ABSTRACT

The bibliography presents approximately 650 references (1955-1975) on educational programs for the severely handicapped. Citations are listed alphabetically by author's name in the following areas: behavior management, curriculum guides, medico-prosthetic aids, motor development, parent training (including aspects of parent involvement in school programs, self help and speech and language intervention), physical education, preacademic and academic skills, prevocational and vocational training, recreation, self help (including dressing, independent living and toileting), sex education, social skills and speech and language programs. References usually include author, title, source, date and pagination information. Appended are complete addresses of publishers and distributors. It is explained that the bibliography forms the basis for a computerized program retrieval library system which is expected to be in operation by Fall, 1975. (CL)

Reader's suggestions will be incorporated into subsequent printings. The authors, of course, bear no responsibility for the success or failure of application of any of the listed program references, and the references should not be construed in any way as the authors' recommendations for meeting educational objectives.

The references contained in this bibliography form the basis for the computerized program-retrieval library system which is, in turn, a component of the TARC Assessment System (Sailor, W. S. The TARC System: Instructional Objectives for the Severely Handicapped. In: Norris Haring (Ed.), Proceedings: The First Annual Conference on Research for the Severely and Profoundly Handicapped; in press, 1975). The program-retrieval system is expected to be in operation by Fall, 1975. Users will be able to review abstracts of many of the programs listed in the bibliography as well as receive detailed information about each program (e.g., population parameters; research data; cost; training
