ABSTRACT

The careermobile is designed to bridge the gap between education and work for urban and rural youth in the Western Wisconsin Vocational, Technical and Adult Education District by providing occupational and career guidance information through its vast audiovisual resource library. In order to develop its collection of audiovisual resources, an extensive nationwide search of filmstrips was conducted. The careermobile began its operation in 1972 with approximately 300 commercial career programs. Concurrent production of sound filmstrips at Western Wisconsin Technical Institute resulted in the development of additional career programs. Thirty-two schools were visited during the school years 1972-73 and 1973-74. Approximately 30,000 students received the opportunity to obtain information and guidance concerning career and occupational programs during that time period. Appended materials make up three-fourths of the document and include: a 20-page list of the careermobile's audiovisual materials, public relations materials, forms, an evaluation instrument, and an evaluation report. ### CAREERMOBILE

1971-74

#### I. ORIGIN

In 1971, it was proposed that Western Wisconsin Technical Institute should create, staff and operate a trailer-based career information unit.

Thus, the Careermobile was originated in 1972 after districtwide interest in the project was expressed through an extensive counselor survey.

The rationale for the Careermobile are twofold:

1. To provide relevant occupational information to urban and rural youth of the Western Wisconsin Vocational, Technical and Adult Education District. The terrain of western Wisconsin is such that, in many instances, the smaller communities within the district are isolated from the cultural advantages which are available in the more metropolitan areas.
2. To provide a supportive audiovisual library of guidance and occupational materials which, because of prohibitive costs, are not generally available to all schools within the district.

The Careermobile, therefore, is designed to bridge the gap between education and work for urban and rural youth in the Western Wisconsin Vocational, Technical and Adult Education District by providing occupational and career guidance information through its vast audiovisual resource library.

The Careermobile is available to all schools in the district for at least one week each school year.

## II. DEVELOPMENT

In order to develop the vast audiovisual library, an extensive nationwide search of career filmstrips was conducted. Over 50 percent of the audiovisual materials previewed were rejected, however, due to the poor quality of materials.

The Careermobile began its operation in 1972 with an audiovisual library of approximately 300 commercial career programs. Many of the programs, however, were duplicates of the same career. It also contained an Occu-Scan and various printed materials on careers. Concurrent production of sound filmstrips of the career programs at Western Wisconsin Technical Institute was begun. By the beginning of the first year of operation, 26 career programs offered at Western Wisconsin Technical Institute were presented on sound filmstrips. A Viewlex Super Viewers, Model 136, was chosen to present the sound filmstrips because of operating simplicity. All audiovisual materials were systematically catalogued to facilitate their expedient use. (Appendix I, pp. 8-27)

## III. STAFFING

The Careermobile is staffed by a full-time career technician, who is responsible for scheduling, moving and operation of the unit. The Careermobile technician also assists students in locating the career materials, use of equipment, and in guidance relative to career information.

#### IV. EQUIPMENT

The trailer chosen for the Careermobile, owned by Western Wisconsin Technical Institute, is eight feet wide by 28 feet long and is equipped with filmstrips, cassette tapes, sound filmstrips, counters, storage cabinets, a row of five carrels, and a conference table.

#### V. SCHEDULING AND OPERATION OF THE CAREERMOBILE

Scheduling of the Careermobile for schools within the district is completed through the combined efforts of Cooperative Educational Services Association #11 (CESA) and the particular school to be visited. Thirty-two different schools were visited during the school years 1972-73 and 1973-74; the farthest school visited is 70 miles from La Crosse. During these two school years, approximately 30,000 students received the opportunity to obtain information and guidance concerning careers and occupational programs offered within the Western Wisconsin Vocational, Technical and Adult Education District.

Prior notice is sent to each school to announce the arrival date of the Careermobile; this includes a letter to the superintendent, principal and counselor. Announcements are also posted on the school's bulletin boards. (Appendix II, pp. 28-32)

Upon arrival at the school, the Careermobile is located at a spot which is convenient to student flow. The career technician orients the total school staff members to the audiovisual media format, resources, and operation of the unit, and discusses the schedule which is best suited to the needs of the school. The career technician offers materials, guidance and resources for use in teachers' classrooms and career-related class pro-

grams. Student visitation schedules are maintained by the school officials. Monitoring of student visitation to the Careermobile is accomplished through the use of the "Student Evaluation Form". (Appendix III, pp. 33-34) Student control is the responsibility of the school being visited.

Students, who visit the Careermobile for the first time, are given a five-minute orientation regarding the resources which are available as well as the operation of equipment. The students are then free to explore any of the career planning resources of interest to them. This, in turn, allows the career technician an opportunity to offer individual student guidance and assistance. By this schedule, approximately 15 students per class hour can be effectively accommodated.

During the summer months, county fairs are the major public gatherings in the rural areas of the Western Wisconsin Vocational, Technical and Adult Education District. Through the help of the Community Services Division of Western Wisconsin Technical Institute, a scheduled visitation to these events is a vital part of the service of the Careermobile. The summer months are also utilized to repair and service equipment, and to acquire both hardware and software.

## VI. EVALUATION

The evaluation of the Careermobile is a threefold process:

1. Student Evaluation
2. School Response
3. Follow-Up Survey

#### A. Student Evaluation

Each student who visits the Careermobile is requested to complete a "Student Evaluation Form". This form offers students an opportunity to comment on hardware, software and services, as well as to make suggestions for improvement of the Careermobile. The perforated tear-off section on the "Student Evaluation Form" offers the students a space to note their career interests. This section is given to the school counselors for possible follow-up. At the end of each day, the career technician reads all student evaluations and notes the strengths and weaknesses of the day's operation. (Appendix III, pp. 33-34)

The student evaluation of the Careermobile provides the informational needs of those being served, and also forms a basis for software development and acquisition.

#### B. School Response

A "School Response Form" (Appendix IV, pp. 35-37) is given to the counselor and/or other school personnel at the conclusion of each school's visit for completion and return to the project coordinator at Western Wisconsin Technical Institute. This form relates to publicity, facilities, software and services, and also encourages suggestions for improving the Careermobile. The "School Response Form" provides an ongoing evaluation instrument for the project coordinator so that the advisory committee and the career technician can adapt the services of the Careermobile to the changing needs of the school being served. In instances where suggestions were received from a number of evaluations, a program offering was modified.

For example, as a result of the evaluations, the second year's schedule was modified to more accurately reflect the student population in the various schools.

#### C. Follow-Up Survey

At the end of the 1972-73 school year, a "Careermobile Evaluation Counselor Response Survey" (Appendix V, pp. 38-44) was sent to each school. This survey measured grade levels served, student interests and teacher responses, strengths and weaknesses of the project, and the counselors' responses to the service.

The direct result of this evaluation indicates that the Careermobile has received an overwhelming positive response for its continued use.

### VII. ADVISORY COMMITTEE

An advisory committee consisting of counselors, administrators, teachers, representatives of CESA #11 and Western Wisconsin Technical Institute was formed to provide direction and guidance for the operation of the Careermobile.

The advisory committee met as necessary, but at least three times each year.

### VIII. CONCLUSIONS

Based on the operation of the Careermobile for the school years 1972-73 and 1973-74, it has been determined that:



1. The Careermobile proved to be a viable means of delivering career information to the geographically isolated schools within the Western Wisconsin Vocational, Technical and Adult Education District.
2. The Careermobile provided a strong supplement to the career and educational information services of the district and supplemented school career planning services.
3. The Careermobile and ancillary services stimulated a strong career education interest which has continued to be supported and developed through additional federal and local career education projects.
4. The success of this venture, as a project, has prompted a continuation of the service under district sponsorship and funding.
5. The service has been expanded to include visits to junior high schools and to some elementary schools within the district in subsequent years.
