ABSTRACT

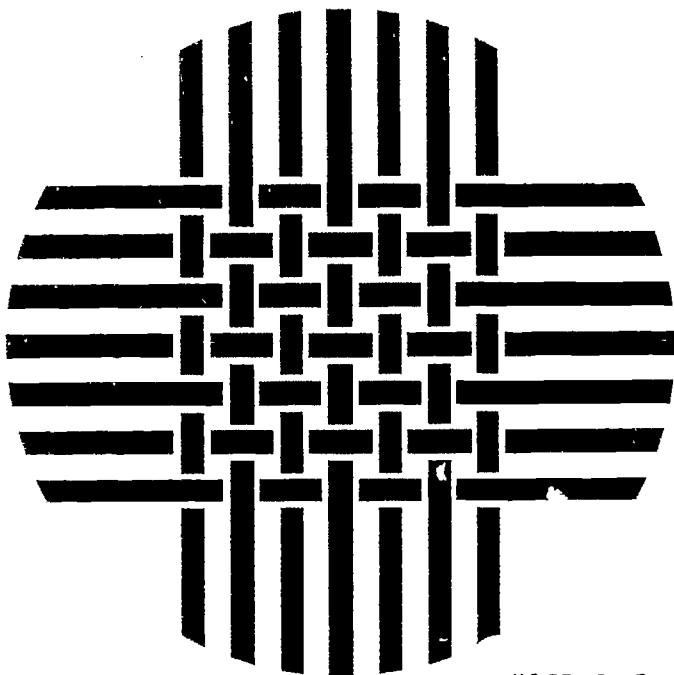
The Academic Common Market is an interstate agreement among Southern states for sharing academic programs. Participating states are able to make arrangements for their residents who qualify for admission to enroll in specific programs in other states on an in-state tuition basis. Thus far, the arrangements have been limited to unusual graduate programs. Every Southern state has programs that are not offered in some of the other states and that can accommodate additional students. To enroll as an Academic Common Market student, you must: (1) be accepted for admission into a graduate program to which your state has obtained access for its residents through the Academic Common Market; (2) Obtain certification of residency from the Common Market coordinator in your home state. This document lists, state-by-state, the graduate opportunities available to residents of Southern states through the Academic Common Market and gives brief descriptions of the programs and addresses for direct inquiries about admissions. Preface

The Academic Common Market is an interstate agreement among Southern states for sharing academic programs. Participating states are able to make arrangements for their residents who qualify for admission to enroll in specific programs in other states on an in-state tuition basis. Thus far, the arrangements have been limited to unusual graduate programs.

The Common Market concept recognizes that it is impractical for every state to attempt development of programs in every field of knowledge. Every Southern state has programs which are not offered in some of the other states and which can accommodate additional students. Through the sharing of such programs, the Market assists in eliminating unnecessary duplication and increasing the availability of and access to programs which meet the educational needs of citizens in the participating states.

To enroll as an Academic Common Market student, you must:

- 1) Be accepted for admission into a graduate program to which your state has obtained access for its residents through the Academic Common Market. Application for admission should be made directly to the institution offering the program.

- 2) Obtain certification of residency from the Common Market coordinator in your home state. Contact the state coordinator for certification information.

The graduate opportunities available to residents of Southern states through the Academic Common Market are listed state-by-state on the following pages. The participating states have made arrangements such that students entering these programs through the Common Market will not be required to pay out-of-state tuition fees.

This information is followed by a section of Program Notes containing brief descriptions of the programs and addresses for directing inquiries about admission.

Program Notes

- 1. Accounting** — University of Arkansas. The program is designed primarily to prepare an individual for an academic career at the college or university level, although the program also will provide a thorough background for the application of administrative sciences in non-academic settings. Direct inquiries to Dean, College of Business Administration, University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, Arkansas 72701.
- 2. Actuarial Science** — Georgia State University. The program has a two-fold objective: 1) the preparation of students for a meaningful and productive career in the actuarial profession; the curriculum emphasizes the technical aspects of actuarial work as well as course work covering basic business disciplines such as finance, accounting and economics; and 2) the preparation of degree candidates for the professional examinations of the Society of Actuaries of the Casualty Actuarial Society. Direct inquiries to Actuarial Science Advisor, Department of Insurance, Georgia State University, Atlanta, Georgia 30303.
- 3. Aerospace and Aerophysics Engineering** — Mississippi State University. The curriculum is based on strong work in the physical and engineering sciences and mathematics. Major areas of emphasis in the curriculum are fluid mechanics, flight mechanics, structures and design. Direct inquiries to Head, Department of Aerospace and Aerophysics Engineering, Mississippi State University, Mississippi State, Mississippi 39762.
- 4. Aerospace Education** — Middle Tennessee State University. The Master of Education degree with a major in aerospace education and a minor in aerospace was designed to help teachers keep up with the latest developments in the aerospace industry. There are two required workshops in which specialists at the elementary school, middle school, and high school levels show individuals the most effective ways of including aerospace materials in their classes. - 11. Anthropology and Education** – University of Georgia. The purpose of the program is to provide systematic training in the cultural foundations of education and to educate teacher-scholars in the complementary methods of anthropological field observation and educational research. The emphasis of training is on a cross-cultural approach to the study of educational variables. - 12. Astronomy** – University of Florida. Areas of specialty for dissertations include observational and theoretical work on close double stars, photography of quasars, planetary radio astronomy, extra-galactic radio astronomy and cosmology. - 13. Audiology and Speech Pathology** – Memphis State University. The doctoral program in the Department of Audiology and Speech Pathology is a research degree. It is designed to include such areas as: (1) research in normal communication, (2) research in communicative disorders relative to clinical activities, (3) teaching of courses relevant to undergraduate and graduate level students, and (4) administration of research, service, and training programs. 17. **Biomedical Engineering** — University of Virginia. 18. **Biometry** — Medical University of South Carolina. 19. **Biophysical Sciences** — University of Alabama, Birmingham. 51. **Environmental Health** — East Tennessee State University. 52. **Expressive Therapies** — University of Louisville. The program is offered through the Institute of Expressive Therapies. Students are introduced to a variety of therapeutic and learning models. Intensive study in graphic development, formal and constant analysis of deviant production, theories of creativity, symbolism, projective techniques and operational models for art therapy through manipulation of media dimension variables is culminated in original research by each student. - 53. Fisheries and Allied Aquacultures** — Auburn University. The program offers 22 graduate-level courses in various aspects of fisheries and aquacultures: Aquaculture, Aquatic Ecology, Fisheries Biology, Fisheries Management, Fish Pathology, Fish Processing and Technology, Ichthyology and Research Methodology. Field facilities consist of 289 earthen ponds with a total surface area of approximately 200 acres, 92 concrete ponds, and over 300 plastic pools. - 54. Fisheries Science** — Louisiana State University, Baton Rouge. These are field-oriented with emphasis on pond culture, management of fisheries resources in fresh and marine environments or on any aspect of the aquatic environment. - 55. Folk Studies** — Western Kentucky University. The discipline deals with the traditional culture of man as manifested in his customs and beliefs, verbal traditions and material forms; and has close affinities with literature, anthropology, sociology, history, geography, philosophy, and psychology. - 56. Food Systems Administration** — University of Tennessee. The program provides training for effective utilization of management resources in the administration of food service systems. Content areas include Manpower Planning and Training for the Food Service Industry, Quantitative Methods to Control Resources in Food Service Systems, Food Systems

Evaluation, Financial Management of Food Systems Research, Experimental Quality Food Study, Personnel Development, and Design and Layout of Food Service Systems. Emphases for the Ph.D. are geography of rural areas (including agriculture and land use, settlement and folk culture, recreation, and resource utilization), historical and modern geography of the U.S. (especially the South and Appalachia), Latin America, and man-oriented physical geography. Additional fields at the M.S. level are urban geography, systematic physical geography, cartography, and remote sensing. - 62. Geophysical Sciences** — Georgia Institute of Technology. The School of Geophysical Sciences has programs in the areas of geochemistry, geophysics, and engineering geology. 66. **Home Economics** — University of Tennessee. 67. **Horticulture** — Mississippi State University. The Department of Horticulture has graduate programs in ornamental horticulture and fruit and vegetable food science. 68. **Hospital and Health Administration** — University of Alabama, Birmingham. Upon completion of required course work, students spend nine to twelve months in residency training. - 70. Immunology** — University of Alabama, Birmingham. - 71. Industrial Design** — Auburn University. Areas of study include Product Design, Industrialized Housing, Package Design, Corporate Communications, Transportation Design, Exhibition Design, and Systems Design. Applicants with a baccalaureate degree from disciplines other than Industrial Design shall be admitted to the Graduate School under the condition that a minimum of 30 credit hours in the Industrial Design Program be completed at the undergraduate level. - 72. Industrial Technology** — East Tennessee State University. Topical fields of concentration include cross-national quantitative analysis of international relations, science and technology in international politics, and national security policies of major powers. - 76. Journalism** — West Virginia University. 84. **Marine Science** -- College of William and Mary. The School of Marine Science is a joint venture of the College and the Virginia Institute of Marine Science. - 89. Metallurgical Engineering and Materials Science** — University of Kentucky. - 92. Microbiology/Aquatic Pollution Ecology** — Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University. Major emphases in the program are on clinical and research experiences. A six-month music therapy clinical experience is required upon completion of the core sequence. Graduates of the program qualify for entry into the National Registry maintained by the National Association for Music Therapy, Inc. - 103. Musicology** — University of Kentucky. Basic courses include those involving research technics, stylistic analysis and study of periods, genres, music theory, and special subjects. - 105. Natural Resource and Environmental Economics** — Clemson University. Related courses in city planning, water resources engineering, environmental engineering, and several biological sciences are available. - 106. Neurosciences** — University of Alabama, Birmingham. Graduate degrees with programs related to neurosciences offered through the Departments of Pharmacology, Biochemistry, Anatomy, Physiology and Biophysics and others are in this program. - 107. Nuclear Engineering** — Georgia Institute of Technology. The program provides emphasis in the areas of reactor engineering, reactor operations, nuclear fuels engineering, energy systems engineering, computer applications, nuclear power management, radiation technology, environmental engineering, radiological health physics and health physics. Nuclear Engineering, Georgia Institute of Technology, Atlanta, Georgia 30332.

108. **Nuclear Engineering** – University of Tennessee. Areas of concentration in the program are: reactor analysis and design; interaction of radiation with matter; dynamics, control, instrumentation and safety; and energy transfer. Facilities for research are available to students at both the University Nuclear Engineering Laboratory and at the Oak Ridge National Laboratory. 109. **Nuclear Engineering Sciences** – University of Florida. 111. **Nursing** – University of Maryland, Baltimore. The program is basically organized around two main areas: expanding and strengthening knowledge and skill in selected clinical fields; and gaining knowledge and experience in certain types of roles through which the clinical content is applied. Students select one of four "tracks" within the clinical component: Community Health Nursing, Maternal-Child Health Nursing, Medical-Surgical Nursing and Psychiatric Nursing. between the food science department and the nutrition program that has been encouraged by the awareness that these disciplines should work together in the creation of new foods, and 3) the close cooperation between the reproductive physiology program and the nutrition program to study the effects of diet on embryonic development. - 113. Occupational Safety and Health** — Auburn University. The program is the only engineering-based graduate occupational safety and health program in the country. It builds on a student's basic industrial engineering background to prepare him to function in the following topic areas: 1) identification and evaluation of OSH conditions, practices, and loss potential factors; 2) analysis, design, and implementation of OSH control methods, procedures, and programs. - 114. Ocean Engineering** — Florida Atlantic University. The program provides Master-level study for baccalaureates having prior preparation in engineering or the physical sciences in four ocean-oriented optional subspecialties; oceanographic processes, materials and corrosion, underwater communications and acoustics, and ocean structures. - 115. Oceanography** — Old Dominion University. Among the various fields of oceanography the program emphasizes the study of waves, tides, and currents, sound and light in the sea, sediment transport in the ocean, pollution monitoring and control, beach erosion and stabilization problems, marine algae, fungi, and plankton. The Institute of Oceanography occupies a 20,000 square foot building with eight laboratories. A 65 foot oceanographic vessel owned and operated by the University is docked nearby at the Naval Amphibious Base. 117. Organizational Psychology — University of Tennessee. The program is offered jointly by the Departments of Psychology and Industrial and Personnel Management. The emphasis is upon applied research utilizing a thorough theoretical background, including classical and modern organizational behavioral psychology, and industrial management. - 125. Physical Education** — Middle Tennessee State University. The Doctor of Arts degree is specifically designed to train individuals

These are supervised by professors from the major department and from higher education. Typical goals might include specialization as a clinician, educator, researcher, consultant, or administrator with expertise in a basic science or in a clinical specialty. - 127. Planning** — University of Tennessee. Strong elective courses are available in the University to supplement the required core curriculum. Summer courses are provided. - 135. Radiological Health Specialty** — University of Kentucky Medical Center. - 156. Tropical Medicine and Medical Parasitology** — Louisiana State University. The program offers unique opportunities in Tropical Medicine and Medical Parasitology. The campus includes the Medical Center in New Orleans as well as the Gorgas Memorial Laboratories in Panama and the LSU-ICMRT in San Jose, Costa Rica. Basic course work is offered in New Orleans with additional course work and opportunity for field studies in Panama and Costa Rica. Graduate school faculty members are present in both offshore areas. Research opportunities in parasite physiology, metabolism, electron microscopy, chemotherapy, and immunology, as well as applied areas, are ongoing. - 157. Urban and Regional Planning** — Florida State University. At the Master's level, the program seeks to produce a graduate with professional competence in comprehensive community planning. The doctoral program seeks to foster the scholarly attainments that are necessary for critically examining the nature of planned change and for conducting independent research in areas related to urban and regional fields. The objectives are an expansion of the body of knowledge concerning the urban system, the establishment of means for influencing the direction of change, and an enhancement of the capacity to intervene effectively in the process of transforming large segments of the urban environment. - 158. Urban and Regional Planning** — University of New Orleans. The program is designed to provide professional planners to city, regional, state, and federal planning agencies; private consultants; public service foundations; and other public or private institutions. This program is designed to meet the requirements of the American Institute of Planners and the Association of Collegiate Schools of Planning. - 159. Urban Studies** — University of New Orleans. Emphasis is placed on understanding of social and physical aspects of urban planning and

the necessary interaction between these factors. In addition to courses in planning, the student may select minor courses in areas such as social science, education, or the humanities. - 160. Water Resources Engineering** – Clemson University. The objective of the Clemson WRE graduate program is to produce a competent, effective practitioner who is equipped with modern skills and insights to deal successfully with real-world, applied water resources challenges. Unlike more conventional water resources graduate programs based in engineering, the core curriculum for Clemson's WRE program is specified by areas instead of in terms of specific courses. Two approved courses or six semester hours are required in each of the following areas: 1) water quality and environmental aspects (e.g., environmental impact, effects of pollutants on the aquatic environment, water quality management); 2) water occurrence and transport (e.g., hydraulics, stream and estuarine analysis, hydrology); 3) planning and policy or the broadening and supporting areas (e.g., planning, economics, public administration recreation, systems engineering). - 161. Wildlife** – Louisiana State University, Baton Rouge. The program provides students with an ecological background in wildlife science so that when successfully completed they are prepared for research or management positions with federal, state or private agencies. Emphasis is placed on upland and wetland ecology. These are field-oriented and may cover any species of wildlife or plant and any type of habitat. - 162. Wood Science and Technology** – Mississippi State University. Major areas of study include fluid relations, pathology, carbohydrate chemistry, mechanical properties, anatomy, treatments and coating, and wood processing operations. A background in either organic and physical chemistry, industrial engineering, business, or other area is required of students, depending upon career objectives.
