ABSTRACT

Applications, acceptances, and new enrollments in all graduate programs for the Spring 1974, Summer 1974, and Fall 1974 terms are tabulated. This report differs from previous editions in that it contains a complete set of trend tables that array data for 1972, 1973, and 1974 in a manner that should facilitate comparisons. Data are also provided for M.D. and D.D.S. programs individually as well as aggregated with other first-professional programs. (LBH)

GRADUATE STUDENT ADMISSIONS SURVEY, 1974

INTRODUCTION

1974 marks the fourth year of a state-wide graduate admissions data collection effort. Again this year the Central Staff Office of Institutional Research has summarized the State University of New York portion of the responses to the survey. The current report covers applications, acceptances and new enrollments in all graduate programs for the Spring 1974, Summer 1974 and Fall 1974 term.

Because of the nature of the graduate admissions process, the enrollment data reported here should be used only in the context of this report. For example, only students who have been formally accepted into a graduate program during 1974 are included here. Graduate students admitted to their programs prior to the Spring 1974 term and all non-degree graduate students are not included in any of the enrollment figures in this report.

This report differs from previous editions in that it contains a complete set of trend tables which array data for 1972, 1973 and 1974 in a manner which should facilitate comparisons. Also, in response to numerous requests, data is provided for M.D. and D.D.S. programs individually as well as aggregated with other first-professional programs.

This study posed difficult problems to those who were asked to provide the data. Graduate applications may not always be formal, but can be the result of professor-to-professor communications and a central source of information on applications and acceptances seldom exists. The campus persons who compiled the data deserve appreciation for making the report possible. Special thanks is also due to the statistical and typing pools of the Central Staff Office of Institutional Research.

SUMMARY OF DATA

Because different types of graduate programs exhibit considerable variation in application, admission and enrollment patterns, they will be discussed separately. The data will be summarized within the categories of master's, doctoral and first-professional programs.

MASTER'S PROGRAMS

There were 24,292 applications for master's degree programs in 1974; this is an increase of 2,055 or 9 percent from 1973. The University Centers received 12,937 applications (53 percent of all applications), the University Colleges received 8,559 applications (35 percent of all applications) and the remaining 12 percent were received by other senior institutions. This distribution did show an interesting change from last year. During 1974, the University Centers received 53 percent of all applications as compared with 48 percent last year, an increase of 5 percent; the University Colleges received 35 percent of all applications this year as compared with 41 percent last year, a decrease of 6 percent.

The acceptance rates for applications varied widely from 16 percent to 97 percent; an average of 58 percent received favorable decisions (see table 2), this compares with 64 percent for 1973. The application acceptance rates for each type of institution are as follows: University Centers, 64 percent; University Colleges, 56 percent; Health Sciences Centers, 31 percent; Specialized Colleges, 71 percent; and Statutory Colleges, 41 percent. These rates are generally similar to those of last year; the greatest change being at the University Colleges which accepted 73 percent of applications last year as compared with 56 percent for the current year.

The number of master's degree students who actually enrolled (7,388) was considerably less than the number of applications accepted. This is normally the case and there are two major reasons for this: (1) students are likely to file more than one application, and in the absence of a centralized admissions system for graduate students, the number of unduplicated applicants cannot be identified; and (2) plans for attending graduate school may change, so that the student may not continue his education or may enroll in an institution outside the State University of New York.

The enrollment rates of accepted applications vary widely (see table 3). The average percent of enrollment compared with accepted applications was 52 percent. This compares with 59 percent for last year. The averages by institutional type and the corresponding data for last year are as follows: University Centers, 47 percent (53 percent in 1973); University Colleges, 56 percent (65 percent in 1973); Health Sciences Centers, 85 percent (69 percent in 1973); Specialized Colleges, 55 percent (66 percent in 1973); and Statutory Colleges, 81 percent (69 percent in 1973).

The "yield" of applications (i.e., actual enrollments as a percent of applications received) varied from 11 percent to 72 percent (see table 4). The average percent yield was 30 percent as compared with 38 percent last year. The average yield by institutional type and the corresponding data for last year are as follows: University Centers, 30 percent (33 percent in 1973); University Colleges, 31 percent (47 percent in 1973); Health Sciences Centers, 26 percent (22 percent in 1973); Specialized Colleges, 39 percent (48 percent in 1973); and Statutory Colleges, 33 percent (28 percent in 1973).

DOCTORAL PROGRAMS

There were 11,616 applications for doctoral degree programs and graduate certificate programs in 1974; this represents a decrease of 323 applications or -2.7 percent. The University Centers received 8,560 (74 percent of all applications); University Colleges, 451 (4 percent of all applications); Health Sciences Centers, 1,053 (9 percent of all applications); College of Environmental Science and Forestry, 68 (1 percent of all applications); and Statutory Colleges, 1,484 (13 percent of all applications). The percent distribution of applications remained essentially the same as last year, with the maximum variation being two percentage points.

The acceptance rates for these applications varied from 13 percent to 100 percent. An average of 39 percent of these applications were given favorable decisions (see table 2); the comparable figure for last year was 42 percent. The applications acceptance rates for each type of institution and the corresponding data for last year are as follows: University Centers, 41 percent (43 percent in 1973); University Colleges, 80 percent (80 percent in 1973); Health Sciences Centers, 23 percent (27 percent in 1973); the College of Environmental Science and Forestry, 59 percent (80 percent in 1973); and Statutory Colleges, 26 percent (28 percent in 1973).

The number of enrollees (2,131) was less than the number of applications accepted. The reasons for the similar phenomenon in the case of master's students discussed above are also applicable to doctoral students. The enrollment rates of accepted students vary widely from 8 percent to 100 percent; the average was 47 percent. The average for 1973 was 45 percent. The averages by type and the corresponding data for last year are as follows: University Centers, 48 percent (46 percent in 1973); University Colleges, 35 percent (44 percent in 1973); Health Sciences Centers, 53 percent (50 percent in 1973); the College of Environmental Science and Forestry, 28 percent (19 percent in 1973); and Statutory Colleges, 49 percent (47 percent in 1973).

The "yield" of applications in terms of actual enrollments varied from 7 percent to 100 percent (see table 4). The arerage percent yield was 18 percent as compared with 19 percent last year. The average yield by institutional type and the corresponding data for last year are as follows: University Centers, 20 percent (20 percent in 1973); University Colleges, 28 percent (35 percent in 1973); Health Sciences Centers, 12 percent (14 percent in 1973); the College of Environmental Science and Forestry, 16 percent (16 percent in 1973); and Statutory Colleges, 13 percent (14 percent in 1973).

FIRST-PROFESSIONAL PROGRAMS

Considerably different rates of acceptance and enrollment are found for the first-professional graduate program, necessitating a separate summary.

(1) Law (J.D.):

The University Center at Buffalo is the only State University institution with a Law School. There were 2,764 applications, which is an increase of 689 or 33 percent over last year. 994 applications (34 percent) were accepted. This compares with an acceptance rate of 40 percent last year. Of the 994 acceptances, 303 applicants enrolled as students (32 percent); the percentage for last year was 39 percent. The "yield" of applications in terms of actual enrollments was 11 percent this year and 16 percent in 1973.

(2) Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy (M.D., D.D.S., Pharm.D.):

All four Health Sciences Centers enrolled M.D. and D.D.S. students in 1974, but only the Buffalo and Stony Brook Centers had a Dentistry program and only Buffalo had a Doctor of Pharmacy program. The data does not permit a separate analysis for Dentistry students.

There were 21,263 applications for these programs. This represented a decrease of 1,382 applications (-6 percent) over the previous year. Of the 21,263 applications, 1,226 (6 percent) were accepted. The acceptance rate this year is virtually the same as last year. The acceptance rate of applications received at each of the Health Sciences Centers is as follows: Buffalo, 6 percent (5 percent in 1973); Downstate, 8 percent (9 percent in 1973); Stony Brook, 6 percent (2 percent in 1973); and Upstate, 4 percent (4 percent in 1973).

Of the 1,226 acceptances, 664 (54 percent) enrolled; in this case, the rate is virtually the same as last year. The enrollment rate of accepted applicants at each of the Centers is as follows: Buffalo, 56 percent (73 percent in 1973); Downstate, 49 percent (42 percent in 1973); Stony Brook, 54 percent (59 percent in 1973); and Upstate, 63 percent (61 percent in 1973).

The "yield" of applications in terms of actual enrollments was 3 percent, which was the same last year.

(3) Optometry (0.D.)

The State College of Optometry offers the only professional Optometry program within the State University. This program received 502 applications, an increase of 105 (26 percent) over last year. Of the 502 applications, 43 (9 percent) were accepted; the rate being

virtually the same as last year. Of the 43 acceptances, 26 students (61 percent) enrolled in 1974; as compared with 1973 when 76 percent of the accepted students enrolled.

(4) Veterinary Medicine (D.V.M.)

Only the New York State Veterinary College at Cornell University has a program in Veterinary Medicine. It received 855 applications, an increase of 200 (31 percent) over 1973. Of the 855 applications, 72 (8 percent) received acceptances. All of the students who were accepted enrolled.
