger youth are a slightly more prominent component of the rural population than of the urban population of the South. This is illustrated by the following figures for the combined 16 Southern states (Table 6).

Regarding the racial composition <u>per se</u> which characterizes rural Southern youth, it is observed that the black component is slightly smaller among rural youth than it is in the total population of youth; 21.47 percent of all rural youth in the South are black, compared to 22.34 percent of all young people under 25 in the region -- See Appendix Tables A-1 and B-1. A further subdivision of the rural



Southern young population by age, shows a slight trend towards a higher proportion of blacks in the teen years than in the younger subgroups -- See Table 7 below. Beginning in the early twenties -- ages 20-to-24 -- there is a noticeable drop in the relative number of blacks.

Evidently, a very important racial component of our target population is the black sub-group. In order to facilitate the understanding of the quantitative relations existing between this subgroup and other categories, data are presented here illustrating the proportion which black youth represent of (1) all youth in each state, (2) all rural youth in each state, and (3) all black youth in each state (See Table 8). These figures also include the actual number of black youth in the rural areas of each Southern state.

One further characteristic of the target population treated in this report is the sex ratio. For rural Southerners under 25 years of age the overall sex ratio is 103.6, indicating a slightly higher number of males than females in the group. This finding also holds true for the two main racial sub-groups: the white sub-group under 25 displays a sex ratio of 104.2 and the figure registered for the black sub-group is 101.7.

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


Figure 3. Sex ratios for the tural population under 25 years of ϵ ge in the South, 1970, by age and race.

In a general sense, the sex ratio of children tends to be greater than 100 since normally more boys than girls are born each year. Also, generally the sex ratio of the overall national population approaches 100 at age 20. In a "closed" population -- one in which theoretically no migration occurs, in or out -- the sex ratio should decline very slowly from age 20 upward. From the evidence gathered here, however, the conclusion can be drawn that neither the South as a whole nor the rural areas of the region are characterized by a totally closed population. The age-specific sex ratios presented below in Table 9 and Figure 3 serve to illustrate partially the trends observable among subgroups of rural Southern youth.

The dramatic drop in sex ratios between the 15-to-19 year and the 20-to-24 year levels stands out here. As it is apparent from the agesex pyramids included in Appendix A, the number of persons of both sexes declines notably after the teen years. The sex ratios of 93.0 to 95.0 shown above for the 20-to-24 year group mean that suddenly around the age of 20 there is an "excessive" loss of males in the South's rural territories. Possible explanations include migration

through joining the armed forces, migration to the cities of the South, migration out of the South, a higher death rate among males of this age -- though this might be an unlikely explanatory variable in this case --, as well as simply probable errors in coverage in the census.

A simple comparison of rural and urban sex ratios by five-year age groups provides further information. In table 10 below, a greater sex ratio in the age group 20-to-24 for the urban South is shown, which can serve as partial evidence of differences in both the age and sex structures between the rural and urban sectors of the South.

3. Summary. The 1970 U.S. Census of Population reports are the source of data presented in this information packet. A substantial proportion of all rural American youth live in the rural South. These youth are unevenly distributed by state; and include a sizeable proportion of blacks, who constitute — on a state-by-state basis — a varying proportion of all youth, of all rural youth, and of all black youth in this region.

//ge-specific sex ratios are displayed here for the total rural youth of the South, as well as for the white and black sub-groups; showing a general and dramatic drop between the 15-to-19 year and the 20-to-24 year



levels. Possible causes of this "loss" of males in the region are proposed. Relevant tabular data -- arranged by race, age and sex -- are offered in Appendix B regarding rural youth in the South, by State.



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APPENDIX A




Figure C-6. Sex ratios for the Total Population under 25 years of age in the United States, 1970, by age and race or Spanish heritage.




Figure C-7. Sex ratios for the <u>Rural Population under 25 years of age</u> in the United States, 1970, by age and race or Spanish heritage.

#### APPENDIX D

#### GLOSSARY OF DEFINITIONS

Throughout the text certain key words have been employed with consistent technical definitions, generally those used by the United States Bureau of the Census. Such words have been printed in all capital letters (e.g., RACE) in their first use to indicate that their definitions are given in this glossary. Generally these definitions are found in the relevant census reports as part of the appended textual notes. Quotations included below are from the 1970 Census of Population, Final Report PC(1)-C1, "General Social and Economic Characteristics," pages App. 1 - App. 8.1/

RACE. (See also SPANISH HERITAGE.) As used in census statistics the word race "does not denote clear-cut scientific definitions of biological stock. Rather it reflects self-identification by respondents."

The "white" category includes both persons who checked the standard response "white," and also others who wrote in such answers as Mexican, Puerto Rican, or responses suggesting Indo-European stock.

The "black" category used in this report corresponds to the Census' definition of "Negro," which comprises persons who checked the standard response "Negro or black," and also persons with write-in designations of Jamaican, Haitian, Afro-American, etc.



The most detailed definitions are found in "The 1970 Census User's Dictionary" in U.S. Bureau of the Census, 1970 Census User's Guide (Washington: Government Printing Office, 1970), pp. 71-136.

"Nonwhite" in this report includes the aggregate of all persons who were not "white."

RURAL RESIDENCE. (See also URBAN RESIDENCE.) All persons living outside of areas classified as "urban" are considered to be "rural" residents. There is no substantive definition of rural, but the category includes those who live in recognized places and towns under 2,500 in population, as well as those who live in the open country.

The "rural farm" population is that portion of the rural population which had its residence on a farm of 10 acres or more with sales of \$50.00 or more in 1969, or on places under 10 acres when sales were \$250.00 or more in 1969. The remainder of the rural population is designated as "nonfarm."

SEX RATIO. The sex ratio is an index of the relative balance between the numbers of males and females in the population or age group. It is actually the number of males for each 100 females in the group, and is computed by dividing the male population number by the number of females and multiplying the result by 100.

A sex ratio of 100 means the numbers of males and females is exactly equal. A sex ratio of 200 would mean that there are twice as many men (200) as women (100), while a sex ratio of 50 would mean that there are twice as many women (100) as men (50).

SOUTH. The Census Bureau traditionally reports its data for the "South" for an area of 16 states and the District of Columbia. The region stretches from Texas and Oklahoma eastward and somewhat north to Delaware, and also includes Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana,



Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia.

SPANISH HERITAGE. In the states covered in this report the Census Bureau used two different definitions for persons of Spanish heritage. Everywhere in the South except in Texas the concept of a "Spanish language" population is employed. In those states the Spanish heritage population consists of persons of Spanish "mother tongue" (the language spoken in the home when respondent was a child), together with "all other persons in families in which the head of wife reported Spanish as his or her mother tongue."

In Texas (and four other southwestern states) the Spanish heritage population consists of all of the Spanish language population as defined above, with the addition of all persons who had Spanish surnames but who did not meet the Spanish language criterion. Thus the Spanish heritage definition in Texas is more inclusive than in the rest of the South.

In the United States total figures the Spanish heritage category also includes another definition. In New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania the Spanish heritage group consists mostly of persons of Puerto Rican birth or parentage instead of either Spanish language or surname.

URBAN RESIDENCE. (See also RURAL RESIDENCE.) The basic division of population into rural and urban residence categories is accomplished by defining the urban zones. In the 1970 census "the urban population comprises all persons living in urbanized areas and in places of 2,500 inhabitants or more outside urbanized areas. More specifically, the urban population consists of all persons living in (a) places of 2,500



inhabitants or more incorporated as cities, villages, boroughs (except Alaska), and towns (except in the New England States, New York, and Wisconsin), but excluding those persons living in the rural portion of extended cities; (b) unincorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more; and (c) other territory, incorporated or unincorporated, included in urbanized areas. The population not classified as urban constitutes the rural population."

DEPENDENCY RATIO. This index is used to gauge the importance of youth and the aged compared with the remaining adult population in any area. We have assigned those under 20 years of age and those 65 years and older to the "dependent" category, and all persons 20-64 years of age to the presumed "producers." The index is usually computed by dividing the number of "dependent" persons (youth + aged) by the number of economically active age, and multiplying the result by 100.

In the United States as a whole the dependency ratio in 1970 was 91.9 -- meaning there were about 92 "dependent" persons for every 100 "producers." Indexes much over 100 in the United States would mean the population is ideally burdened with persons who find it hard to support themselves, while indexes below 80 would represent the opposite.
