ABSTRACT

"Population Profiles, Vol. 3" contains modifications which were made in order to update the second volume in this trilogy. Adjustments were also made when research revealed major 1970 census report inaccuracies. Demographic and socioeconomic characteristics of the populations resident in 114 smaller school districts in Washington State are presented. Demographic data for reference use in educational programs in the State are detailed. Tabular demographic and socioeconomic data from the 1970 U.S. Census are given for each of 114 smaller school districts, as well as the State as a whole. Particular emphasis is placed on needs assessment data required by the Urban, Racial, and Rural Disadvantaged Programs of the Office of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. The demographic and socioeconomic profiles are also designed to be of value in administering other categorical aid programs, as well as a wide variety of educational and curricular programs. The majority of the document is comprised of statistical tables and charts.

OF WASHINGTON STATE SCHOOL DISTRICTS
WITH LESS THAN 400 STUDENTS

Introductory Background

Pertinent information is an essential central ingredient in efforts to deal with the problems inherent in school administration. As the complexity of the problems encountered increases, school planners and administrators require more and more data on an ever expanding range of topics. These data are used to assess significant issues and problems, to provide bases for management decisions, to formulate objectives and program approaches for achieving these objectives and to evaluate the effects of ongoing programs and objectives.

This report is designed to furnish the detailed demographic aspects of such data for the State of Washington for reference use in Washington State educational programs. To implement this objective, tabular demographic and socioeconomic data from the 1970 U.S. Census have been portrayed for each of Washington's 114 smaller school districts, as well as the State as a whole. Particular emphasis has been placed on needs assessment data required by the Urban, Racial and Rural Disadvantaged Programs of the Office of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. The demographic and socioeconomic profiles are, of course, also designed to be of value in administering other categorical aid programs, as well as a wide variety of educational and curricular programs.

This report, Population Profiles III, which delineates the demographic and socioeconomic characteristics of the populations resident in the 114 smaller school districts, is the third of a trilogy. The first, published in November 1972, details demographic and socioeconomic data from the

1970 U.S. Census for each of Washington's 49 legislative districts. The prime objective of that study was to identify and describe the subareas of each legislative district where the population characteristics were such as to indicate distinct adverse cultural, environmental, economic, or familial circumstances resulting in an above average concentration of "disadvantaged students." The second report, Population Profiles II, published in June 1973, delineates the demographic and socioeconomic characteristics of the populations living within the attendance areas of the 200 largest school districts in Washington State.

The three reports should be used in conjunction. In utilizing the three reports it should be borne in mind that the first, the legislative district characteristics report, deleted transient military population, whereas the second and third, the school district characteristics report, included all the populace.

CENSUS DEFINITIONS

The majority of census categorizations used herein are self-explanatory. Definitions of those categories most frequently evoking questions are given in the following paragraphs:

Persons of Spanish Language - These comprise persons of Spanish mother tongue and all other persons in families in which the head or wife reported Spanish as his or her mother tongue. This is a heritage, not a racial category. Nearly all persons of Spanish language are classified as White by the Bureau of the Census. The overwhelming majority of the 70,734 persons of Spanish language in Washington in 1970 were undoubtedly of Mexican-American ancestral heritage. Many of the knowledgeable individuals who work closely with the State's Mexican-American populace are of the opinion there was a degree of undercounting of "Persons of Spanish Language" particularly those in lower socioeconomic areas. Representatives of other minorities have voiced similar concerns regarding undercounting of their particular group. No data on the Spanish surname category were detailed by the 1970 U. S. Census for the State of Washington. The Spanish surname category was reported only for the southwestern states.

Other - Other used in conjunction with Blacks and Indians as the residual non-whites includes, Eskimos, Filipinos, Japanese, Polynesians, etc.

Foreign Stock - The category "Foreign Stock" includes the foreign-born population and the native population of foreign or mixed (one foreign-born parent) parentage. Persons of foreign stock, thus, comprise all first and second generation Americans. Third and subsequent generations in the United States are described as "Native of native parentage."

Mother Tongue - Mother tongue was the language spoken in the person's home when he was a child.

Age - Age is based on the age of the person in completed years on April first of the census year.

Medians and Means - The median age is that age which divides the age distribution into two equal parts, one half being older than the median age and the other half younger. Similar definitions are applicable to housing values and family income. The mean (or average) housing value was obtained by dividing the aggregate total housing value by the total number of houses.

Living in Group Quarters - All living arrangements other than in households are classified by the Bureau of the Census as Group Quarters. Group Quarters includes correctional institutions, nursing and convalescent homes, rooming and boarding houses, ships, communes, dormitories, convents, mental hospitals, military barracks, fraternity houses, etc.

Household Head - Two types of household head are distinguished, the head of a family and a primary individual. A family head is a person living with one or more persons related by blood, marriage or adoption. A primary individual is a household head living alone or with non-relatives only.

Value - Value of an owner-occupied home is the respondent's estimate of the sale value of the house and lot. Value data are limited to owner occupied one family houses on less than ten acres without a commercial establishment or medical office on the property. Owner occupied corporations, condominiums, mobile homes, and trailers are excluded. The value data include housing values on farm units of less than ten acres only. This criteria frequently affects the average housing values in agricultural areas.

Family Income - The 1969 incomes of all family members 14 years old and over are summed and treated as a single amount.

Poverty Level - The poverty level threshold has a range of income cut-off adjusted by such factors as family size, sex and age of the family head, number of children under 18 years old, and farm and non-farm residence. In 1969 the poverty thresholds ranged from \$1,487 for a single female 65 years old and living on a farm to \$6,116 for a non-farm family of seven with a male head. In 1969 the average poverty level threshold for a non-farm family of four headed by a male was \$3,745. Poverty level thresholds are computed on a national basis only and are revised annually to allow for changes in the cost of living.

Employment Status - Most of the employment status data in the 1970 Census reports related to persons 16 years old and over. In 1960, 1950, and 1940 employment status data were presented for persons 14 years old and over. The change was made to achieve conformity with the official measurement of the labor force as revised in January 1967.

Labor Force - All persons 16 years old and over are classified dichotomously as either "Not in the Labor Force" or "In the Labor Force." The Labor Force includes all persons in the Civilian Labor Force plus members of the Armed Forces on active duty. The Civilian Labor Force consists of persons classified as Employed or Unemployed (looking and/or hopeful of employment). The Employed Civilian Labor Force is grossly categorized as White Collar Workers, Blue Collar Workers, Service Workers, and Farm Workers. There are major subcategories within these categories. The subcategories in turn may be further classified in considerable detail; thus, certain workers in the Craftsmen category portion of Blue Collar Workers are classed as Mechanics, who in turn are subclassified as Automobile Mechanics, or Mechanics except Automobile.

Census Tracts and Census County Divisions - The basic units for census data statistical tabulations are census tracts and census county divisions.

Census tracts are small areas into which large cities and adjacent suburban areas have been divided for statistical purposes. Tract boundaries were established cooperatively by local committee and the Bureau of the Census, and were generally designed to be relatively uniform with respect to population characteristics, economic status, and living conditions. Tract boundaries were established with the intention of being maintained over a long time so that comparisons may be made from census to census.

Census county divisions (CCD's) represent areas which have been delineated by the Census Bureau with the cooperation of the State's Governor and cognizant officials. CCD's have relatively permanent boundaries, which generally follow physical features or the limits of incorporated places. In 1950 the State of Washington pioneered in the establishment of CCD's for use in the census. By 1970 twenty other states had followed Washington's lead. All counties in Washington have CCD's. Seven counties (Benton, Clark, Franklin, King, Pierce, Snohomish and Spokane) additionally are subdivided by census tracts. In all states, except Washington, CCD's have names. In Washington most of the divisions are numbered rather than named. Thus, Adams County has ten numbered divisions; Asotin has one named and two numbered divisions; Chelan County has nine named divisions; and Yakima County has 37 numbered and five named divisions. The five major incorporated cities of Yakima County are the named divisions: Selah, Sunnyside, Toppanish, Wapato, and Yakima.

Census tracts and CCD's are further subdivided into enumeration districts, block groups and, in some cases, blocks. Most socioeconomic data are available only at the census tract or CCD level.

Census tract and CCD data are gathered by other agencies than the Bureau of the Census, e.g., case worker report summaries of the juvenile court frequently are tabulated by census tract, as are crime reports of police departments.

1970 CENSUS OF POPULATION AND HOUSING

The results of the April 1970 Census of Population and Housing have been and are still being issued by the U.S. Bureau of the Census in the form of printed reports and computer tapes. In developing the data for the tabulations in this report, recourse was taken to approximately a dozen published reports detailing census data for Washington State. In addition, similar Washington census publications for previous censal years were studied to evaluate trends, and 1960 and 1970 census reports from other states were likewise studied to note similarities or differences. Pertinent census tape tabulation printouts were obtained or programmed. Approximately half the data used were based on computer printouts of census data.

There are several thousand census items available, ranging from the number of persons in an individual census tract who are over 18 to the number of clothes dryers which are gas heated in a given community. It was believed that optimum arrangement called for not more than 28 items shown as an entity in a single tabulation. Demographic (usually based on 100% data) and socioeconomic (usually based on sample data) items for a given school district were shown as separate, but facing, tabulations. Available census items were studied, tested, restudied, and retested before final acceptance. The relative value of the census items in arriving at needs assessment, educational, and curricular decisions was the prime criterion for acceptance.

TABULAR DEMOGRAPHIC AND SOCIOECONOMIC CATEGORIES

The following paragraphs briefly describe the import and highlights of the demographic and socioeconomic categories selected for incorporation in this report. Details of the import of data items from specific areas will be discussed as deemed warranted.

Sex and Ethnic Data

Relative sex ratios are obviously of import in birth rate data and are of distinct significance in labor force categorizations.

Ethnic and minority (non-whites plus persons of Spanish language) percentages are reported for each school district.

Age Group Distribution

The relative number of under fives are of importance in forecasting future school enrollment trends. This facet is discussed more fully under a separate section on population pyramids. Persons 5 to 17 years of age are nearly all in school, and school enrollment is highly correlated with this group. Persons 18 years and over form the voting population, which varies in individual school districts from 56% of the population to over 80%. The statistics on 18 to 24 year olds are markedly affected by the presence of a college or military installation in the area. Persons 25 to 44, in the main, comprise the parents of school age students. Persons 45 to 64, in general, are workers whose children are in or have finished high school. Persons 65 years and over are basically retired.

Family and Household Data

The percentage of persons in group quarters is abnormally high in college areas, military installation areas, and penal and other institutional

areas. The percent of primary individuals is highest in urban areas and lowest in suburban "bedroom" areas. The percent of families with children under 18 is generally lowest in urban areas and highest in suburban "bedroom" areas. The percent of children in families with female heads is usually highest in urban areas. Renter-occupied household percentages are highest in urban areas and lowest in suburban "bedroom" areas. Rental and housing values, in the main, are a function of socioeconomic status.

Schooling and Educational Level Data

Adult schooling status is, in general, an excellent indicator of socioeconomic status as measured by housing value, income and occupational category status. The percent of males 16 to 21 enrolled in school is an indicator of continuing post-secondary education. The percent of males 16 to 21 not enrolled in school, and who are not high school graduates, is an indicator of high school dropouts. Care in using these indicators is necessary since an atypical number of young males can deflate or inflate the percentages. This is particularly evident in college or military installation areas.

Income and Poverty Level Data

Income level data are obviously highly correlated with socioeconomic status. It should be borne in mind that in college areas (particularly those with a high proportion of graduate students), such as the Pullman School District, there will be a high level of college graduates but not necessarily a high level of income. Income levels in urban areas are not strictly comparable to income levels in rural agriculturally oriented areas. Poverty level data indicated that a significant proportion of the poverty level families were headed by females with children under 18.

Employed Labor Force

The percent of females in the labor force generally varies from 30% or less in the rural areas to over 45% in the older urban areas. The percent of persons in professional and managerial vocations is highly correlated with other socioeconomic indicators.

Percentages

In each district tabulation there are two columns labelled "Base of Percent" and "Percent of Base." These columns were incorporated to denote the bases from which percentages were computed. Letter symbolization used was mnemonic: A for adults, E for employed, T for total population, T 18- for total population under 18 years, H for households, etc. The percentage of primary family type households was based on the number of households "H." The percentage of primary families with children under 18 years of age was based on the number of primary families "F." The percentage of high school graduates was based on the number of adults, 25 years of age and over "A."

SCHOOL DISTRICT GEOGRAPHIC REFERENCE FILE
AND CENSUS DATA TREATMENT

Accurate allocation of population by census tract or census county division (and their component enumeration districts or block groups) to the 314 school districts of Washington State was the most difficult and time consuming portion of the entire project.

A School District Geographic Reference File and a School District Summary Data Project were developed by the Census Bureau, under the sponsorship of and in cooperation with the Office of Education, to provide pertinent 1970 decennial census data corresponding to school district boundaries. Approximately two-thirds of the school districts in Washington State were included in this Office of Education project (in theory, all school districts with 1970 enrollments of more than 300 students). A School District Geographic Reference File was developed by the Census Bureau for each of the 218 Washington State school districts included in the project. This reference file identified fractional and entire enumeration district or block groups within each school district. Parent counties, census tracts, and census county divisions were also identified. For the 218 Washington State school districts reported the tape printout of the geographic reference file only (percent of each enumeration district or block group in each school district) involved 167 pages of 37 lines each. These data were aggregated by school district populations to census tracts and county census divisions (CCD's), and the resultant percentages of each tract or CCD in a given school district were computed. The whole or partial census tract (or CCD) populations were summed to obtain the school district total population.

Numerous errors of commission and omission were found in the tape printout. A few major school districts were not included in the Office

of education project. In several instances the territory indicated by the computer printout was markedly at variance with the school district boundaries. In one county certain of the printouts showed duplication of territory resulting in the cumulative percentages of population assigned to a school district from a given enumeration district reaching a total of over 150%. In other cases, whole CCD's, census tracts, or enumeration districts were erroneously assigned (in several instances to non-contiguous school districts). All of the foregoing necessitated revision of the Census Bureau population allocations to school districts in Washington State.

A few revisions in population allocation were caused by school district consolidations or major boundary changes. However, the major cause of revisions was the Census Bureau allocation of population to various school districts within the same census subarea on a strictly geographic area basis (even in some instances including major water areas). No apparent account was taken of housing density patterns. The terrain and land use characteristics of Washington State make such a proportional territorial distribution particularly subject to error. The bulk of the school district population allocation revisions involved changes of less than 10% in population. These changes in the main were in the larger school districts. A relatively minor population change in a larger school district usually results in an appreciable percentage change in the population of a contiguous smaller school district. In general, the quantitative revisions in the larger school districts resulted in relatively minor qualitative revisions in demographic and socioeconomic profiles (as portrayed by medians and frequency distribution percentages).

Larger scale census maps and school district boundaries were studied in detail and painstaking efforts were made to distribute population to

individual school districts on an accurate and equitable basis. Assistance, when needed, was solicited from cognizant county planners. Cognizant Intermediate School District personnel and individual school district personnel were also consulted, as were county engineers, county assessors, and county voting registrars. It was found that over forty percent of the school districts for which population allocations were reported by the Census Bureau needed revision. Revised data for a substantial number of these districts have been incorporated in the tabulations of Population Profiles II. The smaller school districts (most of which were not reported by the Census Bureau) population allocations by census county divisions (and their component enumeration districts) were similarly painstakingly developed from detailed census maps, land use maps, housing density maps and printouts and other data utilizing as appropriate and necessary cognizant individuals as consultants.

Population distribution data for an appreciable number of school districts included in Population Profiles II, have been revised in the course of developing population distribution data for the smaller school districts. A listing of these school districts was incorporated as an addendum to Population Profiles II. Revised tabular and profile data were sent each affected school district and their cognizant Intermediate School District. The revised tabulations are also presented in Tables II A through II N of this report.

Figure 1 is illustrative of the impracticability of allocating population to school districts by geographic area. Enumeration District (ED) 9 occupies the extreme northwest corner of Cowlitz County located in southwestern Washington. Three school districts have portions of their

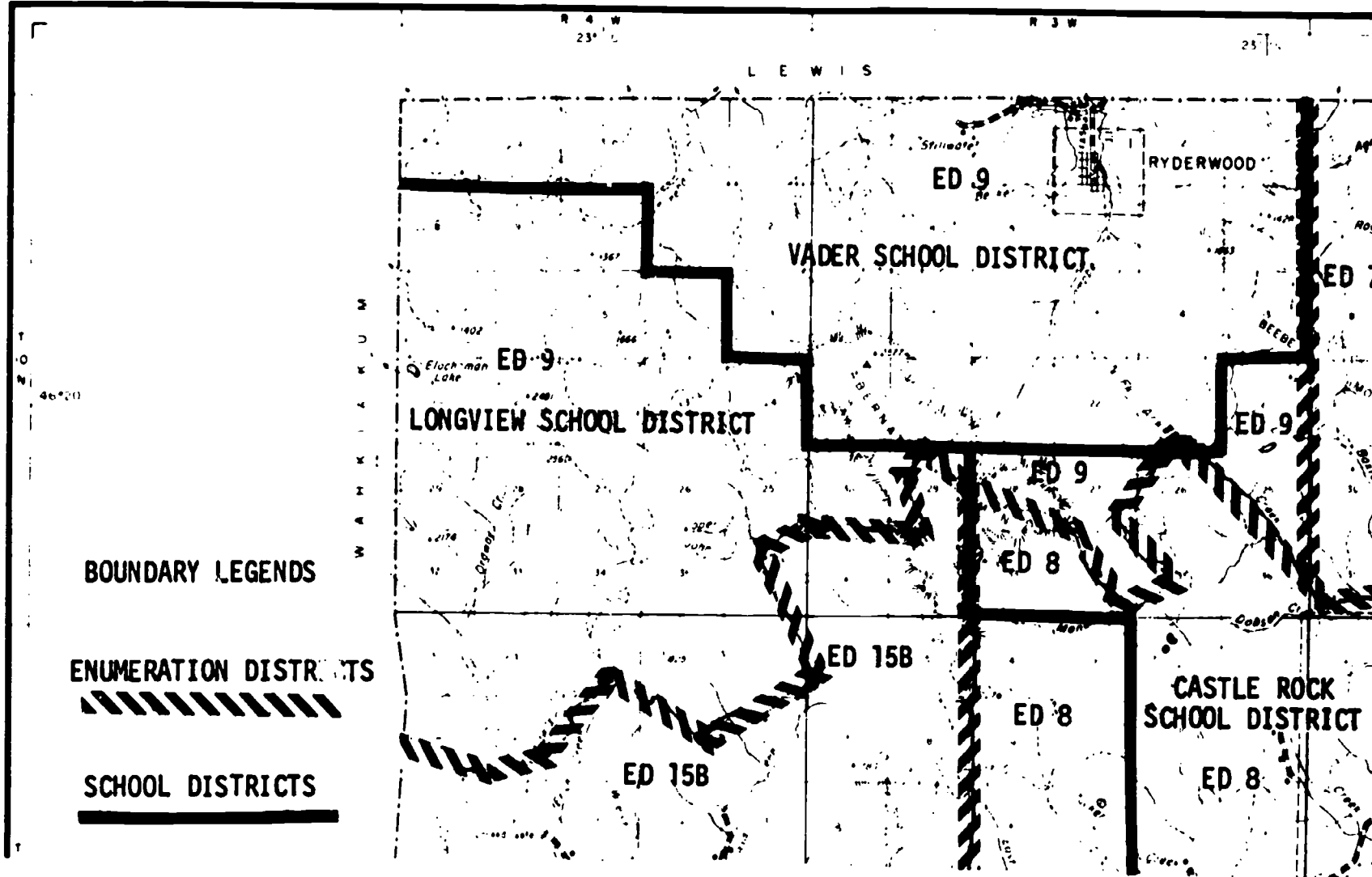
territory within ED 9. These are the Castle Rock, Longview, and Vader School Districts. The Census Bureau allocated 45% of the population of ED 9 to the Longview School District and 10% to the Castle Rock School District, leaving 45% for the Vader School District. The population of ED 9 is concentrated in the Ryderwood area of the Vader School District, and the terrain characteristics of the Longview School District portion of ED 9 render it highly improbable that more than a family or so (if any) live therein. Well over 90% of the population of ED 9 live within the Vader School District-Cowlitz County boundaries (the Vader School District also includes a portion of Lewis County). Revising the distribution of the 299 inhabitants of ED 9 has only minimal demographic profile effects on the Longview School District with its over 35,000 population but has distinct effects on the slightly over 1,000 persons in the entire Vader School District.

Tabular summaries were made of the school district allocations by census tract or census county division (and their component enumeration districts or block groups) for each county. Table I is illustrative of the school district allocations for Mason County.

The entire population of the State was uniquely allocated to individual school districts. Table II shows the population allocations by counties to Washington State Intermediate School Districts (ISD's).

In Washington State sixty-six (66) of the 314 school districts were non-high school districts. These 66 non-high school districts were sending districts to 61 receiving districts with high schools. Some high school receiving districts are fed by as many as four non-high school sending districts. The Shelton School District in Mason County receives high school students from the Grapeview, Hood Canal, Pioneer and Southside School

WASHINGTON

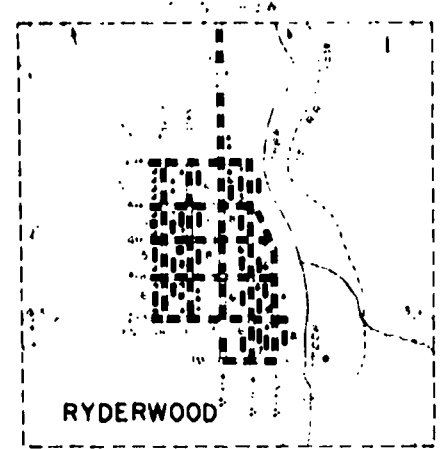

Districts. The Grapeview School District sends high school students to both the North Mason and Shelton School Districts. Two school districts are both receiving and sending school districts. Sprague in Lincoln County covers grades 1-5 and 9-12, and Lamont in Whitman County covers grades 6-8.

All but two (Kitsap and San Juan) of the thirty-nine Washington State counties have school district attendance areas involving more than one county. There are 64 school districts in more than one county. Of these, 56 are in two counties, seven are in three counties, and one--Grand Coulee Dam--is in four counties. The students in the Blaine School District who come from the Point Roberts area of Whatcom County have nearly an hour bus ride through Canadian territory to attend school in Blaine.

In many instances school district boundaries cut across census tracts or CCD's. As many as five school districts might have territory within a single census tract. Census tract counts ranged from eight in Franklin County to 252 in King County. County census divisions ranged from two in Garfield County to 44 in Yakima County.

Proportional allocation of demographic and socioeconomic data in forms of applicable population percentages of split tracts or CCD's were made for each school district. The aggregated data for each item represented the demographic or socioeconomic data of the component whole or fractional tracts or CCD's for the school district as a whole.

In the interest of ease of comparability, applicable percentages and medians were computed for the demographic and socioeconomic data. Median values were computed on the basis of data intervals shown in the tabular presentations and may vary slightly from published medians derived from different intervals.

Published population statistics for Chelan County, King County (about fifty census tracts), Pierce County, Thurston County, and Yakima County were subsequently revised by the Bureau of the Census. The latest available Bureau of the Census revisions for total population were utilized in developing this report.

Published demographic and socioeconomic data in some instances were based on earlier reported different populations. Thus, published data for King County Census Tract 300 in the Federal Way School District were based on a population of 7,333; later Census Bureau revisions changed the total population to 10,027, resulting in a correction factor of 1.3674. Appropriate corrections were made in demographic and socioeconomic data items for this tract and also for other tracts or CCD's showing changes in published populations.

In addition to corrections in data dictated by incorporating Bureau of the Census revisions, a limited number of corrections were made involving illogical or inconsistent data. Nearly all of these involved sampling data. Appropriate logical techniques and rationale were utilized to determine the most probable valid data and indicated corrections were made. The census demographic and socioeconomic data were basically believed to be representative. Data discrepancies, in general, were few and far between, and corrective actions were taken in the interests of accuracy of the demographic and socioeconomic profiles of the affected areas.

OF WASHINGTON STATE INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICTS

Intermediate School District Summaries are arranged in geographically contiguous groups of three ISD's. Data for each group of three ISD's are presented in two facing tabular parts: Part I, "Demographic Data Profiles," and Part II, "Socioeconomic Data Profiles."

Table ISD - A details the demographic and socioeconomic profiles of the three eastern Washington ISD's: ISD 101, ISD 104, and ISD 123. Figure 2 shows the location of these three ISD's and also the boundaries of the other nine ISD's. Pertinent census tract and census county division maps of Washington are presented in Population Profiles I and II. Census county division maps for northeast Washington (Figure 3), southeast Washington (Figure 4), northwest Washington (Figure 5), and southwest Washington, (Figure 6) are included in Population Profiles III.

Table ISD - B presents the demographic and socioeconomic profiles of the three central and northwest Washington ISD's: ISD 105 and ISD 167 in central Washington and ISD 108 in northwest Washington.

Table ISD - C portrays the demographic and socioeconomic profiles of the three metropolitan western Washington ISD's: ISD 109 (primarily Snohomish County), ISD 110 (primarily King County), and ISD 111 (primarily Pierce County).

Table ISD - D depicts the demographic and socioeconomic profiles of the three southwestern and coastal Washington ISD's: ISD 112, ISD 113, and ISD 114.

Table III summarizes and compares the key percentage and median data for the 12 ISD's.

1970 DEMOGRAPHIC AND SOCIOECONOMIC PROFILES OF THE POPULATIONS
OF WASHINGTON STATE SCHOOL DISTRICTS WITH LESS THAN 400 STUDENTS

The tabular demographic and socioeconomic data for the 114 smaller school districts in Washington State are arranged by the Intermediate School Districts in which they are located. Within each ISD they are presented in sets of approximately five school districts arranged alphabetically by county.

ISD 101, which includes Ferry, Lincoln, Pend Oreille, Spokane, Stevens and Whitman counties, has 33 of the 114 smaller school districts. The five school districts in Ferry County--Curlew, Hazelmere, Inchelium, Keller, and Orient--are shown in the facing data tabulations of Tables III A-1 and III A-2. Tables III B-1 and III B-2 give the demographic and socioeconomic data for the Almira, Creston, Edwall, Harrington, and Sprague School Districts of Lincoln County. The other 23 smaller school districts in ISD 101 are portrayed in Tables III C through III G. ISD 104 data are detailed in Tables III H and III J and ISD 123 data are shown in Tables III K and III L. Tabular demographic and socioeconomic data for the remaining 64 smaller school districts are presented in Tables III M through III Z.

A brief writeup of the salient features of each Intermediate School District is presented in the following subsections of this report. These will amplify and supplement the ISD writeups of Population Profiles II. Noteworthy characteristics of constituent smaller school districts will be briefly discussed.

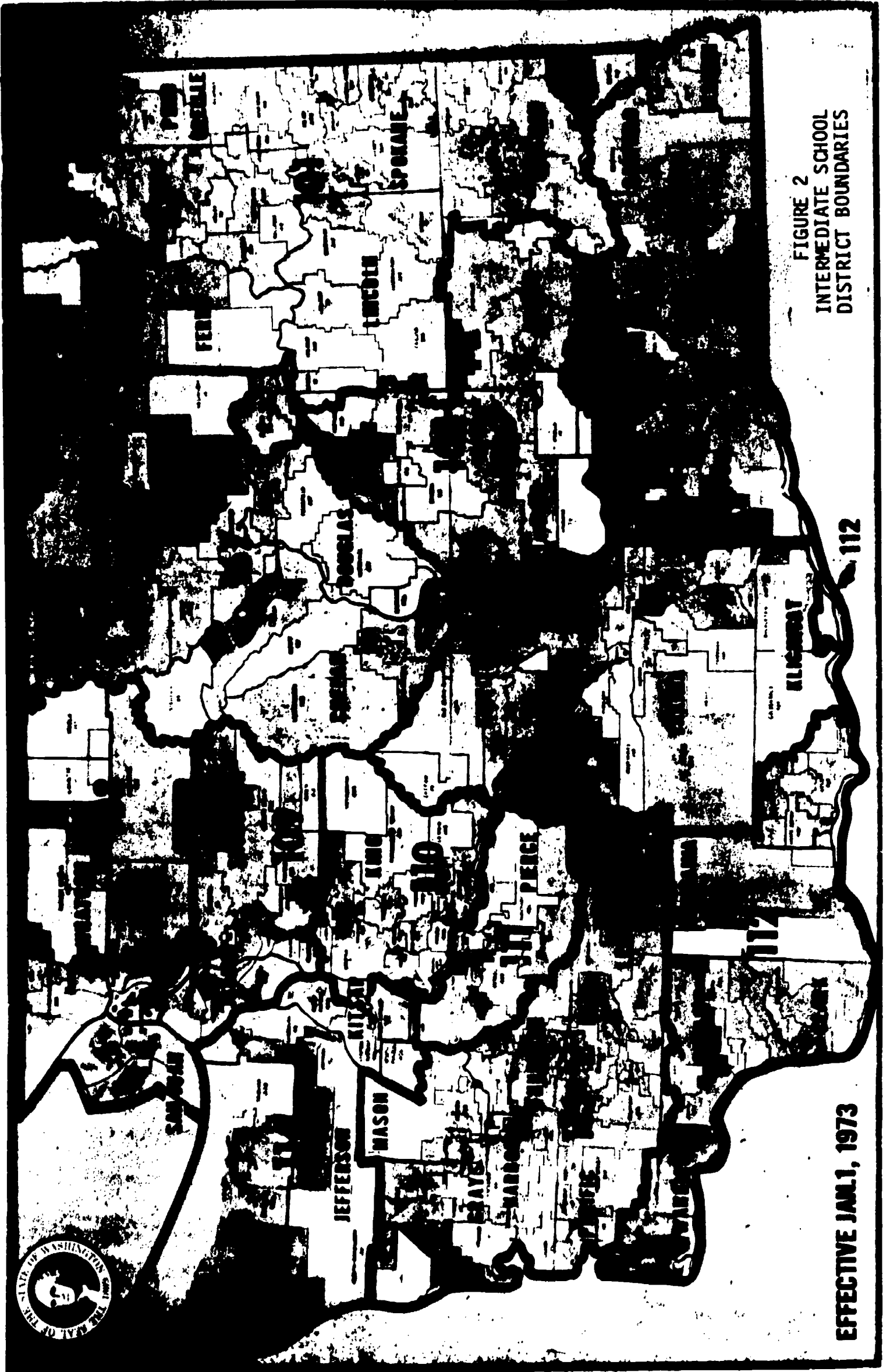

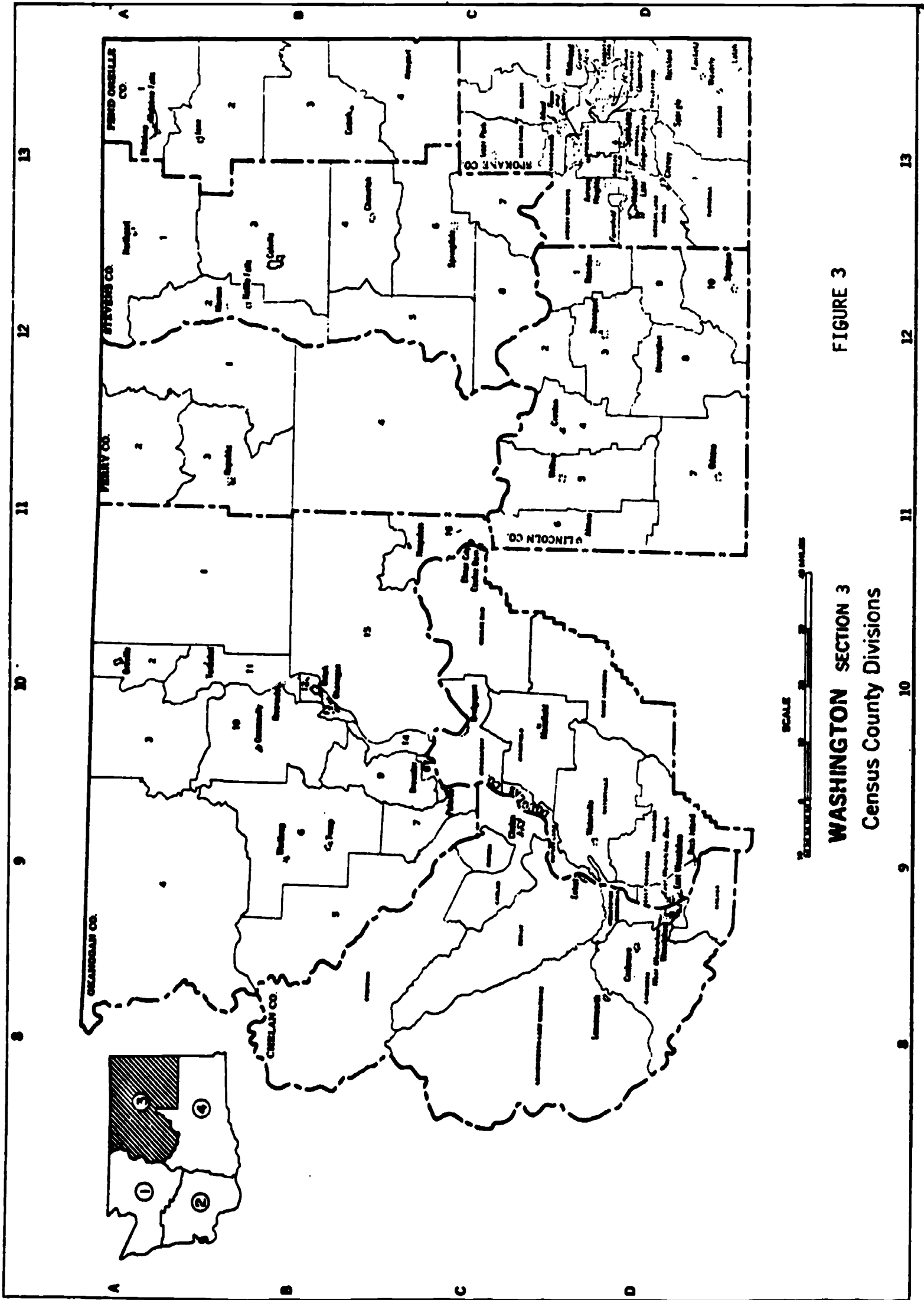
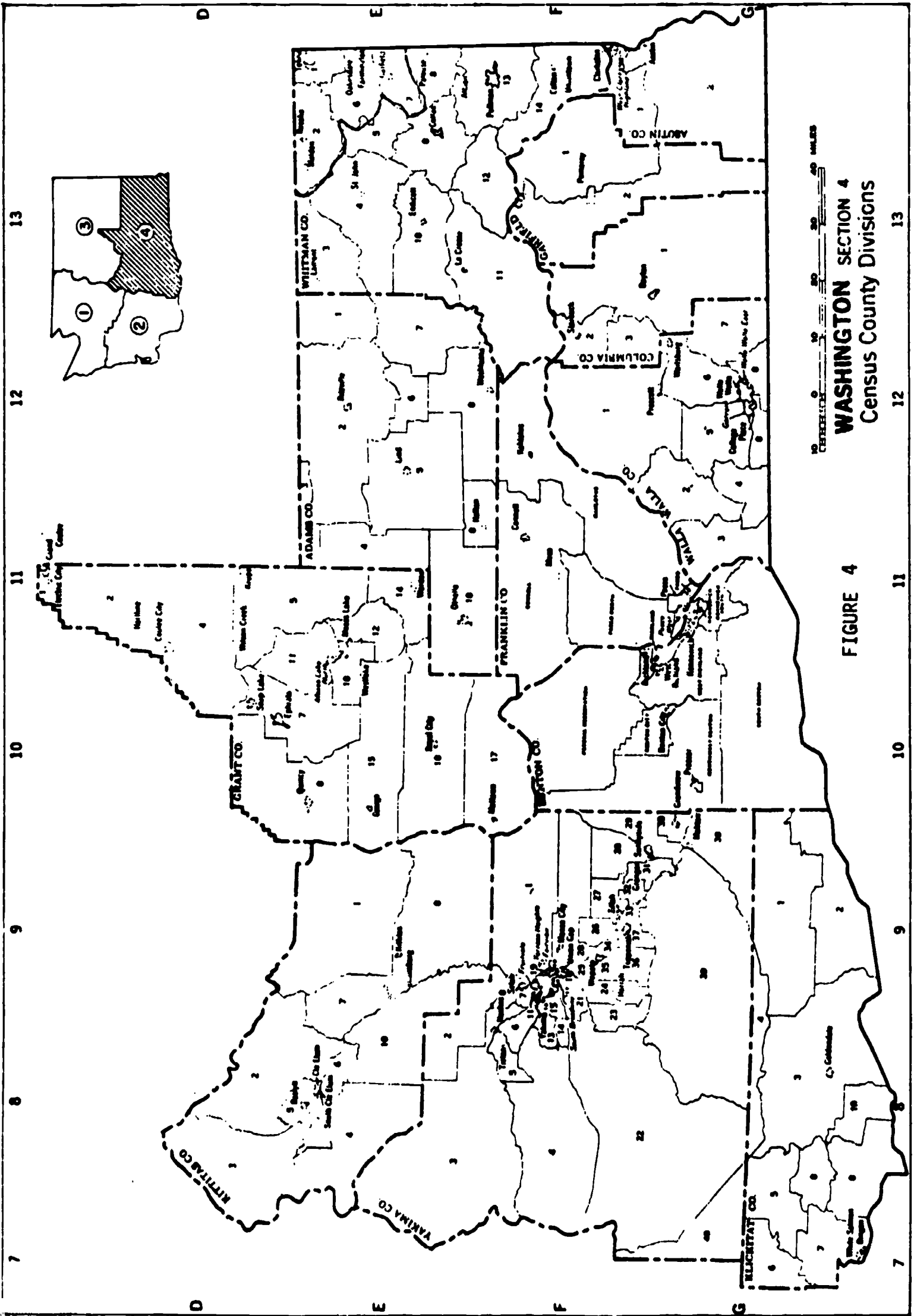

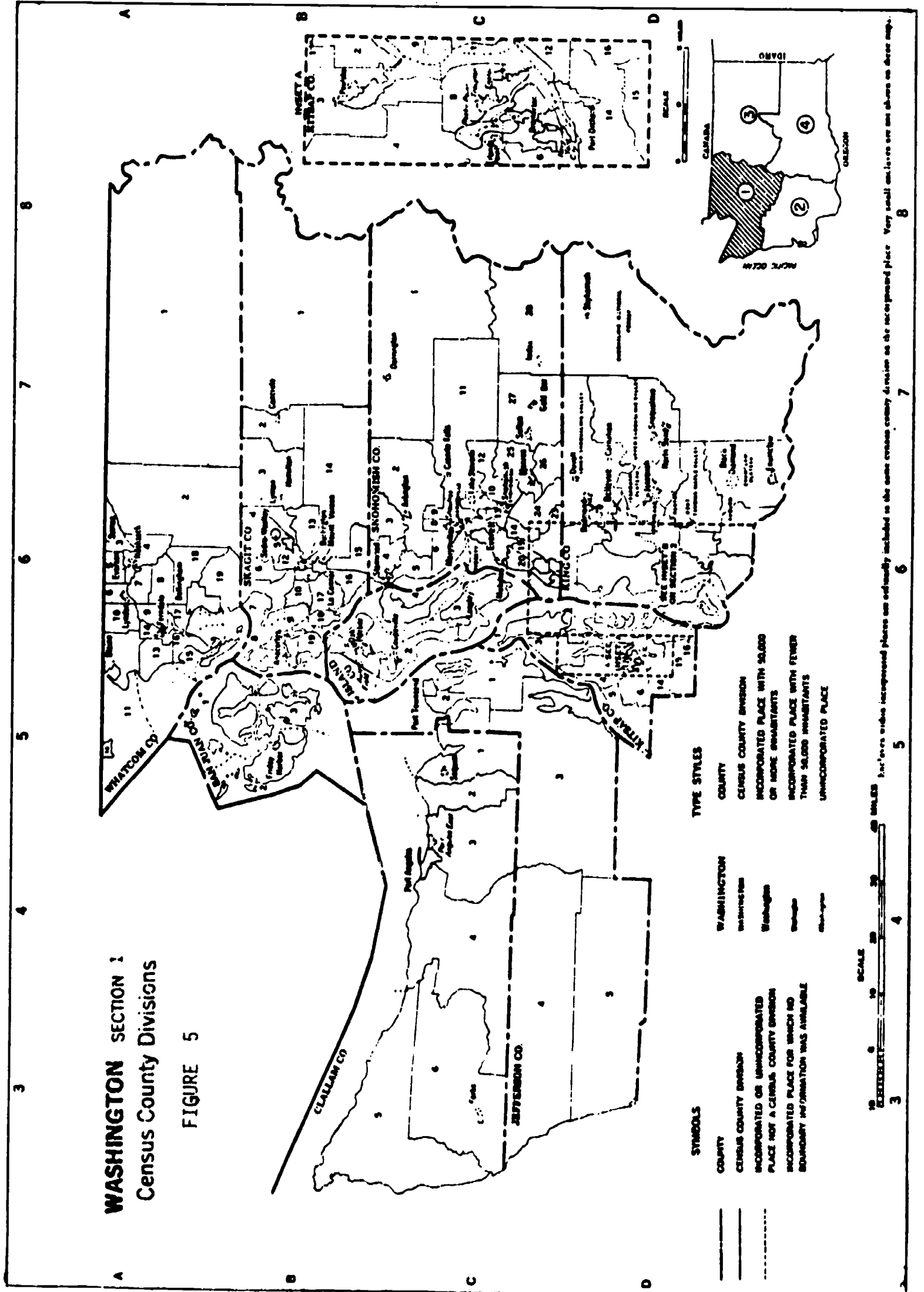

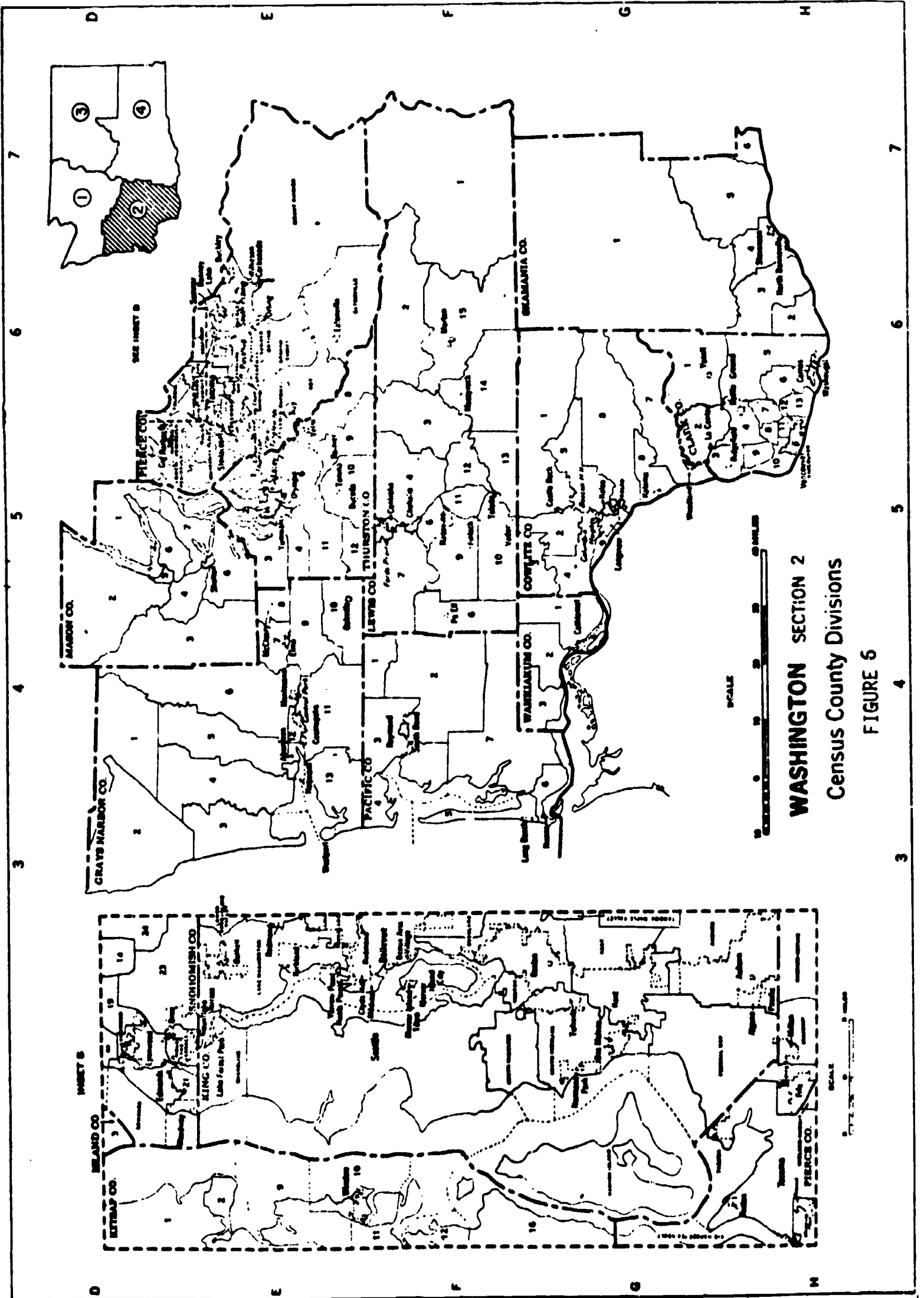

INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICTS 101, 104, AND 123

Intermediate School District 101

The Spokane School District accounted for slightly over half the population of ISD 101, and its urban nature definitely affected the overall statistics of ISD 101. The balance of Spokane County is in ISD 101, as are Ferry, Lincoln, Pend Oreille, Stevens, and Whitman Counties. ISD 101 has the highest number of school districts--58, of which 33 are smaller school districts. ISD 101 has the highest percentage of persons living in group quarters due primarily to college dormitories and military barracks. ISD 101 ranked second in the State in percent of high school graduates, however, its income level did not keep correlative pace. The Edwall School District in Lincoln County ranked second in the State in percent of high school graduates. The high Indian population percentages of several schools in Ferry County and the 62.2% of Indians in the Wellpinit School District of Stevens County will be noted.

Intermediate School District 104

This was the smallest ISD in total population, and is located primarily in the Grant and Adams Counties. The Moses Lake School District accounted for slightly over one-third of the population of ISD 104. ISD 104 had the highest minority percentage of any ISD primarily due to its high percentage of persons of Spanish language. ISD 104 had the highest percentage of farmers and farm workers and the lowest average housing value. It should be borne in mind that owner-occupied homes on farm units of more than ten acres are not included in housing value summaries. It should also be borne

in mind that incomes in a rural agriculturally oriented area are not strictly comparable to incomes in an urban area. The relatively small Benge School District in Adams County has 80.5% of high school graduates.

Intermediate School District 123

This ISD embraces southeastern Washington and includes Asotin, Benton, Columbia, Franklin, Garfield, and Walla Walla Counties. The Walla Walla, Richland and Kennewick School Districts are the three largest of the smaller school districts in ISD 123. The Columbia School District in Walla Walla County had the highest percentage (24.0) of under eighteens in poverty level families.

Intermediate School District 105

Yakima County accounts for the bulk of the ISD 105 population. ISD 105 also includes Kittitas County and approximately half of Klickitat County. ISD 105 ranked second in percentage of persons of Spanish language and percent of Indians. ISD 105 ranked twelfth in family income level and also had the highest poverty level indices. ISD 105 ranked third in percent of farmers and farm workers. Of the smaller school districts in ISD 105 the Bickleton School District in Klickitat County had the highest percentage (26.1) of under eighteens in poverty level families.

Intermediate School District 167

This is the second smallest ISD in population and includes Chelan, Douglas, and Okanogan Counties. The Wenatchee and Eastmont School Districts accounted for half the population of ISD 167. ISD 167 ranked first in the State in percent of Indians and lowest in the State in percent of persons of Spanish language. ISD 167 ranked second in percent of farmers and farm workers. The Nespelem School District had 53.5% of Indian population. Of the smaller school districts in ISD 167 the Waterville School District in Douglas County had the highest percentage (26.0) of under eighteens in poverty level families.

Intermediate School District 108

San Juan, Skagit, and Whatcom Counties and the northern two-thirds of Island County make up ISD 108. The Bellingham School District accounted for over one-fourth of ISD 108's population. The median age of 45.6 years is

affected by the high proportion of retirees in the Firday Harbor area of the San Juan School District. The Orcas Island School District had 19.3% of under eighteens in poverty level families.

Intermediate School District 109

Snohomish County accounts for 97% of ISD 109, and the southern third of Island County accounts for the balance. The Edmonds (36%) and Everett (23%) School Districts accounted for nearly 60% of the population of ISD 109. ISD 109 ranked second in both median family income and value of owner-occupied housing.

Intermediate School District 110

ISD 110 includes nearly all of King County, the Bainbridge Island School District from Kitsap County, and that portion of Snohomish County that is in the Northshore School District of King County. ISD 110 is nearly three times larger than the second largest ISD (112) and includes over one-third of the State's population. The Seattle (45%) and Hignline (10%) School Districts accounted for 55% of the population of ISD 110. ISD 110 ranked first in median family income, housing value, and adult educational level.

A word of caution regarding incomes is in order. Metropolitan Western Washington is highly urbanized and incomes in this area are not strictly comparable to incomes in other sections of the State, particularly rural agriculturally oriented communities.

In Population Profiles II the twenty larger school districts with the highest percentage of high school graduates were listed. The following list amends the previous list to include the highest 30 districts.

Intermediate School District 111

This ISD has the second largest population and school enrollment. Over 99.9% of the ISD 111 population is in Pierce County. The Tacoma (40%) and Clover Park (21%) School Districts accounted for over 60% of the population of ISD 111. ISD 111 stood second in percentage of non-Whites. The ethnic and age-sex distribution percentages of ISD 111 and particularly the Clover Park School District are skewed by the large military populations in Fort Lewis and at McChord Air Force Base. The small Anderson Island School District population profiles are badly skewed by the inmates of the McNeil Island Federal Penitentiary, which is within its attendance area. The atypical profiles of McNeil Island are shown in Table III-R.

SOUTHWESTERN AND COASTAL WASHINGTON
INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICTS 112, 113, AND 114

Intermediate School District 112

ISD 112 includes Clark, Cowlitz, Skamania, and Wahkiakum Counties and substantial portions of Klickitat and Pacific Counties. The Vancouver (33%) and Longview (17%) School Districts accounted for one-half of the population of ISD 112. ISD 112 ranked twelfth (lowest) in both the percentage of non-Whites and the percentage of minorities. ISD 112 ranked first in percent of craftsmen. The relatively small Roosevelt School District in Klickitat County had the highest percentage (51.9) of farmers and farm workers.

Intermediate School District 113

ISD 113 includes Grays Harbor, Lewis, and Thurston Counties. It also includes substantial portions of Mason and Pacific Counties. The Olympia (16%), North Thurston (12%) and the Aberdeen (11%) School Districts accounted for nearly 40% of ISD 113. The remaining 43 school districts, 19 of which are classified as smaller, make up the balance. ISD 113 has a relatively low minority populace and a quite low (0.2%) Black population. Indians made up the majority of the non-White population. The Taholah School District with 66.9% of Indians was the highest in the State. Taholah also had the highest percentage in the State (58.7) of under eighteens in poverty level families.

Intermediate School District 114

ISD 114 includes Clallam and Jefferson Counties, all of Kitsap County (except for the Bainbridge Island area), and a portion of Mason County. Bremerton (31%) and South Kitsap (16%) School Districts account for nearly half of the population of ISD 114. The Bremerton School District, and to

some extent the ISD 114 demographic profiles, were skewed by the over 4,100 transient military personnel included in the 1970 Kitsap County census data. ISD 114 ranked second in the State in percentage of craftsmen. ISD 114 ranked third in the State in percentage of Indian population. The Clearwater School District with a 40.6% Indian population was the highest in ISD 114. In the Clearwater School District 40.3% of the under eighteens were in poverty level families.

BY EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT OF MOTHER AND FATHER

In Population Profiles II it was shown in Washington State that a very significant high correlation existed between the educational level of the adult populace and key socioeconomic attributes. A similarly high correlative relationship also exists between parental education and relative progress and retention in school. The Bureau of the Census has published a wide variety of comprehensive subject reports based on 1970 census data. Two of these subject reports are on "Educational Enrollment" and "Educational Attainment." Most of the data in the subject reports are national rather than regional in scope. Perusal and study of the data in the subject reports on education reveals interesting and rewarding information.

Table IV presents a compilation of data showing the effect of parents education on the scholastic progress of their children. It will be noted that as the parental levels of educational attainment increase the percent of 16 year old students enrolled in school increases (79.0 to 98.3), the percent of students two years or more below modal grade level decreases (21.5 to 1.2), and the percent of students at or above modal grade level increases (51.6 to 91.5). The parenthetical figures show the changes from the case where both parents have a seventh grade or less education to the case where both parents have some college. Although the data in Table IV is for the United States as a whole, it is also believed to be applicable to Washington State 16 year olds.

The data in Table IV is also of sociological interest and indicates that the educational criterion is a highly significant factor of associative mating.

ENROLLMENT STATUS OF PERSONS 16 TO 22 YEARS OLD
BY YEAR OF AGE, SEX, AND ETHNICITY

Table V contrasts the school enrollment status of the Washington State population with that of the United States as a whole. For ages 16 through 18 years Washington State shows a somewhat higher pattern of school enrollment for both sexes than that of the United States. Females in Washington State also show a higher enrollment pattern in the 19 to 22 year old age bracket than that of the United States. Washington State males in the 19 to 22 year old age bracket show a comparable enrollment pattern to that of the United States.

Detailed ethnic enrollment status data are not available for Washington State. The United States data shows marked ethnic differences in enrollment pattern. Blacks have the highest ratios of female to male enrollments in the post-secondary age groups of 19 and over. The Sino-Japanese post-secondary very high enrollment pattern for both males and females will be noted. It also is of interest that second generation Whites show a significantly higher post-secondary enrollment than Whites of native stock.

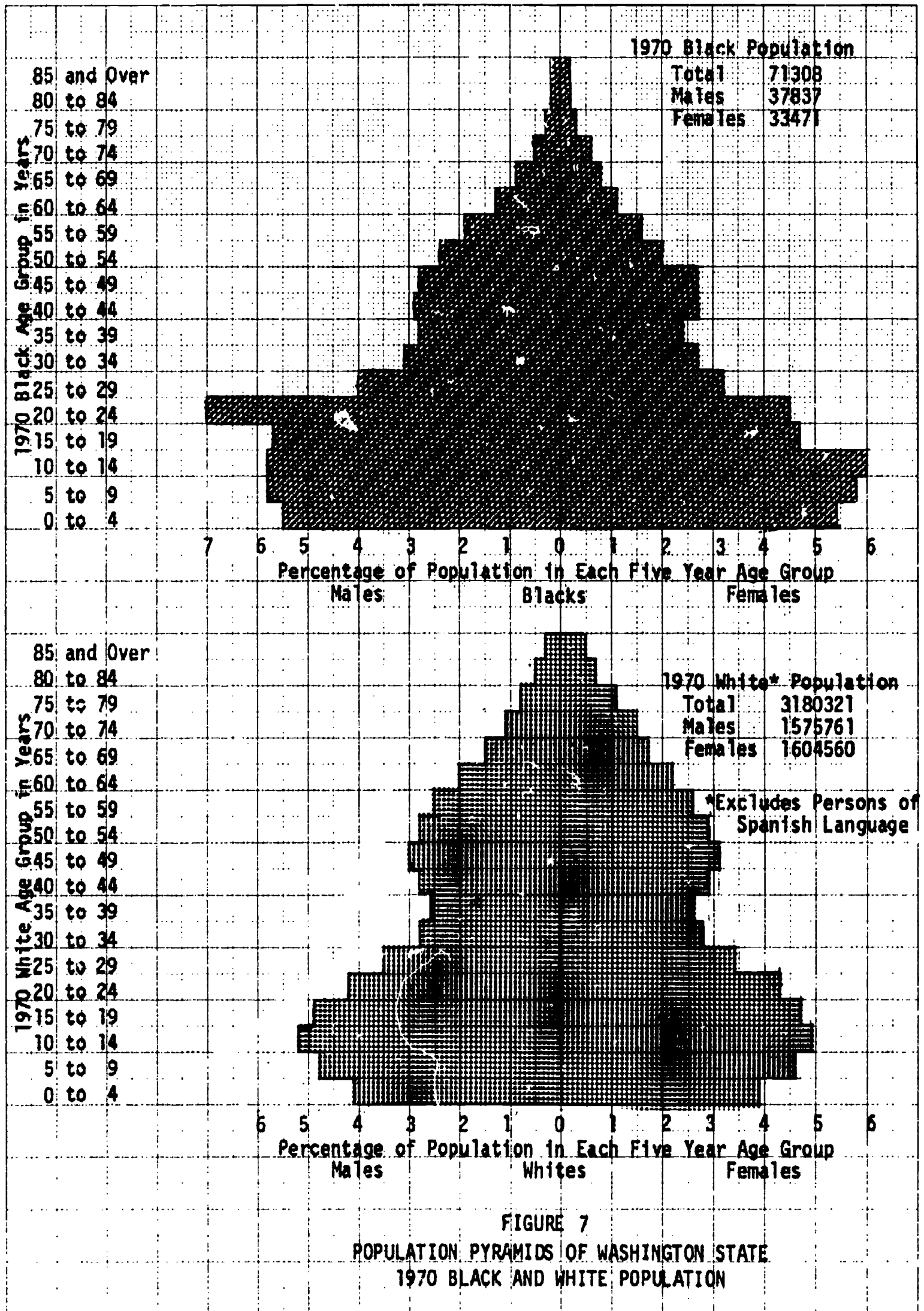

POPULATION PYRAMIDS OF WASHINGTON STATE
FOR SELECTED ETHNIC GROUPS

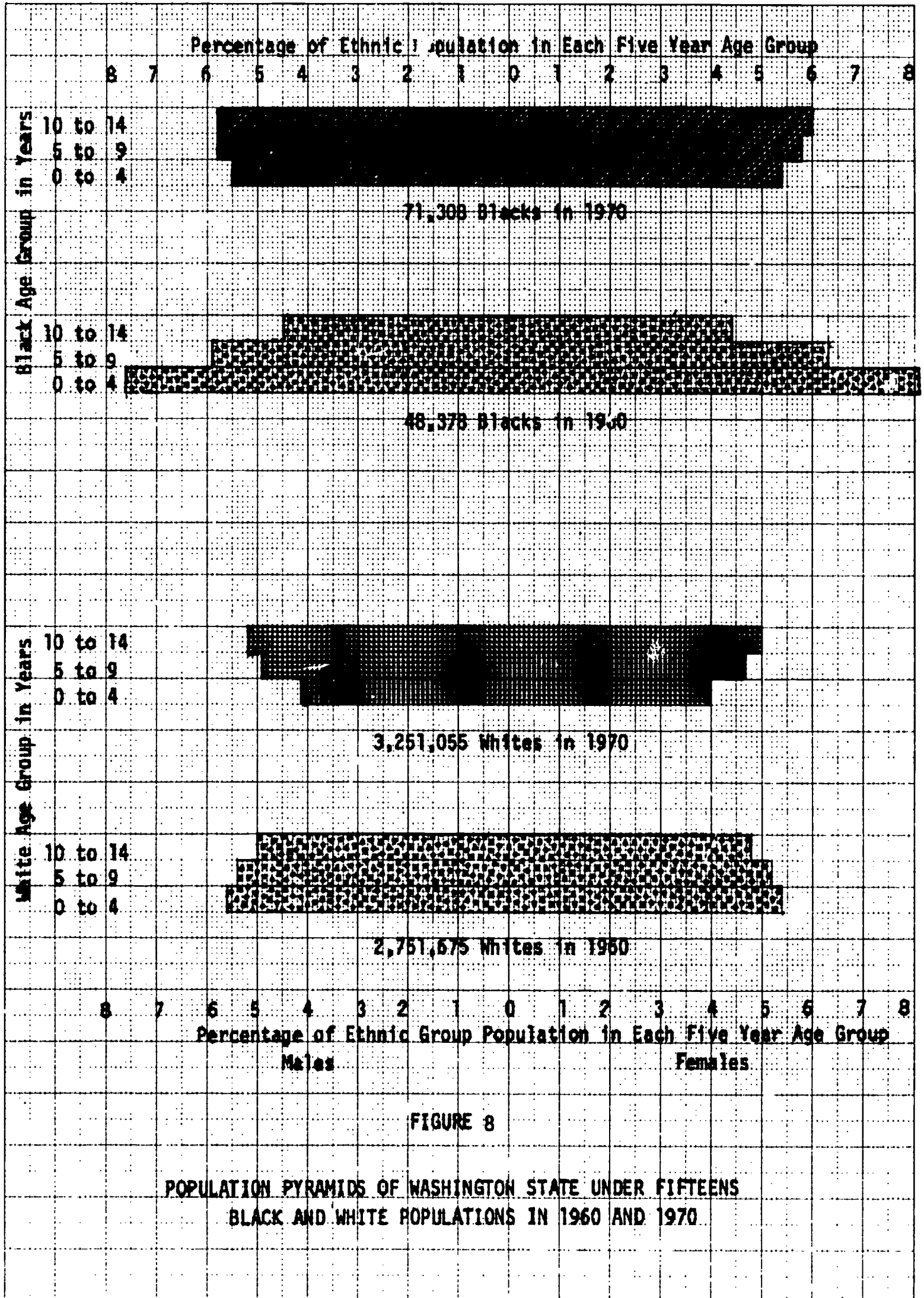


Figure 9 compares the population pyramids of Washington State under fifteens by ethnic group. The Japanese have the lowest percentage of under fives and the most pronounced inverted pyramid. The persons of Spanish Language have the highest percentage of under fives. A portion of the differences is accounted for by differential median ages. The median age of the Japanese population is 32.1 years; the median age of the persons of Spanish language is 19.8 years.

Population pyramids are graphical portrayals of the detailed age-sex structure of the population of a given area. Population pyramids normally depict five-year age and sex summaries. The separate sex-age groups are arranged in ascending order with the female population shown on the right and the males depicted on the left. Population pyramids are a useful and interesting demographic tool. They, among other facets, pictorially illustrate the effects of past birth rates. Other phenomena are also depicted by the population pyramids. Illustrative applications are detailed in the population pyramids of Figures 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11.

A military installation, university community, or penal institution usually markedly affects age-sex distributions as well as other demographic and socioeconomic data. The Clover Park School District (which includes the major portions of Fort Lewis and McChord Air Force Base in its attendance area), the Pullman School District (which includes Washington State University in its attendance area), and the Anderson Island School District (which includes the McNeil Island Federal Penitentiary in its attendance area) are prime examples of atypical demographic and socioeconomic data profiles. Population pyramids of certain of these atypical communities were included in the population pyramids section of Population Profiles II, as was a comparison of the 1960 and 1970 population pyramids of Washington State and selected school districts.

Figure 7 depicts the 1970 Black and White population pyramids of Washington State. The two bulges in the 1970 White population pyramid reflect the higher birth rates of the 1950's and the 1920's. The 35 to 39



year age group is illustrative of the low birth rates of the depression era of the 1930's. The higher initial white male birth rates and the greater female longevity are also shown in this graph.

The Black population shows in general a somewhat similar profile, modified by the fact that there are an appreciably higher proportion of senior citizens in the White population (the median age of the Whites is 27.9 years--the median age of the Blacks is 22.2 years). The high percentage of Black males in the 20 to 24 year old age bracket reflects the high proportion of Blacks in the military installations such as Fort Lewis. Blacks in the military in Washington State were more representative of the national Black population (11%) than the Washington State Black population (2%).

The major change that took place between 1960 and 1970 in the population pyramid profiles of all ethnic groups was in the three to five year age groups representing the under fifteens. Figure 8 contrasts the 1960 and 1970 population pyramids of Washington State Black and White under fifteens. The 1960 graphs show the successive increases in births during the late 1940's and throughout the 1950's. The 1970 graphs show the age-group inversions resulting from the successive five year decreases in births during the 1960's.

The percentage of foreign born children in each age group are shown. The highest percentage of foreign born children are those of Chinese ancestry. Seattle schools, where nearly all the foreign youngsters of Chinese ancestry are concentrated, report that the Chinese students have the greatest linguistic difficulties in their younger years. The foreign born Indian children are, in the main, from Canada; a few are from Latin America. The Blacks have the highest percentage of native born children of native born parents.

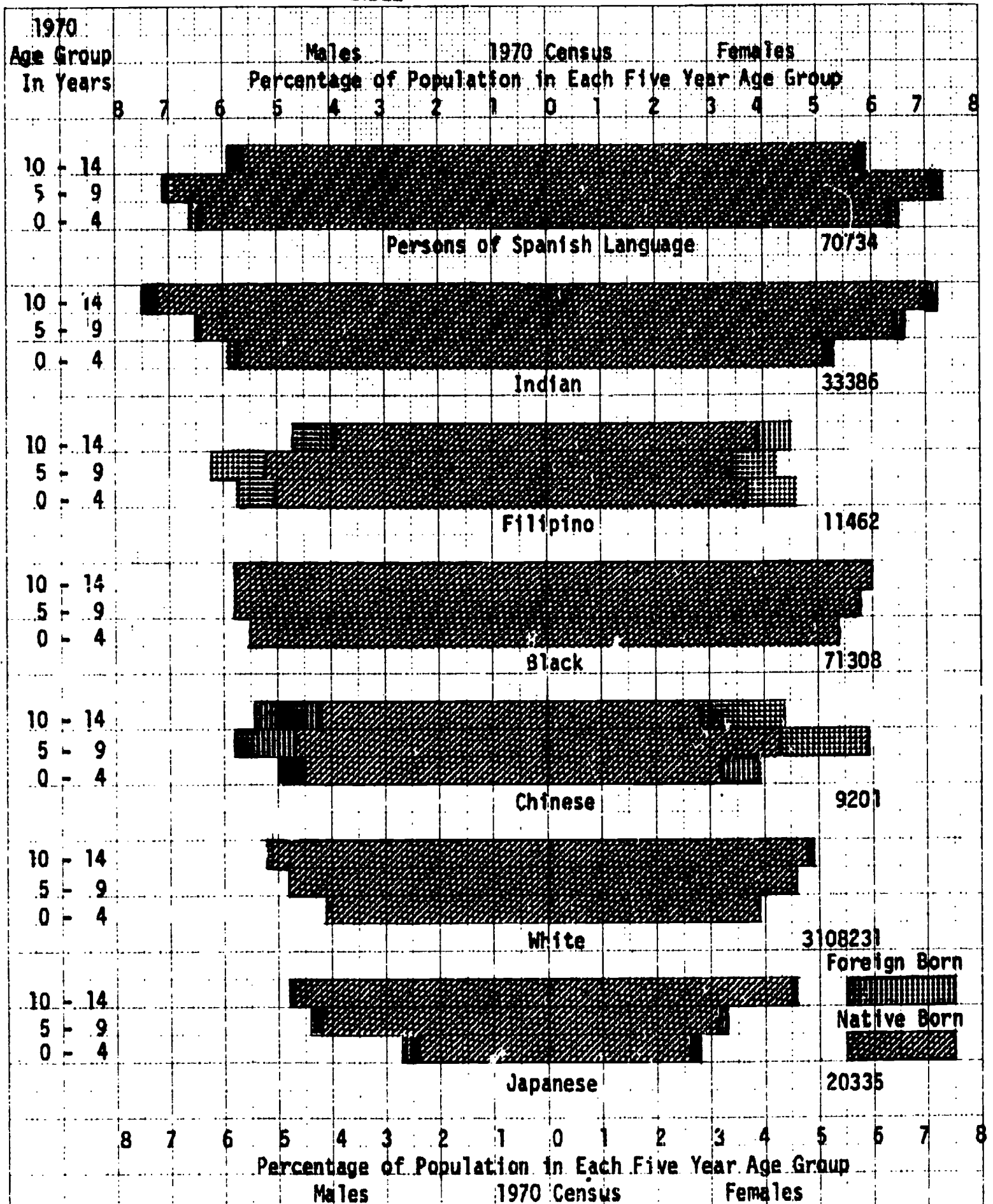

Figure 10 portrays the population pyramids of the Japanese and Korean populations in the 15 to 54 year old age group. The native born and foreign born are distinctively patterned in the population pyramids. It will be noted that the percentage of foreign born Japanese females in the 35 to 44 year old age bracket are distinctly in excess of the 35 to 44 year old foreign born males. In the case of the Korean born females, the distinction is even more marked and is primarily concentrated in the 25 to 39 year old age group. The age groupings are closely correlated with the post-World War II and the post-Korean War eras. It is believed the data reflects the high proportion of Japanese and Korean war brides residing in Washington. Many of the 20 to 24 year old Koreans are understood to be college students.

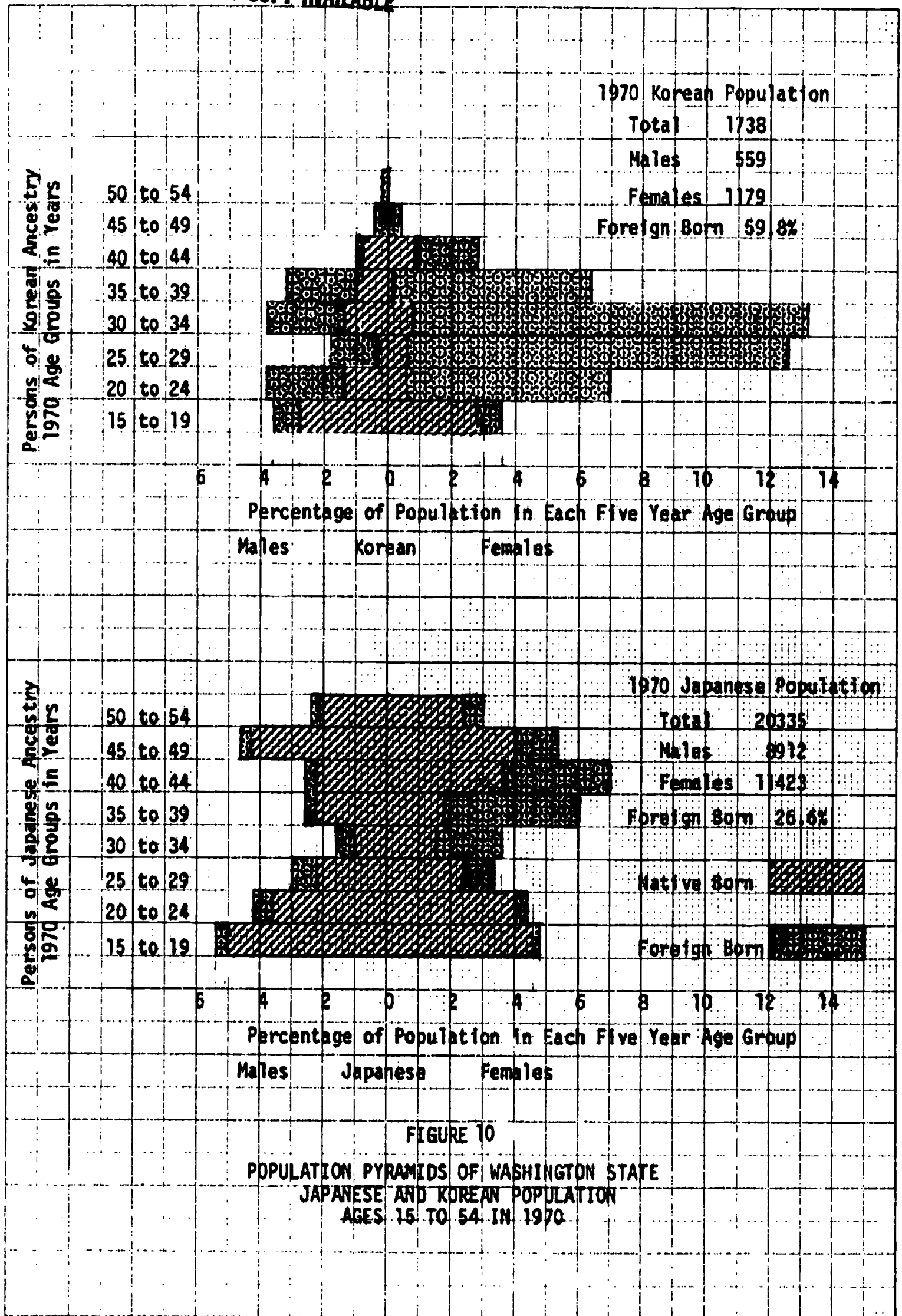


Figure 11 depicts the 1970 population pyramids of the Royal and San Juan School Districts, who respectively have populations with a median age of 20.0 years and 45.8 years. The high proportion of retired senior citizens in the San Juan School District will be noted, as will the much higher proportion of school age students in the Royal School District of Grant County. In 1970 there were 389 5 to 17 year olds in the San Juan School District and 728 in the Royal School District.

Well over 90% of the 5 to 17 year old age group are enrolled in grades K to 12 in the public and private schools of Washington State. Private and parochial schools account for slightly over 5% of the K-12 enrollment in Washington State. The greater proportion of these enrollees are in parochial schools. Certain of the school districts have a distinctly higher than an average percent of their 5 to 17 year old population attending parochial schools (in some instances the proportion approaches 50%). Illustrative are the College Place School District (Clara Rogers Elementary - Seventh Day Adventist - 320 and Walla Walla Valley Seventh Day Academy - 300 students); Colton School District (Guardian Angel - St. Boniface - 186 students); and the Lynden School District - Lynden Christian Elementary - 578 students and Lynden Christian High - 458 students). Damman, a non-high school district in Kittitas County, has approximately 100 resident 5 to 17 year olds. Five of these are enrolled in the Damman elementary school--approximately forty students from the Damman School District attend high school in the Ellensburg School District. It is understood that many elementary school students from Damman attend school in Ellensburg.

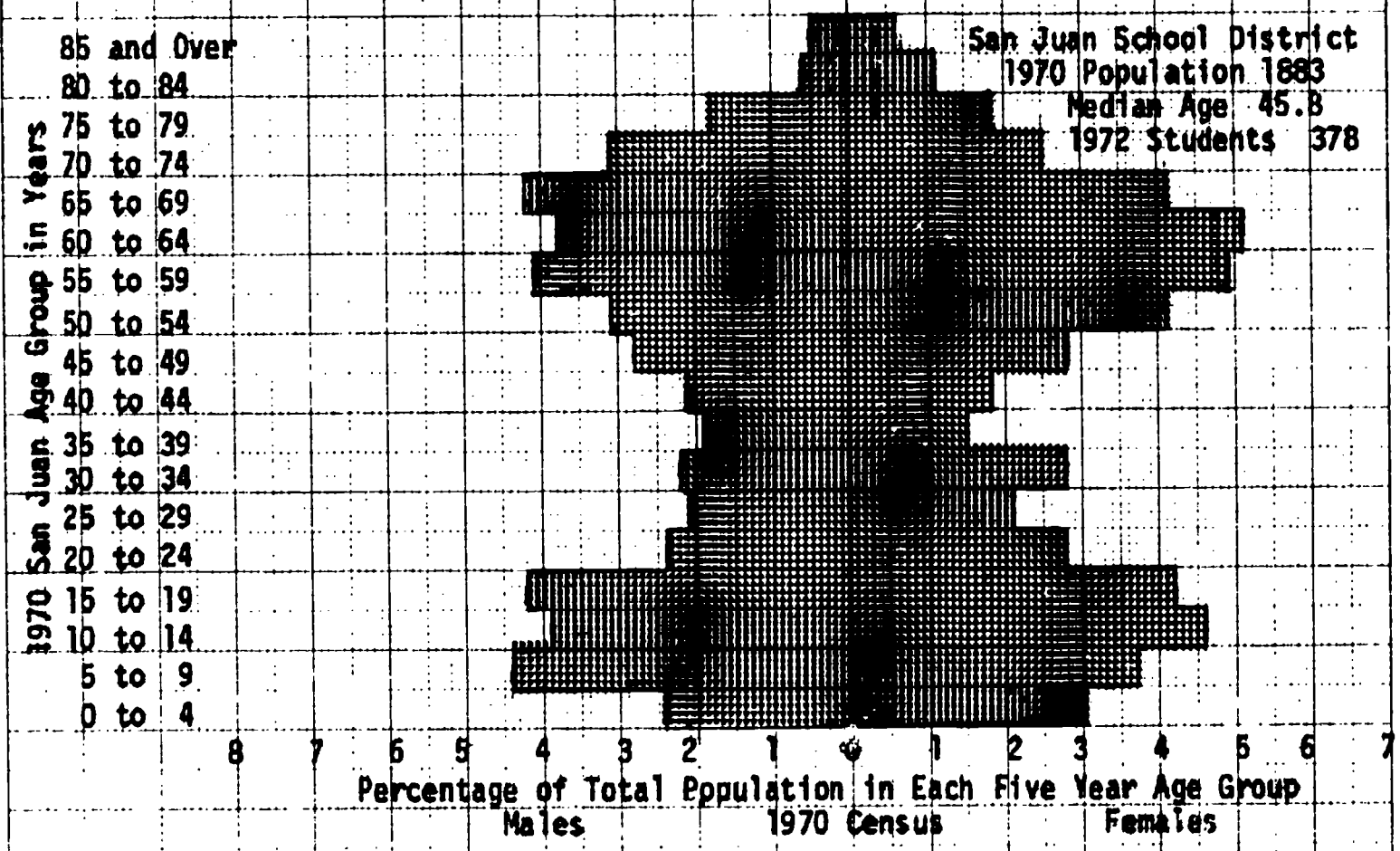
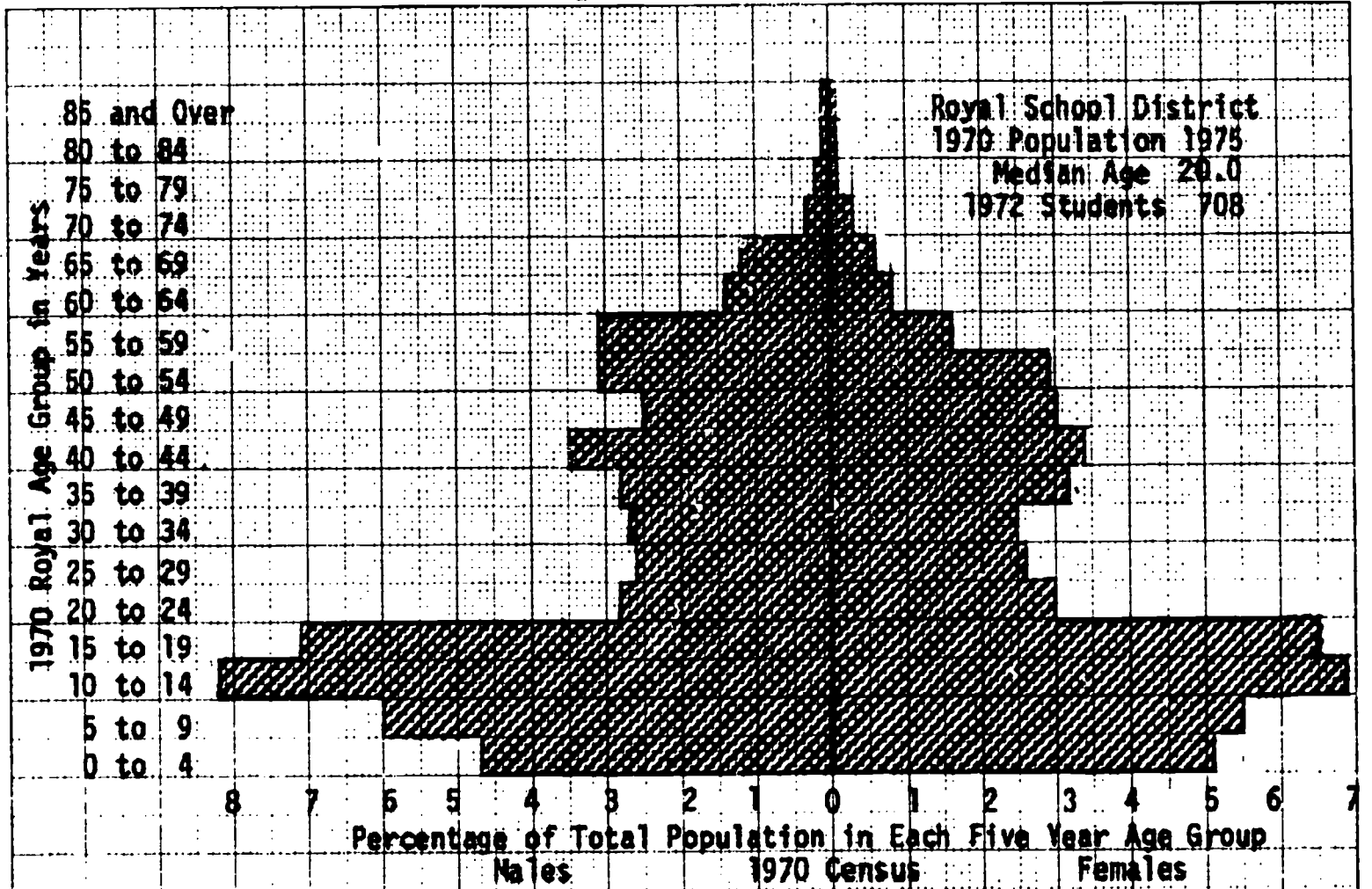

BIRTH RATE TRENDS IN WASHINGTON STATE
1960 THROUGH 1972

Births and birth rates are of distinct interest and importance in projecting future school enrollments, for the newly born infant is the matriculating kindergarten student five years hence. Washington State birth rates, in common with United States birth rates, peaked in the post World War II era, maintained their momentum through the 1950's and gradually declined during the 1960's. The birth rate declines accelerated in the early 1970's and by 1972 had plummeted to new lows challenging the lows of the depression years of the 1930's. Preliminary indications are that the birth rates (and total births) in 1973 will be lower than those of 1972. Increased emphasis on family planning is probably the primary factor. There are urban-suburban differences, female age group differences, and ethnic group differences in birth rates. All groups showed marked declines. Greatest percentage declines for specific age groups of females were in the 20 to 24 year old and the 35 to 44 year old age groups. Many population analysts have advanced the theory that these declines are the result of changing life styles rather than short term trends.

Table VI details birth and birth rate statistics for Washington State, King County, and Seattle for 1959 through 1972. The distinct decline from 1960 to 1970 in birth rates will be noted as will the precipitous drop from 1970 to 1972. There are marked ethnic differences in birth rates, however, all ethnic groups showed drastic declines in birth rates in the early 1970's. The very low 1972 Japanese and White birth rates, particularly in Seattle, will be noted.

The excess of births over deaths is termed natural increase in population. Table VII compares the births and death of Washington, King County, and Seattle in 1960, 1970, and 1972. It will be noted that the state-wide percentage rate of natural increase has decreased sharply over the past twelve years. In 1972 Seattle, for the first time in history, reported more resident deaths than births resulting in a negative natural increase rate.

The rationale for the revisions is discussed in the section of this report entitled "School District Geographic Reference File and Census Data Treatment." The major cause of revisions was the Census Bureau allocation of population to various school districts on a strictly geographic area basis. The terrain and land use characteristics of Washington State make such a proportional territorial distribution particularly subject to error. Approximately three-fourths of the school district revisions involved changes of less than

10% in population. A relatively minor population change in a larger school district normally results in an appreciable percentage population change in a contiguous smaller district. In general, the quantitative revisions in the larger school districts resulted in relatively negligible qualitative revisions in demographic and socioeconomic profiles.
