ABSTRACT

The Unit Cost Study is an annual project involving the direct participation of all public community colleges in Illinois. Each college provides basic data on course offerings, enrollments, and costs in each instructional area to the Illinois Community College Board, which checks the data for consistency with apportionment claims and financial audits, then compiles the reports via a computer program. The effective implementation of the Uniform Accounting Manual by the colleges establishes reasonable continuity between classifications. The community colleges furnish data on midterm enrollments, course credits in semester hours, direct costs for instruction, and other departmental costs. Indirect costs are reported in total dollar amounts which are allocated to each instructional area on the basis of the proportion of course credit hours generated in the given area to the total credit hours generated by the college. The bulk of this report is made up of reorganizations of the data to show various interrelationships. The study is designed to provide information necessary to planning, evaluation, and management. In addition, the study is an accountability report to the citizens of Illinois and to the citizens of each community college district. (Author/NHM)

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PREFACE

This report consists of an analysis of the Illinois Public Community College Unit Cost Study for FY 1974. The Illinois public community colleges have been engaged in a uniform Unit Cost Study since 1969. This cost study is fairly uniform from college to college primarily because all community colleges use a Uniform Accounting Manual and the cost study procedures are directly related to the manual. The data submitted by the colleges are audited financial data and midterm (apportionment) enrollments which can be verified by ICCB apportionment claim printouts. The Unit Cost Study is processed on a computer program and consists of 25 separate reports. The parts of the Unit Cost Study which pertained to the detailed aspects of the various cost areas of each community college (unit cost study reports 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6) were distributed to each of the colleges earlier this year and are not included in this analysis. The unit cost data in this report provides an analysis of each of the cost areas and instructional disciplines by state averages, by college districts, and by college campus.

The organization of this report into sections is an attempt to present the material in a logical order, and caused some of the parts of the Unit Cost Study to be presented in a different sequence from the computer program that generated the reports. An attempt was made to provide a brief explanation of each of the various printouts. The Unit Cost Study procedure remained essentially the same during fiscal year 1974 as in the past few years. The ICCB is grateful to Mr. Vern Wolf and Triton College for running the computer programs that generate the various report of this Unit Cost Study.

SECTION 1OVERVIEW OF THE ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGE UNIT COST STUDYIntroduction

The Unit Cost Study is an annual project involving the direct participation of all public community colleges in Illinois. Each college provided basic data on course offerings, enrollments, and costs to the Illinois Community College Board which in turn checks the data for consistency with apportionment claims and financial audits and then compiles the various reports of the Unit Cost Study via a computer program.

The Unit Cost Study provides the Illinois Board of Higher Education and the Illinois Community College Board with information necessary to carry out the planning and advisory functions and serves the individual community colleges as a tool in local planning, evaluation, and management. The Study also provides relevant information for evaluating and refining the basis for state financial support to public community colleges. In addition, the Unit Cost Study is an accountability report to the citizens of Illinois as well as the citizens of each public community college district.

Every effort was made in the design of the Unit Cost Study to reflect comparability among the colleges. The effective implementation of the Uniform Accounting Manual by the colleges establishes reasonable continuity within classifications. However, caution must be exercised in making direct comparisons between colleges. Environmental characteristics and variances among the public community colleges are very great and must be taken into consideration. Examples of some of these factors which contribute to higher unit

costs are the higher faculty salaries in urban areas and the relatively lower enrollments in some of the rural districts.

The Unit Cost Study makes use of basic enrollment and cost data supplied by each college for each instructional area offered. These data include mid-term enrollment, course credit in semester hours, direct cost for instruction and other departmental costs such as contractual services, supplies, travel and capital outlay. These data are furnished by each community college on specially designed forms. (See Appendix C for instruments used to obtain the basic unit cost data from the colleges).

The indirect cost are reported by a college on a separate form in total dollar amounts. (See Appendix D for instruments used to obtain data about indirect costs). The Unit Cost Study computer program then allocates these indirect costs to each instructional area on the basis of the proportion of course credit hours generated in the given instructional area to the total course credit hours generated by the college.

The Unit Cost Study for the Illinois public universities has several significant differences from the Unit Cost Study used in the Illinois public community colleges which make comparisons between unit costs at the public universities and community colleges difficult and often invalid. The public universities use "10th day" enrollment in their Unit Cost Study which is higher (thereby making the unit costs lower) than the mid-term enrollment used by the community colleges. It is estimated that "10th day" enrollments in the community colleges would be from 4% to 7% more than "mid-term" enrollments. This additional (10th day) enrollment would reduce the unit costs per student credit hour by the same percentage. Several other differences exist in the allocations, definitions, and unit costs procedures. For example, the use of

graduate assistants as instructors in lower division courses at the universities and the procedure of allocating costs between the lower division and upper division courses at the universities introduces some gross inequities for comparison of costs at the lower division level. In addition, the community colleges and the public universities have significantly different missions and serve a significantly different student clientele. Hence, a comparison of unit costs between the community colleges and the public universities is very hazardous because of the many limitations and a number of differences which must be taken into account.

The costs reported in most of the tables in this document are instructional costs rather than overall grand total costs. Grand total costs include cost of functions not directly related to the cost of instruction such as the cost of the Public Service and Organized Research functions. These functions have outputs other than course credit hours and these outputs are not included in the cost study. The grand total unit costs are calculated in the study, however, and are shown in Report 21 on page 25. These additional costs are shown below.

COMPARISON OF FY 1974 UNIT COST WITH PREVIOUS YEARS

The result of the fiscal year (FY) 1974 Unit Cost Study show that the state average cost per (semester) credit hour for instruction in the public community colleges of Illinois has increased from \$50.62 for FY 1973 to \$52.25 for FY 1974, an increase of 3.2 percent. Table 1 shows the state average cost per credit hour for instruction for FY 1970 through FY 1974.

STATE AVERAGE COST PER STUDENT CREDIT HOUR BY COST AREA CATEGORY

The Unit Cost Study distributes the cost per credit hour into various cost categories such as direct salary, other departmental costs, allocated costs and operation and maintenance costs. Direct salary is the direct gross salary dollars paid to faculty members for teaching courses and/or attendant laboratory sections as determined by faculty effort reports. These costs are assigned to each course on the basis

of the percent of course credit hours to the total course credit hours taught by the faculty member. Other departmental costs are all costs other than direct salaries incurred at departmental or smallest organizational unit level. Examples, not necessarily inclusive, are: department head compensation, secretarial and clerical salaries, contractual services, supplies and materials, travel and capital outlay assigned to that department. Allocated costs are college-wide costs such as student services and library costs which cannot be directly assigned to a particular course or department and must be proportionately allocated. Operation and maintenance costs are those costs necessary to operate the campus facilities and are also allocated proportionately. A summary of the state average costs per student credit hour for each of these cost categories is shown in Table 2. Figure 1 shows how many cents out of each dollar spent for instruction in the Illinois Public Community Colleges goes to each of these cost categories.

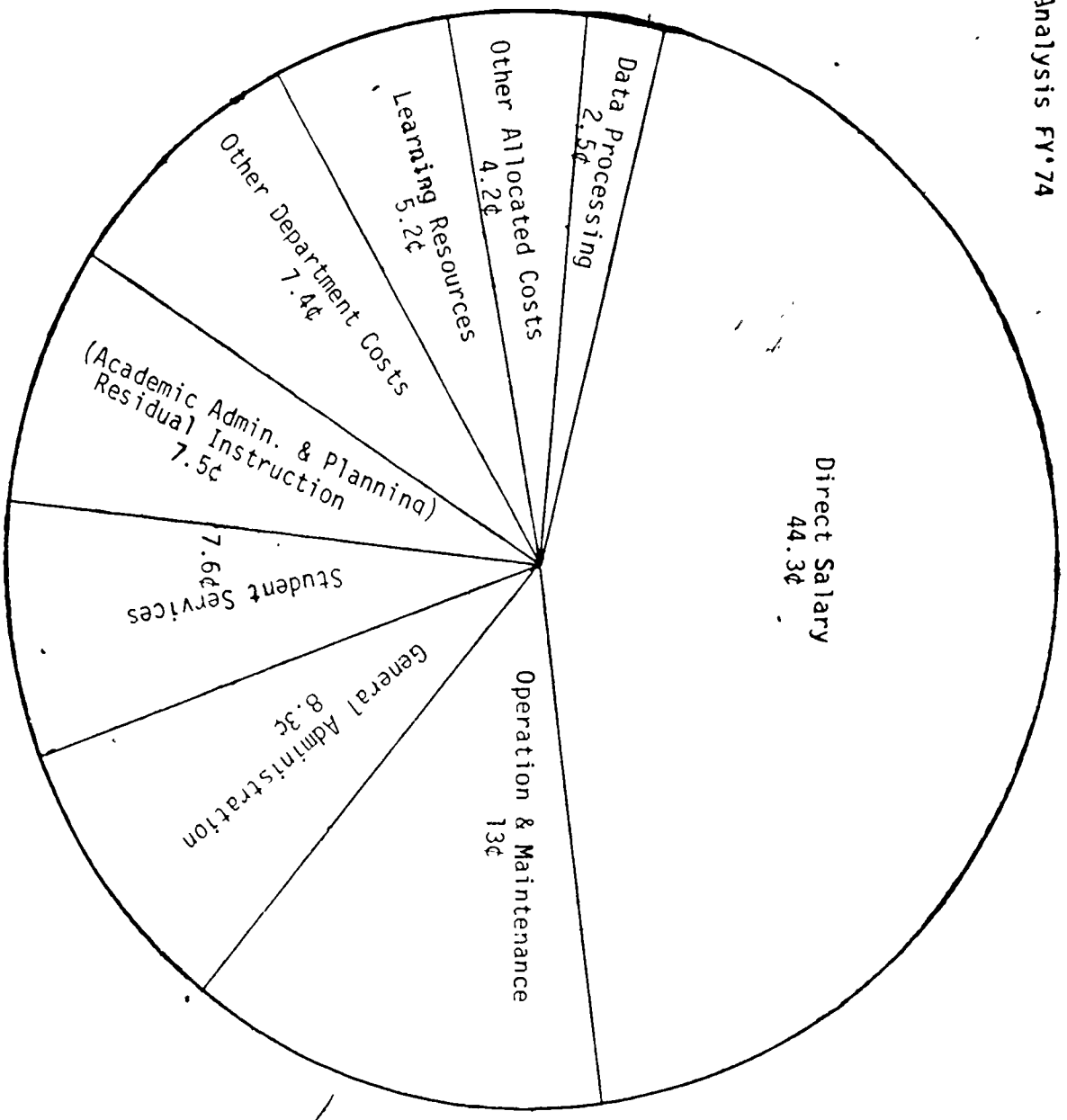

EDUCATION SUPPORT SERVICES AND OTHER INDIRECT COSTS

The cost of instruction includes indirect costs which are allocated to instruction on the basis of course credit hours. These indirect costs include learning resources, student services, data processing and general administration. The state average cost per student credit hour of instruction for all of the educational support services was \$18.59 or approximately 36% of the state average total instructional cost per student credit hour. Table 3 shows a summary of the FY 1974 costs per student credit hour for each of the educational support areas and the percent of the total instructional cost per student credit hour that each of these costs account for. Residual instruction costs are costs above the departmental level that can be directly applied to an instructional subfunction. For example, the salary for the Dean of Adult and Continuing Education or the salary for the Director of Curriculum Planning might be included. The cost for auxiliary services (bookstores, food services) in the Unit Cost Study represent only the deficit that a college experiences in providing these services.

COMPARISONS OF UNIT COSTS BY INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM AREAS

Figure II shows the comparison of cost per student credit hour among the program areas. The occupational program area is divided into occupational (business) and occupational (non-business) to be consistent with the categories used for state apportionment funding purposes. The difference in cost per student credit hour between the occupational (non-business) program area (\$63.75) and the general studies program area (\$45.55) is \$17.70. At the present time occupational (non-business) courses are being funded at a rate of \$5.80 per student semester hour higher than other courses. The cost data shown in this analysis indicates that occupational (non-business) courses cost from \$12.64 to \$17.70 more per credit hour than do courses in other program areas.

COMPARISONS OF UNIT COSTS BY INSTRUCTIONAL DISCIPLINES

The Illinois Public Community Colleges Unit Cost Study also analyzes costs by instructional subject areas. This type of analysis is capable of revealing differentiated costs associated with various instructional offerings. A detailed analysis is in Section II, reports 9 and 12 of this paper. A summary of this analysis by instructional discipline is shown in Table 4. The disciplines are aggregations of similar instructional subject areas. The range in costs per student credit hour among the disciplines varied from a high of \$75.66 for Health Technologies in the occupational program area to a low of \$33.20 for Mathematics

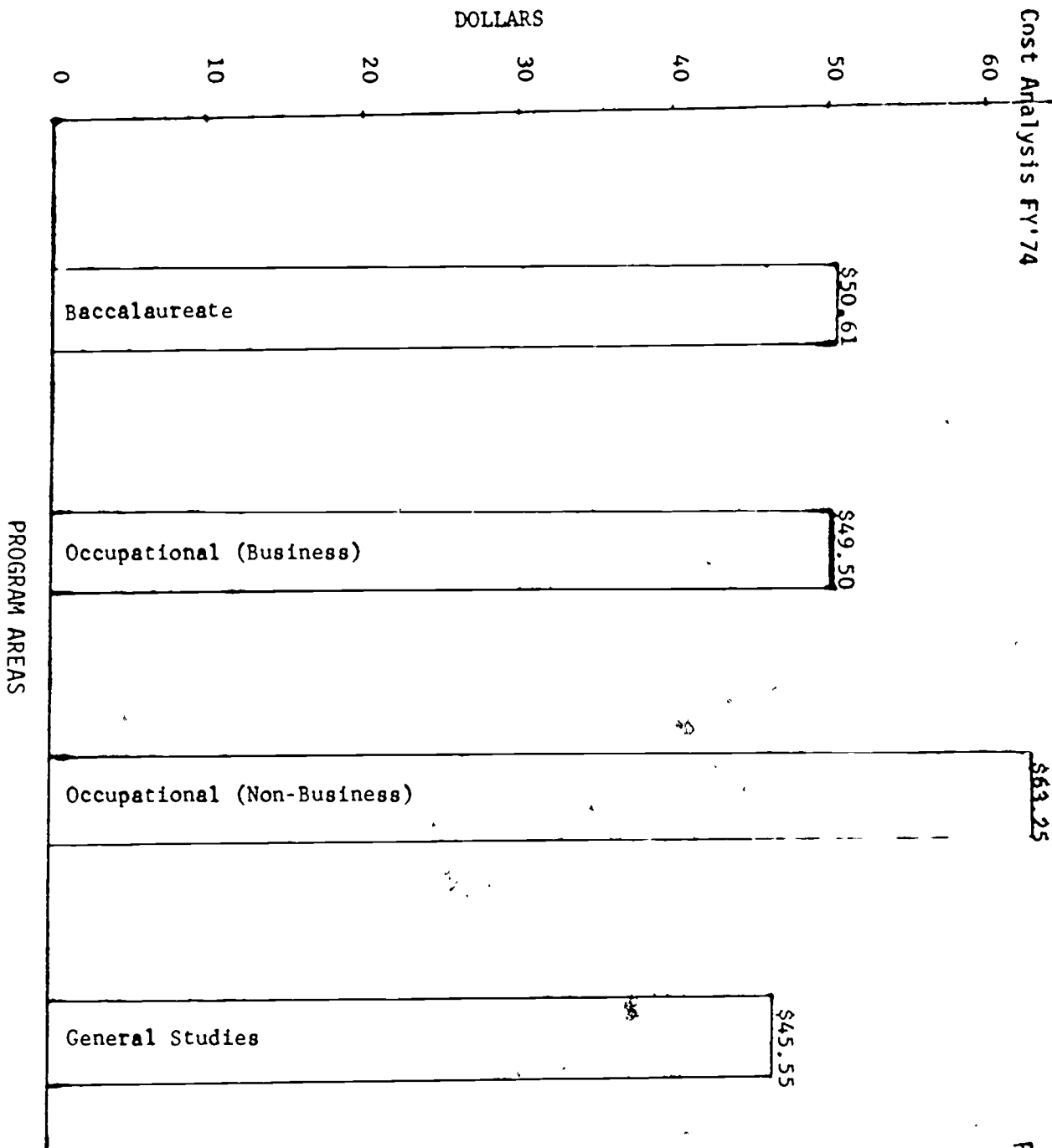

in the baccalaureate program area. There is more differentiation among the unit costs for disciplines within the program areas than there is in the unit costs among the different program areas. Table 5 illustrates the range of cost per credit hour of the disciplines within the baccalaureate and occupational (non-business) program areas. The occupational (non-business) program area does have overall cost per credit of \$63.25 which is \$12.64 per credit hour higher than the \$50.61 per credit hour average cost in the baccalaureate program area. The differences in costs within the program areas may vary by \$34.18 per student credit hour among the baccalaureate disciplines and \$27.72 per student credit hour among the occupational (non-business) disciplines.

COST PER STUDENT CREDIT HOUR FOR INSTRUCTION BY COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

Table 7 shows the distribution of the costs per student credit hour by instructional program area for each of the public community colleges in Illinois. The table also shows the unit costs per student credit hour for all instructional programs for FY 1974, FY 1973, FY 1972, and FY 1971. The range of costs per student credit hour for total instruction among the thirty-eight districts varied from a low of \$39.30 to a high of \$66.96. The range of costs among the thirty-eight districts for each of the instructional program areas is shown below in Table 6.

SECTION II

DISTRICT COST PER STUDENT CREDIT HOUR FOR INSTRUCTION
IN ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Report 18 of the Unit Cost Study shows the cost per student credit hour for each of the cost categories for the functions of instruction in each of the public community colleges of Illinois. Table 8 shows the range of unit costs and the state average in each of the cost categories.

The function of instruction represents all of the instructional areas combined. In comparing the costs of the individual community colleges one must keep in mind that occupational programs generally cost more than baccalaureate or general studies programs, hence, a college which has a large proportion of occupational programs would be expected to have higher overall unit costs for that reason alone.

Report 24 shows the cost per student credit hour for each of the indirect cost areas that are allocated to the cost of instruction in each public community college of Illinois. This report shows the cost per student credit hour for such instruction support services as learning resources, student services, data processing, and general administration. Note that the ~~only~~ costs reported for auxiliary services are those which are needed to compensate the services rather than gross costs. It must be pointed out that some of these support areas have a fixed minimum cost if they are in existence at all, regardless of the size of the institution. Hence, very small institutions might expect higher unit costs for data processing for example. Many other factors such as differences in the characteristics and special needs of students, differences in the educational needs of the communities and differences in the commitments to serve certain sectors of students among the colleges contribute to the differentiation in unit costs among the colleges in these indirect cost areas as well.

Table 9 shows a summary of the state average costs per student credit hour for the educational support cost areas.

DISTRICT COST PER STUDENT CREDIT HOUR FOR ORGANIZED
RESEARCH AND PUBLIC SERVICE IN ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Report 21 shows the unit cost per student credit hour for the functions of organized research and public service for each Illinois public community college. This unit cost was obtained by dividing the dollar cost of each of these functions by the total student credit hours. The state average cost of organized research is around 8¢ per student credit hour and the state average cost of public service is 74¢ per student credit hour.

Table 11 below shows a comparison of the costs per student credit hour for organized research, public service and instruction in the public community colleges of Illinois.

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STATE COST PER STUDENT CREDIT HOUR BY INSTRUCTIONAL
DISCIPLINE IN ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Report 12 of the Unit Cost Study shows the cost per student credit hour by HEGIS* instructional discipline code for all public community colleges in Illinois. This analysis groups the instructional curriculum designations into the more general discipline categories. The distribution by discipline is useful for departmental or divisional analysis of instructional costs within the community colleges.

The data in this analysis reveal that there is considerable differentiation among the unit costs of the various disciplines within each instructional program area as well as among the instructional program areas themselves. In the baccalaureate area the cost per student credit hour for agriculture is \$67.38 and for engineering the cost is \$66.56 which indicates that some of these disciplines cost more than some of the disciplines in the occupational program area. The cost differentiation among the instructional program areas is from \$45.54 for the general studies program area to \$63.25 for the occupational (non-business) program area.

* Higher Education General Information Survey classification system of instructional disciplines is a nationally accepted system which is used by the U.S. Office of Education. This classification system identifies each discipline by an assigned number (See Appendix B, pages 79-85 for a listing of HEGIS categories.

SUBJECT AREA IN ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Report 9 of the Unit Cost Study shows the cost per student credit hour by instructional subject area for all public community colleges in Illinois. The report shows the cost per student credit hours by each cost area category for each instructional curriculum code, discipline code, and instructional area. Low unit cost results from either low dollar cost or high enrollment per course or both. This type of analysis is very useful for comparative purposes by community college deans of instruction and division chairmen in comparing the cost of their offerings with the state average costs.

Another useful purpose of the cost per student credit hour analysis by instructional area is to point out that certain types of instructional curricula cost considerably more to offer than do others. This type of analysis may furnish an explanation for unusually high unit costs by institutions that offer a high proportion of high cost instructional programs. As an example, an institution may have below average costs in each of the instructional disciplines in which they have approved programs but come out with above average total instructional costs as compared to other institutions simply because they offer a larger number of high cost programs than do other colleges. The cost differentials between various instructional areas are also useful in designing equitable state funding systems for the community colleges. For example, the total instructional cost per student credit hour for non-business occupational instructional areas is significantly higher than for any of the other instructional areas.

IN ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Report 8 of the Illinois Community College Unit Cost Study shows the dollar cost by instructional area for the public community colleges in Illinois. The instructional areas are identified by HEGIS code numbers (See Appendix B to identify the instructional area represented by each HEGIS number). The student credit hours are obtained by multiplying the enrollment in each course by the number of course hours. For example, a 4 semester hour course having an enrollment of 25 students would produce 100 student credit hours. FTE faculty in the Unit Cost Study is produced by dividing course credit hours by 30. This is based on a standardized measure of a full-time faculty with the assumption that the average full-time faculty member produces 30 course semester hours per year. Note that although the 30 course credit hours per year is the average required by community colleges in Illinois for full-time faculty members, the number of FTE faculty derived by the Unit Cost Study Method will not correspond to the number of FTE faculty based on institutional definitions.

The reconciliation report included herein should be sent to the ICCB Office at the time the completed forms and punched cards are sent to Mr. Wolf at Triton College. Along with the report, colleges are asked to submit punched cards for each line of the report where there is mid-term enrollment and credit hours generated, following the card format and key-punch instructions included with the forms. Any stock card will do. In the unusual event that your college lacks the facilities to create the cards or is unable to have them created by a service bureau, please contact Mr. Verner H. Wolf at Triton College to make arrangements to have your cards punched.

NOTE: Particular attention should be given to the following four matters:

1. In coding instructional areas, use only the code numbers on the material included in this memorandum.
2. All credit hours generated at a college must be reported in the Unit Cost Study.
3. The "total" pages included in Form I must be balanced against the pages preceding them, e.g., Page 10 totals must agree with the data submitted on Pages 1-9.
4. Changes from the 1972-73 directions are:
