ABSTRACT

A directory of Ohio libraries contains information about state, area, public, academic, school, special, and institutional libraries as well as multicounty interlibrary cooperative projects, state library advisory groups, and officers of associations. Directory information includes name and location of library, type of library, telephone number, the name of the director, and in the case of large organizations, names of heads of departments. In addition to directory information, statistical data is provided for public libraries, academic libraries, school library media centers, and the state as a whole. Data is given concerning collections, staffing, finance, and clientele. The section on public libraries is expanded to include a list of libraries by county as well as by city, and information on library organization and tax support, branches, bookmobile service, audiovisual materials, and statistics and distribution of tax moneys. INTRODUCTION

The Ohio Directory of Libraries is compiled chiefly from information supplied by public, academic, elementary and secondary school, special, and institution libraries in Ohio through questionnaires sent by The State Library of Ohio.

Arrangement of information is generally self-explanatory, footnotes have been used as needed. A dot leader (. . .) or an N/R in a data column indicates a non-response.

Public Library directory listings are based on information from the public library annual report sent by the State Library to the 250 public libraries on January 3, 1975. All 250 responded. The eight-page form, which collected information on personnel, services, resources and expenditures for calendar year 1974, was developed as part of State Library cooperation with the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) in the Library General Information Survey (LIBGIS). The Ohio Public Library Report form was redesigned in November, 1974 to obtain information for both Ohio and for LIBGIS.

Libraries are listed by the name of the city in which the main library is located. Branch libraries open fifteen hours or more per week are listed under the main library. Names and titles of assistant librarians, coordinators, and department heads with system wide responsibilities are included for those libraries which have a staff of 30 or more persons.

Statistics furnished on the annual report forms were checked at the State Library and forwarded to the State Data Center for computer calculation. Copies of the completed forms from the libraries in the LIBGIS sample were made, pre-edited for LIBGIS, and sent to NCES May 1, 1975. Questionnaires were also sent December 27, 1974 to the 88 county auditors' offices to collect data on the distribution of intangibles tax funds. The information from these questionnaires was compared with the reports received from the public libraries.

Area Library Service Organization (ALSO) statistics were taken from the annual report submitted by the ALSO January 3, 1975 and from the public library report forms filed by the twelve libraries which are members of the ALSO. These data are for the calendar year 1974.

Academic Library directory information was gathered by questionnaires sent to 119 post secondary educational institution libraries by The State Library January 15, 1975. Of these, 98 responded.

School Library Media Center directory information was updated March 31, 1975. This includes name, title, address, and telephone numbers of directors, supervisors, or coordinators of library media centers employed at the school district level, directing, supervising, or coordinating the work of certificated library or media specialists in two or more school buildings. Statistics (for school year 1973-74) on secondary school library media centers were collected by the Ohio State Department of Education's Secondary Principals' Annual Opening Report which was sent to 4,737 secondary schools in September, 1974. These statistics were compiled by the Department of Education's Division of Computer Services and Statistical Reports and forwarded to the State Data Center, March 1, 1975, for print-out.

Special Library directory and statistical information were collected by questionnaires sent October 25, 1974 to the 154 special libraries which were listed in the 1974 Directory. The questionnaire requests information concerning the personnel, collection, and fiscal data for the most recently completed fiscal year. Responses were received from 108.

Institution Library directory and statistical information were collected on questionnaires sent October 25, 1974 to 44 state supported institution libraries in Ohio. Of these, 40 libraries responded to this questionnaire. The form requested information concerning personnel, collection, budget, and expenditures for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1974.

Data handling was done both at The State Library and at the State Data Center. Directory listings (and statistics for special libraries and institution libraries) were edited and typed on magnetic tape at the State Library. The printer produces "cold type" from this magnetic tape. Academic, public and school library statistical forms were edited at the State Library and then sent to the State Data Center. Printouts are checked for accuracy at the State Library and preliminary printouts of academic and public library data are sent to libraries for verification before printing.

These statistics are also used to compile Rankings of Ohio Public and Academic Library Statistics, which is available from The State Library at \$3.25 per copy.

Information in this Directory was checked, and changes were made up through April 25, 1975. Notes of omissions and errors are invited. Thanks are expressed to the librarians, clerk-treasurers, auditor, school superintendents, and other officials who have supplied the data for this Directory.

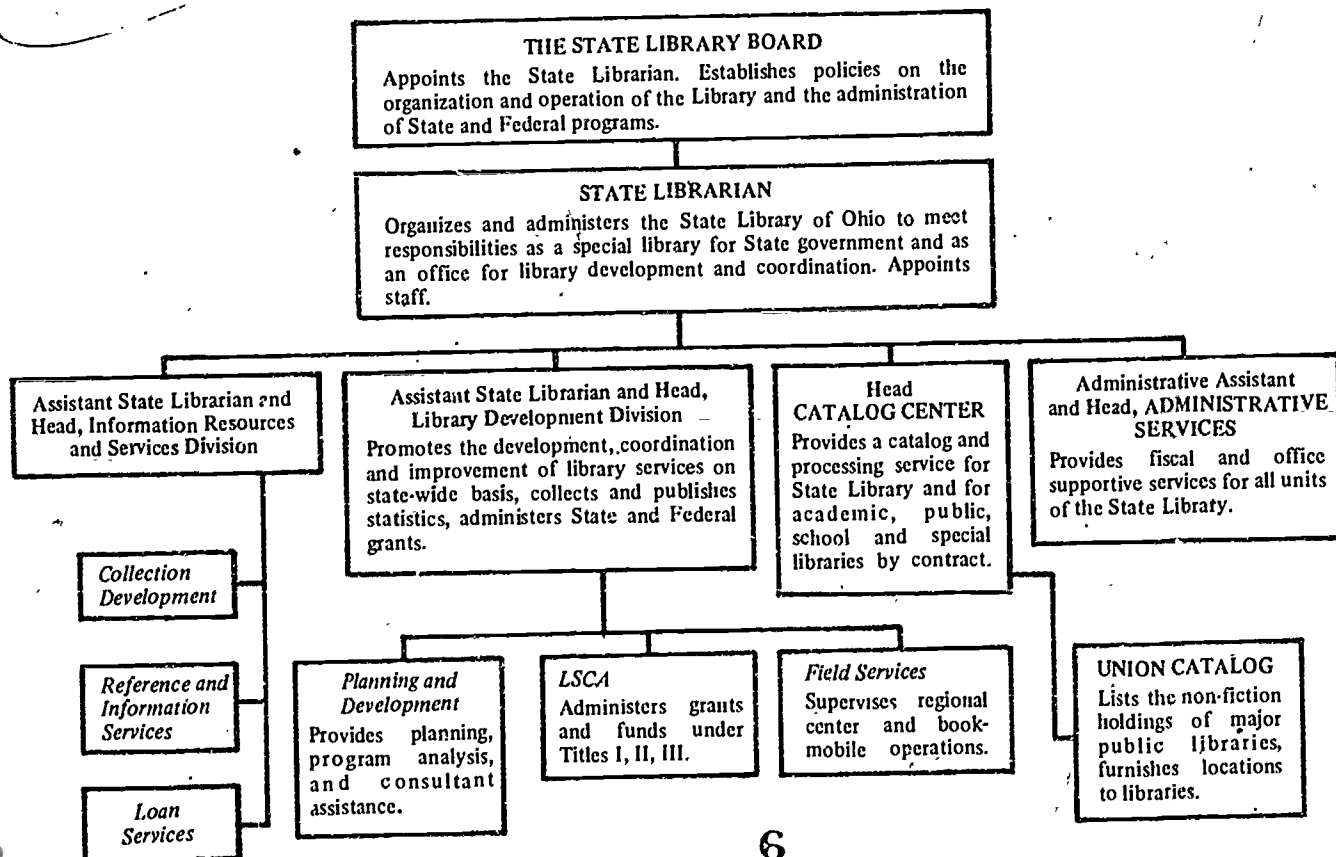

Checklist of Services

As a special library and as the State agency responsible for library service and development, the State Library of Ohio offers a variety of services to libraries, institutions, and individuals. The following list is not comprehensive. Inquiries on these and other services are welcome

- Interlibrary Loans** — from a million volume collection including federal and state documents. Submit requests on standard ALA interlibrary loan forms or on forms available from the State Library. Books are loaned for one month. Borrowing library pays postage charges.
- Location of Items** — from the Ohio Union Catalog which includes 2,500,000 titles in 29 major Ohio libraries. Requests should be sent to the State Library by mail. Urgent needs may be met by calling the Union Catalog collect at (614) 466-8160.
- Photocopy Service** — Periodical articles are available to libraries from the State Library collection at 10 cents per page. The State Library has an arrangement with the Ohio State University by which copies of periodical articles held by OSU are made available to public libraries on this same basis. Request forms are available with-out charge.
- Reference Answers** — Reference questions may be referred to the State Library.
- Documents Program** — All Ohio documents are filed with the State Library. The Library also supplies depository libraries with copies of State publications.
- Consultant Service** — As a part of its public library development program, the Library provides advice on program development and planning.
- Placement Office** — Receives, screens, and refers applications to public, academic, special and other libraries. Maintains lists of positions available.
- Catalog Center** — Books are cataloged under contracts for public, academic, school and special libraries.

Organization and Tax Support of Public Libraries in Ohio

Organization

There are six types of public libraries organized under Ohio law. These are association, county district, county, municipal, school district, and township libraries. Since 1947 the only type of library that can be created under Ohio law is the county district library. However, in certain circumstances, municipalities with populations of 25,000 or more may also organize libraries.

Any public library or association library giving public library service may secure support from the "classified property tax" or, as it is more commonly called, the county intangibles tax fund, provided it is willing to give service to residents of the county.

Before 1931 libraries were supported by real estate tax levies or by gifts and the income from endowments. Libraries were established by, and organized as, parts of political subdivisions (city, school district, township, county, etc.) willing to support them. Now all types of libraries receive their primary support from the county intangibles tax fund; and today about the only distinction left between the several types of libraries is the size of their governing board and the way this board is appointed.

The board of an association library is appointed according to the rules of the individual library association as set forth when it received its State charter. (Sec. 1713.28 R.C.) There are 17 association libraries in Ohio receiving intangibles tax support.

The county library board has six members, appointed by the judge of the court of common pleas. (Sec. 3375.06 R.C.) There are 3 county libraries in Ohio.

The county district library board has a membership of seven, three appointed by the common pleas judge, or judges, and four by the commissioners of the county. (Sec. 3375.22 R.C.) There are 43 county district libraries in Ohio.

The municipal library has a board of six members, appointed by the mayor. (Sec. 3375.12 R.C.) There are 21 municipal libraries in Ohio.

The school district public library has a board of seven members appointed by the local board of education. (Sec. 3375.15 R.C.) There are 162 school district public libraries in Ohio.

The township library is governed by a board of three members, appointed by the township trustees. (Sec. 3375.10 R.C.) The township trustees confer upon this board such authority as they deem necessary. There are 4 township libraries in Ohio.

In addition to the county and county district libraries, certain libraries in Ohio have been designated by the State Library Board as "county extension center libraries." (Sec. 3375.05 R.C.) These are libraries which meet certain standards established by the State Library Board and which have formally resolved to provide for extension of their services to residents who live in their county but outside their regular service area. County extension libraries are, under certain conditions, eligible to receive state aid and other services of The State Library of Ohio to assist in extending their services to county residents.

Libraries may form an Area Library Service Organization which is governed by a board of trustees of at least seven and no more than fifteen members, selected from among the members of the boards of trustees of the participating public libraries (Sec. 3375.70 R.C.). There is one Area Library Service Organization in Ohio.

Tax Support

Public libraries in Ohio are supported by a tax levied on intangible personal property. Designated in law as the "classified property tax", this is more commonly referred to as the intangibles tax. This is a county tax levied on intangible personal property such as investments and deposits. An example of such personal property is the dividend paid on stocks.

Intangible personal property is taxed in two different ways.

One tax (Sec. 5707.03 R.C.) is collected by the State and is returned to the county of origin for the use of local governments. Libraries may not receive any funds from this source. The table on page 76 shows receipts for this tax.

The other tax (Sec. 5707.04 R.C.) is collected by the county and is the tax from which libraries secure their support. This is levied on intangible property listed on the classified tax list in the county auditor's office and the duplicate in the county treasurer's office.

Allocation of the county intangibles tax fund is made by the county budget commission, composed of the county auditor, the county treasurer and the prosecuting attorney.

The county budget commission estimates the tax collection for the coming year, allocates to the libraries on the basis of their need as presented in their budgets. Funds not allocated to the libraries are returned to the general operating fund of the political subdivisions from which they were collected in direct proportion to their collection.

Public libraries are eligible to participate in funds available under the State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972 ("revenue sharing funds" paid under Public Law 92-512) inasmuch as libraries are specifically named as a priority expenditure under this act. Since revenue sharing funds are paid by the U. S. Treasury directly to county, municipal, and township governments, library boards must apply for such funds directly to the appropriate local government bodies rather than to the County Budget Commission.

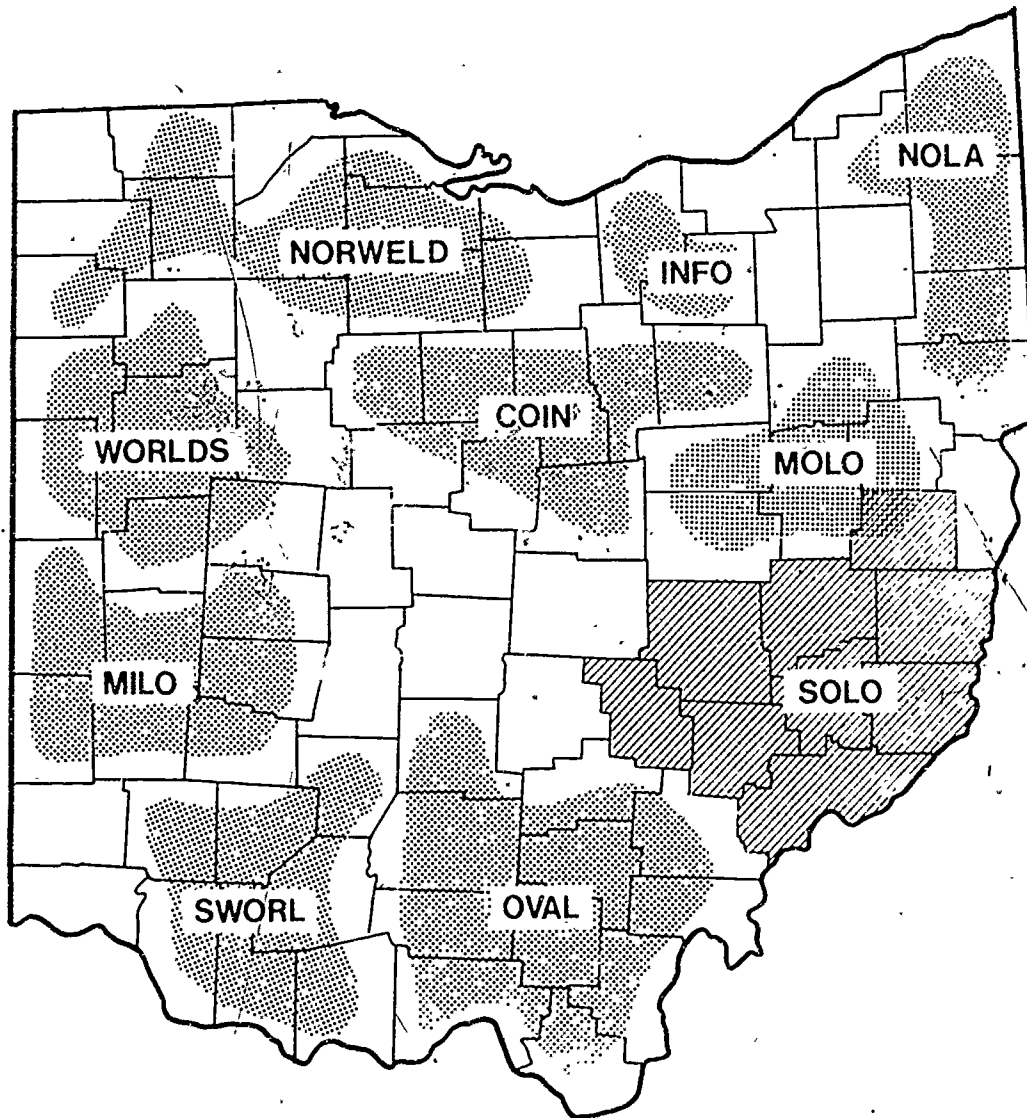
