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ABSTRACT

Population characteristics of rural youth (persons under 25 years of age) living in the rural areas of the four national regions of North Central, Northeast, West, and South are presented. Emphasis is placed on describing the racial and ethnic variations shown by the target population; focus is on the regional distribution of ethnic minority groups: blacks, American Indians, and youth of Spanish heritage. Data were collected from various 1970 U.S. Census of Population final reports. This report is organized into six basic sections--five sections contain the analytical text and one presents detailed tabular data by regions. The analytical text discusses: (1) the youth of the nation, (2) the rural population under 25 by region, (3) regional comparisons, (4) the regional distribution of rural ethnic minority youth, and (5) findings, a brief summary. Tabular data provide figures on the total and rural populations under 25 in the U.S., organized by race or ethnic groups, sex, age subgroups, and regions. Definitions of technical terms used are provided in the appendix. (NQ)

PREFACE

This report has been prepared in response to the needs expressed by interested persons in various states of the nation. One major concern guiding the effort was that the rural population of ages appropriate for educational purposes was not well known, and that the characteristics of these rural youth in terms of demographic patterns were considerably less than clear.

The present report is the final summary in a series which includes a bulletin on rural youth in the South, and another on the rural youth of the Southwest.⁺ Its preparation was supported by the Prairie View Agricultural Experiment Station at Prairie View University under Project G-1968, "Change in the Nature, Composition and Socio-Economic Conditions of Black Families," under the leadership of Dr. William P. Kuvlesky.

The publication of this report is one facet of the cooperative effort undertaken by The Prairie View A&M and the Texas A&M Agricultural Experiment Stations to meet the needs of the state, the various regions of the nation, and the United States as a whole.

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INTRODUCTION

Knowledge of the population characteristics of rural youth in the nation and its various regions is necessarily required in order to locate these persons and deal with the issues related to their education, migration, employment, voting behavior and general life style. One essential step in the direction of attaining such knowledge is the compilation of available information from the various sources containing it, such as the census reports prepared for the states and regions.

This report represents an effort to bring together such scattered information regarding rural youth in the United States, and to offer a packet of data ready for the use of potential consumers: educators, researchers, policy makers and others.

OBJECTIVE, CONTENT AND ORGANIZATION

The principal objective of this report is to present selected data on certain population characteristics of persons under 25 years of age living in the rural areas of four national regions: North Central, North East, West and South (See Appendix for definition of rurality). For the purpose of the report, these persons will be referred to as the "rural youth" of these regions. Among these youth, some were born during the decade of relatively high birth rates which followed the end of World War II, and others may reflect more recent changes in the characteristics of the national population. In exploring the basic demographic characteristics of rural youth in the United States, a major emphasis is made on describing the racial and ethnic variations shown by the target population. Attention is directly focused on the regional distribution of ethnic minority groups: Blacks, Native Americans and youth of Spanish Heritage.

The data presented here deal specifically with the distribution of rural youth by region, the various age groups by sex, and their racial or ethnic composition. Some specific information is provided regarding inter-regional comparisons.[†]

The report is organized into six basic sections. The first five of these contain the analytical text, and the sixth section presents detailed tables of information by regions. The textual sections concern themselves with (a) a brief treatment of the youth of the nation, (b) the

rural population under 25, by regions, (c) regional comparisons, (d) the regional distribution of rural ethnic minority youth, and (e) a brief summary of findings. This tabular section comprises the detailed data packet which is fundamental to the objective of the report.

An appendix provides the definitions of technical terms used throughout the report.

I. THE YOUTH OF THE NATION

This section presents general information regarding the population under 25 years of age in the United States. For the purposes of this report, the term "United States" refers to the 50 states and the District of Columbia, excluding Puerto Rico and the outlying areas (See Appendix for definition). The population characteristics presented here include age and sex distributions, and proportions by racial and ethnic groups. Such information serves as a ground for perspective to describe some basic demographic features of the rural sector of the national population under 25.

A. National Youth

There are more than 93 million persons under 25 years of age in the United States, representing over 45 percent of the entire population of the nation. The sex ratio for this portion of the national population is 101.6 males for each hundred females (See Appendix for definition). Almost two thirds of these youth are included in the age sub-groups under 15 years of age. More specific subdivisions by age have been compiled and presented here in Tables A1 and A2.

The proportion of persons categorized as White among the youth of the nation is over 85 percent. Black youth make up 13 percent, which comprises more than 12 million persons. There are, in addition, over 5.3 million persons classified in the Spanish Heritage sector of the youth of the nation; and less than a half million are reported as Native Americans (See Appendix for definitions). Tables A1 and A3

present detailed information regarding the proportions of each of these ethnic or racial groups which make up the various age subgroups among national youth. Also, the proportions by sex are presented.

Over half of the total population of Black persons in the United States are under 25 years of age. The corresponding proportion for the White population is slightly less than 45 percent. For the Spanish Heritage and Native American groups, the proportions are 57.6 and 57.7 percent respectively. In general, the proportion of persons under 25 within each of these racial or ethnic groups tends to be higher for the national minorities than for the White population (See Table 1).

B. Rural Youth

The rural population of the United States comprises over 53.8 million persons, or a fourth of the total number of Americans (See Appendix for definition of rurality). Almost one half of the entire rural population is composed of persons of 25 years of age or less. Rural youth represent 46.4 percent of all rural persons and a number of 25 million Americans. The overall sex ratio for this sector of the rural population is 100.3 males for each hundred females.

Almost two thirds of all rural youth are included in the age subgroups under 15. Approximately one of each seven among these youth is classified in the "20 to 24" age subgroup. More specific subdivisions and proportions are presented in Tables B1 and B2.

The proportion of all rural youth classified in the racial category of "White" is 89.0 percent: 22.2 million persons in a total of 25.0 million. One of each ten rural youth in America is classified as "Black" (9.5 percent of the total). Spanish Heritage and Native American youth represent a minor proportion of all rural youth, as shown in Table B3.

In terms of the proportions of each racial or ethnic group which are represented by rural youth under 25, the following information is offered: rural White youth represent less than a half of the total rural White population (45.4 percent); rural Black persons under 25 make up over 56 percent of all rural Black persons; rural youth of Spanish Heritage comprise 59.6 percent of the total rural Spanish Heritage population; and the proportion of all rural Native Americans classified as "under 25" is slightly over three fifths, or 60.1 percent. Table 2 presents the numerical data on which these comparisons are based.

II. GENERAL CHARACTERISTICS OF RURAL YOUTH FOR REGIONS

The following information presents some of the essential demographic characteristics of the rural population under 25 years of age in the United States according to their regional patterns. For the purposes of this report, the term "region" refers to geographical categories which group the states of the nation into four major areas: "Northeast," "North Central," "South," and "West." The specific states included in each of these regions correspond to those determined by the U.S. Bureau of the Census (See Appendix for definitions). The population characteristics discussed here include numeric distributions and proportions by ethnic or racial groups, and proportions of the total population as well as of the rural population represented by rural youth within the given regions.

A. North Central

There are over 7.4 million rural youth in the North Central States as a region. These persons represent almost a third of all youth under 25 and slightly less than 46.0 percent of the entire rural population in the area. Similar proportions within each of the racial or ethnic groups in the North Central region are displayed in Table 3.

An estimated 98.5 percent of all rural youth are classified in the "White" category, whereas Blacks represent less than 1.0 percent of the total, and youth of Spanish or Native American heritage

represent 1.0 percent of the total rural population under 25. (See Table 4.) For detailed information regarding the distribution of these rural youth by age subgroups and sex, see Tables B4 and B5.

B. North East

The number of rural youth in this area is less than 4.5 million, which represents a fifth of all north eastern youth and slightly less than half of the total rural population. (See Table 3.) Over 98.0 percent of these persons are classified as white, and less than a half of one percent as Black. The proportion of Spanish Heritage youth is 1.5 percent, and that of Native Americans is 0.14 percent. For detailed information regarding the distribution of these rural youth by age subgroups and sex, see Tables B6 and B7.

C. South

There are almost 10.5 million rural youth in the South, representing over a third of all southern youth under 25 and 46.8 percent of the total rural population in the area.^{1/} (See Table 3.) Slightly less than four fifths of all southern rural youth are classified as White, whereas Blacks make up 21.5 percent of this sector of the Southern population.

The proportions of rural youth classified as "Spanish Heritage" and "Native Americans" in the area are 2.5 and 0.6 respectively. (See Table 4.) For detailed information regarding the distribution of these rural youth by age subgroups and sex, see Tables B8 and B9.

D. West

Rural youth under 25 in the Western region number about 2.8 million, a figure representing less than a fifth of all western youth and 47.0 percent of the rural population in the area.^{2/} (See Table 3.)

Nine of each ten rural western youth are classified as White. Over 12.0 percent of these youth have been grouped into the Spanish Heritage category, whereas those characterized as Blacks make up 1.0 percent of the total. Native Americans compose over 5 percent of all rural western youth. (See Table 4.)

For detailed information regarding the distribution of these rural youth by age subgroups and sex, see Tables B10 and B11.

III. RURAL YOUTH: REGIONAL COMPARISONS

The demographic characteristics of rural youth under 25 in the United States already presented in this report offer a limited ground for comparability in terms of regional patterns. This section attempts to synthesize some general comparisons among the regions on the basis of racial or ethnic distribution patterns, and numeric proportions.

A. Numeric Distribution and Proportions

In the United States there are over 25 million rural youth under 25 years of age, representing a fourth of all youth and 46.4 percent of the total rural population. (See Tables 3 and 4). The proportion of rural youth residing in the North Central region is almost a third of the United States total. One of each ten of these persons resides in the West, and less than a fifth of the total are located in the Northeastern states. When grouped together, the Northeast, the North Central and the West include less than 60.0 percent of all rural persons under 25, or about 14.6 million people. The rest of the total comprises over 10 million persons, all living in the South and representing 41.6 percent of all rural youth in the nation. (See Table 5).

Nine of each ten rural youth in the United States are classified as White. This proportion shows variation by regions: in the Northeastern and North Central areas the proportion reaches over 98.0 percent of all rural youth; in the West it is 90.9 percent; for the South, the proportion is less than four fifths, or 77.8 percent. In the South, one of each five rural youth is classified as Black, and this proportion is considerably lower for the other regions studied here.

The proportion of rural youth in the nation classified as Black is almost a tenth of the total.

Rural youth of Spanish Heritage in the United States represents 2.9 percent of the total, and include over 727,000 persons. For the West, the percentage rises to 12.4 percent; becoming considerably lower in the other regions.

Around 1.0 percent of all rural youth in the nation are classified in the Native American category. This proportion varies by specific regions, reaching a high level of 5.2 percent in the West, and a low level of 0.14 percent in the Northeast. (See Table 4).

B. Comparisons within Racial or Ethnic Groups

In general, rural youth in the United States are numerically concentrated in two regions, the South and the Central North, with substantial proportions in the other regions. This general pattern shows variation in terms of specific racial or ethnic groups.

The regional distribution of rural White youth, follows a pattern which is similar to that of the total. Almost a third of the rural White segment is located in the Central North, and 36.4 percent reside in the South. A fifth of these persons reside in the Northeast and a tenth in the West.

In observing the distribution of the total rural Black population under 25, a different pattern is discernible. By and large, rural Black youth are concentrated in the South: 95.3 percent of them reside in this region, whereas only 2.7 percent are located in the Central North, 1.2 percent in the West, and less than 1.0 percent reside in the Northeastern states.

Rural youth of Spanish Heritage tend to be located in the West and in the South.^{3/} Almost a half of the total rural Spanish Heritage population under 25 reside in the Western states. For the South, the porportion is 35.2 percent. Less than a tenth of the total reside in the Northeast and 7.8 percent reside in the Central North.

The Western states serve as the region of residence for more than 57.0 percent of all rural Native American youth. Some substantial segments of this group are found in the Central North (17.2 percent) and in the South (23.3 percent). A minor proportion is located in the Northeastern area (2.5 percent).

The specific figures from which these comparisons are estimated are shown in Table 5.

IV. THE REGIONAL DISTRIBUTION OF RURAL ETHNIC MINORITY YOUTH

A substantial proportion of the rural population of the United States is composed of the younger sectors of the ethnic minority groups. The following data bring to focus some aspects of the regional distribution of these youth.

A. Rural Black Youth

There are over 2.34 million rural Black youth in the United States, representing a tenth of all rural youth, almost 20 percent of all Black youth, and well over half of the total rural Black population.

By and large, rural Black youth reside in Southern locations. Over 95 percent of them (2.24 million persons) identify places in the Southern states as their place of residence. In the Central North and in the West there are roughly 63,000 and 28,000 rural Blacks under 25, respectively. There are less than 20,000 rural Black youth in the Northeastern states. In all of the four national regions, however, Black youth represent over half of the corresponding total rural Black population.

In the South, slightly over a third of all Black youth reside in rural locations. The corresponding figure for the other regions is, in comparison, much lower (See Table 3).

B. Rural Native American Youth

Of the entire Native American population, a third are youth residing in the rural areas of the nation. There are over 250,000 of these rural youth, representing 60 percent of all rural Native Americans and 57.7 percent of all Native Americans under 25 years of age.

This sector of the rural people of the United States are concentrated in the Western and Southern states, and a significant porportion reside in the Central North. The figures are 57.0 percent, 23.3 percent and 17.1 percent of the total for the nation, respectively. The remaining proportion corresponds to the North East (See Table 5).

In the West, Native Americans represent 5 percent of all rural youth. The porportion is relatively lower for the other regions of the nation (See Table 4). Within each of the regions, excepting the North East, rural Native Americans under 25 represent over half of the total

youth and about two-thirds of the corresponding total population of Native Americans (See Table 3).

C. Rural Spanish Heritage Youth

Youth of Spanish Heritage represent over 9 million rural Americans under 25 years of age. These rural youth, comprising almost two-thirds of the total rural Spanish Heritage population, also represent 13.6 percent of the total youth in this ethnic minority group.

The West is the residence area for slightly less than two-thirds of the total rural Spanish Heritage youth. Almost a fourth of the total reside in the South, a region including Texas, which shows a rural Spanish Heritage youth population of over 200,000.* About 43,600 of these youth reside in the Central North, and 6,300 in the Northeastern states (See Table 5). In the West, at least one of each ten rural youth is of Spanish Heritage. This proportion is much lower for the other national regions. However, in each of these national divisions, the proportion of youth under 25 is about two-thirds of the corresponding rural Spanish Heritage population (See Table 3).

V. SUMMARY

It has been reported here that rural youth under 25 years of age are an important component of the youth of the United States, and represent almost a half of all persons residing in the rural areas of the nation. Most of these youth are categorized as White, but the proportion of each ethnic or racial group which enters into the compo-

sition of rural youth varies considerably from one region to another. Also, some information is presented regarding the proportions of each group which are characterized as rural youth, by sex, age subgroups and regional variations.

The distribution of rural White youth by regions follows a pattern similar to that of the national aggregate. Rural Black youth are numerically concentrated in the South; rural youth of Spanish Heritage are found in higher proportions in the West and the South; rural youth characterized as Native Americans are, by and large, centered in Western locations, with a substantial proportion residing in the South.

An attempt is made to integrate available demographic information regarding the general distribution of rural youth by sex, age subgroups, regions, and ethnic or racial groups into tabular data amenable to a variety of uses.

**VI. THE POPULATION UNDER 25 YEARS OF AGE,
TOTAL AND RURAL: TABULAR DATA.**

The following tables present the information on which reported findings are based. They provide detailed figures on the total and the rural populations under 25 in the United States, organized by race or ethnic groups, sex, age subgroups, and regions.

- A. The first set of tables offers data on some general demographic characteristics of the total population under 25 in the United States. See Tables A-1, A-2, A-3 for the national aggregate; and Tables A-4 to A-11 for regional data.

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VIII. APPENDIX

Glossary of Definitions

Throughout the text certain key terms have been employed with consistent technical definitions, generally those used by the United States Bureau of the Census. Definitions are found in the relevant Census Reports as part of the appended textual notes. Quotations included below are from the 1970 Census of Population, Final Report PC(1)-C1, "General Social and Economic Characteristics," pp. App. 1 - App. 8.[†]

RACE. (See also Spanish Heritage) As used in census statistics the word race "does not denote clear-cut scientific definitions of biological stock. Rather it reflects self-identification by respondents." The "White," and also others who wrote in such answers as Mexican, Puerto Rican, or responses suggesting Indo-European stock.

The "Black" category used here corresponds to the Census definition of "Negro," which comprises persons who checked the standard response "Negro or Black," and also persons with write-in designations of Jamaican, Haitian, Afro-American, etc.

The category "Native American" corresponds to the definition given by the Bureau of the Census of "Indian" persons. It includes "persons who indicated their race as American Indian or who did not indicate a specific category but reported the name of an Indian tribe."^{††}

REGIONS. The United States, as defined by the sources used throughout this report, include the 48 continental states, the District of Columbia, Alaska and Hawaii, excluding Puerto Rico and other outlying areas. The regional divisions presented in this report correspond to those used by the Census Bureau in collecting and analyzing data for the 1970 U.S. Census of Population.^{†††} These divisions group the 50 states and the District of Columbia in the following pattern:

RURAL RESIDENCE. (See also Urban Residence.) All persons living outside of areas classified as "urban" are considered to be "rural" residents. There is no substantive definition of rural, but the category includes those who live in recognized places and towns under 2,500 in population, as well as those who live in the open country.

The "rural farm" population is that portion of the rural population which had its residence on a farm of 10 acres or more with sales of \$50.00 or more in 1969, or on places under 10 acres when sales were \$250.00 or more in 1969. The remainder of the rural population is designated as "nonfarm."

SEX RATIO. The sex ratio is an index of the relative balance between the numbers of males and females in the population or age group. It is computed by dividing the male population number by the number of females and multiplying the result by 100. This ratio indicates the number of males for each 100 females in the population or age group.

SPANISH HERITAGE. In Arizona, California, Colorado, New Mexico and Texas the Spanish heritage population includes (a) persons of "Spanish language." (That is, persons of Spanish "mother tongue" -- the language spoken in the home when respondent was a child -- and all other persons in the families in which the head of household or the spouse of the head reported Spanish as his or her mother tongue), and (b) all persons who had Spanish surnames but who did not meet the Spanish language criterion. The United States total figures for the Spanish heritage category include persons from every state, but the definition of "Spanish heritage" varies: (1) in the Southwest (5 states) it is defined as stated above; (2) in New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania the Spanish heritage group consists of persons of Puerto Rican birth or parentage instead of either Spanish language or Spanish surname; while (3) in the other 42 states and the District of Columbia the Spanish heritage group includes only the persons of "Spanish language."

URBAN RESIDENCE. (See also Rural Residence.) The basic division of population into rural and urban residence categories is accomplished by defining the urban zones. In the 1970 census "the urban population comprises all persons living in urbanized areas and in places of 2,500 inhabitants or more outside urbanized areas. More specifically, the urban population consists of all persons living in (a) places of 2,500 inhabitants or more incorporated as cities, villages, boroughs (except Alaska), and town (except in the New England States, New York, and Wisconsin), but excluding those persons living in the rural portion of extended cities; (b) unincorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more; and (c) other territory, incorporated or unincorporated, included in urbanized areas. The population not classified as urban constitutes the rural population."
