ABSTRACT

Enrollment statistics for the state of Connecticut are presented. Highlights indicate: (1) Total enrollment in all colleges and universities in the state increased by 7.7 percent in fall 1974 over fall 1973, the largest percentage increase since 1970. (2) This increase in total enrollment resulted almost entirely from an increase in the number of part-time students. (3) There was a slight decrease in full-time undergraduate enrollment in the four-year independent colleges and in state colleges. (4) After slight decreases in full-time enrollment for two years in the regional community colleges this category increased 6.8 percent in 1974 over 1973. (5) The largest increases occurred in part-time enrollment in the public two-year colleges; 33.0 percent in the regional community colleges and 2.1 percent in the technical colleges. (6) 26,825 degrees were awarded during the college year ended June 1974. (7) Women earned 44.6 percent of all degrees awarded. (MJM)

HIGHLIGHTS

...Total enrollment in all colleges and universities in the State increased by 7.7% in Fall 1974 over Fall 1973, the largest percentage increase since 1970. In student count, total enrollment increased from 136,956 in 1973 to 147,533 in 1974.

... This increase in total enrollment resulted almost entirely from an increase in the number of part-time students. While full-time undergraduates increased by 1.4% (from 76,543 to 77,606) part-time undergraduate enrollment increased 29.8% (from 28,064 to 36,421).

...There was a slight decrease in full-time undergraduate enrollment in the four-year independent colleges (-0.8%) and in the state colleges (-1.1%). Full-time undergraduate enrollment at the University of Connecticut increased 5.2% (from 14,271 to 15,009).

...After slight decreases in full-time enrollment for two years in the Regional Community Colleges this category increased 6.8% in 1974 over 1973 (from 10,737 to 11,472).

...The largest increases occurred in part-time enrollment in the public two-year colleges: 33.0% in the Regional Community Colleges (from 13,337 to 17,744), and 27.1% in the Technical Colleges (from 3,378 to 4,295).

...26,825 degrees were awarded during the college year ended June 1974. This is an increase of 7.3% over the 25,001 awarded in 1973.

...44.6% of all degrees awarded were earned by women. Last year, 1973, the percentage for women was 42.9%.

FOREWORD


This report is the 9th annual survey of college enrollments in Connecticut as prepared by the Commission for Higher Education. The principal data sources for the report are the Higher Education General Information Survey form completed by the colleges. These forms are distributed, collected and forwarded to Washington by the Commission. Additional sources used this year were reports on enrollment received from the Central Offices of the Regional Community Colleges and the State Technical Colleges.

The tables and figures in this survey present a head count of all students by categories as reported on the HEGIS forms. Readers should be alert to the fact that enrollment as a head count of all students in the public colleges is not the same as the enrollment supported by State General Fund appropriations. If the operating expenditures of the public colleges are to be related to enrollment data, then the Commission report on General Fund supported enrollments is the better source of enrollment data.

Connecticut's newest degree granting agency, the Board for State Academic Awards began operation on October 1, 1974 and had enrolled sixty-five registrants by November 1. Since the Board's function is limited to that of an examining university offering no instruction, its enrollment figures represent something different from what such figures signify when reported for a traditional institution; consequently, they are not included in the enrollment tables. The first degrees were awarded by the Board in late December, and these will be reported in the Fall 1975 Annual Enrollment Survey.

The staff of the Commission is grateful to the staff members of the colleges who have supplied these data to us. The requests for statistical information made of the colleges are many, and we appreciate the efficient and pleasant manner in which the forms were completed.

Readers of this survey are invited to express their comments and suggestions to the the Commission.

TABLE 1 - Opening Fall Enrollments, 1974

Sources:	HEGIS, 1974, Form No. 2300-2.3, Reports from Central Offices, Regional Community Colleges and State Technical Colleges
Reporting Date:	October 15 - November 1, 1974
Full-Time Undergraduate:	A student registered for 12 or more undergraduate semester hours credit.
Full-Time Graduate:	A student classified by the reporting college as a full-time graduate. Semester hours may differ depending upon independent study and research.
Part-Time Undergraduate:	A student registered for less than 12 undergraduate semester hours credit.
Part-Time Graduate	A student classified by the reporting college as a part-time graduate. Usually implies three to six graduate hour credit program and not applying all of his working hours to study.
Unclassified Students:	Students not matriculated for a degree, diploma, or certificate, or equivalent award, although taking courses in regular classes with other students; this category also includes students who cannot be classified by level.
Other Students:	A student carried by the college in an organized occupation program not directly creditable towards a bachelor's degree.
Public System:	Includes the constituent units in Higher education: the University of Connecticut; the four State Colleges; the twelve Regional Community Colleges; and the four State Technical Colleges.
Independent Colleges:	A college licensed by the Commission for Higher Education which is not included in the Public System; excludes the U.S. Coast Guard Academy which is federally supported.

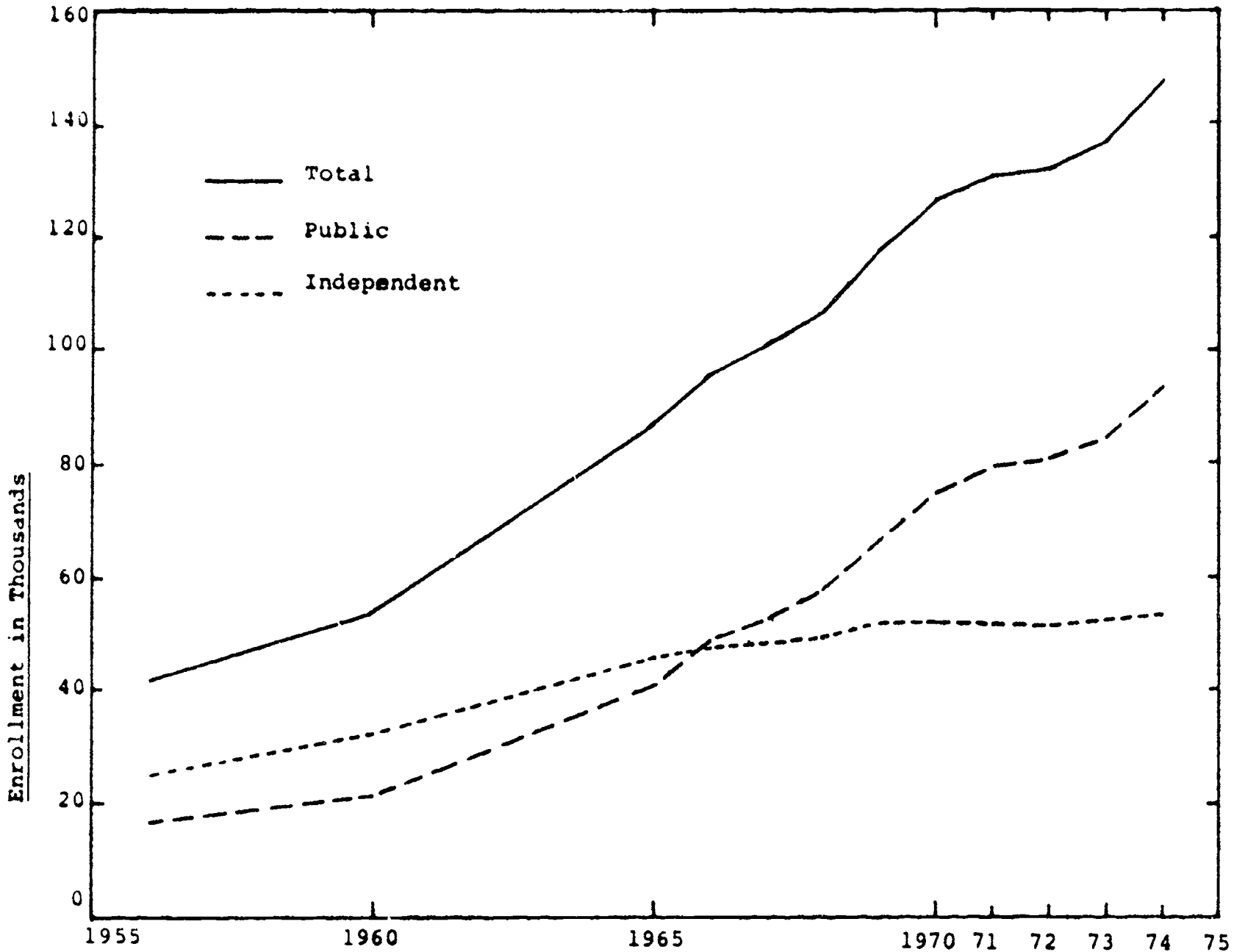
- Advanced Study Study beyond the Master's degree and less than the doctoral degree. Includes the 6th year specialist programs in education. Also includes further study beyond the master's in other academic disciplines.
- Master of Philosophy: A degree granted only by Yale after a minimum of two years of post baccalaureate study to students who have completed all the requirements for the PhD except for those relating directly to the dissertation.

APPENDIX - Summer Session Enrollment, 1974

- Source: Questionnaire from the Commission for Higher Education.
- Summer Session Student: A student who registers for study during the summer months. If the reporting college offers more than one summer session, the table may show duplications inasmuch as each summer session is counted separately.
- Unclassified Student: Not matriculated at the reporting college for a degree, diploma, or certificate, or equivalent award, although taking courses in regular classes with other students.

BY TYPE OF INSTITUTION: 1965-1974

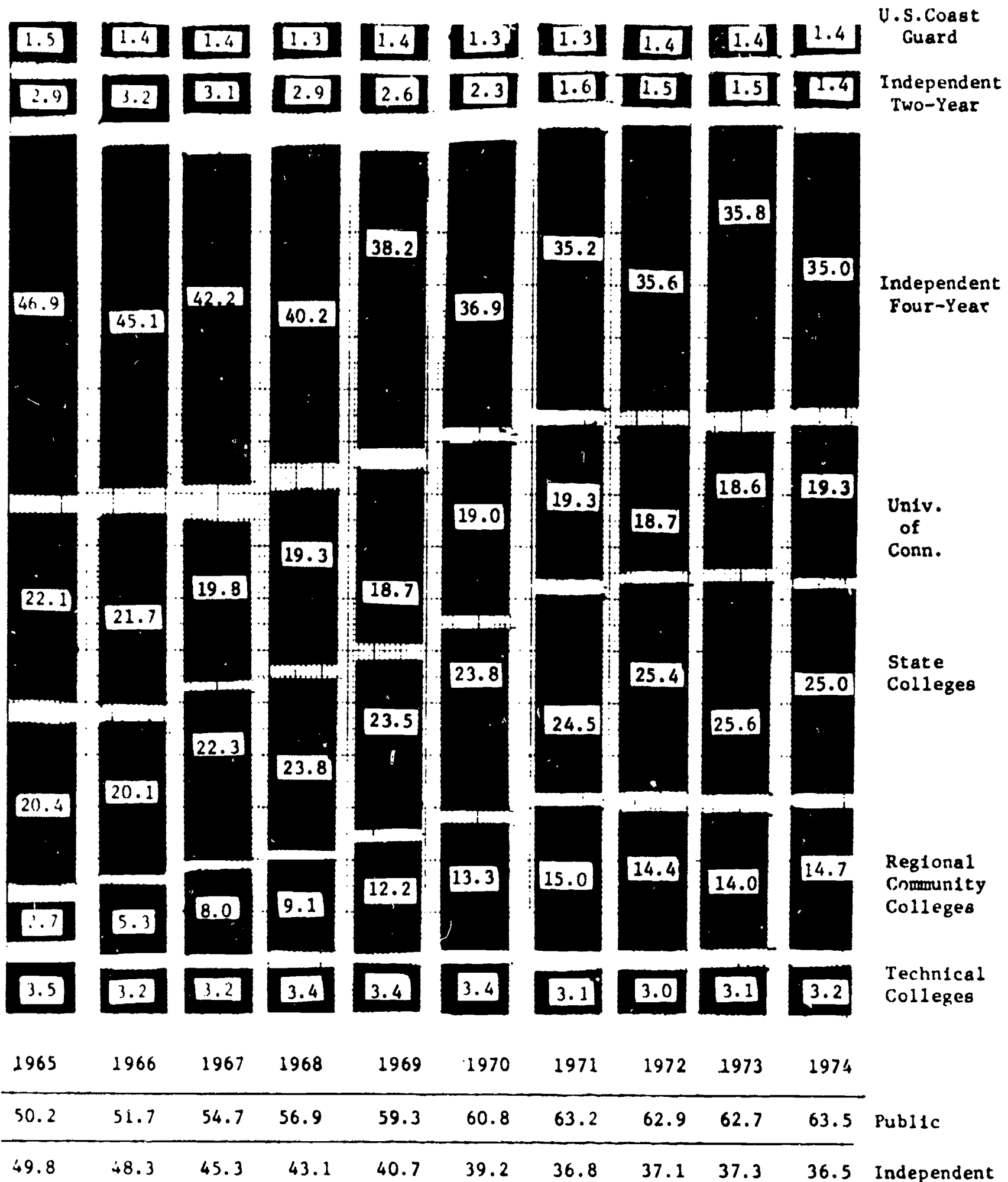
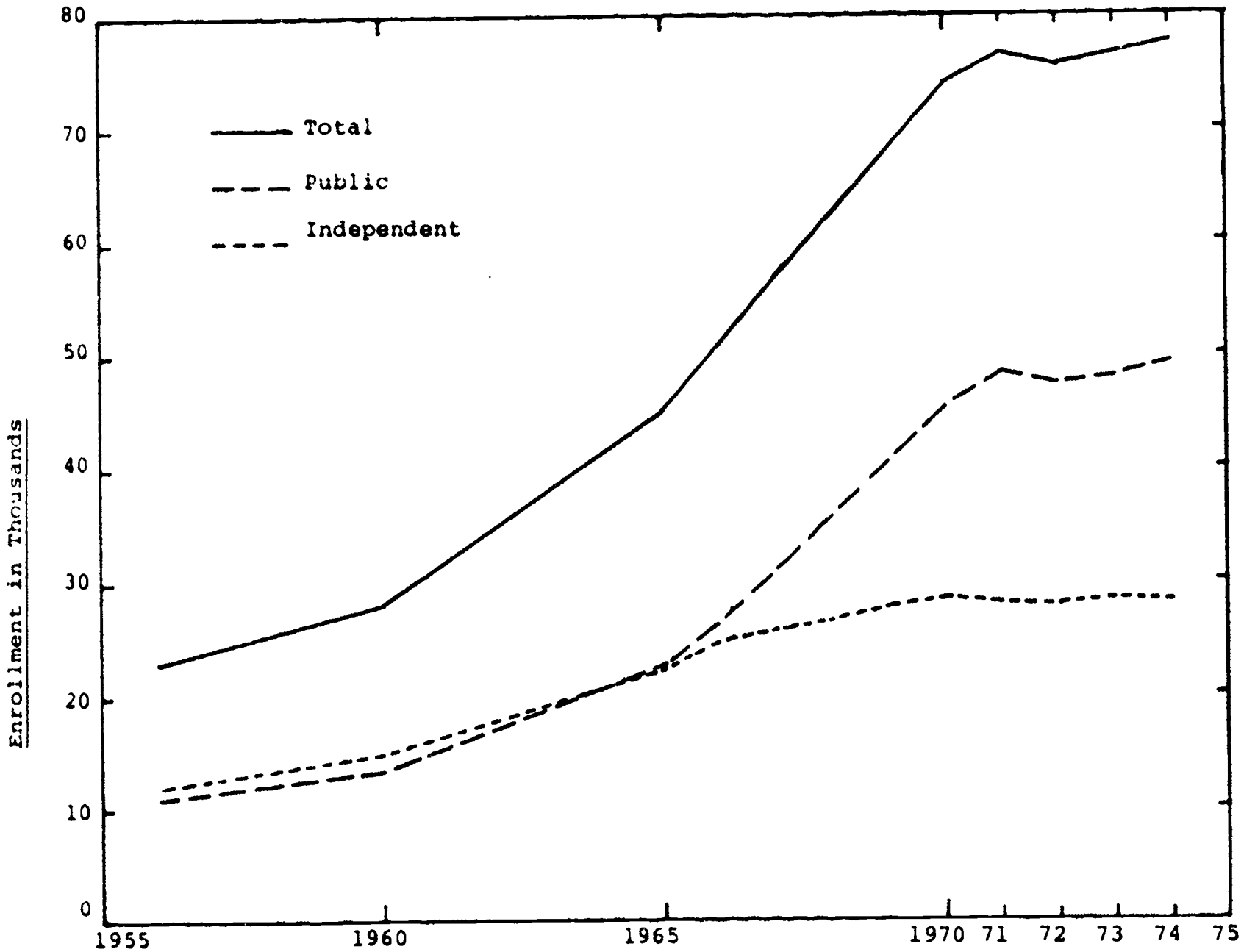
