PREFACE

One of the first requirements of the negotiations process is the need for comprehensive and accurate comparative information. This study is designed to help fill that need.

In order to make the Professional Salary and Fringe Benefit Study more responsive to the needs of the negotiations process, many changes have been made since 1955 when the first salary study was conducted. These changes are the direct outcome of the many suggestions we have received from area educators.

This year's study, for instance, has eliminated data on salaries of Board of Education personnel (Clerk, Treasurer, Auditor, etc.). It was found that these were not used in negotiations since they do not lend themselves to meaningful comparisons between districts on those salary positions. A need was also expressed to make the salary questionnaire brief in the interest of those who fill out these forms. A late request was also made that BOCES salaries be included in this study. This has been done; however, it might help to point out that the questionnaire was designed for local school districts. It was cumbersome to include BOCES salaries within this format. With next year's study, provisions will be made to report BOCES more adequately.

The value of this study stems from the wide participation of school districts. Every effort was made to include as many school districts as possible in the study. This year, several districts had not yet settled their salaries prior to our usual closing dates. The addenda reflects an effort to include as many districts as possible and yet get the study to you in January.

We welcome your comments and suggestions for further improvements in these studies.

1. Administrative Personnel - Includes the chief school officer, associate/assistant superintendents, coordinator, directors or supervisors (system-wide responsibility), administrative assistants or interns, principals, assistant principals, and any others included in the administrator's bargaining unit.

N= 10, MEDIAN = 27,425

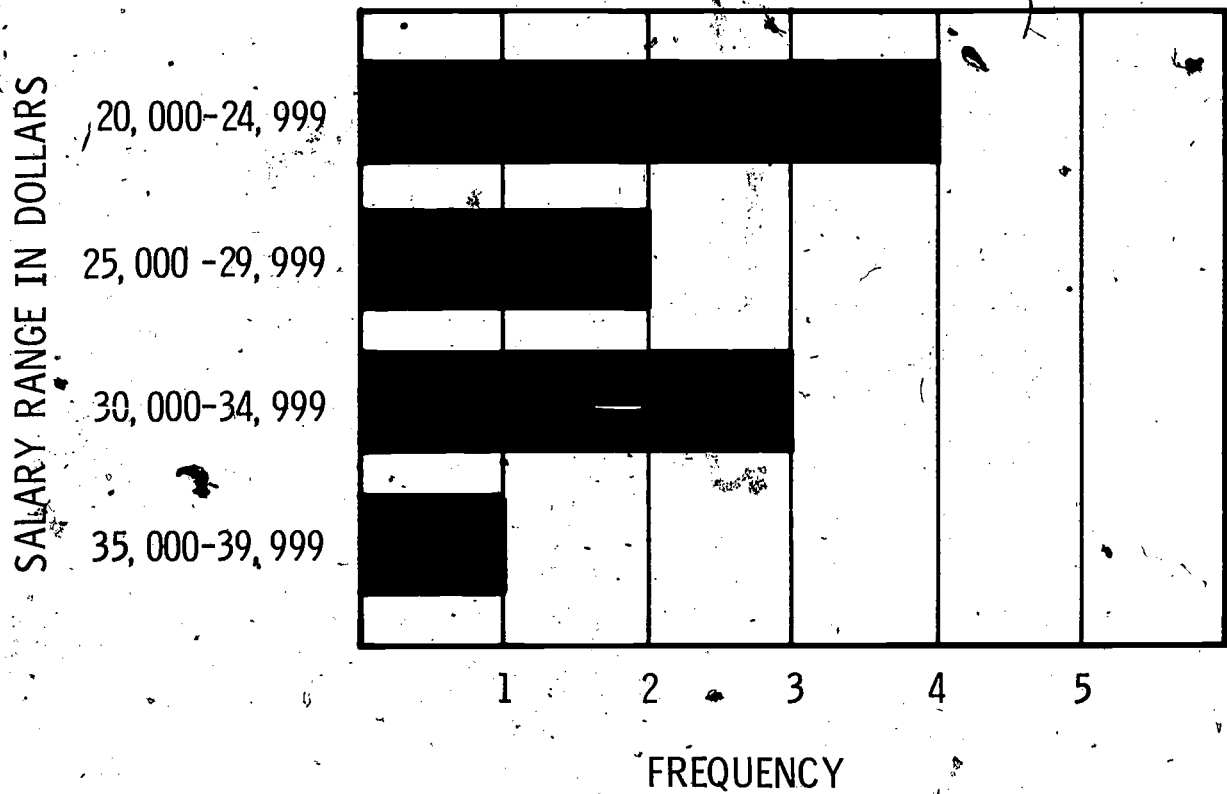

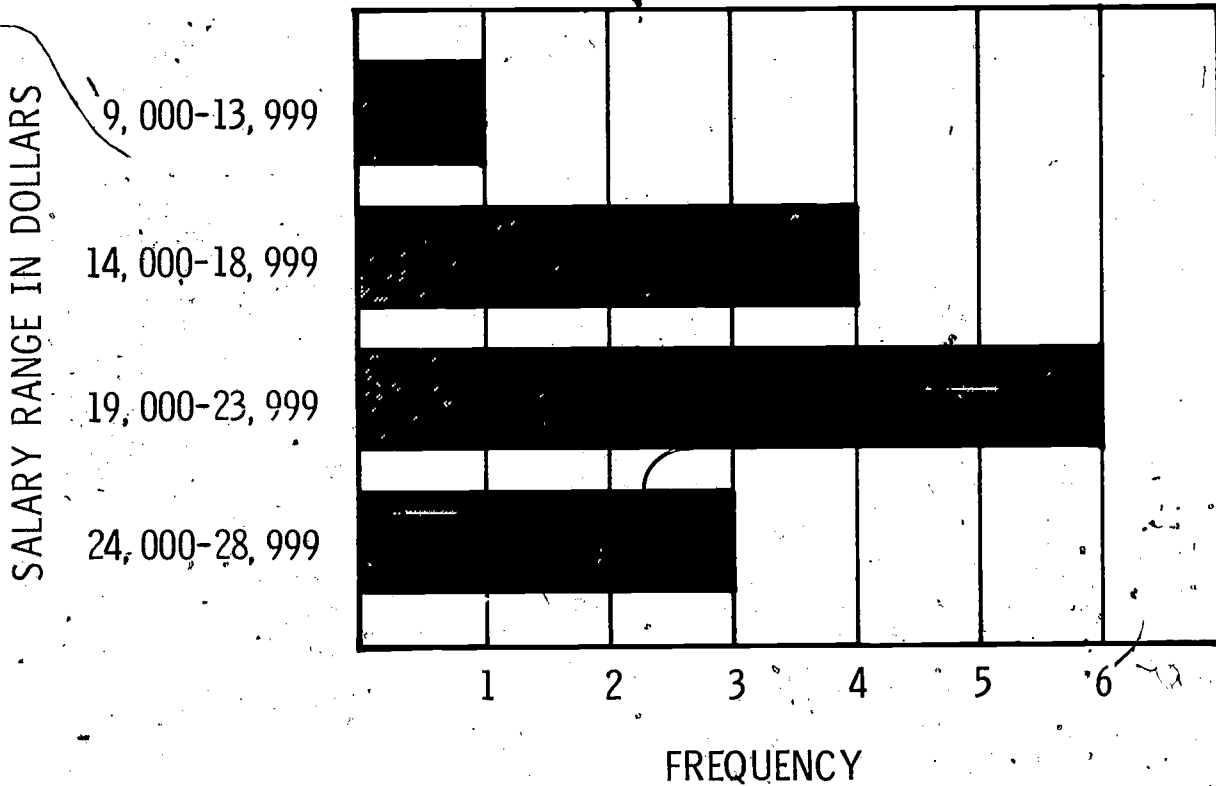
