ABSTRACT

Over 190 listings comprise this general bibliography. The bibliography presents sources of information on architecture and design, economics, energy, landscape and landscape architecture, and urban concepts. Listings provide current information on these topics. Most date from 1972 through 1975. The bulk of the documents are project reports, commercially published books, and government reports and bulletins. Citations are alphabetized by author within each category and include the title, date, number of pages, availability, and price. An author and title index and a list of some publishers' addresses conclude the document. (JR)
