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ABSTRACT

Information in the report is taken from FY 1973 annual vocational education reports submitted by States and major cities and from the 1970 census report. The material indicates the proportion of the States' population served by vocational education in the major cities and the expenditures that were made for vocational education. The total vocational enrollment for the State and city is reported with a breakdown by educational level and number of disadvantaged and handicapped enrollees. The expenditures for vocational education are reported by Federal and State/local sources, by total amount allocated to each level of education, and by total amount allocated to the disadvantaged and the handicapped. For States having more than one major city, a total is compiled with a percentage for the total indicated. Information on 56 major cities in 31 States is included. The cities range in population from (Charlotte) 211,178 to (Chicago) 3,366,957. No data is reported from New York City, Buffalo, Rochester, and Richmond. Information indicates that the major cities generally provide a reasonable proportion of their States' vocational education and as a whole have about the same share of the national enrollments as the population.

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FOREWORD

The information presented in this report, the fourth in the "Vocational Education Information" series, is taken from FY 1973 annual vocational education reports submitted by the States and the major cities. Population data are taken from the 1970 Census Report.

The purpose of the material is to give some indication as to the States' population served by vocational education in the major cities and the expenditures that were made for vocational education. The total vocational enrollment for the State and city is reported with a breakdown by level of education and the number of enrollees who are disadvantaged and handicapped. The expenditures for vocational education are reported by Federal and State/local sources, by the total amount of expenditures allocated to each level of education, and by the total amount allocated to the disadvantaged and the handicapped. For States having more than one major city, a total is compiled with a percentage for the total indicated. Due to rounding, the percentage for the State does not always equal the sum of the city percentages. Information on 56 major cities in 31 States is included and range in population from (Charlotte) 211,178 to (Chicago) 3,366,957. Reports were not received for 4 of the 60 biggest cities, as identified by the Census: New York City, Buffalo, Rochester, and Richmond (less than 250,000 population). For a few cities the data are incomplete and are so indicated on the tables.

Caution must be used in making comparisons of cities from one State to another, particularly as they relate to expenditure data. Because of the variations in administrative policies and procedures as related to State aid, priorities, allocations for construction, size of programs, intensity of programs, and funds used for matching, expenditures per unit may vary widely between States.

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SUMMARY

Information presented in the series of tables indicates that the major cities within the States generally provide a reasonable proportion of their States' vocational education and as a whole have about the same share of the national enrollments as the population. In the following is shown the relative amount of vocational education effort in major cities expressed as a percentage of the U.S. total. FY 1971 and 1972 are included for comparison. The rather large percentage decrease in vocational education enrollment in 1973 occurred mainly from a change in reporting procedures in Chicago.

Table 1 - Vocational Education Enrollment Related to Population, FY 1973

The major cities are making a sizable effort in meeting the States' need for vocational education. The proportion of the States' enrollment in major cities was slightly less than the proportion of the States' population, as revealed by the total of all cities of 15.3 percent of the enrollment compared to 16.8 percent of the population. This compares with 21.0 percent and 16.5 percent respectively in FY 1972.

Of the 56 cities reporting, 24 had a higher percentage of their States' enrollment than of their population with the following cities

having an enrollment percentage which exceeds their population percentage by over 5 points: Honolulu (32.8), Phoenix (22.6), Portland (10.9), Miami (10.2), Denver (9.8).

Looking at the enrollment as a percent of the population, it is noted that the major cities in total serve 5.4 percent of their population as compared with the national enrollment of 5.9 percent of the total U.S. population. Twenty-three cities enroll a higher percentage of their city populations than the States do of their populations. Cities exceeding their State's percentage enrollment by more than 5 points are: Miami (21.6), Tampa (10.5), Toledo (6.6), Dayton (6.6), Phoenix (5.2).

Table 2 - Amount and Percentage of States' Vocational Education Expenditures in Major Cities, by Source

Comparing expenditures with enrollment, it is indicated that 37 cities had a lower percentage of their State's total vocational education expenditures than the percentage of their State's enrollment. The total expenditures of all cities were 2.9 percentage points less than the enrollment of all cities. In Baltimore and Los Angeles the percentage of expenditures exceeded enrollment by 8.9 and 5.2 percentage points respectively, while in the following cities the percentage of expenditures was over 5 points less than their enrollment percentages: Phoenix (26.0), Denver (18.0), Dallas (6.5), Honolulu (6.2), Boston (5.4), Memphis (5.3), Detroit (5.2), Toledo (5.0). A review of Federal expenditures shows that 39 cities also received less Federal funds than their percentage of enrollment.

A comparison of Federal with State and local expenditures shows that 35 cities had a higher percentage of State and local effort than of Federal funding.

Table 3 - Secondary Vocational Education Enrollment Relates to Expenditures

The total secondary expenditures in major cities was 0.9 percentage points less than the secondary enrollment. Twenty-five cities expended a lesser percentage of their State's secondary funds than their percentage of secondary enrollment.

Even though there was a wide variation in expenditures among major cities within a State, the data generally indicate more efficient programs in major cities. Twenty-nine cities had a smaller expenditure per secondary enrollee than the State figure and the average of all cities was \$19 less than the national average of \$271 per enrollee.

In comparing secondary enrollment with total enrollment in Table 1 we find 17 cities had a higher percentage of their State's secondary enrollment than their percentage of the State's total enrollment.

Table 4 - Postsecondary Vocational Education Enrollment Related to Expenditures

A comparison of postsecondary enrollments with total enrollment shows that the major cities in total had 7.5 percentage points more of the U.S. total postsecondary enrollment than of the total enrollment. Similarly, 25 cities exceeded their State's total enrollment percentage in Table 1. It is evident that in many States the major cities provide a large share of the postsecondary programs. For example, the following cities had over 10 points higher percentage of postsecondary than their total enrollment: Chicago, New Orleans, Kansas City, Albuquerque, Portland, and Milwaukee. In the States of Arizona, California, Florida, Hawaii, Illinois, Louisiana, Missouri, New Mexico, Oregon, Tennessee, Texas, and Wisconsin the cities account for more than 25 percent of their State's postsecondary enrollment.

The table shows that 41 cities expended a lesser percentage of their State's postsecondary expenditures than their enrollment percentage and for all cities the percentage expenditure was 14.7 compared to 22.8 for enrollment.

Expenditures per postsecondary enrollee in all cities was \$405 as compared to \$624 for all U.S. postsecondary enrollment. By city the expenditure data varies widely and apparently is not entirely complete. Thirty-six cities expended less per enrollee than did their State.

Table 5 - Adult Vocational Education Enrollment Related to Expenditures

Comparing adult enrollment with total enrollment in Table 1, we find that the major cities provide a large portion of the States' adult enrollment. In fact, 34 cities had a higher percentage of their State's adult than their total enrollment and the total of all cities (19.1 percent) exceeded by 3.8 percentage points the U.S. total enrollment figure (15.3 percent). Denver, Honolulu, and Albuquerque had over 50 percent of their State's adult enrollment, with the cities in Arizona, California, Florida, Illinois, Minnesota, Tennessee, and Texas having over 25 percent of their State's enrollment.

The table shows that 26 cities expended a lesser percentage of their State's adult expenditures than their enrollment percentage and for all cities the percentage expenditure was 19.9 compared to 19.1 for enrollment.

Expenditures per adult enrollee in all cities was \$59 as compared to \$56 for all U.S. adult enrollment and 30 cities expended less per enrollee than did their State.

Table 6 - Vocational Education Enrollment of Disadvantaged Related to Expenditures

Comparing disadvantaged enrollment with total enrollment, we note that the major cities had a larger portion of their State's disadvantaged than their State's total enrollment by 9.3 percentage points. Forty of the 56 cities reporting had a higher percentage of their State's disadvantaged than of their State's total enrollment.

The table reveals that 29 cities had a lesser percentage of the State's expenditures for disadvantaged than of the State's disadvantaged enrollment, with all cities combined being 7.0 percentage points less.

There is evident a wide variation in expenditures per enrollee due to a number of factors which must be carefully evaluated.

Table 7 - Vocational Education Enrollment of Handicapped Related to Expenditures

The table indicates that the major cities had a slightly higher proportion of the State's handicapped than their State's total enrollment. Nineteen cities had a higher percentage of their State's handicapped than their State's total enrollment.

Programs for the handicapped were operated with a smaller proportion of the expenditures. While the cities had 16.0 percent of the total handicapped enrollment, they used only 13.0 percent of the total expenditures.

Table 8 - Number and Percentage of States' Vocational Education Teachers in Major Cities and Relationship to Enrollment

Comparing teachers with enrollment, 17 of the 54 cities reporting had a lower percentage of their State's teachers than they did of their State's enrollment. The total number of teachers in the 54 cities represents 16.7 percent of all U.S. teachers compared to their enrollment which is 15.7 percent of the U.S. total.

Even though enrollment per teacher varies widely among States and cities in States, due to intensity of programs and the number of part-time teachers, the overall average is slightly less in major cities than in other areas. While the average enrollment for total U.S. vocational teachers was 49.6, the city average was 46.5. Similarly, of the 30 States with major cities the average for cities was less than the respective State averages in 20 States.

Table 9 - Number and Percentage of States' Total Program Completions and Placements in Major Cities

The major cities reports indicate that program completions as a percent of their State's total are fairly consistent with their total enrollment. Twenty cities of the 38 reporting had a higher percentage of their State's completions than of their State's enrollment.

The number of placements in full-time employment in the field trained or related, as indicated by the percentages of their State's total, with few exceptions compares quite favorably with the number of completions. Twenty cities had a higher percentage of placements than completions.

Table 10 - Cities Ranked on Selected Items, Vocational Education

This table summarizes city data, included in the previous tables, in rank order. Using the rank of the city population (1-56) as the base, the rank in vocational education data may be compared and there is revealed the variations in emphasis given to vocational education.

Generally cities deviate from their population less in enrollment and teachers than in expenditures and completions. Because certain data are not reported for some cities, the ranking is distorted by giving a higher rank than normal particularly to the cities with smaller populations.

As exemplified by Miami, some cities exceeded their population rank in all items. Others are: Honolulu, St. Paul, Tampa, Albuquerque, and Charlotte. Cities exceeding their population in expenditures (3 items) are: Baltimore, Seattle, Pittsburgh, Toledo, Portland, Oakland, Long Beach, Akron, Sacramento, and Tucson. Cities exceeding their population in enrollment (3 items) are: Dallas, San Diego, Jacksonville, Atlanta, Toledo, Portland, Newark, Norfolk, Wichita, Akron, Tucson, Sacramento, Austin, and Dayton.
