ABSTRACT

This report organizes fall, 1975 registration data for the seven Hawaii community colleges in tabular form. The focus of the report is on faculty workload in terms of the classroom situation: credits and classes taught, student credit hours generated, and class size. There was a general increase in the number of courses, classes, credit hours, registration and student credit hours at all campuses. The number and proportion of classes with 10 or fewer students have declined at most colleges, while average class sizes are slightly larger. As in the past, average class size in general education courses is larger (30 students) than in vocational education courses (26 students). Average class size varies by campus, from 24-31. Faculty workload figures indicate a generally lighter load at the colleges compared to fall, 1974 and fall, 1973, especially in terms of credit hours taught and faculty-student ratios. The productivity ratios, however, show a slight increase at most of the colleges. A comparison with fall, 1974 data shows increases in the number of instructors at all colleges. Tables break down the data by institution and instructional subject areas.

Introduction

Faculty workload is a critical element because it is one of the dimensions of the cost of operating a college and is related to the quality of education.

The dimensions of faculty workload are varied and numerous: the actual teaching of classes as measured in credit and contact hours, serving on committees, engaging in departmental research and curriculum development, responding to varied requests from the community, etc.

The focus of this report is on one aspect: workload in terms of the classroom situation, ie., credits and classes taught, student credit hours generated, class size, etc.

Sources of Data

SIS Computer Report 3010 and 3011 series (Course Registration Reports), which provide raw and summary data on faculty-student workload based on student credit hours were used as the primary documents for this report. (Data for these reports were abstracted from students' class registration data.) Computer reports 3030 (Schedule of Classes list) and Faculty-Staff Information System (FSIS) reports were used as reference points. Standard form 5Bs (personnel transaction forms) in the Chancellor's office were used to obtain a count on full-time equivalent faculty for staff on overload and for lecturers. The deans of instruction and/or the registrars of the colleges were also consulted for certain information.

Population Included

The information for this report is based on registration data including the following groups of students registered in the regular credit programs in seven community colleges: classified and unclassified students, early admittees, concurrent registrants, and other special students whose registration records are processed through the SIS. All computer reports are as of early October. The data have been "updated" since and where possible, certain changes have been made.

Workload information on Hawaii Community College is included for the first time this fall. The increase in system totals in terms of number of classes, credit hours, student credit is partially affected by this.

Adjustments

Equivalent credits were established for classes with variable credits. The methodology differed, however, depending upon the kind of classes under consideration, e.g., directed studies, cooperative education, etc. (See Appendix A, Definitions.)

Highlights

1. A general increase in the number of courses, classes, credit hours, registration and student credit hours is noted at all campuses (Table I).
 - a. This partially reflects this fall's general enrollment increase.
 - b. At some campuses, however, the increases in the number of classes and registration count also reflect a greater number of classes scheduled on modular (short-term) segments.
2. The number and proportion of classes with 10 or fewer students have declined at most colleges (Table II).
 - a. System wide, the 121 "low enrollment" classes is the lowest proportion (4.3 percent) in five years.
 - b. Many of these small classes are held regardless of low enrollment because of graduation requirements, facility limitations, and accreditation requirements especially in the health services, etc.
3. Average class sizes are slightly larger at most of the colleges. As in the past, average class sizes in general education courses are larger (30 students) than those in vocational education courses (26 students). Average class sizes vary by campus: from 24-31* (Table III).

*John Lombardi's study on faculty workload indicates that generally average class sizes fluctuate between 25-60 with 35 as the average. 4. Faculty workload figures indicate a generally lighter load at the colleges compared to fall 1974 and fall 1973, especially in terms of credit hours taught and faculty-student ratios. The productivity ratios, however, show a slight increase at most of the colleges (Table IV).

- a. Average credit hours taught range from 11.8 to 13.7 with 13.1 being the system average. (Last fall's range: 12.5 to 13.7; system, 13.3.)**
- b. At several colleges, a slight increase in productivity ratios is noted in spite of a higher credit load, reflecting slightly larger average class sizes. The ratios vary from 274 to 415. The system average is 355.**

5. The full-time equivalency (FTE) count of approximately one thousand people engaged in teaching credit courses this fall is 647.5; 350.8, (54 percent) in general education and the remaining 296.7 (46 percent) in vocational education (Table V).

A comparison with last fall's data (CC-IRP 72) shows increases in the number of instructors at all colleges, especially at Honolulu and Kapiolani Community Colleges while the FTE lecturer count is much larger at Leeward CC (40.7 compared to 24.8) and at Maui CC (9.3 compared to 5.1).

Summary

Instructional workload is slightly lighter this fall compared to last fall in terms of credit hours taught. However, average class sizes and productivity ratios are slightly larger. A considerable reduction in the number of small classes is evident.

APPENDIX A
DEFINITIONS

1. COURSE: A unit of instruction consisting of recitations, lectures, laboratory sessions, etc., in a particular subject.
Example: English 100
2. CLASS: A lecture section of one or more students meeting regularly for instruction in a lecture or seminar course.
Example: Lecture section, 39 of English 100
3. CREDIT HOURS: Credit or credit hour value assigned to each lecture section of each fixed credit course.
Example: Three semester hours for lecture section 39 of English 100
4. STUDENT REGISTRATIONS: Number of students registered in each class, excluding students auditing the class.
Example: 25 student registrations in lecture section 39 of English 100
5. STUDENT CREDIT HOURS: Sum of semester hours taken by all students registered in all classes, excluding auditors.
Example: 75 student credit hours taken by 25 students in lecture section 39 of English 100 which is a three credit course
6. AVERAGE CLASS SIZE: Student registrations divided by number of classes. (Excludes classes and student registrations in classes such as directed studies, cooperative education.)
7. FTE FACULTY: FTE instructors employed on a full-time basis, counting the time of division chairman as two-third FTE; the position count of part-time instructors; and the FTE count of lecturers, instructors on overload and non-instructional staff teaching certain courses.
8. FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT OF: (1) "LECTURERS"; (2) INSTRUCTORS ON "OVERLOAD"; (3) AND "NON-INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF TEACHING CERTAIN COURSES":
Number of semester hours taught by these three groups divided by 15 credits.
9. FTE STUDENTS: The conversion of full- and part-time students into full-time equivalent by dividing total SCH taken by 15 credits.

10. EQUIVALENT CREDITS for classes with variable credits:

- (a) Regular subject, self-paced classes: average SH (derived by dividing SCH by number of students).
- (b) Classes with catalog numbers 099, 199, 299: total SCH divided by 10 credit hours.
- (c) Cooperative vocational - liberal arts courses:
50 students = 15 credit hours.

11. WORKLOAD MEASUREMENTS:

- (a) Average credit hours taught: the quotient obtained by dividing credit hours taught by FTE faculty,
e.g. $\frac{8,473 \text{ credits taught}}{647.5 \text{ faculty}} = 13.1$
- (b) Productivity ratio: the quotient obtained by dividing student credit hours (SCH) by FTE faculty,
e.g. $\frac{229,573}{647.5} = 355$
