ABSTRACT

This report provides data on the faculty and staff of the Hawaii community college system as of fall 1975. It focuses on full-time appointees, but also provides information on lecturers, part-time appointees, and professional staff on leave. Data are summarized by five program categories: instructional support, academic support, student services, instruction, and public service; the instruction category is further divided into the areas of general education and vocational education. The bulk of the report consists of eight tables: (1) headcount for all professional staff, by full-time and part-time status; (2) sex, highest degree earned, and mean age of full-time professional staff, by program category; (3) average salary, salary range, tenure status, age, highest degree earned, and instructional area for full-time instructors, by sex; (4) sex, program category, highest degree earned, salary, and age of all lecturers; (5) salaries for full-time appointees, excluding instructors, by program category; (6) salaries for full-time instructors, by program category; (7) tenure status, by year of possible tenure and by instructional area; and (8) number of instructors on leave, by type of leave and by tenure status. Although data are also provided for fall 1974, the figures for 1975 include an additional community college, so reliable comparisons cannot be made.

Introduction

Developments in the area of professional personnel appear to be the most active in the higher education scene to judge from the literature, professional meetings and conferences, time demands faced by administrators. It is therefore valuable to have an accurate description of faculty, the most important resource.

The primary attention of this report is on FULL-TIME BOR APPOINTEES WHOSE STANDARD FORM 5Bs (SF5Bs) WERE SUBMITTED TO AND PROCESSED BY THE UNIVERSITY PERSONNEL OFFICE BY THE OCTOBER 28, 1975 UPDATE. Minimal information (mostly headcount) is provided on: lecturers, part-time BOR appointees and professional staff on leave.

Information for this report is abstracted from Faculty-Staff Information System (FSIS) summary reports 2530-2535, as of October 31, 1975. Standard Form 5Bs are used as the basis of these computer reports.

Data on the BOR staff are summarized by five major groups. (See Appendix A.) These categories were developed jointly by representatives from the colleges, Management Systems Office and the Office of the Chancellor for Community Colleges.

Information on BOR staff at Hawaii Community College is being included for the first time. Therefore historic data may not be entirely comparable, system-wide. However, generally, system data on staff this fall indicate patterns similar to those of the past with a few exceptions.

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HIGHLIGHTS

I. What is the distribution of the 963 BOR appointees at the seven community colleges? (Table I)

a. The distribution pattern of the BOR appointees in terms of full- and part-time basis is similar to last fall: 67 percent (647) full time, 2 percent (18) part time and 31 percent (298) lecturers.\*

b. The number of BOR staff ranges from 63 at Windward to 239 at Leeward.

II. What are the characteristics of the 647 FULL-TIME PROFESSIONAL STAFF? (Table II)

a. As in previous years, almost two-thirds of the staff are males. (Campus variation: 51-70 percent males.)

b. The staffing distribution is similar to last fall:

Instruction:	76 percent (69 to 84 percent, by campus)
Academic Support:	7 percent (4-14 percent, by campus)
Student Services:	9 percent (6-12 percent, by campus)
Institutional Support:	5 percent (3-9 percent, by campus)
Public Services:	3 percent (0-10 percent, by campus)

c. Compared to last fall, excluding Hawaii CC personnel, the following are the proportionate changes in the staffing structure:

Institutional Support:	+43 percent (21-30)
Academic Support:	+7 percent (39-42)
Student Services:	+15 percent (46-53)
Instruction:	+12 percent (386-434)
Public Services:	-14 percent (21-18)

d. Age: 40.7, the same as last fall (35.8-43.2 by campus).

e. As in past years, the great bulk of the appointees have masters' degrees (58 percent).

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\*The lecturer figure cited in this report differs from the 365 cited in the faculty workload report, CC-IRP 84. A lecturer teaching at more than one campus is counted only once in this report while he is included in the lecturer count for each campus at which he is teaching in the former report.

III. What are the characteristics of the 493 FULL-TIME INSTRUCTORS?  
(Table III)

- a. Male instructors comprise the majority group at every campus except one. (63 percent, system; 47-75 percent, by campus.)
- b. Vocational instructors comprise 51 percent of the teaching staff this fall compared to 43 percent in fall 1974. (Including Hawaii CC's. 49 vocational instructors in this fall's count probably accounts for the change.)
- c. Some noteworthy observations about instructors' average salaries this fall are: (See Appendix B for average salaries of other professional staff.)
  1. The average salary this fall is \$16,905, 23 percent more than the \$13,757 reported last fall.\*\* Campus averages vary: \$15,835 to \$18,129.
  2. Male instructors' salaries increased by 22 percent, females, by 25 percent.
  3. Male instructors' salaries are 7 percent higher (about \$1,065) than those of the female instructors probably because there are more male instructors particularly in the vocational programs with many years of service.
  4. Vocational education instructors' salaries are higher than those in general education (\$17,425 compared to \$16,366). The exception is Kapiolani CC. (See Appendix C.)
- d. Salary ranges: Almost two-thirds of the instructors are in ranges 4 and 5. 71 percent of the males and 53 percent of the females are in these categories.
- e. Tenure status:
  1. 55 percent are tenured, 32 percent are on tenure track, and 13 percent are not eligible (13-70 percent are tenured, by campus). (See Appendix D for details.)
  2. Generally, the proportion of those tenured declined. A partial explanation maybe that more instructors with tenure are on leave this fall (33 compared to 15 last fall. See Appendix E.) Their positions are filled with instructors who are not on the tenure track.

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\*\*Last fall, the average compensation, including fringe benefits and salary for those on sabbatical was \$16,257 for six community colleges. This was somewhere between ranks 1 and 2 in the AAUP scale. "Chronicle of Higher Education," Volume X, Number 15, June 9, 1975.

f. Highest degree:

1. The distribution in terms of highest degrees earned is: doctoral 38, 8 percent; masters, 283, 57 percent; bachelors, 96, 20 percent; less than bachelors, 74, 15 percent.\*\*\*
2. Of particular interest is the increase in the number of those with doctoral degrees: from 25 to 38 (52 percent).

IV. What is the typical lecturer like? (Table IV)

A 36 year-old male with a master's degree, teaching a general education course. He is earning about \$240 more than last fall (\$1,807 compared to \$1,569).

SUMMARY

Reflecting enrollment increases, there is a sizable increase in the number of professional staff. As expected, average salaries of instructors increased appreciably compared to last fall. Other than the fact that the number and proportion of those with doctoral degrees increased this fall, the other characteristics remain stable: more males, mean age about 41 years old, with the majority of instructors having been granted tenure.

Note: 1975 figures are not comparable to previous years. Previous years' data exclude Hawaii Community College. Percentages rounded.

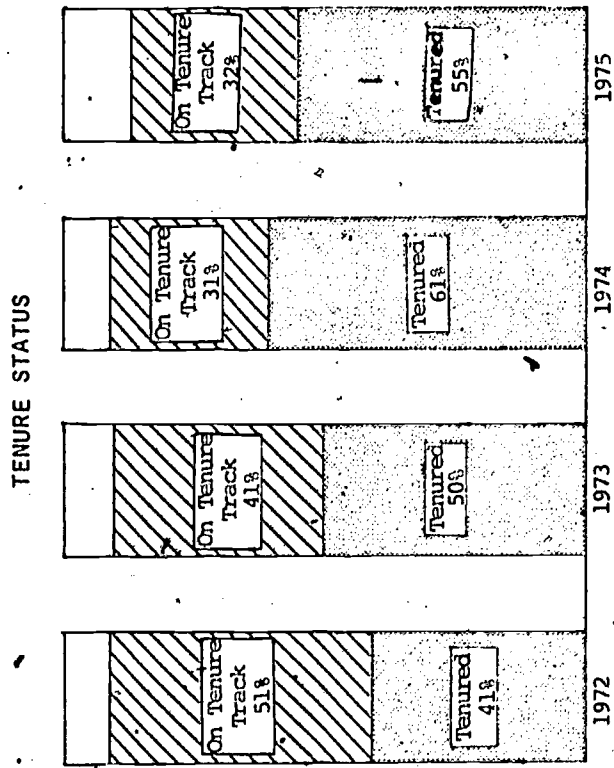
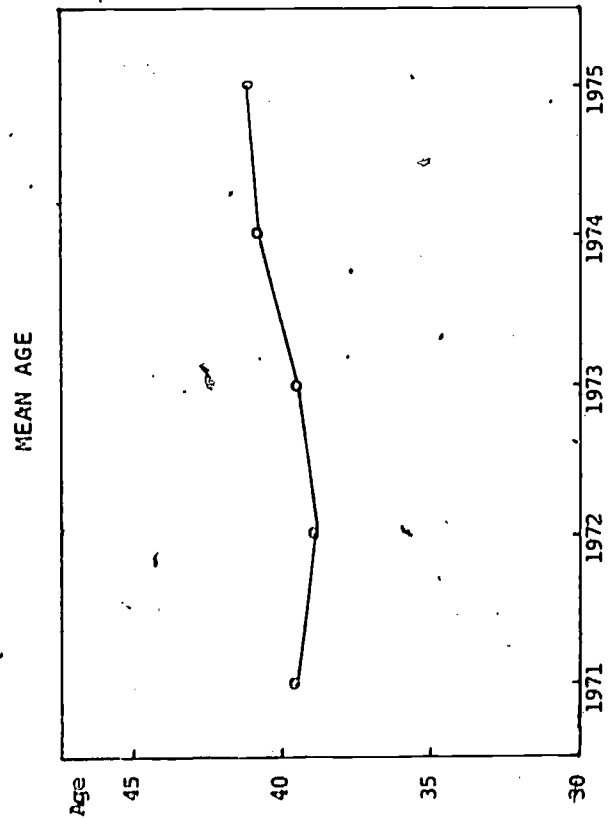
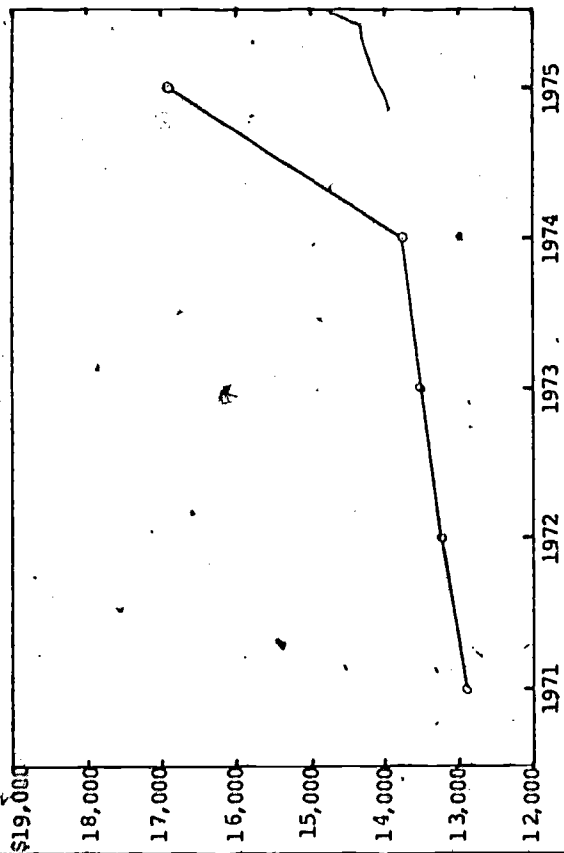
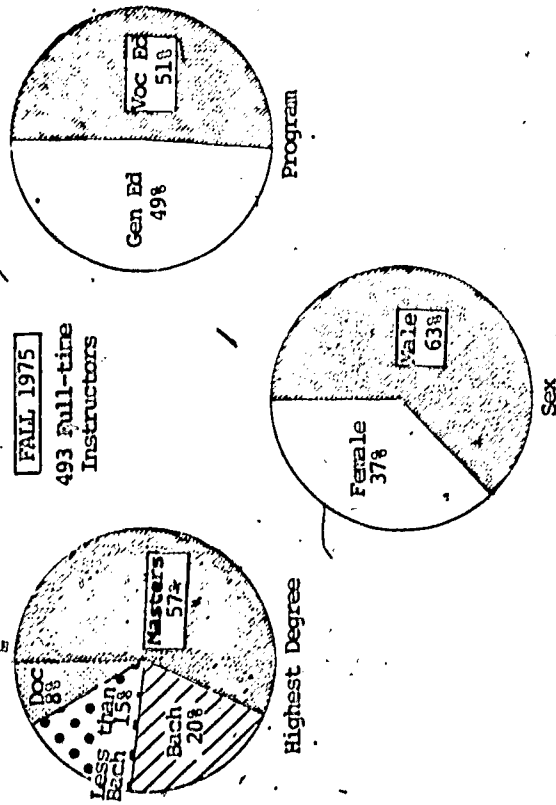
