**ABSTRACT**

The State of Idaho submitted this 1972-73 annual report to the Bureau of Indian Affairs in compliance with Federal regulations governing Johnson-O'Malley (JOM) funding. There has been a drastic decrease in the use of JOM funds for basic school support due to P.L. 874 and local funds provided for Indian education. District administrators, working with the JOM Parent Advisory Committees, have provided special programs and activities designed to benefit the Indian children. Ongoing JOM programs included summer workshops for teachers and aides, kindergartens, summer tours, and other activities designed to solve problems generally peculiar to Indian children. Problems faced by trustees and administrators in school districts educating Indian children fell generally within the categories of: parental permissiveness; direction; communication breakdown; student attitude, behavior, attendance, and self-image; responsibility and function of trustees, administrators, and faculty; and other home-school-community related problems. Some suggested goals to enhance the present programs were the continuation and expansion of financial aid for summer workshops, provision of funds for inservice training, development of "on reservation" programs for parents and children to explain the public school operation and parental responsibility, etc. The majority of the document is made up of statistical tables and charts for State and JOM financial assistance, attendance, transportation, enrollment, school lunches, and tax levies. 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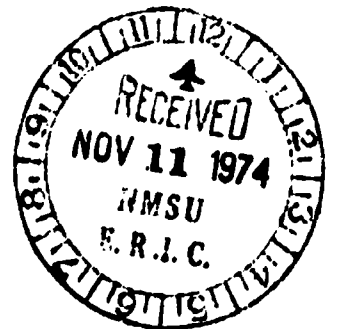

The following report is submitted in accordance with the provisions of the contract which the United States Government through the Bureau of Indian Affairs has with the State of Idaho and its designated educational authority, the State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

The narrative section of this report will be quite brief since the Director of Indian Education suffered an illness early this spring, making it impossible for him to continue in this position. The writer assumed the responsibility of this position at the close of the school year which was too late for him to visit the Johnson-O'Malley schools to evaluate programs, determine special program activities, or to visit with Indian students in the various schools in the Johnson-O'Malley districts.

The Johnson-O'Malley Act of 1934, amended in 1936, authorized the Secretary of the Interior to enter into a contract with any state having legal authority for the responsibility for the education of Indian children residing in such state. Specifically, the Act reads in part:

"That the Secretary of the Interior be, and hereby is, authorized in his discretion, to enter into a contract or contracts with any State or Territory, or political subdivision thereof, or with any State University, college, or school, or with any appropriate State or private corporation, agency, or institution, for the education, medical attention, agricultural assistance and social welfare, including relief of distress, of Indians in such State or Territory, through the agencies of the State or Territory or, of the corporations and organizations hereinbefore named, and to expend under such contract or contracts, monies appropriated by Congress for the education, medical attention, agricultural assistance and social welfare, including relief of distress, of Indians in such State or Territory."

The inclusion of Indian children under the provisions of Public Law 874 has had a direct influence on the use of Johnson-O'Malley funds. The Public Law 874 funds plus local school district funds, the source of which is noted

below, has enabled school district trustees and administrators to divert more Johnson-O'Malley funds to the support of special programs and activities designed to solve problems generally peculiar to Indian children.

#### TAX SOURCES OF PUBLIC SCHOOL OPERATION FUNDS-1972-73

General County School Levy represents an eight (8) mill levy on the adjusted assessed valuation of the county (with the exception of token counties), (Section 33-1015, Idaho Code), plus a prorated share of the holdback on the 1972-73 State appropriation for Public Schools (Section 33-1009, Idaho Code).

#### SCHOOL DISTRICT LEVIES

General: This levy is for maintenance and operation. (Section 33-802, Idaho Code).

School Plant Facilities Fund: This levy provides funds for specifically identified expenditures--levy not to exceed fifteen (15) mills for ten years. (Section 33-804, Idaho Code)

Bond Service: This is a levy for amortization of interest and principal on outstanding bonds. (Section 33-802, Idaho Code).

Equalization: This levy is made by County Commissioners on behalf of school districts in low ratio of assessment counties. (Section 33-1016, Idaho Code).

Emergency Fund: This levy is made upon school district's application to county commissioners based on increased average daily attendance over prior year--limited to three (3) mills. (Section 33-805), Idaho Code).

Library Levies: Total County and School District levies include levy for School-Library District. (Section 33-2601, Idaho Code)

Tort Levies: Total County and School District levies include levy for Tort Liability premium. (Section 6-927, Idaho Code).

Beginning during the 1968-69 school year, and continuing to the present, there has been a drastic decrease in the use of Johnson-O'Malley funds for basic school support. District administrators have, on the other hand, while working with Johnson-O'Malley Indian Parent Committees, provided special programs and activities designed to benefit the Indian children of their districts. Evidence of this effort is shown in the individual district's expenditure breakdown found elsewhere in this report.

Problems facing trustees and administrators in school districts educating Indian children fall generally within the categories of parental permissiveness, parental direction, home-school-community communication, lack of understanding by Indian leaders and parents of the responsibility and function of a Board of Trustees and its administrative staff, faculty attitude and behavior, student attitude and behavior, student attendance, self-image, language usage and misunderstanding or lack of knowledge of school law, school board responsibility, school policy, and general school operation on the part of some Johnson-O'Malley Indian Parent Advisory Committee members.

It is believed that the effectiveness of the program could be increased and desired goals more easily attained by:

- (1) Continuing and expanding financial assistance for summer workshops for teachers and teacher aides.
- (2) Providing financial assistance for in-service training of teachers during the school year.
- (3) Developing "on reservation" programs for parents of Indian children which would enable them to gain knowledge and understanding of public school operation and parental responsibility,
- (4) Providing funding and leadership for planning, and evaluating programs and developing of strategies designed to resolve problems.
- (5) The Bureau of Indian Affairs taking a more active and cooperative part in company with the Idaho Tribal Leaders, the Idaho State Department of Education, and the School Districts of the State in planning and implementing programs designed to benefit students.
- (6) The Bureau of Indian Affairs assuming its full responsibility relative to decision making in regard to the Johnson-O'Malley Indian Education Program.

- (7) Encouraging and assisting financially, pilot educational programs and services for Indian students.

Programs during the past year have stressed the continuation of activities reported for the 1971-72 school year with an increased involvement, generally speaking, of local Johnson-O'Malley Indian Parent Advisory Committees.

Although not part of the State supported education program, several districts have, with the use of funds from other than State sources, supported kindergarten programs. This activity is expected to continue.

Summer tours, as part of an enrichment program, are being requested by some parents. These have been provided in a few instances. However, there has been some question as to the real value or whether Johnson-O'Malley money might be better spent. Thus, it would appear that careful scrutiny and detailed evaluations should be made of each tour and tour request.

A workshop was held under the direction of Idaho State University during the past summer. The workshop was moved from the Idaho State University Campus to the Fort Hall Reservation. While facilities were not as good as those at the University, the conducting of the workshop at Fort hall provided for much more Indian participation. Persons enrolling for the workshop received two hours of college credit for successful completion. As an incentive to secure participation, tuition fees were paid from Johnson-O'Malley funds for the Johnson-O'Malley school district employees whose attendance was approved by the school district's administrator. It is recommended that this activity be continued and that a workshop also be held on one of the Northern Idaho reservations during the summer of 1974.

Recently a series of meetings concerning the Johnson-O'Malley program

have been held. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction and some staff members, representatives from the Bureau of Indian Affairs in Portland and Agency offices, and tribal leaders from the Idaho Indian tribes with their Education Committee representatives have been in attendance. Review of the Johnson-O'Malley program, discussion of activities projected and input from all attendees has resulted in a decisive change in the planned program operation for 1973-74. Much of this change has come about through more interest and participation on the part of the Indian people, in each district's Johnson-O'Malley program. This new direction will allow for the operation of the program through a Director in the offices of the State Department of Education in Boise, with two Assistant Directors, one in Southern Idaho whose assignment will be to work with Indian youth and adults and the Johnson-O'Malley school districts in this area of the State. The other Assistant Director will reside in Northern Idaho and have the same assignment for the northern part of the State. It should be pointed out, that the increase in number and/or activity without additional funds labeled specifically for administration, will decrease the programs and activities designed to benefit the Indian children. On the other hand, this new direction must have the full support of each Indian tribe and must provide for a cooperative endeavor on the part of the Bureau, the State Department of Education, the Indian people and school district trustees and employees in order that the desired results may be achieved.

#### FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION

The primary source of revenue used for the operation of Idaho public schools is from property taxes levied at the local district and county levels. School districts, if they are to participate in State foundation program funds must levy a tax of at least 27 mills in support of the maintenance and operation program. The districts participating in the Johnson-O'Malley program



make levies which range from 27 mills in one instance to a high of 40.04 mills. The average for this group is 31.673 mills. Additional funds for maintenance and operation come from a mandatory 8 mill county levy, miscellaneous fines, forfeitures, various Federal funds and State appropriations. Additional funds to pay operational and construction costs come from school plant facility fund levies. Total levies for the school districts participating in Johnson-O'Malley programs vary from a low of 41.2 mills to a high of 69.292 mills. The average for these districts is 50.629 mills.

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BORDER DISTRICT CONTRACT..... \$ 15,000.00

The Duck Valley Indian Reservation is located in the states of Idaho and Nevada. The education center for this area is Owyhee, Nevada. The Owyhee schools are a part of the Elko County school system. The portion of the reservation and adjoining area lying in Idaho, is part of the Bruneau-Grand View School District. This area is so isolated from the major population centers of the district that it is impractical for the children to attend Idaho schools.

All children residing in this area (both Indian and non-Indian) attend school at Owyhee under a Border District Contract with the Bruneau-Grand View School District #365 Jt. State Foundation Program funds, Public Law 874 funds, and Johnson-O'Malley funds are being used to pay the costs of educating Idaho Indian children at Owyhee.

The Owyhee School District offers a K-12 program for its students, of which more than 90% are Indian. The program meets the standards established by the State of Nevada. In addition, the school has an outstanding music program.

There were 74 Indian students from the Idaho side of the reservation attending the Owyhee schools this past year. A total of \$15,000 in Johnson-O'Malley funds were expended in behalf of these children. Per student costs are approximately \$1200.

The suggestion has been made that since the reservation lies in two jurisdiction areas, it might be wise to investigate the possibility of allocating and administering all Johnson-O'Malley funds for this reservation through the Albuquerque office and the State of Nevada. The administrative staff of the Bruneau-Grand View district has indicated that they would have no objection to this procedure.
