ABSTRACT

Data gathered throughout Hawaii's six-campus community college system shows that the number of diplomas awarded during 1974-75 totaled 1,782, an increase of 18 percent over the previous year. Growth was evident in all diploma categories: Associate in Arts degrees increased 15 percent; Associate in Science degrees increased 22 percent; and Certificates increased 7 percent. Vocational degrees represented 69 percent of the total granted, although vocational majors comprised only 38 percent of fall enrollment; the Associate in Arts degree accounted for another 29 percent, although liberal arts majors comprised 49 percent of fall enrollment. The graduates were evenly distributed by sex. Included are two tables showing the number of diplomas awarded by each campus since 1970-71 and the number and types of degrees conferred during 1974-75. It is suggested that the study might be helpful in assessing the effectiveness of various programs since student persistence to completion shows wide divergence particularly when vocational and liberal arts programs are compared. Information about graduates is of perpetual interest. It is one reflection of "productivity" of programs and lays the foundation for other questions related to accountability.

The data for this report were obtained from the registrars of each college who edited computer report 2527 and the deans of instruction who provided the information on certificates of completion awarded.

Highlights

1. A total of 1,782 diplomas was awarded during the July 1, 1974-June 30, 1975 fiscal year.
 - a. This represents an increase of 274 diplomas (18 percent) over the number awarded last fiscal year.
 - b. Data in the computer reports and from the registrars indicate that about 650 diplomas (one-third) were awarded at the end of the fall semester.
 - c. Graduates numbered 1,735, however, since 47 students received two diplomas. (In previous years about 20-29 students received double diplomas.)
2. The graduates were about evenly distributed by sex. The proportions varied by campus, however, reflecting to an extent the sex distribution of the total enrollment, i.e., male graduates outnumbered females at Honolulu while the reverse was true at Kapiolani.
3. An analysis by type of degrees awarded shows an increase in every category: AA degrees by 15 percent; AS degrees by 22 percent, certificates by 7 percent.
4. Associate in Arts degrees awarded represent 29 percent of the total although liberal arts majors comprised 49 percent of the enrollment in the fall. On the other hand, vocational majors comprised 38 percent of the fall enrollment, but accounted for 69 percent of the diplomas awarded.

5. Further campus analysis shows that the number of degrees/certificates awarded this year increased at every campus but substantially so at Kapiolani CC (400-525, 31 percent), Leeward CC (353-417, 18 percent), and Windward CC (30-65, 117 percent).
 - a. Kapiolani CC. Considerably more diplomas were awarded for the following programs: Sales and Management (from 49 to 70) and Food Services (from 26 to 64),
 - b. Leeward CC. Considerably more diplomas were awarded for the following programs: Accounting (from 36 to 65), Computer Science (from 4 to 9), Recreational Instructor (from 4 to 11), and Food Services (from 2 to 8).
6. An analysis by program indicates that the most numerous diplomas were awarded to majors in the following:
 - a. Liberal Arts 521
 - b. Clerical 143
 - c. Accounting 117
 - d. Sales/Management 101
 - e. Secretarial Science 96
7. In addition to the AA, AS and Certificates of Achievement awarded, several campuses conducted short-term programs developed to meet special needs. Certificates of Completion were awarded to those who participated and met the requirements of these programs. The information is presented in Appendix A.

SUMMARY

The number of diplomas awarded increased by 18 percent this past fiscal year. While the gain is among the more notable increases within the past five years, the 1,782 diplomas awarded still represent a modest figure considering the number of students served. In view of the aims of the community colleges, however, this may not be unusual. (The University of Kentucky Systems' data reveal a similar situation.)* Nevertheless, several questions may be raised again:

- a. What implications are there in terms of: measures of effectiveness? the need for followup studies? program assessment? student advising? curriculum revision?
- b. What relationship is there between the expansion of liberal arts programs and diplomas earned? i.e. why do liberal arts students transfer before earning AA-degrees?
