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ABSTRACT

The course outline has been prepared as a guide to help the student become proficient in the skills required to execute speedball lettering. Prior to entry into the course, the vocational student will display mastery of Pencil Lettering. Consisting of 135 clock hours, the course is organized into five instructional blocks: (1) orientation to speedball lettering, (2) speedball gothic alphabet, (3) speedball roman alphabet, (4) speedball old english text, and (5) speedball round hand script, followed by a post-test. Teaching techniques include lecture and demonstration methods with active student participation and practice. Supplementary methods include the use of visual aids, charts, diagrams, books and instructional learning packages. A bibliography and sample post-tests conclude the course description. (MW)

PREFACE

The following quinmester course outline has been prepared as a guide to help the student become proficient in the skills required to execute speedball lettering.

The course is 135 hours in length. The outline consists of six blocks of instructions which are subdivided into several units each. The student must master the skills and techniques of each specific unit in order to meet the objectives of the course.

In presenting the material outlined in this quinmester the instructor uses lecture and demonstration methods, with active participation and practice by the student. At times individual help in manipulative skills is most beneficial. These methods are supplemented by the use of visual aids, charts, diagrams, books and instructional learning packages. These charts and learning packages are referred to frequently.

This outline was developed through the cooperative efforts of the Instructional and Supervisory personnel, the quinmester advisory committee, and the Vocational Curriculum Materials Service, and has been approved by the Dade County Vocational Curriculum Committee.

2. Demonstrate an understanding of speedball gothic by executing the complete alphabet in a class project. (Includes upper and lower cases, vertical manuscript, italics and numbers)

BLOCK III - SPEEDBALL ROMAN ALPHABET

The student must be able to:

1. Select the appropriate style speedball point and using the correct stroking techniques complete practice sheets demonstrating the basic elements of the speedball Roman alphabet.
2. Demonstrate an understanding of speedball Roman by executing the complete alphabet in a class project. (Upper case, lower case, italics and numbers).

BLOCK IV - SPEEDBALL OLD ENGLISH TEXT

The student must be able to:

1. Select the correct style speedball point and using the appropriate stroking techniques, complete practice sheets demonstrating the basic elements of the speedball old English alphabet.

BLOCK V - SPEEDBALL ROUND HAND SCRIPT

The student must be able to:

1. Select the appropriate style speedball point and using the appropriate stroking techniques complete practice sheets demonstrating the basic elements of the speedball script alphabet.

2. Demonstrate a comprehension of speedball script by executing the complete alphabet in a class project. (upper case, lower case and numbers).
