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**ABSTRACT**

The directory provides a comprehensive list of programs for training physician support personnel and reflects increasing interest in efforts to train new types of physician support personnel to perform tasks that significantly extend the services of physicians. The programs in this directory are arranged by State, city, and program title within the following categories: (1) Programs to train assistants to a Primary Care Physician only; (2) Programs to train assistants to a Physician practicing Specialty only; and (3) Programs to train assistants for a Primary Care and/or Specialty Physician. Each entry provides information on entrance requirements, length of program, when class begins, class capacity, credentials awarded, and sources of financial aid. (Author/BP)

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This directory is prepared jointly by the Department of Health Manpower in the American Medical Association (AMA), and the Bureau of Health Resources Development in the Health Resources Administration (HRA). It provides a comprehensive list of programs for training physician support personnel and reflects increasing interest in efforts to train new types of physician support personnel to perform tasks that significantly extend the services of physicians.

Variety is the keynote of educational programs training physician support personnel. This is illustrated by a sample of current program names: "Physician's Assistant," "Physician's Associate," "Clinical Associate," "MEDEX," "Child Health Associate," "Community Health Medic," and "Pediatric Assistant." Length of training varies from 12 months to five years. Educational settings include medical schools and medical centers, public and private hospitals, clinics, community colleges, colleges, and universities. Prerequisites for admission to the programs vary from high school graduation, to experience as a military corpsman, to possession of a baccalaureate degree. Credentials awarded include certificates and degrees--associate, baccalaureate, or higher. Examples of employment settings include physicians' offices, hospitals, and clinics. Job descriptions vary from general to highly specific; and the level of functioning ranges from purely technical to highly judgmental.

The AMA House of Delegates in December 1970 adopted the following working definition of the "Physician's Assistant": "A skillful person qualified by academic and practical on-the-job training to provide patient services under the supervision and direction of a licensed physician, who is responsible for the performance of that assistant." To further clarify this supervisory relationship, the House of Delegates adopted a report in June 1971 opposing use of the term "physician's associate" to designate this new occupation, since "associate" commonly implies another physician.

Standards or "essentials" for the education of several types of physician's assistants have been established by the AMA Council of Medical Education. In collaboration with the appropriate medical specialty groups, the Council on Medical Education approves educational programs for the Orthopedic Physician's Assistant, Urologic Physician's Assistant, and Assistant to the Primary Care Physician.

#### Certification

The National Board of Medical Examiners (supported by the Bureau of Health Resources Development), the AMA Educators in the physician's assistant field and practicing physician's assistants, have collaborated in a project to conduct national certification of the assistant to the primary care physicians, based on a proficiency examination. This examination was administered for the first time at approximately 60 test centers throughout the country on December 12, 1973.

An individual was eligible to register for the first administration of this examination if he had been graduated or would have been graduated by January 31, 1974 from:

- 1) A program that has been approved by the AMA Council on Medical Education for training assistants to the primary care physician.
- 2) A program that has received preliminary approval by the AMA Council on Medical Education for training assistants to the primary care physician.
- 3) A program that has been funded by the Bureau of Health Resources Development (not included in the above categories) that trains assistants to the primary care physician.
- 4) A program of at least four month's duration within a nationally accredited school of medicine or nursing that trains pediatric or family nurse practitioners.

After analysis of the first examination, eligibility for the certifying examination will be expanded in subsequent administrations to include candidates who have acquired relevant proficiency through work experience that has been documented by the State boards of medical examiners, or an appropriate State body, in accordance with nationally developed criteria.

#### Legal Status

The legal status of the "physician's assistant" has been defined by a number of State legislatures. As of June 30, 1973, a total of 33 States had enacted legislation establishing some type of legislative mechanism for physician's assistants (P.A.'s). An analysis of those State laws shows that two distinct types of statutory forms are used to grant legislative sanction to Physician's Assistants. One type of statutory form amends the State Medical Practice Act and permits P.A.'s to work under the supervision of physicians. This approach is referred to as the "general delegatory" statute. An example of such a statute appears in the laws of Connecticut:

"The provision of this Chapter (Medical Practice Act) shall not apply to...any person rendering service as a physician's trained assistant, a registered nurse, or a licensed practical nurse, if such service is rendered under the supervision, control and responsibility of a licensed physicians." 1/

Presently 6 States (Alaska, Arkansas, Colorado, Connecticut, Kansas, and Montana) have similarly worded "general delegatory" statutes.

The remaining 27 of the 33 State legislatures have enacted laws which authorize a specific organizational entity, usually the State Board of Medical Examiners, to establish rules and regulations with respect to PA's educational and employment qualifications and to approve employment of the PA by a specific physician, based on a proposed job description by the prospective employer. This type of law, referred to as the "regulatory authority" statute, has been enacted in Alabama, Arizona, California, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Iowa, Maine, Maryland, Michigan, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia and Wyoming.

Specific job descriptions, listing potential functions and responsibilities for personnel developed to assist the orthopedic surgeon, urologist, primary care physician, have been endorsed by the AMA Council on Health Manpower as developed by representatives of the following medical specialty organizations: American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons, American Urological Association, and (jointly) the American Society of Internal Medicine, American Academy of Family Physicians, American Academy of Pediatrics, and American College of Physicians. Essentials of an Approved Educational Program for Orthopedic Physician's Assistant, the Assistant to the Primary Care Physician, and the Urologic Physician's Assistant have been ratified by the AMA House of Delegates. Educational programs which meet or exceed the standards contained in these "essentials" will be granted AMA approval.

The Programs in this Directory are arranged by State and title within the following categories:

- I. Programs to train assistants to a Primary Care Physician only
- II. Programs to train assistants to a Physician practicing a Specialty only
- III. Programs to train assistants for a Primary Care and/or Specialty Physician(s)

In the list which follows, those programs approved by the AMA Council on Medical Education up to the present are so identified. It should be noted that additional physician support personnel programs are eligible for accreditation or are in process of being accredited by the AMA. Such programs will be identified in future issues of this publication.

For further details on any one of the programs listed in this Directory, it is advisable to contact the Program Director. Excluded from this list are programs designed primarily to train nurses for an extended role. Information on specific programs designed to expand the role of the nurse is available in a joint American Nurses Association/Bureau of Health Resources Development publication.
