ABSTRACT

Data from a survey of 1,137 junior colleges, community colleges, and technical institutes conducted by the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges in October 1972 and up-dated in March 1974 show that these institutions are playing a vital role in addressing the needs of older persons in the communities they serve. Following a brief overview of the results of this survey, including discussions of what kinds of services community colleges are providing for the elderly and how these services are funded, this pamphlet includes directories of: (1) two-year colleges with manpower training programs for persons who will work in the agencies and commercial enterprises that serve older persons; (2) two-year colleges with retired senior volunteer programs; (3) two-year colleges offering retirement education programs; (4) two-year colleges with cultural enrichment courses for senior citizens; and (5) two-year colleges offering free or reduced tuition for the elderly. # A Commentary

Ever since the 1961 White House Conference on Aging, the United States has been focusing increasing attention on the plight of its senior citizens. As a result of that conference, Medicare was enacted in 1964, relieving many older people from the threat of economic catastrophe due to illness; significant housing legislation was enacted; and in 1965 Congress passed a landmark bill—the Older Americans Act of 1965.

As a result of the Older Americans Act, states and institutions within the states, began to focus more intensely on providing services to a neglected segment of our society—its old people. As new programs emerged, the condition of older citizens became more exposed. Many problems which were not generally known began to surface and mobilization on be-

half of the elderly began to take place.

One of the institutions that has responded in a positive and enlightened way has been the community junior college. This is somewhat surprising in that the stereotype which has afflicted both community colleges and older persons would not normally lead to a merging of the two. However, community colleges can and are playing a vital role in addressing the needs of older persons in the communities they serve. The variety of ways in which they do this is covered in this report.

It is hoped that as a result of the initiative taken by the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges, and especially the work of the project on aging and its director, Andrew S. Korim, more linkages will be established between community colleges and state and local units on aging and senior citizens organizations. As shown in this publication, community colleges are a resource growing in importance to the community. Senior citizens are a constituency which has a great deal to offer and

which can benefit from the imaginative and comprehensive array of activities that community colleges across the country can provide. It is, happily, a linkage in which both will benefit.

# Older Americans and Community Colleges: an Overview

Many of the nation's more than 1,100 community colleges, junior colleges, and technical institutes are moving dramatically to provide services to their communities for improving the life of America's increasing number of elderly persons. The range of services being offered to meet the needs of senior citizens reflects the long-standing commitment community and junior colleges have in the utilization of their resources for local and national priorities.

## **Training Personnel**

One of the most pressing issues facing older Americans has been the ineffectiveness of human services on the life of

senior citizens. Wherever senior citizens turn for services, much remains to be desired in the quality of service rendered.

Whether senior citizen centers, social security agencies, family service agencies, mental health agencies, nursing homes, hospitals, aging agencies, volunteer service agencies, or commercial enterprises, the people who work on a face-to-face basis directly with senior citizens often are poorly prepared for the jobs they perform.

In community colleges, certificate and two-year associate degree programs designed to prepare persons for working in agencies and commercial enterprises that serve older persons are being offered in gerontology, homemaker services, nursing home administration, geriatrics, human services, mental health technology, recreational leadership, nursing, and nutritional services. More than 40 community colleges have reported that they offer programs specifically geared to prepare persons to work more effectively with the elderly.

### **Mobilizing Senior Volunteers**

One of the developments of the

past year has been the extent to which community and junior colleges have participated in older American volunteer programs under ACTION. Twenty-six community colleges in 15 states operate Retired Senior Volunteer Programs (RSVP), with six of these programs in Oregon. Many other colleges serve as stations to utilize the services of retired volunteers. As one community college president noted, "Retired seniors are a rich resource to our colleges as volunteer faculty, librarians, counselors, and in many supportive roles."

Some colleges also service the programs by providing instruction for prospective volunteers in the skills of volunteer work. One example of short-term training for volunteers is that offered by the Community College of Allegheny County (Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania) to retired persons participating in the Foster Grandparent Program.

### **Retirement Education**

Programs that prepare persons to function better in retirement are being offered by a growing number of community and junior

colleges. Senior citizens are provided with a wide range of courses, guidance, and informational services associated with retirement planning.

More than 140 community colleges offer pre-retirement and retirement educational services regarding such matters as income plans, insurance programs, wills, estates, tax matters, and planning the use of leisure. In some cases, college faculty develop programs which reflect specific needs identified by local community groups. Many community colleges build their programs around information available from public agencies such as the Social Security Administration and the Administration on Aging, or private organizations, such as the National Council on Aging and the American Association of Retired Persons.

New York City Community College (Brooklyn, N.Y.), through its Institute for the Study of Older Adults contributes to the retirement education of a large population in its cooperative efforts with senior centers.

An outstanding approach to

retirement education is the use of cable television by Flathead Valley Community College (Kalispell, Montana) to provide a series of programs covering the concerns of retired persons.

### **Nutritional Services**

Improving the diets of senior citizens has been identified as one of the top priorities in the program of the Administration on Aging, under the Older Americans Comprehensive Service Amendments of 1973. Community and junior colleges are utilizing their facilities, staff, and students to service congregate meals and delivered meals programs. Examples of colleges directly providing meals to senior citizens are Clark County Community College (Las Vegas, Nevada), Gloucester County College (Sewell, New Jersey), Snead State Junior College (Boaz, Alabama), and Catonsville Community College (Catonsville, Maryland).

Lane Community College (Eugene, Oregon) prepares hot meals for delivery by American Red Cross workers to isolated persons. Others, such as Clackamas Community College (Oregon

City, Oregon) cooperate with organizations such as churches in assisting with the programming of supportive services as a part of congregate feeding in a community effort called "Loaves and Fishes." Often excess capacity in college food-service programs may be mobilized to assist community organizations to carry out congregate meal programs.

Southeastern Nebraska Technical Community College (Lincoln, Nebraska) offers courses on nutrition to assist senior citizens in improving their diets. Brookdale Community College (Lincroft, New Jersey) has developed a filmstrip on nutritional guidance for viewing by the elderly in congregate meal settings.

### **Community Leadership**

A new role for many community colleges is one of leadership in working with community groups and agencies in the planning, development, and implementation of community programs for senior citizens. With the emphasis in the 1973 Older Americans Comprehensive Service Amendments on mobilizing unused local resources,

community colleges have assumed responsibility for structuring community resources to meet the needs of the elderly.

At Kalispell, Montana, Flathead Valley Community College and Flathead County Council on Aging are virtually a single entity because of the interlocking character of their programs. Tri-County Technical College (Pendleton, South Carolina) is working with the Appalachian Commission and several local agencies to address the needs of the rural elderly in its multi-county community.

Indian Hills Community College (Ottumwa, Iowa), Kirkwood Community College (Cedar Rapids, Iowa), and North Iowa Area Community College (Mason City, Iowa) have been designated the Area Agency on Aging to provide for the planning and coordination of services for senior citizens in their communities.

Genesee Community College (Batavia, New York) provides technical assistance to county officials in developing the local plan for services to the aging. Other community colleges open up their reservoir of students, their computers, and faculty to

assist communities in conducting surveys on needs, services, and critical gaps in the delivery of services. An increasing number of college presidents, administrators, and faculty serve on state and local councils.

### **Continuing Education**

Perhaps the simplest way in which a community college can extend services to the elderly is through the established offerings of the continuing education program.

Whether to gain skills for a second career, for cultural enrichment, for basic education, or for recreational endeavors, community and junior colleges constitute an easily accessible resource for senior citizens. More than 340 community and junior colleges report that they offer programs of cultural enrichment for senior citizens.

Age is no barrier to the participation of senior citizens in educational programs at community colleges. For instance, recently a student at the age of 97 received an award for completion of a program at Quinebaugh Valley Community College (Danielson, Connecticut). Similarly, Pima College (Tucson, Ari-



zona) recently recognized a 93-year-old woman for her outstanding work as a student.

Reduced tuition or no tuition for senior citizens is a reality at more than 160 community colleges, junior colleges, and technical institutes.

Unfortunately, many senior citizens are unaware of the opportunities provided by community colleges. As one retired person pointed out, "The willingness of our community college to serve old people is a well-kept secret."

### **Other Services**

Diverse services are provided by community and junior colleges that enable senior citizens to utilize the resources of the colleges and their respective communities. In addition to tuition considerations, the concept of a special privilege "gold card" is being widely adopted as a means of encouraging senior citizens to use libraries and other college services that are cultural or recreational. College of Southern Idaho (Twin Falls, Idaho) was an early user of the "gold card."

Information and referral services are being provided to senior citizens as an extension

of the counseling and guidance services of community colleges. Sometimes these services take the form of specific staffing and, in other cases, a special newspaper for senior citizens is produced such as the one at Essex County College (Newark, New Jersey). Arizona Western College (Yuma, Arizona) offers consumer education to senior citizens in both English and Spanish, responding to the bilingual character of its community.

Recognizing transportation as a basic service needed by senior citizens, a number of colleges have initiated special bus services, car pooling arrangements, and/or escort services that enable senior citizens to participate in community activities. Telephone surveillance of persons living in isolation is provided by students enrolled in various career programs at Dodge City Community College (Dodge City, Kansas).

Among numerous services offered to senior citizens at Catonsville Community College (Catonsville, Maryland) are support services for "Autumn Players" — a senior citizen theater production company. At Honolulu Community College (Honolulu, Hawaii)

and Northern Nevada Community College (Elko, Nevada) multi-purpose senior centers are operated as a service of the colleges for senior citizens.

### **Funding**

Financial support for the increased involvement of community colleges in addressing the needs of the elderly comes from many sources. The most frequent source is local funds already available to the community college through its regular revenues. By making services to the aging a major college priority, funds are often reallocated from program areas producing less community benefit.

In other cases, funds are made available through social service agencies, medical service agencies, social security agencies, and area agencies on aging. Training persons to work with the elderly is often funded by the state vocational education agency. Programs to mobilize senior volunteers are funded by the federal agency, ACTION.

Generally speaking, the state aging agency is a logical point of contact for community colleges interested in exploring the needs and the resources available to

meet these needs. State aging agencies receive funds under Older Americans Comprehensive Service Amendments to support programs addressing the needs of the elderly and have provided financial assistance to community colleges in several states. As local area agencies on aging become operational, community colleges will find opportunities to serve these agencies on a contract basis.
