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**ABSTRACT**

This document is the fourth in a series of operations reports dealing with student enrollment data for the community college system in the state of Washington, and is intended to provide an accurate and current compilation of information concerning such enrollment. Data for the years 1962 through 1973 are included for historical comparison purposes with the academic year 1973-74. In 1973-74, 53% of the total student body were enrolled in academic programs, as compared to 67% in 1967-1968. In 1973-74, 45% were enrolled in occupational programs as compared to 28% in 1967-68. Statewide and institutional enrollment summaries are provided quarterly and annually, including FTE and head-count figures for academic, occupational, and community services programs. Steady growth is shown in all programs. Student characteristics, including age, sex, source, ethnic background, and program goals, are also presented. (ER)

WASHINGTON COMMUNITY COLLEGES**

Final Quarterly Enrollments, Academic Year 1973-74, is the fourth in a series of operations reports dealing exclusively with student-oriented enrollment data for the community college system in the State of Washington, and as in the case of the three earlier reports, is intended to provide an accurate and current compilation of information concerning such enrollment. Tables 1, 2, and 3 contain historical enrollment data which appeared in the earlier reports, with comparable data added for the current reporting period. Additional historical enrollment information can be found in tables 14 through 24.

Students enrolled only in courses classified as "community service" are defined to be "community service students" for headcount reporting purposes. In the same manner, students enrolled for at least one credit in courses classified as "academic" or "occupational" have been defined as "academic and occupational students."

Student demographic information (i.e., age, sex, etc.) collected during Fall Quarter, 1973, is summarized in tables 11 and 12. Please note that these data cover "academic and occupational students only" as defined above. Although only state-level summaries have been provided, data by institution is available and can be furnished upon request.

As in the past, a full-time-equivalent (FTE) student is derived from the total number of student credit hours generated by students in each category, divided by fifteen. The category (academic, occupational, or community service) is determined by the intent of the institution in offering the course. An annualized FTE student is derived by dividing the sum of the quarterly FTE's for all four quarters, by three.

The source of these data was the 1973-74 MIS-1 Summary Enrollment Report. The number of FTE students was also verified by the MIS-2 Course Effort Report. The enrollment statistics reported reflect "final" enrollment figures, defined to include net 8th day enrollment plus all subsequent registrations and adds.
