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ABSTRACT

A summary of the performance of Los Angeles City College (LACC) transfers to the California State University at Los Angeles (CSLA) during the 1973-74 school year, indicates that 719 (84 percent) of the 854 entrants completed some work. Their average first quarter GPA was 2.44 (-0.05 points below their LACC average of 2.49); one-third earned a "B" average or better at CSLA, while 19 percent fell below a "C" average. 38 percent of the transfers selected a major in the School of Letters and Science, 26 percent in Business and Economics, 20 percent in Fine Arts, 3 percent in Engineering; 14 percent were undecided. Highest averages were earned in courses in Education, Physical Education, and Drama. Departments offering the most difficulty were Biology, Economics, and History. Since 1975, the GPA's earned by new LACC transfers to CSLA have ranged from 2.36 to 2.60, with differentials between CSLA and LACC GPA's ranging from -0.13 to +0.21. The author concludes that students who transfer from LACC to CSLA experience little, if any, transfer shock. Tabulated data indicate the number of students transferring in each quarter of the 1973-74 school year; the academic performance of transfer students in their first quarter at CSLA according to quarter of entrance, college major, and department; and the academic performance of transfers from 1957 to 1974. PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

To assess academic performance of recent Los Angeles City College transfers to California State University at Los Angeles, and to compare with past performance.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

Grade reports for transfers from L.A.C.C. are received periodically from the Office of School Relations of California State University at Los Angeles. Each grade report indicates, in addition to courses taken and grades earned, the class and major of the student. The report also indicate "transfer totals," i.e., units carried and grade points attempted at colleges prior to entering State College. For the purpose of this study, these figures are assumed to represent L.A.C.C. performance. A previous study indicated that this procedure would be reasonably reliable. The findings indicated in the next section of this study are based on information obtained from the State University grade reports for the academic year 1973-74.

FINDINGS

Table 1 indicates the numbers of grade reports received for each of the three quarters of the 1973-74 year plus the summer quarter of 1974.

854 students entered CSLA as transfers from L.A.C.C. during the four quarters indicated. 45% of these entered in September, 15% in January, 22% in April, and 17% in the Summer. Of the 854, 135 (16%) failed to complete any work at CSLA during their first quarter. 59% of these withdrawals were without penalty.

Table 2 summarizes the first quarter academic performance of the 719 students completing some work during their first quarter.

Table 3 analyzes performance according to School or Division of major. Table 4 indicates distribution of grades earned (in student's first quarter) in each department at CSLA by the 719 transfers. Table 5 shows, in order of grade point average, the grade point averages earned in departments enrolling 15 or more students. Table 6 and Figure 1 present available data for previous semesters.

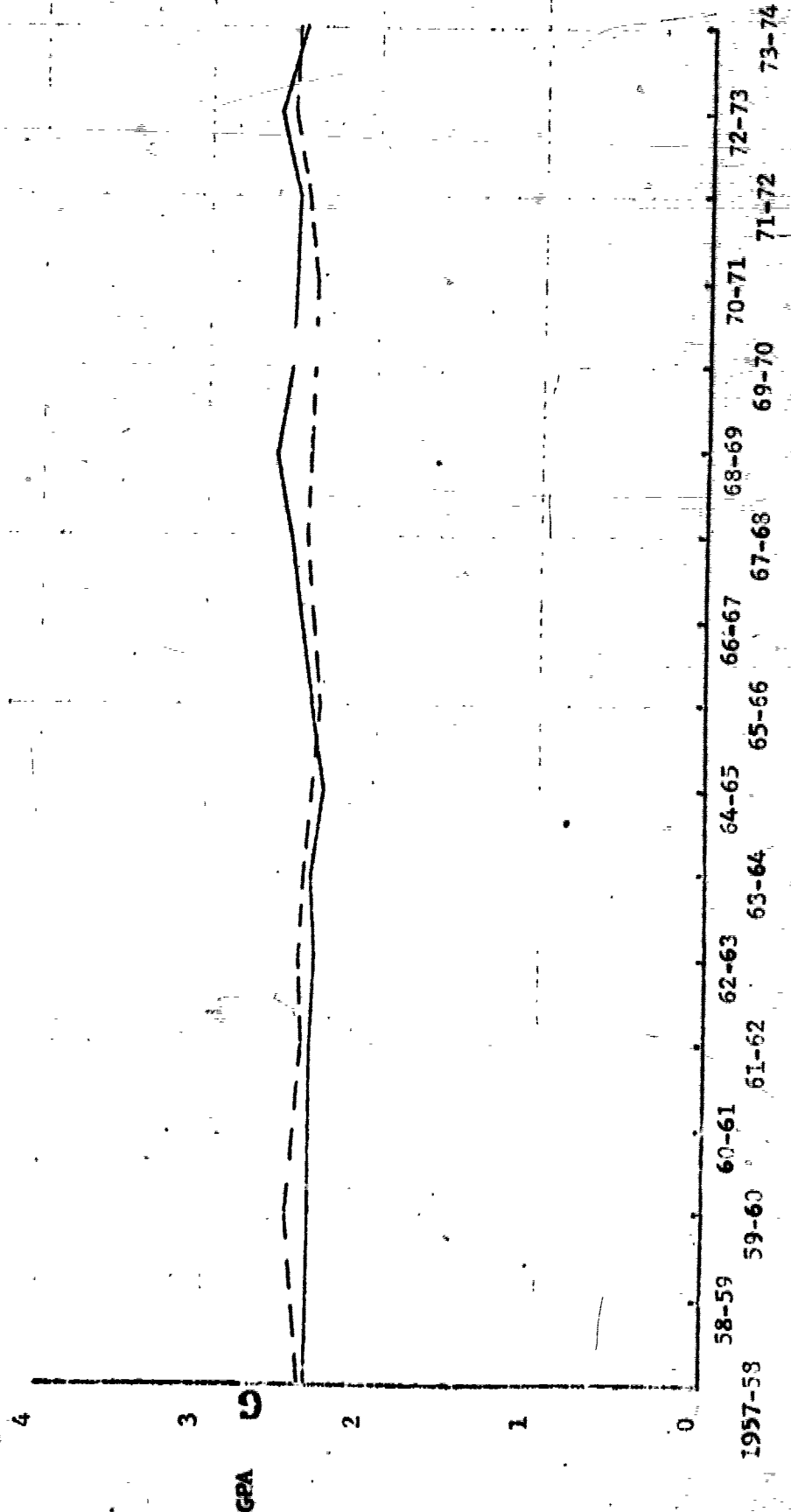

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SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

This study summarizes performance of L.A.C.C. transfers to CSLA during the 1973-74 year. Findings were based on first quarter grade reports for 854 students entering in Fall, 1973, Winter 1974, Spring 1974, and Summer 1974.

719 (84%) of the 854 entrants completed some work. Of the 719, 45% entered in the Fall quarter, 15% in Winter, 22% in Spring, and 17% in Summer.

First quarter grade point average earned by the 719 entrants was 2.44, -0.05 grade points below their junior college average of 2.49. One third of the students earned a "B" average or better at CSLA, while 19% fell below a "C" average.

38% of the transfers selected a major in the School of Letters and Science, 26% in Business and Economics, 20% in Fine Arts, 3% in Engineering, with 14% Undecided. Students in Fine Arts earned the highest GPA at CSLA (2.54); students in Business and Economics had the most difficulty, earning a GPA of 2.29.

A total of 1,755 grades were earned by the 719 transfers in 44 different departments. 46% of these grades were A's or B's, 14% D's or F's. Highest averages were earned in courses in Education, Physical Education, and Drama. Departments offering the most difficulty were Biology, Economics, and History although no department enrolling ten or more students showed a GPA below a "C" average.

Over the seventeen year period since 1957, GPA earned by new L.A.C.C. transfers to CSLA has ranged from 2.36 to 2.60, with differential between CSLA and L.A.C.C. GPA's ranging from -0.13 to +0.21. L.A.C.C. transfers to CSLA continue to experience little, if any, "transfer shock."
