PREFACE

President Gerald R. Ford recently designated August 26, 1974, as "Women's Equality Day," commemorating the 54th Anniversary of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution which gives women the right to vote. In part, Proclamation 4309 observes that "special efforts have been made in the Federal Government, so that women now contribute more fully than ever before to the formulation and execution of public policy."
