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ABSTRACT

Fall 1974 enrollment in the Los Angeles Community Colleges reached an historical high of 124,839--a 14.6% increase over the previous fall. Enrollment increases were greater among day students (17.6 percent) than evening students (10.9 percent), reversing the pattern of last year. Female enrollment increased more sharply than male enrollment and part-time enrollment growth exceeded full-time growth. The average age of district students increased from 26.6 in fall 1973 to 27.7 in fall 1974; especially dramatic increases were evident in the enrollment of students aged 50 and over. Weekly student contact hours (WSCH) increased 9.5 percent this fall. Day WSCH per student declined throughout the district while evening contact hours per student increased. ABSTRACT

historical high of 124,839-a 14.6% increase over the previous Fall. All colleges showed increases, led by West (27.0%), City (22.6%), and Pierce (22.3%). City remains the largest college in the District, with 23,514 students. The 20,000 enrollment level was also exceeded by Pierce and Valley colleges, with 21,206 and 21,323 students, respectively. Community college enrollment throughout the County increased 9.4% since Fall 1973.

LACCD enrollment increases were greater among day students (17.6%) than evening students (10.9%), reversing the pattern of last year. Female enrollment increased more sharply than male enrollment and part-time enrollment growth exceeded full-time growth. Enrollment of students aged 21 and over increased more sharply than that of students under 21; especially dramatic increases were evident in enrollment of students aged 50 and over. The average age of District students increased from 26.6 in Fall 1973 to 27.7 in Fall 1974.

Weekly student contact hours increased 9.5% this Fall, with all colleges showing increases. Day weekly student contact hours per student declined throughout the District while evening hours per student increased.

Possible explanations for the LACCD enrollment increase are: (a) increased Outreach programs, (b) increased recruitment efforts by colleges, (c) a shift of students to less expensive forms of higher education, (d) a perceived need by students to establish or upgrade vocational skills in the face of a "tight" job market, (e) augmented student aid programs.

Full-time students are enrolled for 12 or more units during a semester.

Part-time students carry less than 12 units.

<u>Sophomores</u> are students who, at the time of registration, have completed 30 or more seme or muits of college credit.

Weekly student centact hours (WSCH) are derived by multiplain; the uniter of students enrolled in a class by the number of hours per week to which the meets. A class with 10 students which meets three times a week would true generate 3 × 10 or 30 WSCH.

Enrollmont

Fall 1974 enrollment in the Los Angeles Community Colleges reached an historical high of 124,839 -- a 14.6% increase over the previous Fall. This was the largest percentage increase since 1949, when Harbor, Trade-Tech, and Valley Colleges were established.

pages 6 and 7. All colleges showed enrollment increases, led by West (27.0%), City (22.6%), and Fierce (22.3%). The enrollment increases at the latter two institutions are all the more remarkable in view of the fact that they are sizable, well-established institutions.

Day - evening enrollments at all collegs are presented on page 8. All colleges showed increases in day enrollment, ranging from 8.5% at Vailey to 31.3% at City. However, evening enrollment showed wide variations among colleges, ranging from a 55.8% increase at West to a 7.5% decrease at East.

Ethnic status is reported voluntarily by students at the time of regise tration, and information for Fall 1973 and Fall 1977 is shown on part of Jon-trary to tast Fall, when 90.8% of LAGCD students reported their ethnic statement, only 5%. rapidly than male students since last Fall and now comprise 45.4% of total enrollment; this trend was evident last year as well. Enrollment of parttime students increased 19.5% compared to 5.9% for full-time students; a full two-thirds of our students now attend part-time. Freshmen and sophomores showed approximately the same rate of growth, with the latter group comprising slightly more than a fourth of LACCD students in both Fall 1973 and Fall 1974. Increased enrollment of older relative to younger students, a trend clearly evident in the past few years, was again apparent this Fall. Students aged 21 and over increased 21.0% since Fall 1973 and now comprise 70.1% of our students; enrollment of students under 21 increased 2.0% in the same period.

More detailed age information is presented on pages 12 and 13 and shows that, while the actual numbers of students in the under 20 and 20 - 24 categories increased in the last year, these students represent a smaller portion of the total LACCD student body than they did last Fall. In fact, students under 20 increased only 0.2% in that period. Increasing rates of growth are evident for every five-year interval up to age 50, with the largest percentage increase occurring in the 50 and over categories. The average age of the LACCD student body increased from 26.6 in Fall 1973 to 27.7 in Fall 1974, an extremely large increase for just one year.

are presented on page 14. All community colleges in the County showed enroll-ment increases this Fall, ranging from 2.7% at Compton to 19.4% at College of the Canyons. Total non-LACCD community college enrollment increased 9.4% compared to the LACCD growth of 14.6%. Undergraduate enrollment at four-year



institution of the County increased 3.1% this Fall, the most dramatic change being a 17.7% increase at USC.

Statewide, the 19-campus California State Colleges and Universities grew 1.8% with most of the growth occurring in part-time student envolument. The nine-compas University of California system grew 3.0%. Preliminary figures from private colleges statewide indicate approximately a 2% growth since last Fall. Preliminary figures from the U. S. Department of Education indicate that community college enrollment nationwide has increased 11.6% since last year and total college enrollment 5.5%.

A number of plausible explanations may be advanced regarding the dramatic LACCD enrollment increase this Fall: (a) increased Outreach programs, (b) increased recruitment efforts by colleges, (c) a shift of students to less expensive forms of higher education, (d) a perceived need by students to essentiablish or upgrade vocational skills in the face of a "right" job market, (e) augmented student aid programs.

Total District WSCB increased 9.5% this Fall to a total of 1.344.25 All colleges showed increases in total WSCB, ranking from 3.3 at Trade-Tech to 15.7% at Pierce. Unlike the case with enrolament, evening WSCB increased more sharply (11.7%) than day WSCB (3.3%). The 15.0% decline in evening who is at East was due to the transfer of the Sheriff's Academ, program from evening



status in Fall 1973 to day status in Fall 1974; this fact is partly responsible for East's having the largest percentage increase in the District in day WSCH (21.0%).

wsch per student (i.e., "student load") is shown on page 17 and a dayevening breakdown on pages 18 and 19. The District-wide average WSCH per
student declined from 11.27 in Fall 1973 to 10.77 in Fall 1974. Day loads
declined overall while evening loads increased throughout the District, continuing a trend evident last year. The average day load throughout the District was 13.36 hours in Fall 1973 and 12.36 hours in Fall 1974, while the
average evening load increased from 8.39 to 8.45 hours in the same period.
The sharpest day load decline occurred at Trade, and the sharpest evening
increase occurred at Southwest.





#### EAST LOS ANGELES COLLEGE

Total enrollment at East increased 7.7% this Fall to a total of 16,833 students (page 21). The day enrollment growth of 22.6% was the largest increase in the District, but was caused at least partially by the transfer of the Sheriff's Academy program from evening status in 1973 to day status in 1974. The evening decrease of 7.5% was a concomitant result of this change.

Female enrollment at East grew 12.2% this Fall compared to 4.5% for male enrollment; females now constitute 43.6% of the student body. Freshman students (i.e., those who have completed fewer than 30 semester units) comprised 80.5% of total East enrollment, part-time students 67.8%, and students aged 21 and over 68.3%.

Detailed age information is presented on page 22. While a fourth of East's students are under 20, this age group increased less rapidly than others and constitues a smaller percentage of the total student body than last Fall. Students aged 55-64 showed the greatest rate of increase.

Ethnic enrollment information is shown on page 23. Spanish-Surn me! students continue to comprise the largest percentage of total enrollment (56.5% in Fall 1974). Enrollment of Other White students appears to be declining.

#### LOS ANGELES CITY COLLEGE

Gity Goliege continued to be the largest college in the District in Fall 1974, with enrollment increasing 22.6% to a total of 23,514 students (see page 25). Day enrollment increased 31.3%; the percentage of day students at Gity in Fall 1974 (66.2%) was the largest at any District college. Gontrary to the District-wide pattern, male students comprised a larger percentage of total enrollment this Fall (53.9%) than they did last Fall (49.6%), increasing 33.0% in that period. Increased enrollments of part-time students and of students aged 21 and over were compatible with District trends. Contrary to the District-wide pattern, however, sophomore enrollment increased more sharply than freshman enrollment.

Age information presented on page 26 reveals that Gity experienced the District-wide trends toward increased enrollment of older students. An especially sharp increase was evident in the 50 - 54 category.

Ethnic enrollment information is presented on page 27. Unfortunately, the fact that only 27.7% of City's students completed ethnic survey cards in Fall 1974 makes analysis virtually impossible.

#### LOS ANGELES HARBOR COLLEGE

Enrollment information for Harbor is presented on page 29. Harbor showed a 6.8% gain in total enrollment this Fall, with day enrollment increasing to 65.1% of total enrollment. Proportions of male to female and of full-time to part-time enrollment remained relatively constant since last year. Harbor had the largest percentage of full-time enrollment of any college in the District in Fall 1974 (38.0%). The District-wide trend toward increased enrollment of students aged 21 and over was evident at Harbor, but not the trend toward increased freshman enrollment.

Age information is presented on page 30. Harbor shows a variable pattern of enrollment increases in different age c tegories, with unusually small increases evident in the 35 - 39 and 45 - 49 categories. As was the case throughout the District, students under 24 comprised a smaller percentage of Harbor's total enrollment in Fall 1974 than they did in Fall 1973.

Ethnic enrollment information on page 31 indicates small increases since last Fail in the American Indian, Oriental/Asian and Sparish-Surnamed categories. Enrollment of Black/Negro and Other White students decreased slightly.

Enrollment information for Pierce is presented on page 33. Total enrollment this Fall increased 22.3%. Contrary to the District pattern, evening enrollment increased more sharply than day enrollment and now comprises
more than a third of Pierce's total enrollment. Pierce showed the Districtwide trends toward increased enrollment of female, part-time, and 21 and over
students. However, students under 21 still comprise a larger percentage of
Pierce's total enrollment than at any other District college. Contrary to
the District pattern, Pierce has experienced a greater increase in sophomore
enrollment than in freshman enrollment.

Detailed age enrollment information is presented on page 34. The District trend toward increased enrollment of students in the older age / itegories is clearly evident.

Ethnic enrollment information on page 35 shows that minority enrollment has increased since last Fall. Although Other White students have increased in number since last Fall, their percentage of total enrollment has decreased 1.7% in that period. Pierce has historically been notable in the large number of students reporting their ethnic status, a trend evident this Fall as well.

In the student data for Southwest College are presented on page 37. Southwhich produce the District-wide trend toward increased enrollment of day students, freshmen, and students aged 21 and over. Contrary to the District
trend, however, Couthwest experienced increased enrollment of male relative
for the lents and of full-time relative to part-time students. Actual
features in numbers of evening students, females, sophomores, and students
under 21 were also unusual.

Age enrollment information on page 38 also shows a somewhat unusual outcom. Southwest appears to exhibit the District-wide trend toward dramatic enrollment increases in older students only in 40 - 44, 55 - 59, and 65 and over age categories. Enrollment increases in other age groups were relatively moderate with the exception of declines in the number of students under 20 and of students 50 - 54.

Ethnic enrollment data on page 39 show continued gains in enrollment of Black/Neero students, who now comprise 96.0% of Southwest's total enrolment. The bigh percentage of students reporting their ethnic status in Fall 19.4 (1). It makes this trend appear reliable.

#### LOS ANGELES TRADE-TECHNICAL COLINGE

The control ment at Trade-Tech increased 26.2% this Fall. Although evening enrollment decreased slightly (0.3%), Trade-Tech continued to maintain the largest percentage of evening enrollment (55.9%) in the District.

Day or the outgrew 26.2% over last Fall.

Personale and female enrollment showed gains this Fall. Males comprise 71.2% of the Trade-Tech's enrollment--by far the largest percentage of any college in the District. Freshmen constituted 81.6% of Trade-Tech's enrollment and students aged 21 and over 82.4%, supporting the District-wide trend toward increased enrollments in these categories.

Detailed age information is presented on page 42. The table indicates that the greatest percentage increase in enrollment (35.2%) occurred in the 50-54 age group, while the only decrease (1.1%) was in the under 20 cate-zory.

The ethnic distribution of Trade-Tech's students is presented on page 43. Enrollment of Black/Negro students increased 2.5% and continued to comprise the largest percentage of total enrollment in Fall 1974 (42.0%). Spanish-Surnamed students accounted for 19.2% of the student body compared to 19.0% last Fall.

than day enrollment (8.7%). In fact, West's percentage of evening enrollment (47.5%) is exceeded only by Trade's.
