

#### RECOMMENDED FORMULA FOR FACULTY AND STAFF GROUP INSURANCE Public Senior Colleges and Universities 1975-77 Biennium

For each year of the biennium, \$25 per month (or such other rate as may be appropriated for employees of other State Agencies) for each full-time equivalent employee eligible for Teacher Retirement as of October 31, 1974. The appropriation should be a non-transferrable item with unencumbered balance reappropriated for the second year of the biennium.

An additional amount shall be appropriated to the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System, for each year of the biennium, to be allocated to the public senior colleges and universities to finance group insurance for additional eligible employees of institutions as of October 31, 1975 and 1976 above those employed as of October 31, 1974.
