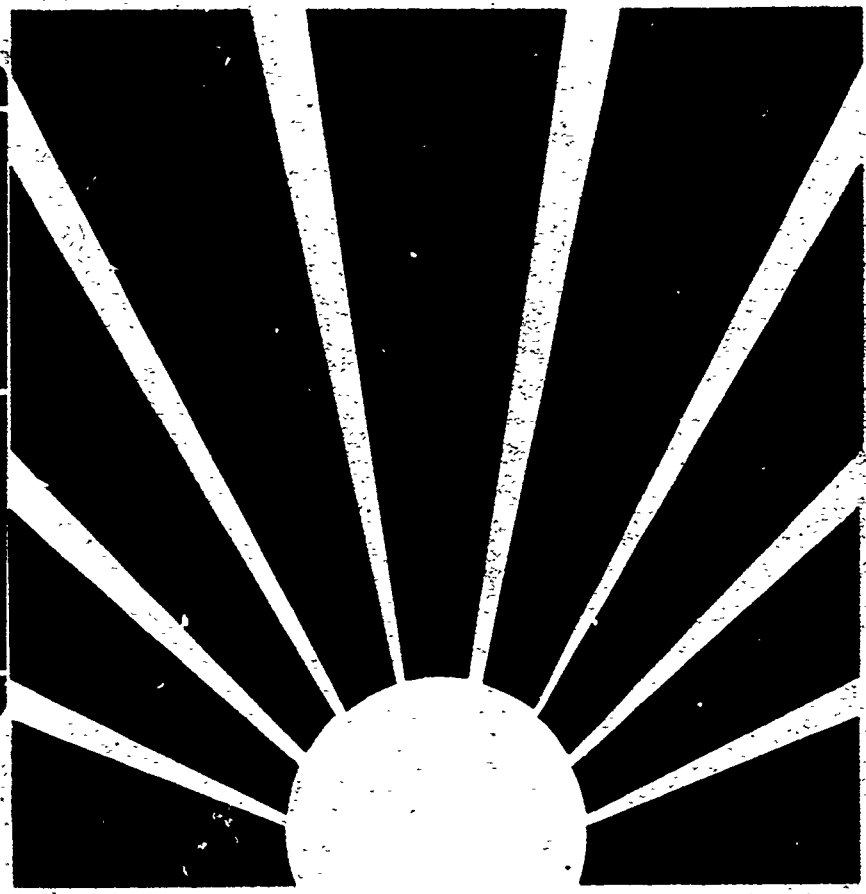

**ABSTRACT**
