**ABSTRACT**

This 19th annual college enrollment report published by the Kentucky Council on Public Higher Education includes statistical data from all accredited independent (private) and public institutions of higher education in Kentucky. A summary of statistical data indicated: (1) The 29 Kentucky public and private colleges and universities accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools enrolled 112,082 students for the fall 1974 term, an increase of 6,147 students from the fall 1973 term. (2) The public institutions reported a 7.0 percent increase, with 96,037 students enrolled for the 1974 term. (3) Among the private institutions, total enrollment declined by 159 students, or about 1 percent. (4) The public institutions reported a total of 150,370.8 units (each unit equals 10 contact hours of participation). (5) Although the number of all types of degrees conferred by the public and private institutions remained constant, 19,890 in 1973 and 19,893 in 1974, there were increases in four of the six degree-level categories. (6) Nonresident student enrollment at the state-supported institutions increased slightly from 13.6 percent in the fall 1973 term to 13.7 in the 1974 fall term. Additional findings and statistical data are included. (MJM)

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## FOREWORD

This 19th annual college enrollment report published by the Kentucky Council on Public Higher Education includes statistical data from all accredited independent (private) and public institutions of higher education in Kentucky.

The information presented for each institution includes actual headcount enrollment figures (full-time and part-time); numbers of student credit hours by student level and course level; numbers of students enrolled in associate, baccalaureate, professional, technical/semi-professional, and graduate programs; resident, non-resident and foreign student figures; continuing education unit totals; and numbers and types of degrees awarded.

Data in this report were compiled by Diara Clay, higher education specialist for the Council. The compilation of the data was made possible through the cooperation of the reporting institutions.

Figures within the report were checked and verified to insure that it will serve as an accurate source of information for those institutions, organizations, agencies and individuals who may use them.

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## INTRODUCTION

### Enrollment Trends

The 29 Kentucky public and private colleges and universities accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools enrolled 112,061 students for the 1974 fall term. This represents an actual headcount increase of 6,126 students or 6.0 percent over the 1973 fall term enrollment. Over the past 10 years, total enrollment at the institutions has increased by 79.0 percent.

A comparison of headcount enrollment figures for private institutions and for public institutions reveals a continuation of recent enrollment trends: overall declining enrollments in the private sector and increasing enrollments in the public sector. The public institutions reported a 7.0 percent increase with 96,037 students enrolled for the 1974 fall term. The 1973 enrollment was 89,731.

Among the private institutions, total enrollment declined by 179 students, or 1.1 percent. Total enrollment for the 1974 fall term was 16,025. In 1973, total enrollment at the private institutions was 16,204.

The eight public four-year institutions increased their total enrollment from 77,243 in 1973 to 82,365 in 1974, an increase of 6.6 percent. The largest increase was at the University of Louisville where enrollment was up 17.3 percent.

Total enrollment in the 13 community colleges of the University of Kentucky Community College system increased from 12,488 in 1973 to 13,672 in 1974, an increase of 9.5 percent.

### Student Credit Hour Report

This report contains for the first time data collected by the Council on the numbers of student credit hours generated by each institution. Credit hours by student classification and course level are listed.

Appendix A, a copy of the instructions and forms used to complete the enrollment questionnaires, explains how this data was compiled and, in precise terms, what it represents.

#### Continuing Education Units

Each institution was asked to report the number of institutional continuing education units --- each unit being defined as 10 contact hours of participation in an organized continuing education adult or extension experience under responsible sponsorship, capable direction, and qualified instruction --- it had awarded during the past academic year.

The public institutions reported a total of 150,370.8 units, and four private colleges reported 1,597.9 of the 10-hour units. The most units within a general speciality area were reported by the University of Kentucky which awarded 86,595 units in agricultural extension.

#### Degrees Awarded

Although the number of all types of degrees conferred by the public and private institutions remained constant, 19,890 in 1973 and 19,893 in 1974, there were increases in four of the six degree-level categories. The most significant increase was in first professional degrees (those in law, dentistry and medicine). In 1973, 675 first professional degrees were conferred. In 1974, 823 were conferred, a 22.0 percent increase.

#### Non-resident Enrollment

Non-resident student enrollment at the state-supported institutions increased slightly from 13.4 percent in the 1973 fall term to 13.7 percent in the 1974 fall term. At the four-year public institutions, 15.6 percent of the 1974 fall enrollment was non-resident. In the University of Kentucky Community College System,

1.8 percent of the 1974 fall enrollment was non-resident. Total non-resident figures at the state institutions were 13,110 for 1974 and 12,223 for 1973.

#### Student Classification

Kentucky's public and private colleges and universities undergraduate enrollment decreased slightly from 1973 to 1974. The 1974 fall term enrollment (full-time and part-time) was 89,405, 181 fewer than the 1973 figure. Full-time and part-time graduate level enrollment (including residents, interms and professional program students) was 22,656 for the 1974 fall term. Comparison of the 1974 graduate level figures with previous years is not possible because of changes in data classification.

#### Reporting Forms

This enrollment report is substantially changed from previous reports. An attempt was made to include additional and more detailed information. No calculations of full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollment are included in this report, but student credit hour information, which is the basis for those calculations, is given.

The final section of this report is a copy of the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS) form that each institution was asked to complete. This form shows the enrollment in various degree programs by categories. Some private or independent institutions were unable to complete this form. It is, therefore, included for information purposes.

## INSTRUCTIONS AND DEFINITIONS

### General

1. Enrollment data included in this report is to be the enrollment as of the last day of the Semester Term on which regular students may register for credit. This report includes students enrolled for credit in courses which meet for an entire semester as well as students in courses which compute credits on a basis comparable to standards regularly used in the computation of semester credit hours. Enrollment in correspondence courses and workshops is not to be included.
2. Enrollment in non-credit courses should be reported as continuing education units.
3. Changes incorporated in current forms are designed to collect enrollment data by degree programs. This change should be noted by persons preparing the forms.

### Definitions

#### Level by Student Classification

Lower Division - Students classified by the Registrar as Freshmen or Sophomores

Upper Division - Students classified by the Registrar as Juniors or Seniors

Master's Level - Students admitted to graduate program with an awarded bachelor's degree. Persons with bachelor's degree not taking graduate courses shall be counted as seniors (upper division).

Doctoral Coursework - Students admitted to graduate program with an awarded master's degree or in a doctoral program and having completed twenty-four credit hours of graduate work.

Post-Doctoral Students - Students engaged in specific form of education having already been awarded the doctoral or terminal degree in the discipline.

First-Professional Students (HEGIS) - Law, medicine, dentistry, theology, other (see HEGIS Form 2300-2.3)

Technical/Semi-Professional Students (CPHE) - Students enrolled in programs of less than four years which are designed to train graduates for employment in specific fields.

Level by Course Number

Lower Division - Student credit hours produced or enrollments in those courses assigned to the lower division of baccalaureate curricula (100 or 200 level in most instances)

Upper Division - Student credit hours produced or enrollments in those courses assigned to the upper division of baccalaureate curricula which is defined as those courses between lower division and graduate division (300 to 500 level in most instances)

Master's Level - Student credit hours produced or enrollments in those courses primarily offered as part of the master's program (e.g., 600 level courses)

Doctoral Level - Student credit hours produced or enrollments in those courses primarily offered for doctoral coursework (e.g., 700 level courses)

First-Professional - Student credit hours produced or enrollments in professional courses (e.g., 800 to 900 level courses)

Technical/Semi-Professional - Student credit hours in courses which develop specific technical and/or occupational skills.

A "full-time" student is an undergraduate student enrolled for at least twelve credit hours or a graduate student enrolled for at least nine credit hours during the fall semester, or any student enrolled for at least six credit hours during the summer term.

A "part-time" student is any student enrolled for fewer credit hours than the minimum requirement for a full-time student.

## Form A - Student Credit Hour Report

This form requires that student credit hours be computed both on a student classification basis and a course level basis. The difference between the two approaches can best be explained by using illustrations.

Example 1: A sophomore in a baccalaureate program taking a 200 level English course (three hours) and a 300 level history course (three hours) would generate six lower division credit hours based on the student classification approach. This same student would produce three lower division credit hours (English) and three upper division credit hours (history) using the course level basis.

Example 2: A first-year student enrolled in a technical/semi-professional program (accounting technology) taking freshman composition (three hours) and applications of accounting (three hours) would account for six technical/semi-professional credit hours using the student classification basis. This student's enrollment in a technical/semi-professional program dictates that all his hours be classified as technical/semi-professional.

This same student would produce three lower division hours (composition) and three technical/semi-professional credit hours (applications of accounting) using the course level approach.

Example 3: Based on the student classification approach, a student admitted to graduate school who has completed twenty hours of coursework would generate six master's credit hours by taking Education 600 and Education 720. This same student would account for three master's hours and three doctoral credit hours using the course level approach.

Form A should be completed based on each individual college (business, education, law, etc.) within your institution. A student taking business administration (three hours) and human growth and development (three hours) would generate three credit hours for the College of Business and three credit hours for the College of Education.

## Form B - Headcount Report

### I. Total Headcount Enrollment.

This table is the same as "total unduplicated headcount enrollment" (Form A, Section III) on the old reporting form, and the same procedures and definitions should be used when completing this table. All students enrolled for credit, except correspondence and workshops, should be included under the appropriate classifications. First- and second-year

technical/semi-professional students should be entered as freshmen and sophomores respectively.

The intern-resident category is reserved for interns and residents in medicine and dentistry.

## II. Headcount Enrollment by Degree Levels.

This table is designed to present the same headcount enrollment as the preceding tabulation with the exception that students are classified according to declared degree programs. Freshmen and sophomores from Table I must be assigned to either the associate category (programs of less than four years) or the bachelor's category based on their presently declared degree plans. The same procedure should be followed for graduate students by assigning them to either master's, specialists, doctorate, or post-doctorate programs.

Institutions awarding associate degrees for pre-baccalaureate studies (college transfer) or liberal arts as well as technical/semi-professional preparation should report associate degree enrollment in two categories. Category 1 under associate degrees is to be used to report technical/semi-professional students, and Category 2 used for pre-baccalaureate and liberal studies students.

## III. Residency Status of Students.

Using the same student classification as Table 1, students should be further classified as residents, non-residents, or foreign (residency outside the United States) according to their status for fee assessment purposes.
